Summary:

Officer Van Tassel was on routine patrol in the area of Sprague and Washington when he heard some yelling and glass breaking. He then saw a bouncer from the Satellite bar pointing down the street and he stated the subject had just tried to stab someone. Officer Van Tassel activated his emergency lights and went after the subject. He drove up Sprague and saw the subject at 300 W. Sprague. The subject had blood on his face and clothing. The subject looked back toward Officer Van Tassel and continued walking. Officer Van Tassel then stopped, exited his vehicle and ordered the subject to stop.

The subject, James Lewis, just turned and looked at Officer Van Tassel. Officer Van Tassel saw the subject had a knife in his right hand. Officer Van Tassel drew his firearm and held it in a low, ready position. He ordered the subject to drop the knife and get on the ground. The subject did not comply and yelled something at the officer. Officer Van Tassel then pointed his firearm at Mr. Lewis for the following Graham factors:

Crime: He had heard subjects screaming and glass breaking. Witnesses pointed out the subject as a possible subject involved and they told the officer he was armed with a knife. The subject had blood on his face and obviously had been involved in something.

Threat Factors: The subject was holding a knife in his hand and he refused to drop the knife when ordered by a uniformed police officer. The subject was in the downtown area of Spokane on the 4th of July and there were numerous people in the area. Officer Van Tassel was confronting the subject by himself.

Resisting Factors: The subject was refusing to stop and to put down a knife he was holding. Officer Van Tassel then ordered the subject to put down the knife and stop. Mr. Lewis then dropped his knife and followed commands. Officer Van Tassel commanded Mr. Lewis to prone out on the ground and he complied. Officer Van Tassel handcuffed Mr. Lewis and proceeded with an investigation.

Mr. Lewis was later charged with 1* robbery, 3 counts of 2* assault, 3* assault and 2* malicious mischief. Mr. Lewis had been injured in the altercation and was taken to Deaconess Hospital for treatment. I contacted Mr. Lewis at Deaconess Hospital.

I asked Mr. Lewis why he did not put down his knife when the officer told him to. Mr. Lewis stated he remembered being hit two times by someone and then having his knife in his hand. He stated he did not remember anything after this. He indicated he did not remember being contacted by a Police Officer. Mr. Lewis showed signs of intoxication. He was treated, released, and then booked into jail.

Officer Van Tassel was presented with a volatile situation, as Mr. Lewis was armed with a knife. His actions of first ordering the subject to put down the knife, and then presenting his firearm and ordering the subject to put down the knife were appropriate for the set of facts known to the officer at the time of this incident. I see Officer Van Tassel's response to be within departmental guidelines and state law.

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On 7/5/13 at approximately 0055 hours I responded to the Satellite bar to assist Officers. Upon arrival I was directed to contact Christina Barlow (DOB #4b Barlow was with three friends, including one friend with a cut to her back from a broken window.

Barlow told me the following: She was sitting at the table inside of the Satellite nearest the broken window. Barlow was with her three friends. She observed a man shove David Elliot into a window at the Satellite. The window broke and her friend was cut.

The man then shoved David Elliot into another window causing it to crack. At that point multiple people got involved and two men were separated.

I walked Barlow to where Officer Vantassel had stopped a man about a block to the East. Barlow

I talked to Kylee Struve (DOB #4b Struve was at the Satellite with Barlow and two other friends. Struve remembers the window breaking and seeing two men in some sort of struggle. Struve then saw that her friend had been cut but the glass. Struve didn't see anything else.

On 07/05/2013 at 0054, I was dispatched to assist Officer Vantassel on a person with a weapon call at Sprague/Washington. Upon arrival, I contacted David Elliott and he told me the following:

He was sitting with several transients near the corner of Sprague/Stevens. A male (described as Native American with long hair), later identified as James Lewis, approached the group. Lewis began asking them for some cigarettes and was intoxicated. An argument ensued and Lewis brandished a small knife. Lewis was within approximately 6 feet of him and held the knife out. David was certain that Lewis wanted to either stab or kill him and was very afraid. He then threw his metal water bottle at Lewis, which struck Lewis in the head. Lewis then chased after him, while holding the knife out.

David said that he ran EB on Sprague and Lewis caught up to him in front of the Satellite Diner. Lewis then shoved him into the main front window, breaking the glass. He received some minor lacerations from the glass being embedded in his skin. He did receive medical attention at the scene from medics. Corporal Ennis arrived on scene and took photos of David's injuries.

It should be noted that at the time I contacted him, David said that he did not want to be a victim and refused to be a part of a witness show-up. I offered several times to provided the crime victim number, but he refused.

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On 7/5/2013 at approximately 0054 hrs, I was dispatched to Sprague/Washington for a person with a weapon.

