Summary:

On 3/17/13, Officers Boothe, Jenson, and Potter responded to 2427 N. Julia on a DVOP violation. This was the second time officers had responded to the address on this shift. Officers were aware that the suspect was Ellenwood and they were aware of some recent police history of him which involved a "suicide by cop" standoff issue and another incident where kinetic energy bean bag and blue nose devices were used on him to no effect.

On the prior event this shift, the reporting female accused Ellenwood of sexual molesting her 10 year old daughter as well as the order violation. On this call, Officer Boothe developed probable cause to arrest Ellenwood for DVOPV. Officer Jensen attempted a K-9 track of Ellenwood, but he was not located.

When Officer Boothe and Jensen arrived, they could hear Ellenwood outside the residence.

Officer Jensen brought his Police K-9, Cruz, with him. Officers located Ellenwood in the back yard of the residence. When Ellenwood saw the Officers, he immediately bladed his body to them and put his right hand into his pants pocket. Officer Jensen ordered Ellenwood to show his hands or he would send his dog to bite him. Ellenwood responded to go ahead and to shoot him. Officer Boothe reported hearing Ellenwood make statements that he had a gun and was going to shoot the officers.

Officers knew at this point:

•There was probable cause to arrest Ellenwood on two counts of DVOPV.

•Ellenwood had not been searched, so it was unknown if he was armed. Officers were aware of his past history with the police of "suicide by cop" situations and where officers had used force on Ellenwood to little effect. There was concern by officers of Ellenwood getting to the victim female and her child.

•Ellenwood was now refusing the officers legal commands to show his hands. Instead, he had his right hand buried into his pants pocket and was making threats of having a gun and using it, and challenging officers to shoot him.

Officer Jensen sent K-9 Cruz to apprehend Ellenwood. Cruz is a new K-9 and this was his first application of this type, so he was confused and did not engage Ellenwood. Ellenwood was still making the same statements, so Officer Boothe deployed his Taser in probe mode on Ellenwood based on the above listed factors. According to both Officers, this had no obvious effect on Ellenwood. Ellenwood kept his hand buried in his pocket and pulled out the Taser wires.

Officer Jensen decided to close space on Ellenwood and delivered a front kick right to the area where Ellenwood had his hand in his pocket. He decided to do this as a disruption technique to get Ellenwood's hand out of his pocket and to close space to affect the arrest. He decision was based on the above listed factors and that the K-9 deployment and Taser application were not successful.

(Officer Boothe reports Officer Jensen using the front kick before he deployed his Taser. According to Officer Jensen's and Officer Potter's reports, it occurred after. This orientation of the order of events is extremely common in these types of situation that occur quickly, dynamically, and under very tense conditions.)

At this point, Officer Potter arrived on scene. He heard officers yelling at Ellenwood, stating that they would shoot him. He too was aware of Ellenwood's prior history. He saw a Taser probe in Ellenwood's chest and saw that he was not affected. Officer Potter observed Officer Jensen's kick to Ellenwood and that it had no visible effect. Officer Potter heard Ellenwood state, "That didn't hurt." Officer Potter saw Ellenwood advance towards the officers.

Officer Jensen's dog had now returned to his side. Officer Jensen deployed his K-9 to apprehend Ellenwood and Officer Potter deployed his Taser in probe mode on Ellenwood at about the same time. (See Officer Jensen's K-9 Use of Force for his K-9 apprehension of Ellenwood).

Officer Potter knew at this point:

•There was probable cause to arrest Ellenwood on two counts of DVOPV.

•Ellenwood had not been searched, so it was unknown if he was armed. He was aware of his past history with the police of "suicide by cop" situations and where officers had used force on Ellenwood to little effect. Officer Potter observed that a previous Taser application and a front kick to Ellenwood had no obvious effect.

•Ellenwood was now refusing the officers legal commands to show his hands. Instead, he had his right hand buried into his pants pocket and was now advancing towards the officers.

This combined Taser application and K-9 apprehension was successful in subduing Ellenwood. Officers still had to use body weight and manipulation techniques to get him handcuffed. Ellenwood continued with "that felt good" and "kill me" as they struggled to get him handcuffed. Officer Everly was present and witness for Officer Jensen's kick and K-9 deployment, and Officer Potter's Taser probe deployment, and assited in handcuffing.

I spoke to Ellenwood at the hospital. I observed his injuries which included a K-9 contact to Ellenwood's groin area and two Taser probe applications. I saw that he still had one probe in his chest and another probe in his left index finger. These were both removed by the doctor. When I saw Ellenwood, he had blood over various parts of his body. I could not see the other two

probe injuries, if there were any. Corporal Ennis photographed Ellenwood's injuries.

