Summary:

On 3/8/13, Sgt. Waters contacted 2 males at the 500 block of W. 3rd Ave. He recognized one of the males as Glen W. O'Brien 44b and knew that Glen had a warrant for his arrest. Ofc. J. O'Brien arrived to assist with this contact. During the contact, Glen attempted to conceal his identity by looking down with his hoodie over his head, avoiding eye contact. Glen had something in his right hand and it appeared he was trying to conceal this item from officers. Ofc. O'Brien positioned himself behind Glen and saw that he was holding a metal tin, as well as what appeared to be a plastic baggie in his right hand. Ofc. O'Brien immediately recognized these items as being consistent with drug storage.

Ofc. O'Brien took right arm control, and Sgt. Waters took left arm control of Glen, however Glen tensed up his arms and clenched tightly onto the items in his right hand. Glen pulled is arms in close to his body, resisting officers attempts to put his hands behind his back. During this time, officers verbally advised Glen to stop resisting and to cooperate. Glen broke his right arm free

and threw the items he was holding onto the ground. Ofc. O'Brien grabbed Glen's right arm again and advised him that they would have to take him to the ground if he did not stop resisting. Glen continued to physically resist detention.

At this point, officers were struggling with a resisting suspect whom they knew had a history of fleeing police, and had been armed with a knife in the past. Ofc. O'Brien decided to use a personal impact tool to knock Glen off balance. Ofc. O'Brien attempted to strike Glen on his chest with his forearm to knock him back off balance. Due to the fact that Glen was moving around a lot, Ofc. O'Brien inadvertently struck Glen on his upper lip with his forearm. The strike did knock Glen off balance and officers were able put Glen into a prone cuffing position and take him into custody.

During the struggle, Glen sustained a bloody/swollen lip from the forearm strike, and a minor abrasion on his left check from the prone cuffing technique. Medics responded and tended to Glen's injuries. Glen was transported to Deaconess Medical Center for treatment to abscesses on his legs not related to the contact with officers. Sgt. Waters sustained minor cuts to his right knuckles and a bruise on his right thumb during the contact.

The items Glen discarded were recovered, and it was discovered that he was in possession of methamphetamine when contacted.

I contacted Glen O'Brien at the jail. I observed minor swelling on his upper lip and a minor abrasion on his left cheek. He did not wish to discuss the incident with me.

Recommendation:

Glen was actively resisting arrest. He has a history of fleeing police and had been armed with a knife on prior contacts. He was wearing baggy clothing that could easily have concealed a knife or other weapon. The personal impact strike was intended for Glen's chest area, but Glen's movements caused the strike to inadvertently contact his upper lip area. Ofc. O'Brien's decision to use a personal impact tool to knock Glen off balance was objectively reasonable under the circumstances. Sgt. Waters use of body weight/manual force was also objectively reasonable under the circumstances.

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On 3/8/2013 at about 1210 hrs, I observed a black male wearing a motorcycle helmet with a full face on a BMX style bicycle S/B on Wall from 4th. This male had three different backpacks across his back and shoulders. When this male saw my vehicle, he took a turn down a trail behind the building on the S/W corner of 3rd/Wall. I attempted to find him but could not. It appeared he may have just prowled some vehicles.

The COMPSTAT report had indicated that the area of 2/Howard has been used by people to exchange stolen property. I am familiar with the short stay traffic in the South alley of 2/Howard, behind the United Central Methodist Church at 518 W Third. I went to that area to see if perhaps this male when there.

As I turned E/B into the alley from Howard, I observed this same male riding his bike toward me W/B. The

male had his face shield up and I could clearly see his lips say, "oh shit." He took off S/B on Howard. When I continued down the alley I could see a male sitting behind the Church on the steps. I could see there were backpacks or bags around him. I had seen this male around downtown before.

I looked around again for the male on the bike but I was unable to locate him. He was a small in stature black male with gaps in his teeth and scraggly facial hair. He was wearing a black helmet with either a design or flames on it. He was dressed in all black.

I went back to 518 W Third to talk to the male I had seen sitting there. He was later ID'd as Rhett Zorn. I arrived back there at approx 1219 hrs. This time there was another male with Zorn. As I walked up, Zorn made eye contact and acknowledged me. The second male would not turn around. I said "hello" to them and both males looked at me.

When the one male turned around, he was wearing a baseball hat and had the hood from his sweatshirt up over his head. He was looking at the ground, avoiding eye contact. I recognized that it was Glen W O'Brien who I knew was a repeat offender and had been breaking into cars downtown. I also knew he had a warrant for his arrest.

Officer J. O'Brien arrived to assist. While I was talking to O'Brien he was still bladed away from me. I could see him move his right hand toward his right pocket which he seemed to be trying to keep hidden from me. Ofc O'Brien went around to the other side of Glen O'Brien, closer to the right hand.

Ofc O'Brien said something like "what's in your hand?" to Glen. Glen's hand looked to be moving toward his pocket and his fist was clenched. At this point, Glen had not been searched and was wearing baggie clothing. I knew he had a history of fleeing officers and has been armed with a knife in the past. I was not sure what he had in his hand. He is also over six feet tall and approx 200 lbs.

I took hold of Glen's left arm near the wrist as Ofc O'Brien took hold of the right. As soon as we took control of his arms, Glen tensed up and clenched his fist. I tried to move his left arm behind his back to handcuff him but he was fighting it. I wrestled with his arm briefly then I began to bring his arm up into a figure four technique. My thought was to break his balance to his rear and use a car parked behind us as some leverage to get him handcuffed. As I was doing this I said several times, "stop fighting."