I arrived on scene and contacted a witness, Stephanie Tavenner, who told me the following:

Tavenner was at the Satellite with two of her friends when a male (David Elliott) was shoved through the business window by another male. The window shattered and her friend had a piece of glass cut her shoulder region (requiring stitches).

Tavenner did not have anything further.

I transported the complainant, Tim Barlows, to do a show up with the male that OFC VanTassel had detained (in front of Big City Saloon). OFC VanTassel had James Lewis detained.

Barlows immediately stated that Lewis was the male who shoved Elliott through the Satellite window. Barlows was 100% positive that Lewis was the suspect.

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On 07/05/2013 at approximately 0054 hours Ofc. Schneider and I responded to Sprague/Washington to assist Ofc. Van Tassel with a person with a weapon call. The call advised a male pulled a knife on someone.

I arrived on scene and contacted Steven Townsend who told me the following:

He was standing near the corner of Sprague/Stevens on the S/W corner of the street. He saw a male approach another male (later identified as Phillip Hocking) on the S/W corner of Sprague/Stevens. The male "grabbed Hocking at knife point." The male first approached and asked Hocking if he had a cell phone. He then grabbed Hocking by the shirt and waved the knife around at him. He "held him at knife point" and demanded Hocking hand over the phone. He stated, "Are you going to give me the phone, yes or no?" He continued to hold the knife by the

handle and wave it around with the blade pointing towards Hocking. He was holding Hocking by the shirt with the knife pointed against him as he demanded the cell phone.

A female (later identified Sarah Barett) attempted to come to the aide of Hocking and prevent him from being stabbed. She attempted to intervene and get in the middle of the suspect male and Hocking.

The male then turned his attention to Sarah and went towards her with the knife. He had the knife in his hand waving it around as he went towards Sarah.

He then was struck by a water bottle thrown by a male (later identified as David Elliot) who was attempting to break up the fight. The male with the knife in his hand chased Elliot on foot E/B on Sprague cross Stevens. He continued to pursue Elliot and chase him E/B. He then heard glass crashing (Satellite Bar's Window) although he didn't see the glass specifically being broken.

I then contacted Sarah Barett who told me the following:

She saw the male approach Hocking and stated, "Give me your phone." She could see him waving around his hand and originally thought he was trying to punch Hocking. She then saw a shiny flash and realized the male was "attempting to stab Hocking." She could see the blade of the knife as he continued to swing it at Hocking. He grabbed Hocking by the shirt and swung the knife at him as he continued to demand Hocking's phone. She advised he "was twirling the knife around." He countinued to demand the phone.

She attempted to step in and save Hocking because at some point the male knocked Hocking to the ground. As she got in the middle the male focused his attention on her. He started to swing the knife around wildly and close distance on her. He moved closer and closer to her, coming within several feet as he continued to swing the knife at her and attempt to cut her. She saw someone throw a water bottle at the male and the male then started chasing the male that threw the water bottle. The male chased the male that threw the water bottle with the knife in his hand.

She advised she felt that he was going to stab or cut her and that she was placed in fear.

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On 070513 at approximately 0054 hours, I responded to the area of Sprague / Washington to assist Ofc. Van Tassel with a person with a weapon. As I responded, Ofc. Van Tassel advised that he was code 4 and asked that other units check for victim's and witnesses at the Satellite.

I responded to the Satellite, 425 W. Sprague and found that one of the front windows was broken out. There was still glass lying on the sidewalk.

I contacted Timothy D. Barlos who told me the following: He works at the Satellite. He

observed a native American male chasing a white male east bound on Sprague. Timothy pointed out the white male, who was later identified as David A. Elliott. The native American male caught up with David in front of the Satellite and pushed him into the window, causing it to break. When the window broke, a female customer inside was cut by the glass. The native American male yelled, "I'm going to fucking kill you" and had a knife in his hand. The native American male stabbed towards David several times. Several people chased the native American male east from the location and the native American male was stopped by Police. Timothy advised that the window the native American male broke will cost \$1000.00 to replace.

As I talked with Timothy, Ofc. Prim spoke with David. Ofc. Prim advised that the incident started when the native American male held a knife to one of the transient's in front of the Ridpath at 500 W. Sprague.

I walked to 500 W. Sprague and asked a group of transients if anyone was involved in the incident that had just occurred and Phillip A. Hocking advised that he was.