Ellenwood stated that he behaved the way he did because he wanted the officers to kill him. Ellenwood was very open and cavalier about the event and his past history. He stated he wants to die and has no fear of it.

Ellenwood's behavior and actions, by his own admission, were an attempt to get officers to use deadly force against him. The use of force by Officers Boothe, Jensen, and Potter was reasonable and within policy. They should be commended for their exceptional response to a very dangerous situation that could have reasonably justified the use of deadly force.

Reviewer comment:

I concur with Sgt. King's assessment. Ellenwood has demonstrated in the recent past and again demonstrated in this incident that he is an extreme officer safety risk. Uses of force employed were within policy, and while only minimally effective, were necessary to control Ellenwood.

Reviewer comment:

Officers used the minimum amount of force to take Ellenwood into custody. He was displaying very aggressive behavior to all officers and actually advanced on them at one point. Other use of force options were available to the officers to address Ellenwood's behavior that could have caused him more significant injuries but the Officers chose to not deploy those options at the time. Officers acted appropriately and within policy in taking the suspect into custody.

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On 031713 at approx 0215 hrs I was dispatched to 2427 N Julia on a possible order violation.

I had responded to the address earlier in the evening, see incident #13-84363. On the earlier call the suspect, Ellwood, had been at the residence and in violation of a no contact order. The suspect was also accused of inappropriate touching and comments to the complainant 10 year old daughter.

We had also contacted the suspect last week after he had barricaded himself in his parents residence, and had made several statements that he wanted the police to kill him.

Officers had responded to the suspects parents house several weeks earlier and the suspect had to be subdued with several kinetic energy devices. These impact devices usually have a significant success rate with one application however the suspect was unphased by the applications.

Dispatch advised that the victim, Stephens was on the phone with the suspects family and that they were calling in because she was too scared to call.

I arrived on scene with officer Jensen and his K9. We approached the house and we could hear a male voice. At first we were unable to determine if the voice was coming from the back yard or from inside the unattached garage.

As we got closer we could clearly hear the males voice coming from the backyard. We came up to the corner of the house and I could see the male in the backyard. The male was wearing the same clothing that Stephens had described in the earlier call. The suspect has several large and distinct facial scars, and I was able to determine that this was Ellenwood.

I could see both the males hands and he had a cell phone in his right hand. As we came closer we stepped out and we identified ourselves as police officers. Both myself and officer Jensen were wearing the uniform of the day.

Ellenwood saw us and then immediately pivoted and bladed his body, he placed his right hand into his pants pocket and placed his left hand up in the air at shoulder height with the hand open. Ellenwood's facial expression changed from being what appeared to be calm to looking very angry, his posture changed from being slack to being very rigid. Ellenwood then began to say that he had a gun and that he was going to shoot us. He said that he was going to shoot us several times.

Officer Jensen deployed his K9, see his report. The K9 deployment appeared to be unsuccessful, Ellenwood began to approach officer Jensen. Officer Jensen was able to Keep Ellenwood away from himself and the K9 by pushing him backwards with his foot.

I then deployed my TASER. One dart struck Ellenwood in the upper part of his chest with the second dart striking him in the stomach. Ellenwood reached up and pulled at the wires. The TASER had little to no effect on Ellenwood.

I brought my TASER down and I heard officer Potter behind me and I could then see a red dot on Ellenwood's chest from officer Potter's TASER. Officer Potter deployed his TASER (see his report). The second TASER application made Ellenwood's body stiffen slightly, and then fall to the ground. Ellenwood was making a guttural noise as he was attempting to fight the effects of the TASER. Officer Jensen then deployed his K9 a second time, see his report. I placed my knee onto Ellenwood's stomach with my body weight to keep him on the ground. Ellenwood was quickly recovering from the TASER's effects, he was balling his hands into fist and he was beginning to bring his knees into his chest. I applied a yawara technique with my flashlight to the area below his waist and above his hips, Ellenwood had a reflexive response to the technique which took his body out of the fetal or guarded position. 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began to roll Ellenwood over into a prone positron. He was handcuffed (DL) and searched, incident to arrest.

Ellenwood's demeanor changed instantly and he began to talk in a calm tone.

I stood him up and walked him back to my patrol car. He was placed into the shield of my car. I advised him of his Miranda warnings, and he said that he understood his rights and waived them. He added that he's heard them more times than he can count.

I asked him if he knew we were the police and he said that he did. I asked him why he didn't comply with our commands and he said that he was hoping we would finally kill him.

