Incident:

This report is to review a Use of Force incident that occurred on the evening of 5/16/13 at The New Washington Apartments 327 W. 2nd Avenue, Apt. #A5. It involved a Use of Force by Officer J. Erickson upon citizen Kevin Gabriel. Officers Erickson and J. Christensen responded to the New Washington for a violation of at the request of manager, Markis Turner. Turner is the petitioner on a served antiharassment order against Gabriel. Ofc. Christensen was a witness to the use of force as he was assisting Ofc. Erickson.

Summary of Incident:

Officers interviewed the victim and were directed to Gabriel's apartment. They were told Gabriel had a machete in his apartment. Gabriel was talked to through the open doorway of his apartment and he made statements confirming the violation of the order. He did not want officers to come into his apartment. Officers stated they coaxed Gabriel int stepping into the common hallway at which point Ofc. Erickson grabbed ahold of Gabriel's arm and told him he was under arrest. Gabriel pulled back into his apartment with Ofc. Erickson holding on. He struggled hard against Ofc. Erickson, was swearing and acting aggressively. Ofc. Erickson and Gabriel down onto the bed in the room. Gabriel hit his head on one of the many items lined up along the far side of the bed. Ofc. Erickson told him repeatedly that he was under arrest. Gabriel rapidly moved his right fist towards Ofc. Erickson trying to hit him. Ofc. Erickson applied two elbow strikes and one open palm strike to Gabriel's face. He and Ofc. Christensen were able to somewaht control Gabriel. They lost some control and Gabriel's aggression elevated. Gabriel began to pull his arm under himself. Ofc. Erickson applied a Neck Restraint Control Hold. They were able to handcuff Gabriel. He never lost consciousness.

Gabriel sustained a bleeding approximate 3" cut on the back of his head from striking it when they weere falling onto the bed. Medics treated him. The cut was shallow and did not require stitches. While being treated Gabriel said he "sorry for coming at the officers." Cpl. Kakuda photographed Gabriel's injury and the apartment.

I, Sgt. Gilmore, responded to assist as officers were radioing for help. Upon arrival, Gabriel was cuffed. I observed the very tight quarters in the small apartment. I saw blood on the bed. I saw a number of knives in an open drawer and basket within a few feet of the location of the struggle. I observed what appeared to be a minor injury on Gabriel's head. There were no other witnesses to the force used. I took statements from both officers.

At jail, I interviewed Gabriel. He said he went to the office to get a rent receipt but was refused so went back to his apartment. Officers came and talked to him at his door. They cam in and tackled him. he denied going into the hall. They mentioned the Order, but never told him he was under arrest. He said he doesn't like people in his apartment. he refused to give further statements. He said aside from the cut to the head he also sustained a sore left shoulder, but I was the first person he told. Jail staff was notified.

Conclusion:

In reviewing the use of force circumstances, I noted:

- Officers were attempting to arrest suspect Gabriel for a violation of an antiharassment order and he was remaining in the same building as the victim.
- Gabriel had pulled Ofc. Erickson into his very small one room apartment that was very cluttered. Residences generally have kitchen knives in them and this one had several kitchen knives in the open. Gabriel was reported to have a machete in the apartment.
- Gabriel was refusing to comply with arrest as he was struggling hard, swearing and trying to strike officers.

Considering the circumstances above and the types of force used by Ofc. Erickson (level 2 strikes and neck restraint control hold) to overcome resistance and protect from assaultive behavior, it appears Ofc. Erickson's actions were reasonable in this situation. His use of force appears to be within police policies outlined in Policy 300 as "An officer may use force which reasonably appears to be necessary to effect an arrest if, after notice of the intention to arrest the person, he/she either flees or forcibly resists."

Reviewer comment:

Officers attempted to arrest a suspect for violating an anti-harassment order. He was advised that he was under arrest and an officer grabbed his arm (which was outside the threshold to his apartment). The suspect violently pulled against the officer and actually pulled the officer into the apartment. He became very angry and told officers that he was not going to be arrested. As the officer was trying to control the suspect, they fell onto a bed among much clutter in the very small apartment. The suspect began trying to punch the officer and yell obscenities at him. The suspect was under arrest and unlawfully, violently resisting officers' attempts to take him into custody. Two elbow strikes and an open palm to the face helped bring him under control, but not in a way where he could be handcuffed. In positioning the suspect so he could be handcuffed, some control was lost and the suspect gained confidence in his fight against the officers. Only after a neck restraint control hold were officers able to handcuff the suspect. The suspect was treated for his injuries and apologized to the officers for "coming at them". The officer involved used reasonable force given the nature of the resistance that he faced. The use of force was within departemental policy and training.



