Summary:

On 8-13-13 at 2240, Officer T. Nollmeyer #786, Officer A. Potter #938, and Corporal M. McNab #689 were dispatched to 424 E Gettysburg Ct on a report of a 16 year old with a knife threatening to harm himself and others. At 2242, radio updated the call stating that there were an additional 8 people in the house and that #14 was in possession of a knife and was threatening to harm himself and others in the house.

Crime:

-There was a possibility of felony harassment,

-The potential for a felony level assault,

-Threats to harm himself.

Threats:

-Male was in possession of a least one deadly weapon (knife),

-The male had stated his intent to harm himself and others inside the house,

-There were at least 8 other people inside the house,

-The layout and other possible weapons in the home were unknowns for the responding officers.

Resistance/Assaultive behaviors:

-The male was not putting down the knife for family members.

Officer Nollmeyer arrived on scene at 2244. Corporal McNab, Officer Potter, Officer D. Howe # 680, and Corporal K. Busch #625, arrived at the house within a couple minutes of Officer Nollmeyer. At 2248, Corporal McNab advised that bean bag rounds had been deployed. I arrived at 2255. Medics were on scene when I arrived.

I contacted Officer Nollmeyer. He told me that he brought his bean bag shotgun with him into the house to be used as a blunt impact device. He, along with Corporal McNab, ensured that the shotgun was only loaded and equipped with bean bag rounds. When he, along with Corporal McNab and Officer Howe, approached the doorway he could see #14 sitting on a mattress on the floor. They were approximately 10 to 12 feet from #14 They were not able to create any further distance from #14 due to the layout of the house. He could not see #14 hands. He heard Officer Howe order #14 several times to drop the knives. When #14 ignored the commands Officer Howe advised Officer Nollmeyer "index". Officer Nollmeyer confirmed with Officer Howe that #14 was still in possession of the knives. Officer Howe told Officer Nollmeyer that #14 still had the knives. Officer Nollmeyer yelled "index" and fired one bean bag round at #14 right thigh. Officer Howe said "again". Officer Nollmeyer understood that to mean that _____still had possession of the knives. Officer Nollmeyer again yelled "index". He fired an additional bean bag round at #14 pright hip. Officer Howe then said "move", which Officer Nollmeyer understood to mean that the second bean bag round was effective in getting #14 to drop the knives. #14 was then handcuffed in a prone position.

Officer Nollmeyer stated that Officer Howe was his lethal cover and that Corporal McNab was there to go hands on when the knives could be removed from #14

Additional threats:

- #14 was still in possession of two deadly weapons, knives,
- refused to drop the knives when ordered to do so,

-The officers were 10 to 12 feet from #14

I contacted **#14** He admitted that he was in possession of two knives. He heard the officers order him to drop the knives and admitted to ignoring the orders. He said, "I didn't want to listen". **#14** also admitted that he would have possibly stabbed a person, depending on who, if anyone entered his room.

I saw that the matching is a contusion on his the outside of his lower right buttock and a second contusion on the outside of his right thigh, approximately half way between his right knee and right hip. Corporal Busch took photographs.

I contacted #14 mother, Misty Hayes. She stated that #14 has ADHD, ODD, OCD, and Asperger's Syndrome. She stated that #14 was upset earlier in the day because one of his DVD's would not work properly. He went into his bedroom to calm down. When she entered his bedroom a short time later to bring him an ice cream cone she could see that his hooded sweatshirt was zipped up covering his face. When she got closer to him she could see that he two knives in his hands. #14 told her that he would hurt himself and possibly someone else if she did not leave his room and if anyone else entered his room.

Misty stated that she was still in shock that the **#14** had armed himself with two knives and that he had made a threat to harm himself and others. She stated that **#14** had never acted this way in the past and she did not know what triggered the behavior.

Misty told me that she was aware that #14 had been hit with two bean bag rounds. She

said, "I would rather him get hit with bean bags than stab himself".

#14 was transported to Sacred Heart for medical treatment and a mental health evaluation. Misty stated that she wanted #14 treated for mental health.

I contacted Corporal McNab. He stated that he was not in position to see if **#14** had any knives in his hands but heard Officer Howe and Officer Nollmeyer order **#14** to drop the knives several times. He heard Officer Nollmeyer yell "index". Officer Nollmeyer then deployed one bean bag round. The initial bean bag round was not effective. He heard Officer Howe continued to order **#14** to drop the knives. **#14** again did not respond to the lawful order. Officer Nollmeyer again yelled "index". Officer Nollmeyer deployed a second bean bag round. The second round was effective in getting **#14** to drop the knives. **#14** was then detained in handcuffs.

Officer Howe stated in his report that when he entered the house he heard a female, identified as Misty, calmly telling **141** to put down the knives. Officer Howe directed Misty to step back from the doorway, she complied. When Officer Howe reached the doorway he could see that **141** was holding a knife in each hand and that one of the knives was pointed toward his upper pelvic/thigh area. Officer Howe ordered **141** to drop the knives several times but

#14 did not respond or comply. Officer Howe noted that as he was trying to talk to

#14 that #14 was tightening his grip on the knives, gritting his teeth, and that his face was turning red. He also noted that it appeared that #14 was putting more pressure against his femoral artery with the knife in his right hand. At one point #14 while in a seated position, turned his body toward Officer Howe.