I asked him about the complaint made by Stephen's about her daughter and he said that he is part Russian and French and that he was just kissing her on the cheek because thats how the French do it. He said that it was just friendly and that there was nothing gross about it.

I askedhimif he knew there was a no contact order between he and Stephens and he said that he did but added that she had called him.

I transported Ellenwood the Deaconess where he had the probes removed. One of the probes had struck him in the index finger of his left hand and the hand had to be numbed to remove it.

The K9 application would require several stitches. When the doctor numbed Ellenwood's scrotum with a large needle, Ellenwood didn't even flinch. He looked down and said, "when should I say ouch"

Ellenwood then added that he just doesn't feel pain, he said that he was arrested for a number of gas station robberies and that he didn't do them for the cash but just for the fun if it.

Ellenwood was medically treated and cleared, Cpl Ennis photographed his injuries. I transported him to the Spokane county jail and he was booked for violation of the no contact order (incident 13-084363), for the second violation of the order and for resisting arrest.

On 031713 at about 0214 hours I responded to 2427 N Julia reference a violation of a DV protection order call. Radio advised that Melvin Ellenwood was calling from 1523 E Pacific stating that his son, Jason Ellenwood, was at 2427 N Julia and that Jason's girlfriend, Deeann Stephens, had called him stating that he was there and she was too scared to call police herself. Radio advised there was a served and valid DV protection order preventing Jason Ellenwood from having any contact whatsoever with Deeann Stephens.

It should be noted that I had already been at 2427 N Julia earlier in my shift on 031613 at about 2358 hours in reference to Deeann Stephens calling police and stating that Jason Ellenwood was at her house. During this incident (cross reference 13-84363) we were unable to locate Jason Ellenwood, but Ofc. Boothe developed probable cause to arrest him for violation of a DV protection order. During this previous incident I learned from radio and other officers that Jason Ellenwood had been involved in a recent standoff with police at 1523 E Pacific where he was taunting police to kill him. During this incident Ellenwood had to be subdued with multiple bean bag rounds in order to overcome his threatening behavior.

In responding to the Julia location for the second time in my shift, I was well informed on Ellenwood's recent history with police and I was going to take extreme caution in my potential contact with him. I arrived at 2427 N Julia at about 0218 hours. I observed Ofc. Boothe arriving at about the same time. I retrieved my K9 partner, Cruz, from my patrol vehicle and placed him on a 3 foot leash. I then told Ofc. Boothe that we should do a perimeter sweep outside of the house prior to knocking in case Ellenwood was outside of the house. As we approached the front of the house, I could hear a male voice talking outside of the house. I couldn't make out the exact location at this time so I walked into an open area in between the garage and house. Once in this area I distinguished that the male voice was coming from the back outside deck.

It was at about this time that I observed a male walk off of the deck, stop and face Ofc. Boothe and I. We were positioned about 10-15 feet from him with a funneled escape route. I immediately recognized the male as Jason Ellenwood because I had viewed his SPURS photograph while enroute to the call. I yelled to Ellenwood, "Spokane Police". I then observed Ellenwood put

his right hand into his right front jeans pocket as if he was retrieving a weapon. I yelled at Ellenwood, "show me your hands or else I am going to send my police dog, he will bite you". Ellenwood stated something along the lines of go ahead. I yelled at Ellenwood again, telling him that if he did not remove his hand from his pocket I was going to send my dog and he was going to bite him.

Ellenwood kept his right hand in his pocket and then began saying, "shoot me". At this point I decided to deploy K9 Cruz for the following reasons. There was PC to arrest Ellenwood for violation of a DV protection order. Ellenwood was presenting the most serious of threats to police in that he was either acting as if he had a deadly weapon or was arming himself with a deadly weapon to harm police. Ellenwood had not been searched and I did not know what was in his possession. The pocket he was reaching into was large enough in that it could have concealed a knife or gun. Ellenwood also presented a serious safety concern for Deeann Stephens, the victim of the DV order violation, in that this was the 2nd time in a brief period that Ellenwood was violating the order and not knowing if he was armed, I did not want to allow him access to Stephens to cause her harm. There was a brief thought in my mind that using lethal force against Ellenwood would be reasonable based on his actions, but I decided to utilize the K9 instead with the hope of preventing any life threatening injuries. Based upon Ellenwood's recent history with law enforcement and his "suicide by cop" pin, I was gambling that the use of a K9 could resolve this situation. Ellenwood was clearly attempting to evade arrest in that he was not complying with commands to remove his hand from his pocket so that he could be taken into custody.