On 05/16/13 at 2133 hours Ofc. Christensen #671 and I responded to 327 W. 2nd, Spokane, WA to contact the victim/complainant, Markis Turner, reference a violation of a civil Anti-Harassment Order violation that just occurred. Turner was reporting that another resident of the building (and Respondent on the order), Kevin Gabriel, had just contacted him. Turner advised that Gabriel kept a machete in his apartment. Radio sent me an electronic copy of the order on my email, and I read the order. The order restricted Gabriel from "coming near or having any contact or conversation" with Turner. The order showed to have been served on Gabriel, and showed to be valid (Case # 13720230).

Upon arriving on scene, I contacted Turner in the office of the building. Turner was the night manager for the building. He said that at approximately 2 minutes before he called (2125 hours) he was in the office, working as the manager. He said Gabriel walked from his apartment (#A5), straight to the office. He said Gabriel asked Turner where "Ray" was (Ray Gandee, the day manager for the building; who also had an Anti-Harassment Order against Gabriel). He said he shut the door to the office, to keep Gabriel away from him, and called 911. He said Gabriel had been told that if he needed anything reference the building or his living situation, he needed to get a hold of the owner of the building. He said Gabriel had been given the owner's phone number, and had permission to call the owner 24 hours a day. I asked Turner where Gabriel was, and he told me he was in his (Gabriel's) room (#A5).

We approached Gabriel's room. The door to the room from the hallway was open. As I neared the opening, I saw Gabriel laying on his bed inside. He saw me and angrily asked, "What do you want?" I asked Gabriel if I could come into the apartment to talk with him. He stated that he did not want me in his apartment. I asked him why he contacted Turner. He said that he wanted a receipt. I asked him why he contacted Turner while having the order restricting him from doing that. Gabriel said, "I just wanted a damn receipt, it's not like I threatened him."

Based on the information available, I determined I had PC for the arrest of Gabriel for violating the order. I asked Gabriel to show me where this all happened at, and backed away from

the door. Gabriel approached, while yelling, "Why, where did they say it happened?" He stepped into the hallway. I grabbed onto Gabriel's right arm (which was outside of the threshold), and told him he was under arrest. Gabriel retracted his right arm in towards his body, and stepped back into his apartment (with me still holding onto his arm). Gabriel was yelling at me, "You mother fucker!" His facial expression was one of extreme anger and aggression. He was attempting to free his right arm, and was able to bring it by his head. I was restraining his right arm with my left arm, and I used Gabriel's momentum to push him off of balance to better control him. He continued to struggle against me and Ofc. Christensen had moved to his left side, attempting to control that arm (see his additional). Gabriel and I fell back onto his bed, and his head hit one of the various items that was stored near the bed. It should be noted that the small apartment and the large amount of clutter in it, made for very tight quarters to operate. I told him several more times that he was under arrest; to which he responded that he was not under arrest. Gabriel was still angrily yelling obscenities at me, and began rapidly jarring his right fist towards me in an attempt to strike me (though I was keeping that from occurring by holding onto that arm with my left hand). I applied 2 right elbow strikes and an open palmed strike to Gabriel's face. Gabriel's efforts slowed, and I was able to get his right arm locked behind his back (though I was still face-to-face with him on the bed). Ofc. Christensen said he had also secured Gabriel's left arm.

We were still unable to handcuff Gabriel due to our position, and we agreed to move him onto the floor. We moved Gabriel into a proned position onto the floor, but in the transition (mainly due to the confined area we were working in), lost some of the control of him. Gabriel's aggressive demeanor elevated again, and he began to twist his upper body and drag his right hand under him. I applied a Neck Restraint to Gabriel. Gabriel relaxed his arms, and we were able to get him handcuffed (DL and PS). Gabriel never lost consciousness.

Gabriel had an open cut on the back of his head that was approximately 3" in length. He had no other apparent injury. We requested medics for Gabriel. They responded and cleaned up the cut, saying it did not require stitches. The cut stopped bleeding. Gabriel said he was "sorry for coming at the officers".

Cpl. Kakuda responded for photos of the scene, and Sgt. Gilmore responded for the Use of Force.

