Summary:

Officers were dispatched to W. 100 Queen, Franklin Park, reference a report of an assault.

Officer D. Lesser #452 was the first to arrive on scene, arriving in a marked police car. As he arrived he saw who several people he believed were involved. The subjects, one of whom Ofc. D. Lesser identified as the male suspect, began running away from him, and around a building (bathroom) in the park. Ofc. D. Lesser gave chase in his vehicle and then exited on foot.

Ofc. D. Lesser gave the male subject verbal commands to stop, "Stop police!" The male who was now walking refused to stop for his commands. Officer Lesser approached the male from behind and pushed him on his back on his upper shoulders. The male fell forward to the ground. Officer D. Lesser told him, "Stay on the ground." When then ended up on the ground the male (Montano) had his right hand beneath him concealed at his waistline.

Ofc. Lesser attempted to pull the male's hand out from underneath him. Montano used muscle resistance to keep Ofc. Lesser from pulling his arm around to his back. Ofc. Lesser told him, "Stop resisting." Ofc. Lesser was concerned about the male's previous resistance, the nature of the call, and the fact that he was alone with the suspect. Using a Lvl 1 neck restraint Ofc. Lesser moved to control the male.

Ofc. Lesser believes that during the application of the Lvl 1 neck restraint the male lost consciousness for a short period of time.

When Officer Spolski arrived to assist the male, who was conscious, continue to resist efforts to place his arms behind his back for cuffing. The male was placed in handcuffs and secured in a patrol vehicle.

Medics cleared suspect Montano onscene.

Reviewer comment:

Officers were responding to an assault on a female in progress at Franklin Park. Officers did not know what they were going to be dealing with specifically upon their initial arrival.

Officers observed people in the park and based on their behavior, it was clear that they were attemptig to avoid contact with the police.

Officer D. Lesser contacted one of the suspects was trying to flee. The subject was refusing to adhere to any of Officer Lesser's commands and was continuing to try and escape. Other officers were contacting other people involved in the incident and Officer Lesser was still by himself at this point. Not knowing the extent of any crime committed and with the suspect clearly trying to escape and evade the police, Officer D. Lesser had the power to conduct a stop on the suspect as part of the

investigation.

Officer D. Lesser used the flat of his hands to push the suspect to the ground. The suspect was behaving as if he possibly had a weapon in the front area of his pants and would not bring his hands out to be clearly visible to Officer Lesser. Officer Lesser placed him in a level 1 LVNR with the intent of holding him in place and under control until other officers could arrive. He reports that he believes that the suspect may have been rendered unconscious at one point. If he was rendered unconscious, it would be considered a level 2 LVNR but it was inadvertent and was not the intent of Officer Lesser.

Other officers arrived and the suspect was continuing to resist officers actions to take him into custody. It was quickly determined that the suspect had pulled out a handgun and pointed it at a victim in an attempt to take property from him and also assaulted him in the process. The handgun was recovered in the purse of female girlfriend of the suspect. The girlfriend was also a suspect in another assault that had occurred.

Officer D. Lesser's use of the level 1 LVNR was within policy. If the suspect was, in fact, rendered unconscious, it was inadvertent and not the intent of Officer Lesser. His actions were still within policy. He took the actions necessary to keep himself and other citizens safe while still detaining the individual that was eventually charged with 1st Robbery land 1st Assault.

On 7/23/2013 hours at about 2346 hours I responded to Franklin Park reference an Assault (see my original report). Lt Cowles requested that I clarify a few issues. When I placed the suspect on the ground I displaced his balance by using a two handed push on the suspects upper back causing him to go forward into a prone position.

I gave him multiple commands, which included "Stop Police", "Stay down on the ground" and to "stop resisting". Due to the fact that I was still alone and awaiting other officers to assist along with the suspect's mechanical resistance, not allowing me to pull his arms out from underneath him) I placed the suspect in a level 1 neck restraint / upper body control. This was to gain control of the suspect and to keep his placement on the ground until other officers arrived to assist.
