Summary:

On 7-27-13 at 1858, Officer S. Haney #730 and Corporal Z. Dahle #766 were dispatched to 2721 E 6th on a report of a female, identified as Heather Challenger, arguing with an intoxicated neighbor, identified as Richard Blakesley. She reported that the neighbor had come toward her and threatened to assault her. Challenger then reported that Richard had obtained a hammer and was yelling "bring on the cops". Challenger further stated in the call that Richard's brother, identified as Shawn Blakesley, was trying to calm Richard down but that Richard was "escalating".

Corporal Z. Dahle was the first officer to arrive at the scene at 1900. He found Richard and Shawn standing on the south sidewalk of 6th in front of 2724 E 6th. Prior to his arrival radio had advised of several threat factors:

- -Richard was intoxicated,
- -Richard had come toward Challenger and threatened to assault her,
- -Richard obtained a deadly weapon, hammer,
- -Richard had yelled "bring on the cops",
- -Richard's brother was attempting to calm him down but Richard was "escalating".

Corporal Dahle stated that when he arrived he saw Shawn said, "My brother is drunk and acting

stupid". Corporal Dahle stated that Richard was scowling at him, was grinding his teeth, had his eyebrows furrowed, and had both of his hands clinched into fists. When Corporal Dahle asked Richard why he was upset he reacted by reaching into his right front shorts pocket and pulling out a black rectangular object. Corporal Dahle feared that Richard had accessed a folding knife. Corporal Dahle reacted by pulling his duty firearm form his holster and holding it at the low ready. Corporal Dahle ordered Richard to drop the knife. Richard then opened his hand revealing that the object was a lighter and said "What fucking knife".

Corporal Dahle then re-holstered his duty firearm. Just after Corporal Dahle had secured his firearm Richard came toward him and used an open right hand to strike Corporal Dahle in the chest, which caused his lapel microphone to fall away from his uniform and slightly out of reach. Corporal Dahle attempted to take control of Richard's left arm but Richard had spun so that he was facing Corporal Dahle. Corporal Dahle then saw that Richard had clinched his right hand into a fist and feared that Richard was preparing to punch him.

Additional threat factors known to Corporal Dahle:

- -There was an additional male with Richard that identified himself as his brother,
- -Richard's brother confirmed that Richard was intoxicated and was "acting stupid",
- -Richard was scowling at Corporal Dahle, was grinding his teeth, had his eyebrows furrowed, and had both of his hands clinched into fists,
- -Richard's initial physical reaction to Corporal Dahle was to place one of his hands into a pocket and pull out what Corporal Dahle initially feared was a folding knife,
- -Richard coming at Corporal Dahle just after he had secured his duty firearm,
- -Richard had assaulted Corporal Dahle by using an open hand strike to hit him in the chest,
- -Richard's open hand strike caused Corporal Dahle's lapel microphone to fall away from his uniform which made it more difficult to request assistance,
- -Corporal Dahle had attempted to gain control of Richard's left arm but Richard had spun toward Corporal Dahle causing them to be face to face,
- -Richard had clinched his right hand into a fist.

Corporal Dahle pulled Richard in closer in attempt to disrupt his balance and to limit Richard's strike points on Corporal Dahle's body. Corporal Dahle then delivered a single right elbow strike to the left side of Richard's head. Richard became disoriented which allowed Corporal Dahle to guide Richard onto the ground. While on the ground, Richard had pulled his right arm underneath his body at waist level. Corporal Dahle was able to maintain control of Richard's left arm and used his left knee to pin Richard's upper body to the ground. Corporal Dahle was then able to access his lapel microphone and request assistance from radio and advised that he was fighting with Richard. Richard then immediately started kicking his feet toward Corporal Dahle's legs. Shawn then stepped in to assist Corporal Dahle by grabbing hold of Richard's legs and straightening them out. Corporal Dahle was then able to gain control of Richard's right arm. Corporal Dahle was able to handcuff Richard in a prone position.

I contacted Richard. He was handcuffed and seated in the back of fully marked patrol vehicle # 389. I could see that Richard had an abrasion to his upper right shoulder, right cheek, and that he had a small amount of dried blood on his lower lip. I was able to smell the strong odor of intoxicants coming from Richard's breath. Richard admitted to that he was drunk. He stated that he can be an "angry drunk" and admitted that he was angry today but would not say why. Richard admitted that he was being aggressive toward his neighbor, family, and the police. He stated that his fists were clinched when the police arrived. Richard would not say why his fists were clinched. Richard would not elaborate on how he was being aggressive. Richard stated that he did not remember if he had assaulted Corporal Dahle or not. Richard did, however, state that if the roles had been reversed that he would have been concerned for his safety had he encountered himself in his current state.

Medics arrived at the scene at Corporal Dahle's request to check on Richard.

As I started to talk to Corporal Dahle about the incident, Shawn interrupted and said, "He had to do it, he had no choice". I then spoke with Shawn. I asked Shawn if he was referring to Corporal Dahle's elbow strike. Shawn stated that he was referring to the elbow strike. Shawn described Richard as an alcoholic. Shawn stated that he witnessed Richard shove Corporal Dahle in the chest shortly after Corporal Dahle arrived. Shawn also stated that Richard was kicking Corporal Dahle in the legs after Richard was guided to the ground.