We transported Gabriel to jail where he was booked on the order violation and Resisting Arrest.

On 05/16/2013, at about 2146 hours, Officer Erickson and I responded to 327 and 1/2 W 2nd reference a Civil Anti Harassment Order Violation.

The complainant Turner called into report he had a Civil Anti Harassment Order protecting him from Kevin Gabriel. He said Ray Gandee also has a Civil Anti Harassment Order against Gabriel as well. Turner advised Gabriel came up to him and asked him where Ray was.

Radio was advised there was a valid Temporary Anti-Harassment Protection Order listing Turner as the petitioner and Gabriel as the respondent. Officer Erickson brought up a copy of the order on our computer. The order number is 13720230 and signed by Judge Patty Walker on 05/09/2013. The order states that Gabriel is not to be near (within 20 feet) or have any contact with Turner. It also states that the petitioner is a manger at the above complex, respondent will not contact the petitioner for any reason but will direct all inquiries regarding housing issues to another manager or to whomever the owners direct him to address housing inquiries. The order also includes the respondent can not be with in 20 feet of the managers office when the petitioner is working. See attached copy of order.

Once on-scene we spoke to Turner who said he was in the managers office. Gabriel came up and asked him where Ray was. Turner said he did not say anything to Gabriel he just shut and locked the managers office door and called police. Turner and Ray advised that Gabriel is violent to staff, police and MHP. They stated that Gabriel is known to have a machete in his room.

Officer Erickson and I went to Gabriel's room A15. The door was partially open. I could see Gabriel sitting on his bed in the room. Officer Erickson made verbal contact and asked if we could step inside and talk to him. He said, "No." He said, "What do you want." "What did they say." Gabriel was becoming agitated. Officer Erickson continued to talk with Gabriel. Officer Erickson told Gabriel he could not hear him over the pop machine and the radio. Officer Erickson stepped away from his door and started to point to the manager's office. He asked him to show him where he was at down by the office. Gabriel said, "I just went down there and asked where Ray was." "I wanted to get a receipt." At this time Gabriel stepped out into the hallway partially and started to point down the hall with his right arm towards the managers office. At this time Officer Erickson grabbed his right arm and told him he was under arrest for Violating the Order. Gabriel immediately pulled his arm back and started

to pull officer Erickson back into the apartment. The apartment was about eight by twelve feet and was very congested inside. Officer Erickson appeared to use Gabriel's body weight and pushed him back on to his bed. Gabriel went down onto the bed on his back. I could see that his head hit some glass items beside his bed. Officer Erickson was on top of Gabriel trying to get control of his right arm. At this point I was able to move up to the bed and take a hold of Gabriel's left arm. Gabriel continued to try and pull his arm away from me and he was tensing his body. I told Gabriel several times he was under arrest and to stop resisting. We were able to then roll Gabriel over onto his stomach. Once on his stomach Gabriel continued to try and pull his arm away from me. Officer Erickson was trying to control Gabriel's upper body. Officer Erickson said to move Gabriel onto the floor. We then pulled him onto the floor to try and get control of his arms. Gabriel continued to tense his muscles and try and pull away. I was then able to take control of his left arm and handcuff his hand. A short time later we were able to get his right arm and handcuff it. Inside the apartment were several large knives that were a concern to our safety.

I could see that Gabriel was bleeding from the back of his head. I believe this is where he struck his head when they first went to the bed. I looked at his bed. I could see fresh blood on the side of his bed and sheets. Medics were called to treat him. Cpl Kakuda responded and took photos. Sgt Gilmore was informed of the call and also responded.

We transported Gabriel to jail and booked him for a Civil Court Order Violation and Resisting Arrest.

I, Sgt. Gilmore, responded to the New Washington Apartments. to assist as officers were radioing for help. Upon arrival, Gabriel was cuffed. He was still on the floor in his apartment. I observed the very tight quarters in the small apartment. Officers carried him out into the common hallway to be treated by medics who were summoned to treat Gabriel. I saw blood on the bed. I saw a number of knives in an open drawer and basket within a few feet of the location of the struggle. I observed what appeared to be a minor injury on Gabriel's head. There were no citizen witnesses to the force used. Officers apprised me of the situation. See their reports for information.

I interviewed Gabriel at jail for an administrative review because of the injuries. He said aside from the cut to the head he also sustained a sore left shoulder, but I was the first person he told. Jail staff was notified.