I asked Phillip what had happened and he told me the following: He was sitting on the sidewalk with Sarah Barett showing her a video on his phone. A male walked up and asked to make a call on his phone. Phillip advised that he had never seen the male before and advised that he was the male that Police had detained. He told the male that his phone was broken and could not make calls. The male grabbed him by the shirt causing it to rip, and held a knife to his chest demanding his phone. Phillip described the knife as either a butterfly knife or a switch blade style knife with a skinny blade. As the male demanded his phone and held the knife to his chest, Sarah stood up and said, "Hey". The male let go of him and went after Sarah with the knife. Phillip advised that the male had the knife pointed at Sarah and made it 1 foot from her before everyone else stood up. The male began to run after David and David ran east on Spargue. I asked David if he believed that the male was going to stab them and he advised that he did and that he knows that he needs to be a victim for this or the male will hurt someone.

I looked at Phillip's shirt and could see that it was torn.

Cpl. Ennis responded and took photographs of the broken window and Phillip's torn shirt.

I gave both Timothy and Phillip crime victim cards with the report number.

I advised Ofc. Van Tassel of Timothy and Phillip's statements. Ofc. Van Tassel gave me the knife that he recovered from the suspect and asked me to place it on property.

I responded to Police Property and placed the knife on as evidence.

in the middle of the street.

I drove on Sprague, up behind the male (Lewis). He was the only person walking around. I had my emergency lights on, indicating for Lewis to stop. He looked back at me. I could see that he was bleeding from his face. Lewis looked back forward and continued to walk. I got out of my vehicle and told Lewis to stop.

Lewis turned and looked at me. I then could see that he had a knife in his right hand. I drew my firearm and had it at low ready. I told Lewis to drop the knife and get on the ground. Lewis yelled back at me. I am not sure exactly what he said. However, he had an angry voice and basically indicated he was not going to drop the knife. I was about 10 feet away from Lewis. I pointed my firearm at Lewis and yelled at him, in a loud clear voice to drop the knife and get on the ground. Lewis took a couple seconds, then threw the knife to the ground. He laid down, in a prone position. I detained him with handcuffs and secured the knife.

I directed other Officers over to the Satelite, 425 W Sprague. This is the area I heard the glass break in. They contacted numerous victims and witnesses, see other reports.

I read Lewis his constitutional rights, which he waived and said he would talk to me. Lewis said that he was walking down the street. Lewis said that somebody hit him and he took off. I asked him about the knife. Lewis said that he was hit once, for no reason at all. He pulled the knife out, just to get the male to back off. Lewis said that another male hit him for no reason. Lewis said that he felt he was about to get jumped, so he took off running. He can't remember anything else.

Lewis has slurred speech and smelled of alcohol, he was intoxicated. However, Lewis was able to walk, concentrate and answer all questions I asked.

After talking with other Officers onscene, we determined there was PC to arrest Lewis for the listed charges. I took Lewis to Deaconess Hospital for stitches to his face. Once he was cleared, I booked him into jail. His knife was placed onto property as evidence. Photographs were taken of Lewis.

Lewis was booked for the listed charges:

-1st Robbery, for holding victim Hocking at knife point and demanding his cell phone.

-2nd assault, for threatening victim Hocking with a knife.

-2nd assault, for threatening victim Barett with a knife.

-2nd assault, for threatening victim Elliott with a knife.

-3rd assault, for engaging in reckless behavior by throwing somebody through a window and a shard of glass punctured victim Ellingsen in the side of her body.

-2nd Malicious mischief, for throwing a person through a window at the Satelite and the cost of the damage is \$1,000.

The undersigned, a law enforcement officer, competent to testify, states as follows: That he/she believes a crime was committed by the above named defendant/defendants in the City and County of Spokane, State of Washington, because:

Officer Van Tassel will testify to the following:

-Driving around Stevens and Sprague and hearing the sound of glass breaking.

-That several people who I know to be bouncers were pointing east down Sprague.

-They advised a male has a knife and just tried to stab somebody.

-They pointed at the only male walking in the middle of the road.

-Driving up behind the def, with emergency lights activated.

-The def looked back and I could see he was bleeding from the face.

-The def had a knife in his right hand.

-Ordering the def to drop the knife, after refusing a couple of times the def finally cooperated.

-The def was detained, read his rights and interviewed.

-The def said he was walking down the street and a male punched him for no reason.

-The def said that he pulled his knife out and held it in his hand.

-The def said that another male punched him in the face.

-The def said that he then took off running so people would stop assaulting him.

-Asking him if somebody was thrown through a window, the def said he did not know anything about that at all.

-After several witnesses and victims gave their statement, determining there was PC to arrest the def.

-After taking him for stitches, booking the def into jail.

David Elliott can testify to the following:

-Observed the def grab onto Hocking by the shirt and the def had a knife in his hand. -Heard the def demand a cell phone from Hocking.

-That she attempted to stop the def.

-That the def still had the knife in his hand and came after her.

-That the def came within a couple feet of her, waiving the knife.

-She feared that she was going to be stabbed by the def.

-That the def took off running after another male, chasing him across Stevens.

-That she heard glass breaking.