While still standing about 10-15 feet from Ellenwood, I gave K9 Cruz the command to contact Ellenwood and I released his leash. Ellenwood still had his right hand buried in his pocket when K9 Cruz was released. I observed K9 Cruz run around Ellenwood, but no contact was made. K9 Cruz is a new police K9 and it was evident at this moment K9 Cruz was not understanding what he was supposed to do. In other words, the training that K9 Cruz had received up to this point had not established a mental picture for the K9 to understand to relate to this real life scenario. As K9 Cruz was running around in the area between Ellenwood and police (Ofc. Boothe and I), I could still see that Ellenwood had his right hand in his pocket. I then heard Ofc. Boothe who was slightly off to my right deploy his taser, with probes. I observed that the taser application had no effect and Ellenwood remained standing and his right hand remained in his pocket.

I decided to close space and deliver a front kick to the area of Ellenwood's front right jeans pocket in which he had his hand still secreted in. I decided to deploy this technique for the same rationale used in deploying the K9 in addition to the thought that I wanted to use the kick as a technique to disrupt Ellenwood's balance enough so that he had to remove his hand from his pocket so that we could transition into taking him into custody. I delivered the front kick and when it struck the area of Ellenwood's front right jeans pocket, I observed Ellenwood stumble backwards, but he remained on his feet and his right hand remained in his pocket.

At this time I was close enough to Ellenwood in that if he had a weapon he could easily injure me with it. I observed K9 Cruz near me so I grabbed his leash and prepared to place K9 Cruz onto a contact on Ellenwood's leg. At about the same time that I grabbed K9 Cruz' leash, Ofc. Potter who had just arrived on scene, deployed his taser with probes into the front region of Ellenwood. As Ellenwood was being tased by Ofc. Potter I pushed K9 Cruz towards the legs of Ellenwood and gave K9 Cruz the command to contact. My deployment reasoning for this contact had not decreased from my initial deployment rationale. I felt like I was more in danger of being harmed by Ellenwood due to my close proximity and I was more concerned that Ellenwood had the mentality to overcome extreme resistance in that a taser deployment and front kick had not broken his will to resist.

I observed K9 Cruz lunge forward to contact Ellenwood as he was falling backwards to the ground from Ofc. Potter's taser deployment. I still observed that Ellenwood had his right hand in his pocket. I observed K9 Cruz contact Ellenwood on the inside of his upper right thigh. Ellenwood landed on the grass and I began yelling, "let me see your hand". I observed Ellenwood still reaching into his pocket. I observed other officers move in and grab his arms revealing no weapons present. I then verbally outed K9 Cruz from the heel position and he outed immediately. The time duration of the contact was about 5 seconds. I stepped back with K9 Cruz as officers handcuffed Ellenwood. I could hear Ellenwood yelling, "that felt good" and "kill me" as officers were struggling to handcuff him. Ellenwood was searched and no weapons were found on his person.

I observed that Ellenwood had a probe sticking in the area of his sternum and a probe sticking in his left index finger. Ofc. Boothe transported Ellenwood to Deaconess Medical Center. I advised Sgt. King of the uses of force and he responded to Deaconess where I discussed the incident with him in further detail. At Deaconess, Ellenwood's pants were removed to assess and treat his K9 contact. I observed the following injuries; 2 punctures on his inner right upper thigh with slight tearing, raking marks near the 2 punctures and a linear scrape about 1 inch in length in the area between his scrotum and anus. I asked Ellenwood if the K9 had contacted him anywhere else and he said, "no". I did not see any other injuries related to the use of the K9. It should be noted that Ellenwood had dark bruising on his left forearm and when I asked how this injury had occurred he stated he was hurt when wrestling with a friend. Ellenwood was treated by Dr. Sarah Parker. The treatment consisted of cleaning the injured areas, 5 stitches on one of punctures and 2 stitches on the other puncture.

While at the hospital, Cpl. Ennis responded and photographed all of Ellenwood's injuries. I also had time at the hospital to ask Ellenwood if he had heard my K9 warning prior to deploying the K9 and he said, "yes". I asked him why he did not comply and remove his hand from his pocket and he stated, "I didn't care". I responded with why and Ellenwood said, "I wanted you to kill me". I told Ellenwood that we did not want to kill him and he said, "I wanted to die". Ellenwood actually became very cooperative at the hospital and at one point said, "you did what you had to do". Ellenwood also thanked us in the end for not killing him.

On 03-17-13 at 0214, Officer Everly and I were working as a two man unit. We responded to 2427 N. Julia for a DVOPV. The notes in the call said suspect, Jason Ellenwood was at the location. We had been at the same address earlier in the night when Ellenwood had been at the location and had sexually assaulted a 10 year old female. Refer to Officer Boothe's report for that incident #13-84363 for details. On this call Ellenwood left and we did not find him.

