





Summary of complaints

OPO 25-01	A community member was frustrated that responding SPD officers did not charge the people responsible for assaulting them.
OPO 25-03	A community member believes that they are being harassed by SPD officers in their area due to the numerous times they have been pulled over and cited for erroneous things.
OPO 25-05	A community member alleged that an SPD detective released information regarding the case involving their child to uninvolved parties.
OPO 25-06	A community member stated that SPD officers used force on them and removed their animals from their care without their consent, in a case of mistaken identity.
OPO 25-07	Multiple witnesses were concerned with the actions of responding SPD officers to a community member during a City Council meeting.
OPO 25-08	A community member stated that they were falsely arrested after reviewing body worn camera footage and hearing the officer state that he had no reason to keep him.
OPO 25-09	A community member was frustrated how their mental health detainment was conducted.




REFERRALS

Summary of referrals

IR 25-01	A community member wanted to speak with an SPD supervisor to have a detective removed from their case. SPD/IA
IR 25-02	A community member wanted to speak with an officer regarding a case involving their child. SPD/IA
IR 25-03	A community member was frustrated that they received a bill when they contacted the SPD for assistance. SPD/IA
ER 25-04	A community member stated that they were made to sit unclothed in the county jail for 15 hours. Department of Corrections
ER 25-05	A community member stated that Code Enforcement officers have been spreading false information about them which led to their arrest. Code Enforcement
