Summary:

Incident:

On 5/17/13 at approximately 0148 hours SPD officers responded to a reported Stalking call at 918 S. Napa. The named suspect Shane Wilson was reportedly there in violation of an Order and displaying a gun. Responding officers ended up in a Vehicle Pursuit with Wilson which resulted in Collisions and the Use of Force resulting in injuries to Wilson. Officers involved in the Use of Force were J. Erickson, J. Christensen and S. Arredondo. There were no officer or citizen witnesses.

Summary of Incident:

Nicole Fowler reported that her ex-boyfriend was outside of her residence in Violation of an Order. As officers were responding she provided further information that Wilson was banging on her windows and she saw him with a handgun. It was later learned that she lied about seeing Wilson with a gun. Ofcs. Erickson and Christensen, a 2-person unit, and Ofc. S. Arredondo arrived at the residence and observed the described suspect vehicle, a Jeep Liberty, parked outside of the residence. Officers attempted to initiate contact with the vehicle which was occupied by a male, Wilson. The vehicle fled and a high speed pursuit ensued. The pursuit lasted from approximately 0152 hours to 0202 hours and covered several miles ending only when the suspect vehicle became disabled after crashing on ATV trails on Beacon Hill near Esmeralda Golf Course (address of Esmeralda is 3933 E. Courtland).

After crashing, Wilson ran from the vehicle. He was chased on foot by Ofcs. Christensen, Erickson and S. Arredondo. All officers were ordering Wilson to stop and telling him he was under arrest. All officers stated they were concerned that Wilson had a firearm. Ofc. Christensen caught up to Wilson first and struck him in the upper body with both hands knocking him down. He began to fight with Wilson. Ofcs. Erickson and S. Arredondo caught up and started to assist and were fighting with and to control Wilson. All Officers said Wilson kept fighting them by not complying with orders, kicking his legs and swinging his arms. Also, his

hands kept moving towards his waist area and there was concern he was accessing a firearm. Ofc. Christensen's force against Wilson included: striking in the chest and shoulder to knock him down, two knee strikes to the back, two level 2 strikes to the back, and neck restraint control hold that did not render Wilson unconscious.

Ofc. Erickson's force against Wilson included: knee strike to the shoulder that glanced off and impacted the face and three open palm strikes to the face.

Ofc. S. Arredondo's force against Wilson included: numerous knee strikes to the thigh and several palm strikes to the back and right side.

Officers were eventually able to control and handcuff Wilson. Wilson exhibited some possible signs of excited delirium. He sustained facial contusions, swollen and bloodied nose, claim of sore neck, claim of broken teeth and claim of dislocated shoulder. He was treated by medics at the scene and taken to Sacred Heart Hospital where he was treated for a few hours and released to police at which time he was booked into jail.

Charges ended up being Attempting to Elude and Possession of Heroin that was located incident to arrest. There was not a valid order violation and the complainant lied about seeing Wilson with a gun. She was cited for False Statement. Later that morning the vehicle driven by Wilson was reported stolen.

Aside from minor abrasions, Ofc. S. Arredondo sustained a sore wrist and Ofc. Christensen sustained a sore and possibly damaged shoulder during the Apprehension of Wilson. Other officers complained of soreness from the vehicle pursuit.

Cpl. Bartlett took photographs of the scene including the damaged vehicles and the injuries to Wilson's face.

I, Sgt. Gilmore, interviewed the three involved officers and obtained statements regarding their use of force. I have reviewed their reports and the information is consistent with the information provided to me verbally at the scene. On the evening of 5/17/13, I interviewed Wilson at Jail. He said he went to Fowler's residence when summoned by her. He denied having a gun. He fled after seeing the police cars because he didn't want to get arrested as he is out on bond. He drove at speeds up t about 70 MPH while fleeing. After crashing the car and running, Wilson said he tripped and fell on his own. He denied any resistance after this point and officers beat him up by kicking him in the face, striking him in the face many times for no reason and choking him to unconsciousness. The officers did tell him repeatedly to quit resisting. He refused to sign a medical information release form and refused to speak to me further to clarify anything.