As I did this, Glen started to move forward as Ofc O'Brien used his forearm across Glen's chest as a technique to get him to go backward. I saw Glen's body move forward at this time. I was still trying to get Glen's hand behind his back.

I saw Glen throw something out of his right hand toward a bike rack that was in front of us. At that time, I could see Ofc O'Brien start to move and Glen started to fall toward Ofc O'Brien. As this happened, I lost my balance and fell onto Glen, smashing my right hand knuckles into the ground. This caused me to lose my grip on Glen's wrist. Glen fell onto his front side.

I heard Ofc O'Brien say "stop fighting" and I heard Glen say, "I'm done, I'm done." At that point, he went limp and we were able to get him handcuffed.

I heard Ofc O'Brien ask Glen where he was bleeding from. I could see he had blood coming from his nose or mouth. Medics were requested to check on him. I asked Glen if he was hurt somewhere other than his mouth area. He said he has sores on his legs that have been bleeding and sores on his hands.

I checked to see where Zorn went and he just sat down on the ground when we started fighting with Glen.

I looked to see what Glen threw from his hands. I could see two small zip lock style baggies sitting on the ground near the bike rack. One had a crystal substance inside and the second looked to have more baggies inside.

I checked my hand which was bleeding from the knuckles and my right thumbnail is bruised from the impact of the ground.

Cpl Lungren responded and photographed the baggies on the ground. AMR transported Glen to the hospital to have his legs (which I could see blood through his pants) checked. It looked to me that Glen had some swelling around his upper lip and perhaps on his cheek. Both injuries are consistent with the prone cuffing technique we attempted.

I collected the baggies from the ground. As I was about to drive away, Zorn came up to me and was crying. He said I could contact him by the message board at the House of Charity if I need to talk to him. He also said thank you and asked us to clean this area up because he is tired of all the violence. I was also contacted by Barry White who works at the church. He said there is video of the area we were in. he was going to check with the pastor and let me know. I later called and left a message to see the status of the video.

I field tested the contents of one of the baggies and it tested as Meth. I placed both baggies on property as evidence.

Sgt Stevens was notified of Glen's facial injuries and those injuries were photographed by Cpl Lungren

O'Brien, did possess a controlled substance to wit: methamphetamine.

Sergeant Waters can testify to the following:

On 03-08-13 at about 1219 hrs, he checked out with two suspicious people in the alley behind 525 W. 2nd Ave.

He recognized one of the subjects as Glen W. O'Brien who he knew to have an outstanding Department of Corrections warrant."

He field tested a crystal substance that the defendant had discarded as positive for methamphetamine.

He placed the methamphetamine on property as evidence.

On 03-08-13 at about 1219 hrs, I assisted Sergeant Waters who had checked out with two subjects in the alley behind Crosswalk at 525 W. 2nd Ave.

Sergeant Waters had seen a possible vehicle prowler on a biker earlier in the morning and SPD dispatch had earlier broadcasted a prowling call a block to the south.

I arrived on scene and saw the two males, one later identified as Glen O'Brien, standing by numerous bags and a red mountain bike. I could see O'Brien was trying to conceal his identity under his hoody while he avoided eye contact. O'Brien kept his head down.

While Sergeant Waters was talking to the other male, I could see O'Brien trying to access or conceal something with his right hand. I moved behind O'Brien and could see a small metal tin in his right hand.

I could see O'Brien had a piece of plastic in the same hand as the metal tin. Both the tin and small plastic bags are consistent with drug storage.

I took right arm control of O'Brien and he was immediately resistive.

O'Brien tensed his arms and tried to pull his right arm into his body. O'Brien clenched his right fist which concealed the items.

Sergeant Waters assisted me by taking left arm control on O'Brien.

I could feel O'Brien tensing his upper body muscles and felt him pulling his arms in close to his body which improved his core strength.

I repeatedly told O'Brien to quit resisting and to relax but O'Brien did not comply. I continued to try and place O'Brien's arm behind his back to detain him but O'Brien resisted.

As I tried to transition my grip and move his arm, O'Brien was able to pull free from my grasp. After pulling free, O'Brien immediately tossed some small plastic bindles onto the ground.

I grabbed O'Brien's arm again and told him to relax and quit resisting or we would take him to the ground.

O'Brien pulled back from me and I used the inside of my forearm in an attempt to hit his chest and push him off balance. I wanted to put him back on his heels and transition in to a level one lateral vascular neck restraint. Because O'Brien was not cooperating and or standing still, the strike did not hit him on the chest but made contact on the area of his upper lip.

The strike did knock O'Brien off balance and we were able to put O'Brien on the ground into a prone cuffing technique.

I told O'Brien he was under arrest and he had the right to an attorney.

While cuffing (dl) O'Brien and removing his backpack, I could see O'Brien had a bloody nose or a bloody lip. I requested medics to check on his condition.

I asked O'Brien what his name was but he refused to answer.

O'Brien is

The medics advised O'Brien needed to be seen at the hospital for the abscesses on his legs.

O'Brien had an abrasion on his left cheek from the prone cuffing.

While the medics were treating O'Brien, I watched to make sure the discarded bindles were not moved or taken. At least one of the bindles had a crystal substance in it.

Sergeant Waters collected the bindles to field test the substance and place them on property as evidence. See his additional report.

O'Brien was medically cleared at Deaconess hospital and I transported him to jail.

I booked O'Brien for possession of methamphetamine and on his outstanding warrants.

I notified Sergeant B. Stevens of O'Brien's injuries.
