Reviewer comment:

Probable cause to arrest for a felony violation of a DV protective order existed, and was within the 4-hour window. Sale was given multiple opportunities to surrender, and instead chose to flee. Application of K9 was reasonable and appropriate given Sale's criminal history and the totality of the circumstances. Injuries were consistent with the documentation submitted by officers, and were relatively minor. Application was within K9 and SPD Use of Force policy guidelines.

Reviewer comment:

The use of the K9 was appropriate and within policy. The suspect posed an ongoing danger to the victim and potentially other people in the residence (i.e. the babysitter). Additionally, the suspect has a history with being aggressive and violent with law enforcement. Officers needed to ensure all citizens were protected from harm including themselves.

NARRATIVE		

On 06-22-13, at about 0002 hours, I was dispatched to 1607 E. Boone on a report of a DVOP Violation. While enroute, radio advised Stacy Turner called 911 and told the operator that she was babysitting for #1 and that #1 had a NCO against James Sale. Turner said #1 lived at 1607 E. Boone and that Sale was currently outside #1 residence. Turner said #1 was not home (#4a) but she #1 told her to call if Sale responded to the Boone address. Turner said #1 and Sale were currently going through divorce. Radio advised there was a valid NCO, which showed #1 as the Petitioner and Sale as the Respondent.

I contacted Turner, who said an unknown person called from a pay phone 3 times tonight, 2030 hours, 2034 hours and 2038 hours. Then, around 2330 hours, Turner said someone knocked on #1 front door but walked away before she could see the person's face. Turner said she believed the person who called from the pay phone and the person who knocked on #1 door was Sale. Turner said based on past experience, Sale has violated the NCO and she believed Sale would violate the NCO again.

While talking with Turner, #1 arrived. #1 said from 1700 hours to 1840 hours, Sale had called her 17 times. I told #1 that each of those calls were violations. #1 said Sale had permission to call her. Later, I viewed NCO N37281 and confirmed #1 was correct. I gave #1 a report number and told her to call police if Sale returned.

Both Turner and #1 said they believed Sale was still in the neighborhood. #1 said Turner would probably go to the river and wait until I left before returning to her home. I told #1 that I would check the area and would wait in the area for a short while.

At about 0033 hours, #1 called 911 and told the operator that Sale had returned and he was last seen waiting on the corner, behind some bushes.

I responded to #4a and contacted Turner, Jessie Cooley and Barbara Shell. All 3 females said they saw Sale in the parking lot, which was directly behind #1 home. I advised the females that I would check the area. All 3 females said they last saw Sale hiding behind some bushes about one to two blocks north of Boone. I checked the area but did not locate Sale. I then called for additional units and a K9.

K9 Ofc. Gorman responded and I advised him that I had PC to arrest Sale for DVOP Violation. I told K9 Ofc. Gorman where the witnesses last saw Sale. K9 Ofc. Gorman and I proceeded to the small shrubbery in front of 1312 N. Helena. K9 Ofc. Gorman gave some announcements and Sale was taken into custody shortly afterwards. (See K9 Ofc. Gorman's Additional)

I advised Sale that he was under arrest for DVOP Violation. Sale argued that he was not in violation because he was more than 2 city blocks away from #4a. I advised Sale that not only did 3 witnesses see him right behind #4a but he was also arrested by SPD within 1 1/2 blocks

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away from **#4a** Sale said I didn't know what I was talking about.

Ofc. Rogan transported Sale to Deaconess Hospital for wounds to his right thigh (Contacted by K9). After Sale was cleared by Deaconess Hospital Staff, I transported Sale to Spokane County Jail.

While enroute to jail, Sale admitted he had walked through the parking lot that was located behind **#1** home. Sale also admitted he saw 2 of the 3 witnesses in the parking lot. Prior to reaching jail, radio advised Sale had 2 prior DVOP Violation convictions. Sale was later booked into Spokane County Jail for Felony DVOP Violation.