Conclusion:

During the course of evaluating the force used as described by the officers above, I noted:

- Officers were attempting to investigate crime of Violation of a Protection Order and Attempt to Elude a Police Vehicle.
- Wilson was large in stature (5'11" and 240 pounds). He was reportedly armed with a handgun. Against officers orders he moved his hands towards his waist which is a common location to keep a handgun. The location of apprehension was very dark so officers couldn't see very well what may have been concealed in Wilson's clothing.
- Wilson went to extreme lengths to resist officers' efforts to apprehend him by engaging in the high speed pursuit including off road, refusing all commands to stop fleeing and stop resisting, and engaging in assaultive behavior against officers by struggling, kicking and swinging his arms at officers.

There are no witnesses that back up Wilson's account of events at the apprehension site. All three officers were interviewed at the scene separately a short time after the incident and all of their statements were consistent in their description of the type of resistance and assaultive behavior being offered by Wilson. Given the level of potential danger presented to the officers given the report of a firearm and the assaultive behavior, their described actions appeared to be reasonable tactics to attempt to bring Wilson under control and arrest him. The apparent injuries to Wilson appear to be consistent with the described tactics used against him. Policy 300.3.1 regarding use of force states, "An officer may use force which reasonably appears to be necessary to effect an arrest if, after notice of the intention to arrest the person, he/she either flees or forcibly resists." The officers' actions and force used appeared to be reasonable, effective and consistent with Policy.

Reviewer comment:

The officers involved were trying to apprehend what had been reported as a DVOPV suspect, armed with a handgun. After a lengthy and physically demanding vehicle pursuit, the officers chased the suspect on foot and then fought with him to take him into custody. Along with possibly being armed, the suspect kept reaching for his waistband (a common place to hide a firearm or other weapons) and he attempted to assault the officers by swinging his arms at them and kicking at them with his legs. The three officers all used reasonable tactics to take the suspect into custody, beginning with the push to the ground. After that and multiple verbal commands that he was under arrest and to stop fighting/resisting, the suspect continued to resist arrest by swinging arms and kicking his legs. Officers tactics ranged from knee and open palm strikes to an unsuccessful attempt at a neck restraint control hold. Their use of these tactics were successful in that they slowly took the fight out of the suspect to the point that he could be taken into custody. Officers immediately recognized the signs of possible excited delirium and requested medics and took steps to mitigate the fights effects on the suspect.

I find that all three officers acted reasonably and within policy while taking this suspect into custody.

Reviewer comment:

The suspect refused to comply with officers at every step during their attempt to stop him both with the patrol vehicles and then during the foot pursuit. They had every reason to believe that the suspect was armed based on the victim's statement. Additionally, his behavior would lead the officers to believe that he was armed and assaultive. Officers' use of force was reasonable and within policy considering the totalilty of the circumstances.

On 05-17-13 at about 0151hrs, I responded to 918 S Napa reference a possible stalking, DVOPV incident.

According to the c/v Nicole Fowler, she was requesting police respond as the father of her child (Shane Wilson) was parked in front of her residence. She said that she has an NCO against him.

Prior to arriving on scene, dispatch advised that Wilson was currently the respondent with two different subjects however, I did not see the complainant as one of the protected subjects. Nicole called back a second time requesting an ETA as Wilson was still parked in front of her residence in a silver suv.

We requested that dispatch re contact Nicole and see if Wilson was still there. She advised that he was banging on the windows and had displayed a gun.

As we arrived on scene, Officers Erickson and Christensen pulled up right in front of the silver Jeep Liberty #8 and spotted lighted the male subject who was sitting in the drivers seat. The male driver(Wilson) bent forward and appeared that he was trying to grab something. He instead started the Jeep up, put it into reverse and back up a few feet. He then made an u-turn and took off at a high rate of speed w/b on 10th.

I assumed the lead car in the pursuit driving a fully marked car(388) and wearing the uniform of the day. I immediately activated my emergency light and sirens attempting to stop the Jeep Liberty. We continued w/b on 10th then n/b on Helena before turning e/b on 9th. We continued down around the s/curve at Altamont with speeds between 40-70mph as the driver ran both red flashing lights at 2nd

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& 3rd before turning e/b on Sprague from Altamont.