Corporal Dahle's statement to me at the scene was consistent with his written report.

Officer Haney contacted Dana Blakesley, Richard's sister-in-law. Dana told Officer Haney that she saw Richard push Corporal Dahle.

Officer Haney contacted Christa Hunter. She told Officer Haney that she heard Richard yell "bring on the cops" prior to the police arriving. She then stated that she saw Richard take a swing at Corporal Dahle with a closed fist.

Richard was later booked into jail for 3rd assault on a law enforcement officer.

The force used by Corporal Dahle was within department policy and procedure due to the listed threat factors and Richard's assaultive actions toward Corporal Dahle.

Reviewer comment:

When officers are confronted with circumstances where there is a chance that force may have to be used, they evaluate the facts and/or information that is available to them at that time to determine what the appropriate response should be. It is recognized that events such as these are volatile, rapidly unfolding and very often officers must respond quickly. SPD Policy 300, Use of Force, provides guidelines to officers regarding the use of force in situations.

Policy 300.3.2, "Factors used to determine the Reasonableness of Force", provides a list of these factors to consider when deciding to use force and at what level.

The incident under review involved Cpl. Dahle and his contact with an intoxiciated and belligerent suspect. In reviewing the incident and applying the factors under 300.3.2, there were many facts that Cpl. Dahle was aware of and had to consider in dealing with the suspect.

The suspect was an obvious immediate threat to Cpl. Dahle and potentially to other citizens standing by (i.e. family members and the neighbor). He had aggressively stepped forward and assaulted Dahle by striking him in the chest which, at least temporarily because the affect the strike had to his equipemnt, did not allow Cpl. Dahle to immediately call for assistance. The conduct of the suspect was obviously aggressive and assaultive in nature. The suspect, by all accounts, was very intoxicated and his mental state because of the alcohol or other unknown factors was negatively affected. It was clear that he had armed himself with a hammer when he knew the police were called and made

threatening statements toward law enforcement when he obtained the hammer. Officer Dahle knew of the information regarding the hammer but did not know where it was located. It was reasonable to believe that the suspect may still have it somewhere on his person. He was unrestrained and there was a strong potential for significant injury to Cpl. Dahle and the other people present if the suspect remained unrestrained. Additionally, if the suspect had decided to try and escape at some point during the contact, there is reason to believe that the orginal target of his aggression, the neighbor, could have still been in danger of being attacked by the suspect. Based on the circumstances and behavior of the suspect that Cpl. Dahle was faced with, a prompt resolution to the situation would help keep the suspect from escalating any further.

Cpl. Dahle attempted to speak to the suspect and de-escalate what was obviously a volatile situation. Cpl. Dahle responded within policy and training when he observed what he reasonably believed was an edged weapon that was accessed by the suspect. As soon as he realized it wasn't an edged weapon, he appropriately reholstered his sidearm. When the suspect immediately and aggressively approached and assaulted Cpl. Dahl with no provocation, Cpl. Dahle had to use force to keep from being assaulted further. The factors in play in this incident are described above. While elbow strikes to the head are not recommended and are considered an exceptional technique, Cpl. Dahle reacted instantly to the escalating threat posed by the suspect and, with the help of the suspect's brother (since Cpl. Dahle's backup had not yet arrived), was able to take the suspect into custody. Medics were summoned by Cpl. Dahle to ensure the suspect was not injured. He did sustain several minor scrapes that were consistent with a prone cuffing event.

Cpl. Dahle's use of force was within policy considering the circumstances and facts he was confronted with in this incident.

On 07-27-13 at approximately 1858 hours, I responded to the report of a disorderly male at 2721 W 6th. Heather Challenger had called to report that an intoxicated neighbor was arguing with her. Challenger further stated that the male was coming towards her, and was threatening her. The suspect was described as a W/M, 40's, thin build, wearing no shirt and jeans.

I was arriving on scene and dispatch advised that the male suspect was armed with a hammer. The male suspect was also reported to be yelling, "bring on the cops."

Several people in the area began pointing towards 2724 E 6th when I arrived on scene. I observed two males standing on the sidewalk in front of this address. I got out of my patrol vehicle and asked what was going on. One of the males (Shawn Blakesley) stated, "My brother is drunk and acting stupid."

I could see that the other male (Richard Blakesley) appeared very angry. Richard was scowling at me and grinding his teeth. I could see that his eyebrows were furrowed and he was glaring at me. I further noted that his hands were balled into fists by his sides. Richard was breathing very heavily at this time.

I asked Richard why he was so upset. Richard then reached his right hand into his front right pocket. He then produced a black rectangular object from this pocket. I immediately believed that he had pulled out a folding pocket knife. I drew my duty weapon to a low guard, and commanded Richard to drop the knife. Richard looked down and said, "What fucking knife?" Richard then opened his hand and I could see he was holding a black tipped lighter.