At jail, I viewed NCO N37281, which stated Sale was not to come within 2 city blocks of **#1** home, **#4a** Furthermore, the NCO stated any violation by Sale would result in a mandatory arrest. In addition to the NCO, I viewed Sale's Triple III, which showed Sale had been twice convicted of DVOP Violations. (See Attached Triple III and NCO N37281.

On 062213 at approx 0037hrs I responded to the area of 1607 W Boone to assist Ofc Arredondo with a DV order violation. Upon arrival, Ofc Arredondo advised the following;

He had PC to arrest the suspect James Sale for a felony count of DV order violation. Radio and Records had confirmed the order was valid and served. He had witness accounts that Sale was still in the area or had very recently fled on foot. The witnesses pointed out an area north of Sharp on Helena, and said Sale turned e/b approx mid block and went thru some bushes.

I deployed SPD K9 Maximus for the following reasons;

-PC existed for a felony count of DV order violation. The suspect had been arrested several times for violating the order in the past. Sale violated the order several times in this same day.

-Sale was actively attempting to evade arrest by fleeing on foot. Sale had violated the order several times that night, and had escaped arrest each time by fleeing on foot.

-Sale fled into an area of thick vegetation in a residential area, which was also adjacent to a river. Sale was very familiar with the area and could have easily set an ambush for searching officers. He was still close enough to the victims house to see when the police left the first time, and continued to violate the order once the police left. The last time Sale was arrested for violating the order, he hid in an attic and had to be forcibly removed. Sale fought with officers in the attic and more once he was brought down. Sale was known to fight with officers upon his capture and arrest. Sale had not been searched and it was unknown if he was armed.

I spoke with witnesses who placed Sale on Helena, north of Sharp on the east curb. Approx mid block Sale turned east into some bushes and a yard. I started walking SPD K9 Max to the last known location of Sale. As I approached approx mid block, I heard a little rustling in some shrubs. The shrubs were just south of 1312 N Helena, along the sidewalk. As I approached closer, K9 Max started to alert on the bushes. I looked closer and could barely see what looked like a small piece of a denim from jeans deep in the bushes. It could possibly have been Sale hiding deep in there.

I gave three loud, distinct announcements to Sale, as follows, "Attention in the area! Spokane Police K9 Unit! You in the bushes, come out now! I see you in there! You are under

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arrest! Come out to the sound of my voice." I waited approx 25-30 seconds between announcements. There was no movement and Sale gave no attempt to surrender.

I waited over a minute after my last announcement before moving forward with the K9 plan. While discussing the arrest plan with other officers, I heard another slight rustling in the bushes. I shined my light where I earlier observed the denim and it was gone. I heard another quick rustle of the bushes and still didn't see Sale or the denim.

I released K9 Max and gave him the command to search for the suspect. Max immediately went to where I had observed the denim, but there was no suspect there. Max pushed through the bushes and continued to run to the east for approx 10 feet. I was still on the road, on the other side of the bushes and didn't see K9 Max contact Sale. When I ran around the bushes it appeared Sale had ran approx 10 feet out of the bushes in an attempt to flee when K9 Max contacted him. Max had contacted Sale's right upper outer thigh. Once Sale was cooperative and I could see his hands were clear, I gave Max the command to release and he did so immediately.

Sale was taken into custody. He was transported to Deaconess for treatment of the contact injuries. His injuries consisted of several rakes that didn't break the skin, and three scratches that broke the skin but were not bleeding on his upper, outer right thigh. Sale's injuries were treated by Deaconess staff and he was cleared for booking.

While in the emergency room, I read Sale his constitutional rights, which he said he understood and waived. Sale agreed to answer questions. Sale denied violating the order, but did admit to trying to evade arrest by crawling out of the bushes and walking the opposite direction. Sale became angry again and stopped answering questions.

Sale's injuries were photographed by Cpl Bartlett. Sale was transported and booked by Ofc Arredondo, see his report for further.

On 06-21-13, I was dispatched to 1607 E. Boone to assist Officer J. Arredondo on a Domestic Violence Order violation call.