We continued e/b on Sprague before turning n/b on Freya. Speeds were between 40-80mph as he travelled n/b on Freya. Officer Baldwin attempted to deploy spikes at Trent/Freya but the Jeep was able to avoid the spikes and ran the red light at this intersection. He continued n/b running the red light at Mission/Greene with speeds between 40-80mph before he made a right hand turn e/b on Jackson from Greene. He continued e/b on Jackson reaching speeds of 40mph before turning n/b on Freya. He continued n/b on Freya before turning e/b on Euclid reaching speeds of 60mph before turning n/b entering Minnehaha Park.

Once we entered the park we continued up the steep hill travelling over rough terrain for 1/4 mile. There were large boulders and hills everywhere as we travelled on dirt roads. The terrain was extremely rough which caused my patrol car to bounce off the ground numerous times causing possible under carriage damage. We travelled another 1/4 mile before the suspect hit a jersey barrier that was blocking access out or into the park on the west side of Minnehaha. The suspect attempted to drive over the cement barrier but instead hit a tree and the right side of the barrier causing extensive damage to his front right tire and front bumper. He temporarily lost control of his car and slammed into a tree. He exited his vehicle ignoring my orders to stop. He took off running down the hill through the brush in an attempt to get away. Officers Erickson, Christensen and myself gave chase to the suspect repeatedly yelling at the male to stop.

With the information that was provided, it was very possible that Wilson was armed and was doing everything in his power to avoid being contacted by the police. After a short foot pursuit, Officer Christensen was able to catch Wilson just east of the Esmerelda parking lot. Within 10 seconds, Officer Erickson and myself were able to assist Officer Christensen who was laying on the ground attempting to detain Wilson. A struggle ensued with all three of us attempting to place Wilson in handcuffs. He was refusing to follow verbal commands and was fighting to get free. He had both of his hands near his waist band as officer Christensen placed a neck restraint hold on Wilson. I approached Wilson and attempted to control his legs. He was kicking his legs around and refusing to release his arms. I applied numerous knee strikes to his thigh area and applied several palm. strikes to his back and right side of his torso. With each strike I yelled out to quit fighting and release his arms/hands.

As Officer Christensen was applying the neck restraint Wilson was losing some of his will. The fight continued for a bit before we were able to secure both his arms and place him in handcuffs. I did noticed that Officer Christensen had blood all over his hands and Wilson face was covered in blood. It appeared that his nose was bleeding and he had road rash on his face which was consistent with the altercation.

Once Wilson was secure, I advised Officer Erickson to roll him on his side. It appeared that he was having some difficulties breathing and appeared to have some purplish coloring. We requested

medics to come check him out. He was later transported to SHMC via AMR to be medically cleared as I had pc to arrest him for attempting to Elude and resisting arrest.

Officer McVay later advised me that he also had pc to arrest Wilson for PCS(Heroin). He located the substance while at the hospital waiting for Wilson to be medically cleared to be booked into jail.

Officer Winters later contacted the complainant(Nicole) and determined there was no pc for the DVOPV. He also learned that Nicole Fowler had actually lied about seeing Wilson having a gun. She only said he had a gun so police would respond faster.

After interviewing Fowler, he determined there was pc to charge her with making a false and misleading statement. She was later cited and released.(See his rpt for more details)

Wilson's vehicle was later impounded for eluding after photos were taking of the damaged his vehicle sustained during the pursuit.

Photos were also taken of his injuries he sustained while fighting with SPD Officers.

It should be noted that during the pursuit, traffic was very minimal and roads were bare and dry.

On 05/17/13 at 0143 hours Ofc. Christensen #671 and I responded to 918 S. Napa, Spokane, WA on the report of a male in a silver SUV (Jeep Liberty, WA lic. #8 at that location, stalking the complainant. The call reported that the female had a court order against the male. The male was identified by the complainant as Shane Wilson. The complainant said Wilson was the father of her son. I attempted to call the complainant back to see if the male was still there, but only got voicemail. Radio re-established contact with the complainant several moments later. We were just arriving on scene when Radio relayed that the complainant was reporting that Wilson was banging on the windows to the house, and had a gun.

