1.0 GENERAL

1.1 PURPOSE

The City of Spokane Wastewater Management Department Riverside Park Water Reclamation Facility (RPWRF) establishes the following Administrative Policy and Procedure specifying the geographical boundaries for acceptance of hauled wastewater.

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2.0 DEPARTMENTS/DIVISIONS AFFECTED

This Department Policy and Procedure shall apply to the City of Spokane Wastewater Management Department RPWRF, Industrial Pretreatment Program.

4.0 DEFINITIONS

- 4.1 Domestic wastewater includes waste removed from a septic tank, cesspool, holding tank, food-service grease trap/interceptor, or a similar system that receives only household, non-industrial sewage.
- 4.2 Non-domestic wastewater includes non-dangerous and non-hazardous commercial or industrial waste, landfill leachate waste, groundwater remediation site waste, chemical toilet waste, etc.

5.0 POLICY

- 5.1 Domestic wastewater, including food service grease, hauled to RPWRF by a permitted wastewater hauler will only be accepted from points of generation within Spokane County and adjacent counties enumerated herein. The adjacent counties include Pend Oreille, Stevens, Lincoln, and Whitman counties in Washington, and Kootenai, Bonner, and Benewah counties in Idaho.
- 5.2 If pre-approved by the Industrial Pretreatment Program, portable toilet waste may be considered equivalent to domestic wastewater. Pre-approved portable toilet waste hauled to RPWRF by a permitted wastewater hauler will only be accepted from points of generation within Spokane County and adjacent counties. The adjacent counties include Pend Oreille, Stevens, Lincoln, and Whitman counties in Washington, and Kootenai, Bonner, and Benewah counties in Idaho.
- 5.3 If pre-approved by the Industrial Pretreatment Program, non-domestic wastewater hauled to RPWRF by a permitted wastewater hauler will only be accepted from points of generation within Spokane County.

6.0 PROCEDURE

- 6.1 Per the Wastewater Hauler General Permit, before offloading hauled wastewater at RPWRF, a Wastewater Hauler Discharge Record must be filled out completely, signed by the permitted wastewater hauler, and submitted to RPWRF.
- 6.2 RPWRF staff will review each pump-out address listed on the Discharge Record to confirm compliance with this Policy. RPWRF staff will ensure locations are within acceptable boundaries as set forth in this Policy.
- 6.3 If one or more locations are listed which are outside of the acceptable geographical boundary, the entire truckload will be prohibited from disposal at RPWRF. If unacceptable wastewater has been discharged at

- RPWRF it will be considered a violation of the Wastewater Hauler General Permit, SMC 13.03A, and this Policy.
- 6.4 If the hauled wastewater is brought to RPWRF after hours, the load must be pre-approved, and the Discharge Record will be reviewed by staff after disposal. If unacceptable wastewater has been discharged at RPWRF, it will be considered a violation of the Wastewater Hauler General Permit, SMC 13.03A, and this Policy.
- 6.5 All violations will be enforced in accordance with chapter 13.03A SMC and generally in accordance with the Industrial Pretreatment Program's Enforcement Response Plan.
- 6.6 In any event, the City reserves the right to take any other available action against any user when the circumstances warrant, to the extent of pursuing legal remedies. Further, the City is empowered to take more than one enforcement action against any non-compliant user. These actions may be taken concurrently. [SMC 13.03A.1004]

7.0 RESPONSIBILITIES

7.1 The Wastewater Management Department, through its Industrial Pretreatment Program, shall administer this Policy. It is the responsibility of each permitted wastewater hauler to understand and comply with the Wastewater Hauler General Permit and this Policy.