I arrived on scene and Ofc. Arredondo and K9 Ofc. Gorman were at Sharp and Helena. I was advised we were looking for James Sale. I know Sale from previous arrest from the location we were called to.

Ofc. Gorman's K9 alerted to some bushes on the corner of the block. He advised he was a Spokane Police Officer K9 and for the person in the bushes to come out. The person did not come out. The K9 went into the bush and Sale came out. See Ofc. Gorman's report for more details.

Sale was handcuffed (DL) and was walked to a patrol car. He was swearing and yelling he was just sleeping and we could not arrest him. He stated he was not within the two blocks. While at the trunk of the patrol car while being searched he started hitting his head on the trunk.

Sale was put in the back of my patrol car to be transported to the hospital. While heading to he hospital Sale was swearing about he was not within the two blocks. He then began hitting his head very hard on the shield. I advised him not to hit his head. He then began kicking the shield and the ceiling with his feet. He was yelling he was going to "Kick my ass!"

Sale continued to kick and I advised him he would be put in leg restraints. He kept kicking and I pulled over at 2nd and McClellan. I was assisted by Ofc. Willard and Ofc. Fairbanks putting soft leg restraints on Sale.

I continued to the hospital and released Sale to Ofc. Arredondo.

INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:

Type of Application: Running Take

Original Call:

Officer Arredondo had PC for a felony DV Court Order violation. The suspect, Sale, had violated the order several times in the past and had also violated the order several times throughout the day of this incident and that the suspect was still in the area hiding.

Suspect Actions:

Sale fled the scene of the DV Order of Protection violation, then hid in a large stand of thick bushes approx 1 ½ blocks from the crime scene. Officer Gorman and K-9 Maximus challenged Sale and made several announcements, Sale attempted to flee by exiting the bushes opposite of the location of Officers and K-9 Maximus. Sale attempted to flee on foot away from Officers.

Est. Time & Distance of Contact (if known):

K-9 Maximus contacted Sale for approximately 15 seconds. Officer Gorman was approximately within 20 feet of Sale.

Officer Safety Concerns/ Why was Canine used:

Sale fled into an area of thick vegetation in a residential area, which was also adjacent to a river. Sale was very familiar with the area and could have easily set an ambush for searching Officers. Sale was still close enough to the victim's house to see when the Police left the first time, and continued to violate the order once the Police departed. The last time Sale was located and arrested for violating the order, he hid in an attic and had to be forcibly removed. At that time Sale fought with the Officers in the attic and continued once he was taken from the attic. Sale was known to fight with Officers upon his capture and arrest. Sale had not been searched and it was unknown if he was armed. This was a residential area and it was unknown to what extreme Sale would employ in order to avoid capture and arrest.

Injury:

Sale's injuries consisted of several rakes that didn't break the skin, and three scratches that broke the skin but were not bleeding on his upper, outer right thigh.

The actions of Officer Gorman and K-9 Maximus were effective, fell within Spokane Police policy, and met department expectations.

SUPERVISORY COMMENTS:

K-9 Supervisor Comments:

Officer Gorman responded to assist Officer Arredondo with locating a DVOPV (Felony) suspect (Sale) who was hiding in the residential area of 1607 E Boone. Officer Gorman and K-9 Max went to the area that Sale was last seen and made several K-9 announcements. Officer Gorman and K-9 Max heard and saw movement in nearby bushes so Officer Gorman made three more loud K-9 announcements, waiting approximately 25-30 seconds between each one. Officer Gorman heard and saw what indicated to him that the suspect was attempting to flee the other direction so he released K-9 Max to locate and apprehend Sale. K-9 Max searched, located, and apprehended Sale by contact on his leg as he was attempting to get away. As soon as it was safe to do so, Officer Gorman immediately released K-9 Max and Sale was taken into custody without further incident. Sale later admitted that he tried to escape by crawling out of the bushes and walk the other direction from the Police. The use of K-9 Leo was within department policy and met department expectations.