Ellenwood has a recent history of being suicidal and wanting suicide by police. Officers had a stand off with him on 03-10-13 when he was suicidal and was supposed to be armed with a knife, and he admitted to being armed with a handgun.

When we arrived I parked a couple houses away. As we were walking up to the house Officers Boothe and K9 Officer Jensen were already on scene. I heard them yelling and it appeared they were contacting Ellenwood. As I ran up I heard one of them yell that they would shoot him. As we ran up to the house, I could see between the house and garage. I saw them in the back yard. As I ran up I saw Ellenwood standing facing Officer's Boothe and Jensen. They were telling Ellenwood to get on the ground. I also was that Ellenwood had his right hand in his pants pocket. Ellenwood was not listening to their commands to get down on the ground. I saw there was a taser probe in Ellenwood's chest area. I did not hear the taser being activated and Ellenwood was not being effected by it. We continued to order Ellenwood to get on the ground and he then stepped forward to push him back. Ellenwood immediately said, "that didn't hurt". He looked like he was going to advance at us again. It was obvious he was not going to comply with our commands and wanted a physical confrontation.

I then advised the Officers and Ellenwood I was going to deploy my taser. I aimed my taser at his chest area and deployed the darts hitting Ellenwood in the chest with both darts. He tensed up and let out a verbal yell. I could see the taser was being effective and Ellenwood fell to the ground on his back. I then saw Officer Jensen's K9 contact Ellenwood on the upper thigh area. We were ordering Ellenwood to roll over onto his stomach. I had put my taser onto the ground to help control and handcuff Ellenwood. We had not searched Ellenwood for weapons yet and did not know if he was armed or not. I then bent over to pick up my taser and Officer's had rolled Ellenwood over. At this time he had his hands under his body. Ellenwood then put his right arm out as I was focusing

on his right side. I then grabbed his arm and helped handcuff him.

This incident was tense uncertain and rapidly evovling. This was based on Ellenwood's recent history of being suicidal, admitting to having a handgun, expressing suicide by police, and seeing Ellenwood with his right hand in his pocket. From the time I joined Officers in the back yard to the time Ellenwood was handcuffed was about 10 seconds.

I collected the taser cartridges and later booked them into property.

Ellenwood was transported to Deaconess hospital prior to being booked into jail.

Sgt. King was notified of our use of force.

On the listed date and time Officer Potter and I were working in a two man car. We responded to 2427 N. Julia in reference to a prior order violation/sex offense. Radio advised the suspect, Jason Ellenwood had returned. Probable Cause had been established to arrest Ellenwood for the order violation from the prior call.

On 3/10/13 I dealt with Ellenwood. During a standoff in his parents house Ellenwood told me he wanted the police to shoot him. He was very adamant about that. During that incident Ellenwood claimed to armed with a .45, but according to his parents they thought he had a knife. From the call I learned Ellenwood suffers from mental illness and is an alcoholic.

Upon our arrival on scene we parked several houses to the south of 2427 N. Julia. After I exited the patrol car I began to hear yelling and heard something to the effect of "you are going to get shot." The yelling was coming from the backyard of 2427 N. Julia.

I ran to the house and as I looked through the walkway from the front to back yard I could see Officers Jensen and Boothe with their backs to me and Ellenwood facing them. I heard a frenzy of commands given to Ellenwood to get on the ground. I noted Ellenwood's demeanor was eerily calm. Ellenwood didn't comply with the commands, rather he advanced the officers. I saw Officer Jensen

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deliver a front kick to Ellenwood. Ellenwood took the strike and it seemed that it had little to no effect. During this both Officer Potter and I were running up to their position to assist. I could see what looked like Taser dart wires coming from Ellenwood's body. Because of the information I knew about Ellenwood, and the fact he was non compliant I drew my Taser. Right before I was able to deploy it, Officer Potter deployed his Taser. I saw Ellenwood was struck by both darts because he stiffened up and fell to the ground. I have seen multiple people tased before and it incapacitated them. Ellenwood was on the ground on his back I saw Officer Jensen's K9 partner contact him in the lower extremities. I was concerned that Ellenwood could still access a weapon as he was on his back and had free access to his pockets/waistband. He hadn't been searched. As I moved to the ground to assist in controlling/handcuffing Ellenwood, he rolled to his stomach. I was able to secure his left wrist. From that point we were able to handcuff Ellenwood.

Ellenwood's demeanor was still calm. He didn't exhibit any signs of being injured or being in pain. From my experience his demeanor was extremely odd for a person who just been tased and contacted by a K9.

This ended my involvement in this incident.