We turned onto S/B Napa from E/B 9th, and saw a silver Jeep Liberty parked on the west side of Napa, facing N/B. The vehicle was in front of 918 S. Napa. Ofc. Christensen and I shined the patrol vehicle's spotlights onto the vehicle. A WM (later ID'd as Wilson) looked at us, and had a surprised/panicked look on his face. He rapidly backed the vehicle up for a short distance, then flipped a 'U-turn' (into the yard on the east side of the street), and proceeded S/B at a high rate of speed. Ofc. Christensen and I were in the police uniform of the day in a fully-marked patrol vehicle (#375).

The suspect vehicle turned W/B onto 10th, accelerated to a high rate of speed, and turned N/B on Helena. The vehicle rapidly accelerated and turned E/B onto 9th. The vehicle continued E/B on 9th negotiated the "S" turns at North Altamont Blvd., and proceeded down the hill (N/B) on Altamont. The vehicle reached speeds of 70 mph, slowed to 40 mph through the flashing red lights at 2nd and 3rd Aves. The vehicle turned E/B on Sprague, and accelerated to approximately 80 mph. The vehicle turned N/B onto Freya and accelerated to 80 mph. Ofc. Baldwin attempted to apply spike strips to the vehicle at Trent and Freya. The vehicle slowed to 60 mph and ran the red light at Greene and Mission. The vehicle continued N/B at 80 mph. The vehicle turned E/B on Jackson, and accelerated to 40 mph. The vehicle turned N/B on Freya, accelerated to 70 mph. The vehicle turned E/B on Euclid, and accelerated to 60 mph. The vehicle turned N/B into Minnehaha Park.

It should be noted that throughout the pursuit, traffic varied between non-existent to very light, and the roads were bare and dry.

The vehicle traveled into Minnehaha Park, and to the dirt road to the north and west. The vehicle traveled on the road until it turned into a narrow "jeep trail". The vehicle continued on the trail at a high rate of speed for another 1/4 of a mile, before crashing into a jersey barrier and tree, and hitting another tree down the hill (coming to a rest). Wilson immediately ran from the driver's side of the vehicle, to the west (away from us). I yelled at Wilson, "Stop! Police!" several times. I chased after Wilson on foot.

Ofc. Christensen was chasing after Wilson on foot, just north of us, and caught up to Wilson first (see his additional), approximately 100 feet west of where he left the Jeep. I was unable to see this initial contact due to being blocked from the trees. I continued running and saw Ofc. Christensen wrestling on the ground with the male. Ofc. Christensen was yelling at Wilson that he was under arrest and to stop fighting. I yelled at Wilson that he was under arrest. Wilson was swinging his arms and kicking his legs, violently. I approached Wilson and began applying a knee strike to Wilson's right upper-body/shoulder. The strike glanced off of his shoulder, and a majority of the force was applied to Wilson's face. Wilson was swinging his arms and kicking his feet at me. He was also bringing his hands down towards his waistband, which was concerning due to the information about him being armed. I applied an open-hand strike to his face. I was yelling at Wilson to stop fighting and to quit resisting several times (as were Orc. Arredondo and Ofc. Christensen), but he continued to fight and swing his arms at us. I applied 2 more open-hand strikes to Wilson's face, and Ofc. Christensen applied a Neck Restraint. Wilson's fighting slowed, and we were able to get him handcuffed (though he continued to resist arrest, his assaultive behavior stopped). We patted him for weapons, but only found a knife (no gun), I asked Wilson where the gun was and he said he didn't have one.

Wilson's breathing slowed, and we were worried about possible Excited Delirium (extended fight, large belly, possible drugs on board), and requested medics respond. We positioned Wilson on his side, and he began breathing more regularly. Wilson had a contusion near the outside of his right eye area, discoloration on his nose, and a bleeding 2" in diameter abrasion on his head. He also said his neck was sore. Medics responded and transported Wilson SHMC for evaluation/treatment. Ofc. C. Jones rode in the ambulance with Wilson.