I holstered my weapon and Richard came directly towards me. Richard then hit me in the upper right chest/shoulder with his open right hand. This caused my lapel microphone to dislodge, and it swung outward and over my right shoulder. I attempted to take control of Richard by his left arm at this time, but he spun into the hold and was facing me. I then observed that Richard had his right hand balled into a fist, and he was drawing it backwards as if he were winding up to punch me.

Richard had been reported to be in possession of a hammer. He had gone into his pocket and produced what at first I thought to be a weapon. Richard was highly agitated and had already assaulted me. I had not checked him for weapons, and was alone with him. I also had no way to call for assistance, as my lapel microphone was over my shoulder and I was struggling with Richard.

I pulled Richard forward towards me to break his balance, and also to limit the area of my

body he could punch. I then delivered one elbow strike to the left side of Richards head with my right elbow. Richard was disoriented from the strike, and I was able to guide him to the ground at this time. Richard then pulled his right hand under and towards his waistband area. Again I had not checked him for weapons, and this is common area for concealing weapons.

I placed my left knee on Richards neck, and extended his left arm straight and against my body. I was then able to roll my right shoulder, and access my lapel microphone. I advised that Richard was fighting over the radio at this time. Richard then began to kick his feet upward into my legs. I could not prone handcuff Richard while he was kicking and struggling.

Shawn then grabbed Richard's feet and pulled them straight out. I was able to handcuff (dl) and arrest Richard at this time.

I requested a supervisor respond for the use of force. Sgt Braun later arrived and contacted Richard. It should be noted that my right elbow was sore and aching after I was forced to deliver the strike.

I then contacted the original complainant, Heather Challenger. Heather reported that Richard had been very intoxicated, and had been destroying a chair in front of 2724 W 6th. Richard had also been kicking a fence in front of the house. Heather stated that at first she had been amused by his drunken stupor.

Heather reported that she had six young children at her house, and Richard was escalating. Heather told Richard to calm down, or she would get his brother. Richard then began to yell and curse at her. Heather reported that she told Richard he was being silly.

Richard then walked out into the street and was coming towards Heather. Heather stated that Richard called her a "fucking bitch." Richard then stated that she "needed to get hit in the head." Heather told Richard that she was going to call the police. Richard the went and got a hammer. Richard was yelling to "bring on the cops." Heather then called the police at this time.

Richard was checked by medics on the scene. I was then contacted by Shawn. I apologized for the way things had gone with Richard. Shawn stated that Richard had given me no choice, and I had just done what I needed to.

Richard was transported to SCJ and booked for assault 3rd. I completed a charging request at that time.

I have no further information to report.

neighbor came toward her, and threatened to assault her. She also reported that he was armed with a hammer.

Before I arrived, I heard CPL Dahle that he was fighting with someone.

When I arrived, CPL Dahle had the suspect detained in handcuffs, and the suspect was lying on the ground. I searched the subject incident to arrest and placed him into OFC Yrigollen's patrol car.

I interviewed three people that had witnessed the confrontation between the suspect(Richard Blakesley), and CPL Dahle.

This is a summary of what Shawn E. Blakesley told me.

Rich is my brother. He lives across the street from me at 2724 E 6th. He is an alcoholic. Earlier today, my wife, Dana, heard a commotion and looked out the window. She saw Rich smashing a chair on the sidewalk, and she asked me to make him stop. I saw him smashing the yellow chair (the broken yellow chair was still on the sidewalk), and I convinced him to go back into the yard and calm down. I told him that he should go to sleep. My wife and I went out to dinner, and when we got back, I saw Rich in street, yelling at the neighbor. He had a hammer in his hand. I started telling him to calm down, and I took the hammer away from him. When the officer pulled up and got out of his car, I heard him ask Rich what was going on Rich shoved the officer, and the officer took him to the ground with a Muy Thai move. Rich was the aggressor, and continued to resist and to refuse to comply with the officer's commands to lie flat on the ground. I pulled Rich's legs out straight to help the officer. I was not trying to interfere or anything. I forgot to mention that at first, Rich was holding a cigarette lighter in his hand and the officer thought it was a knife, and the officer pulled his gun out. He put his gun away as soon as he saw that it was a lighter and not a knife.

This is a summary of what Dana L. Blakesley told me.

Rich is my brother-in-law. Earlier I saw him breaking a chair across the street. I sent Shawn over to calm him down, and I thought that it worked, so we sent out to dinner. When we came home from dinner, I saw her Rich in the street with a hammer, and my husband took it away from him. I saw the officer approach Rich, and I saw Rich push the officer. He took Rich to the ground.

This is a summary of what Christa L. Hunter told me.

1) I saw that guy (Rich Blakesley) kicking the fence apart at 2724 E 6th. My friend, Heather Challenger, asked him to calm down because he was scaring her children. He came out of

He was breathing hard and clenching his fist, and I thought that he was about to hit me. Heather said that she was calling the police. That guy said "bring on the cops". I saw his brother (Shawn) arrive and confront him. I saw the officer arrive and walk toward the drunk guy. I heard the officer speak to him, and reach toward him. Then I saw the drunk guy take a swing at the officer with a closed fist, and the officer hit the defendant with an elbow and wrestled him to the ground.