Officer Howe stated in his report that he was within 10 to 12 feet of #14. Due to the layout of the house it would have been very difficult to retreat without maintaining visual contact with #14 and getting to adequate cover.

Additional threats:

#14 was still in possession of deadly weapons, knives,

#14 was ignoring lawful commands to drop the knives,

#14 was tightening his grip on the knives,

#14 was gritting his teeth and his face was turning red,

#14 was pivoting his body toward officers while in a seated position,

-Due to the layout of the house officers had to be in close proximity to #14

-Due to the layout of the house it would have been very difficult for the officers to retreat without losing visual contact with #14 or finding adequate cover.

Officer Howe alerted Officer Nollmeyer of his observations. He heard Officer Nollmeyer yell "index". Officer Nollmeyer deployed one bean bag round. The initial round was not effective in getting #14 to drop the knives. Officer Howe told Officer Nollmeyer that the first bean bag round was not effective and that #14 was still in possession of the knives. Officer Nollmeyer yelled "index" and delivered a second bean bag round. The second round was effective in getting #14 to drop the knives. #14 was then taken into custody.

The force used by Officer Nollmeyer was within Spokane Police Department Policy and Procedure, Washington State Law, and the use of force factors set forth in Graham V Connor. The officers at the scene established a plan using an impact device while still having lethal cover and an officer assigned to go hands on when the knives were away from #14

The actions of the officers at the scene were well thought act, effective, and reasonable especially considering the extremely dangerous and high stress nature of the incident.

The subject, who was armed with knives, posed a deadly threat to occupants of the house and the officers who responded. The subject refused to drop the knives and appeared to increase his agitation level as the incident progressed. Officer Nollmeyer's use of beanbag rounds to force the subject to drop the knives was well thought out and an extremely effective tool. The force was reasonable and with policy guidelines.

Reviewer comment:

The mother of the individual in crisis indicated to officers that this was the first time that he had threatened to harm himself and/or others. As officers contacted him and began speaking to him, it was clear to them that he had the means of harming himself and was taking significant steps towards doing so. He was holding at least one of the knives against vulnerable parts of his body. Besides the threats to harm himself, he had indicated that he would harm others as well. There were other people inside the residence at the time. Officers were obligated to take appropriate measures to ensure the safety of the individual and others in the house as the threats from the suspect appeared credible. Additionally, officers described his agitation level as increasing as they continued to attempt to talk to him and attempt de-escalation verbals with him. Officers opted to deploy a kinetic energy projectile in the form of two bean bag rounds. They followed proper procedure in loading the bean bag rounds and ensuring the safety of others in doing so, established lethal cover and calling in medics to treat and care for the individual after he was disarmed and taken into protective custody. The use of the bean bag rounds in this incident were within policy and most probably kept the person from following through with the threats he had been making.

I asked Rochelle who was inside the home. Rochelle said that #14 's mother Misty was still at his bedroom doorway. Rochelle described where #14 bedroom was. She directed me upstairs and to the right.

I walked up the stairs. Ofc Howe and Cpl McNab joined me at the top of the stairs. I saw #14

He said yes. I yelled "index". I fired one beanbag round at #14 right thigh. I heard #14 groan. Ofc Howe said "again". I took this to mean that #14 still had the knives. I fired one more time at #14 right hip. I heard him yell and saw him rock backward. Ofc Howe said to move. I laid the bean bag shotgun down and followed Ofc Howe into the room. We were able to handcuff #14 in a prone position on the bed.

I saw two large knives on the bedroom floor near where the state had been sitting. Both were kitchen knives with black handles. The knives were each 6-8 inches long.

Cpl McNab spoke to **111**, **111**

Ofc Howe located both bean bags from the bedroom floor. The bean bags appeared intact and no shot pellets had escaped. I also collected to two shotgun shell casings from the hallway. I later took the bean bags, casings, and knives to the SPD property facility as evidence.

On 081313 at 2240 I responded along with officers Nollmeyer, Howe, and Potter to 424 E. Gettysburg Ct. on a report of domestic violence. The complainant was reporting that her 16 year old grandson, **144** grand grand grandson, **144** grand grand grandson, **144** grand gran

I arrived on scene with officers Howe and Nollmeyer at 2246. Officer Nollmeyer had deployed his bean bag shotgun. I assisted him in making sure the control device was only equipped with bean bag rounds. We formed a plan that, if necessary, Officer Nollmeyer would utilize the control device, officer Howe would be prepared with lethal back-up, and I would detain the subject once the situation was rendered safe.