Sgt. Gilmore evaluated the Use of Force.

Ofc. Winters contacted the complainant, Nicole Fowler, and determined there was no PC for a Stalking or DVOPV arrest of Wilson (see his additional).

Based on the information available, we determined we had PC for the arrest of Wilson for Attempt to Elude.

Ofc. McVay located a baggie of heroin in the cigarette box that was removed from Wilson's right, front pants pocket (see his additional).

On 05/17/2013, at about 0151 hours, Officer Erickson and I responded to 918 N Napa reference a Stalking call.

The complainant Nicole Fowler called 911 to report a silver suv was outside of her house who had been stalking her and she has an order against him. She said the male in the vehicle was a Shane Wilson She went onto say that Shane is the father of her son. Radio advised Shane had a restraining order with Jonathan Brittnie and Kathleen Fowler.

While enroute Officer Erickson tried to call the complainant back to get further information, but only got voice mail.

Just before we arrived on-scene radio advised the complainant said the male keeps getting in and out of the car and bangs on her windows. The complainant also said she saw the suspect with a gun.

Officer Erickson and I turned S/B onto Napa from 9th. I could see a silver suv parked on the West side of the street. As I pulled up I put my spotlight on the vehicle. I then saw a W/M sitting in the driver's seat. We were driving vehicle 375, which was a full marked police car and we were both wearing the uniform of the day. Officer Arredondo pulled up beside me on my driver's side in vehicle 388 which is also a fully marked police car. I advised radio to restrict the channel do to the report of the male having a gun. I could see the male driver's eyes get really big and the vehicle lurched backwards. The vehicle then made a u-turn driving up and over the sidewalk and through the front yard of a residence. The vehicle (WA license #8 accelerated and drove S/B on Napa and then W/B on 10th. I then activated my emergency lights and siren. At Helena the vehicle went N/B and then E/B on 9th. The vehicle accelerated to about 60 mph in a 30 mph zone. We continued to the S-curves of Altamont where the vehicle slowed to about 40 mph. The vehicle then accelerated N/B on Altamont to about 70 mph in a 30 mph zone. The vehicle slowed to about 30 mph and ran the red lights at 3rd/Altamont and 2nd/Altamont and continued N/B to Sprague. Then vehicle then turned E/B on Sprague where he accelerated to 70 mph in a 30 mph zone.

I asked Officer Erickson to get permission from a supervisor to attempted a PIT over 40 mph. Permission was granted by Sgt Gilmore.

The vehicle continued N/B on Freya at about 80 mph in a 30 mph zone. Traffic was light and pulling to the right. Officer Baldwin advised he had spikes at Trent/Freya. The vehicle continued past the spike with out hitting them. The vehicle continued to Mission and Greene where he slowed to 40 mph and went through the red light. The vehicle accelerated back to 80 mph. At Jackson the vehicle turned E/B and drove up into a yard. The vehicle continued to Freya and went N/B where he accelerated to 70 mph. The vehicle then turned E/B onto Euclid. The vehicle again accelerated to 60 mph and continued to Havana where he turned N/B up Havana into Minnehaha park. We continued up the hill side on dirt roads and through non road areas. We went for about a half a mile hitting several rocks and trees on the underside of the vehicle.

The vehicle then hit a tree and a jersey barrier and continued over them and into another tree where he got out and ran. I ran to the North of the vehicle to try and cut off the male who ran to the west. We ran for about 25 yards to the east end of Esmerelda Golf Course parking lot. I was yelling at the male to stop and show me his hands and to get onto the ground. The male turned and faced me where he made a quick movement with his hands to his waistband area. At this time I was concerned he might be accessing a weapon. I closed distance and hit the male with both of my arms in the chest and shoulder area causing him to go to the ground. Once one the ground the male kept his hands at his waist area and I kneeled down on his back with force with my knees. I was ordering the male to stop resisting and that he was under arrest. I was able to get a hold of his left arm. The male tried to pull his arm away from me and his right hand was still by his waistband. At this time since the male was still tensing his body and trying to pull his left arm away from me, I delivered two knee strikes to his back. I was still concerned for my safety after being told he was armed. The male continued to try and pull his arm away from me and was swinging. I then used two level two strikes to the males back. I was able to then move into a neck restraint. At this time Officer Arredondo and Erickson arrived. The male continued to swing his arms and legs. I was yelling at the male to stop fight and resisting. I attempted to render the male unconscious but was unsuccessful Officer Erickson and Arredondo went to roll the male to his side to gain access to his arm and when they did Helt a sharp pain in my right shoulden After a few minutes we were able to get the male handcuffed.

Once the male was handcuffed he stopped talking and appeared to loose color in his face. Do to this and the prolonged fight I advised radio to have the fire department respond for a possible Excited Delirium condition. We continued to talk to the male and we sat him up. The male started to talk and regain his coloring before fire arrived.

Once other officer arrived on-scene I left the suspect. At this time I noticed I had a large amount of the suspects blood on my hands and uniform. I washed my hands off with water and Zep. AMR transported the male to the hospital for treatment.

We had to have a tow truck respond and change our flat tire so we could drive back off the hill side. I responded to the station where I changed out of my uniform. I then noticed that I had about a half

inch new open cut to my right forearm which had the suspects dried blood all over it. I reported the blood exposure to Sgt Gilmore along with the pain to my right shoulder.

Officer Winters contacted the original complainant. He advised the female had lied about the male having a gun and that there was no order violation. Officer McVay located a substance he field tested as Heroin on the suspect. See other officers reports for more details.

We have probable cause to charge the suspect with Attempted to Elude, PCS Heroin, Resisting Arrest.

On 05-17-13, at 0143 hours, I was dispatched to 918 S. Napa for a Domestic Order Violation, (Stalking) call. Officer's heading to the call were advised by radio the victim had a restraining order with a male who was outside the house. The victim also stated the suspect Shane Wilson was pounding on the windows and had a gun in his hands.

As officer arrived in the area we were advised the suspect was in a silver SUV in front of the house. I was the third patrol car to pull onto the 900 Block of south Napa. I saw a Silver SUV (Jeep Liberty) quickly heading north towards the patrol cars, do a U-turn in the road going up into the yard on the east side of the street.

The car went to 10th Ave and then went west on 10th. The car sped up and was attempting to loose the officers that were behind him. I activated me emergency lights and siren and followed Ofc. Arredondo (Lead Car), Ofc. Erickson and Ofc. Christensen (2nd Car, two man). All patrol cars had their emergency lights and sirens on while behind the suspect.

Ofc. Erickson was calling the pursuit and the vehicle went north then east bound on 9th Ave. The suspect was going 60 mph while heading east on 9th. The suspect then followed 9th till it turned into Altamont and went north at speeds over 80 mph.

At Sprague Ave he went east till Freya and went north. The suspect continued north on Freya and we were advised Ofc. Baldwin had spike stripes at Trent and Freya. The suspect missed the spike strips and continued north until it turns into Greene St. The suspect was driving reckless and drove through several flashing red lights.

The suspect continued north across the river and turned east down a side street. He made it to Freya and went north still going at a high speed. He again went east on Euclid towards Minnehaha Park.

On the listed date and time I responded to the area of 913 S. Napa in reference to a Stalking call. Nicole Fowler called in reporting her ex-boyfriend, Shane Wilson was at the location sitting in a silver SUV. She advised there was a protection order in place.

Just before I arrived on scene Radio gave an update stating Nicole had seen Shane with a handgun. Officer Arredondo arrived on scene first and advised Shane was fleeing the scene in the vehicle. As I turned on to 9th from Napa I observed Shane pull away from the curb at a high rate of speed. At this time Officer Arredondo was behind him in a fully marked patrol car with his overhead emergency lights on.