As we approached the bedroom #14 mother was standing in the doorway and I could #14 sitting on the edge of his bed. I directed the mother to exit the residence for her see safety. The entrance to the bedroom was a narrow hallway. I could see #14 sitting on the bed but was unable to see the knife(s) he had in his hands. Officer Howe and Nollmeyer were in a better position to see the weapon. Officer Howe and Nollmeyer ordered **114** to drop the knife several #14 was unresponsive to their directions. Officer Nollmeyer announced "index" times. indicating that he was going to fire the control device. He fired one round which hit #14 in the upper right thigh area but apparently did not cause **#14** to drop his weapon. While verbal commands still being given by officer Howe. Officer Nollmeyer fired a second round hitting #14 in the same area causing him to roll onto his left side. Officer Howe indicated that #14 had now dropped the knife and we all three entered the room. #14 rolled onto his stomach and initially began to resist being handcuffed by pulling his arms away and kicking his legs. I took control of his legs while Officers Nollmeyer and Howe handcuffed him without further incident. After he was handcuffed I saw two large kitchen knives on the floor next to the bed where #14 was sitting.

After moving the knives away we sat up and requested medics respond to check his condition.

I spoke with **14** while waiting for medics to arrive. He said that his right thigh and butt was hurting. He advised that he was angry at his step-father and mother and wanted out of the house. **14** would not respond when I asked him if he was intending to hurt himself.

Officer Nollmeyer and Potter determined after interviewing the family that danger to himself or others and was in need of a mental evaluation.

Prior to **111** being transported to the hospital, I assisted Corporal Busch in exposing the area where the bean bag rounds had hit **111** so they could be photographed. In the privacy of the hallway I pulled **111** jeans down to where the wounds were exposed. **111** was wearing underwear which remained in place. The wounds were to his right upper thigh and right

On 08-13-13 (about 2246 hrs), I responded to 424 E. Gettysburg Ct, Spokane, WA to assist officers on a call of a DV W/A weapon. The complainant (id'd as Rochelle) called to advised that her grandson (was armed with a knife and was threatening to harm himself as well as #14 others with the knife. She further advised that the #14 had mental health issues.

Upon arrival, Ofc.. Nollmeyer was already on-scene. He advised me to pull right up to the house. When I pulled up I saw numerous people outside in the front yard. Many of them appeared to be very emotional. I could see a few of them crying. I noticed there were several young kids in the group as well as adults.

I quickly spoke to Rochelle. She said was inside the house and she pointed toward #14 was still armed with a knife. I asked her if he was alone and the front door. She told me she told me "No", and said his mother was in the room with him.

Myself and Ofc. Nollmeyer then entered the house. I could hear a female upstairs talking. I could hear her say several times in a very calm voice, " Please put down the knives." It was at this point, I realized several things. The first was that there was a citizen in danger and #14 was armed with more than one knife. second.

I walked up the stairs and to my right to a back bedroom. I saw the female in the doorway. I asked her to step backward and to please wait outside. She complied, I then looked inside and saw #14 sitting on the end corner of his bed, closest to the doorway. I saw he had 2 knives. He had one knife appearing to be pointed into his upper pelvic area/thigh. The knife was a long chef's type kitchen knife. I then noticed he had another large chef/kitchen knife in his left hand. He was holding this knife by the handle.

I noticed he had a very tight grip on the knife and he tightened his hand several times, as if he was getting a better grip on it. I immediately began to give him verbal commands for him to drop the knife. He did not comply.

I attempted again to calm him by talking slow, calm, and clear to him. I told him several times to "please drop the knife" and told him "I didn't want him to get hurt or for him to hurt anybody else". He did not comply.

The more I spoke to him, I could see the more agitated he became. I now noticed he gritting his teeth, his face was turning red, and he was getting a tighter and tighter grip on the knife in his left hand. I noticed he was also putting more pressure against his body from the knife in his right hand. The knife in his right hand was up near his femoral artery, and I knew if he cut himself there, he could die very quickly from bleeding out.

I also noticed that was beginning to slightly turn toward me. He once sat parallel with the bed facing the wall, but as he began to get more and more agitated, I saw his upper body slowly turning toward me, and he began to pivot his feet toward me.

It appeared to me as though he was beginning to take a fighting stance. I could see that as he once staired straight ahead toward the wall, he was now beginning to track me with his eyes, without moving his head. I could see his eyes were looking through me, as I have seen numerous times over the years when suspects are about to fight, also called the "1000 yard stare."

It should be noted that due to the way the house was laid out, we could not back out and still see **#14**. Due to the area of his body, he was holding the knife, I did not feel comfortable being further away at this point, if he did cut himself. This left us about 10-12 feet away from the armed subject.

It was at this point, I alerted Ofc. Nollmeyer of my observations. Moments later, I heard Ofc. Nollmeyer announce that he was deploying and index weapon.

Ofc. Nollmeyer delivered 2 bean bag (Supersock) rounds at **14** I noticed that the first round hit **14** near the right thigh area. I could hear **14** groan in pain, alerting me that the round hit him and that it caused the desired affect, however he did not drop the knives, despite my ongoing verbal commands for him to do so. Ofc. Nollmeyer then deployed a 2nd round, which struck him near the right buttocks area, this time he complied with my verbal commands and dropped the knives.

We then moved in and took custody of #14 He was detained him handcuffs (dl). We then had medics come in and check on #14

Cpl. Busch arrived to photograph the scene. Sgt. Braun was advised of the incident and also arrived on scene. #14 was transported to the hospital for a mental eval.