Shane continued west bound on 10th ave with four marked patrol cars behind him. I was the fourth car. I had my lights and sirens activated at this time. The pursuit continued W/B 10th to Helena N/B. At this time Shane turned E/B on 9th Ave. The pursuit traveled E/B on 9th until it turns to N/B Altamont. We continued N/B on Altamont until Sprague avenue we turned E/B and continued to Freya. We traveled north on Freya until it turns into Greene. The pursuit went north on Greene to Jackson were Shane turned E/B we continued to Freya were we turned N/B. The pursuit traveled to Euclid E/B until it turns into a dirt road. The dirt road is a entrance to Beacon hill/ Minehaha recreation area.

Upon traveling up a dirt road that leads to Beacon hill the visibility became very poor with the dust. At this time I was still the fourth vehicle in the pursuit. Officer Rogan was directly in front of me. I observed him swerve to avoid something and get stuck. I attempted to continue around him. However I struck a large rock that was concealed in the tall grass. At this time My vehicle became stuck and I was unable to follow. Officer Rogan then assisted me since we were both stuck in the same spot. We were able to get my vehicle off the rock. There was no visible damage to my vehicle except a plastic piece on the under carriage seemed to be bent back. In addition my front end alignment was obviously not right.

Officer Erickson, Officer Christensen, and Officer S. Arredondo were able to get Shane into custody eventually. I assisted Officer Rogan and a tow truck driver in getting his vehicle unstuck.

I responded to the scene where the suspect was taken into custody. A tow truck driver had to take a tire off of my vehicle to use it as a spare tire for Officer Christensen's vehicle. My vehicle was towed to the city garage.

Lt. McCabe was advised of the possible damage to my vehicle.

I then responded to SHMC in Officer Jones's vehicle to relieve him. Upon arriving at the hospital I located several small plastic baggies in a cigarette box that Shane had. One baggie

As Officers arrived Wilson fled in a vehicle and was pursued by Officers due to the report of a DV order violation and his use of a firearm. Wilson was eventually caught and arrested near Esmerelda Golf Course after a vehicle pursuit.

Upon arrival at 918 S Napa Fowler told me she and Wilson have been involved in an on again off again relationship for several years and last lived together approximately one year ago. Fowler stated she and Wilson have one child in common, a nine month old son. Fowler stated she had applied for a restraining order against Wilson approximately one year ago however the order was never successfully served on Wilson. Fowler told me sometime last week Wilson had slashed her vehicle's tire and broken her vehicle's windshield and she reported the incident then.

Fowler stated Wilson arrived at her residence tonight at approximately 0130 hours and began pounding on the windows and front door. Fowler stated it appeared Wilson was high or intoxicated and she did not feel safe going outside to speak to him. Fowler stated she told Wilson she did not want to talk to him and told him he needed to leave but he refused. Fowler stated she attempted to stall Wilson so the police could respond so she told him she was going to put her son to bed and put on some clothing and come out and talk to him. Fowler stated she waited for more than twenty five minutes before the police arrived and when they did Wilson took off in his vehicle. Fowler stated she saw the police chase after Wilson.

During Fowler's statement to me I noticed she did not mention Wilson having a firearm. I asked Fowler why she told 911 Wilson had a gun or if she saw a gun and she told me that Wilson always carries a gun on him. Fowler stated she had recently spoke to a friend who told her the only way he had ever got the police to respond was to say that someone had a gun on them. Fowler stated she knew it was wrong to say and she felt weird saying it but she told 911 Wilson had a gun because she was scared for her life and it was taking the police too long to respond.

I asked Fowler if she had seen Wilson with a gun and she stated she did not actually see him with a gun but believes he always carries one. Fowler then said she thought she saw something in his hand that could have been a gun however Wilson never threatened her with anything or displayed a firearm. I asked Fowler why she was afraid for her life and she stated because Wilson has assaulted her in the past. I asked Fowler if Wilson was trying to break down the door to get into the residence and she stated he was not he was just refusing to leave the yard.

A record check of Fowler did not show any unserved restraining orders between her and Wilson. I saw there was a protection order with Wilson as the respondent showing Brittnie and Kathleen Fowler as the petitioners however the address on the order was listed as 533 E Everett. Fowler stated Brittnie and Kathleen do not live with her on Napa and have not been at the residence today. Fowler stated there was no reason for Wilson to think Brittnie or Kathleen would be at her residence.

I looked at the vehicle windshield and saw there was several breaks in the windshield. I saw the breaks appeared to be caused by something striking the outside of the windshield due to several of the breaks having a small amount of pitting on the outside of the windshield. I saw the windshield was covered with a layer of pollen and dust consistent with all of the damage to the windshield being done several days ago. Based on the statements of Fowler and the damage to the vehicle being old I determined there was no crime that had occurred at the residence tonight.

I contacted Sergeant Gilmore and Lieutenant Sprague and advised them of Fowler's statements. Lieutenant Sprague confirmed with SPD radio the statements Fowler made to 911 during her initial call. SPD radio advised Fowler stated Wilson was armed with a gun.

Due to Fowler's false statements of Wilson having a firearm being directly related to the justification to pursue Wilson's vehicle I determined there was PC to arrest Fowler for Making False and Misleading Statements. I cited and released Fowler for Making False and Misleading Statements. Fowler again told me she knew it was wrong to lie about the gun but added she was just so frustrated with how long it took the police to respond.

I went to radio to listen to a recording of the 911 call. I heard on the recording Fowler call 911 for the fourth time and state she had called fifteen minutes ago and wanted to know why the police were not there yet. I heard the 911 operator tell Fowler she had called four minutes prior and asked for a call back with an ETA for officer arrival and Fowler became upset and stated again she was afraid and asked why it was taking so long for police to arrive.

I heard on the recording the 911 operator attempt to explain to Fowler the cause of the delay then I heard Fowler state "He has a gun." The 911 operator asked "Have you seen the gun?" and Fowler stated "Yes." The 911 Operator asked again "have you actually seen the gun in his hand" and Fowler again responded "Yes, Yes m-am."

I collected a copy of the 911 recording and placed it on property as evidence.

On the morning of 5/17/13 officers had responded to a reported Stalking and Violation of a Court Order at 918 S. Napa. I was at another incident scene. At approximately 0152 officers began a vehicle pursuit of the suspect in south Napa call.

I telephoned Police Radio and contacted supervisor Kim Arredondo at and began to monitor the pursuit at approximately 0153 hours. Kim Arredondo confirmed for me the nature of the call for which they were pursuing the suspect. Also that the complainant, Fowler, had stated that she saw the suspect, Wilson, with a gun. Given the seriousness of the crime being investigated, the report of the suspect being armed and the potential danger to the victims if Wilson was not apprehended, I felt it was important to allow the pursuit to continue if reasonable.

I noted while monitoring that pursuit speeds were high, but traffic was reportedly light. I did approve a request to use a PIT technique at speeds over 40 MPH, though no opportunity presented itself. I continued to monitor as the pursuit worked its way northeast to Minnehaha Park. After the pursuit came to an end with the suspect vehicle becoming disabled, I continued to the scene.

I arrived on scene at the upper parking lot of Esmeralda golf course at 0210 hours. I saw that Wilson was in custody. Medics were arriving to treat Wilson. I saw he had blood on his face. I assessed the damages to the Jeep Liberty Wilson was driving and the patrol vehicles driven by Christensen and S. Arredondo. Cpl.Bartlett took photos of damages and Wilson.

I remained on scene and spoke to the involved officers regarding the pursuit and apprehension of Wilson.

Once I learned that Fowler apparently lied about seeing Wilson with a firearm, I telephoned Kim Arredondo who confirmed that Fowler told both 911 and herself that she had seen Wilson with a handgun. Fowler reporting that Wilson had a gun escalated the police response to the incident. Subsequently officers went to great lengths to apprehend him. In the process thousands of dollars of damage was caused to the police vehicles. Ofc. Christensen sustained an injury to his right shoulder among other less serious injuries. I requested that Lt. Sprague, who was at my location, go meet Ofc. Winters, who had contacted Fowler, and recontact Fowler. I wanted her charged with making a false statement.
