Summary:

Officer McMurtrey responded to a robbery call at 1104 E. Indiana where the suspect, Rondale Pleasant, was armed with a knife and a gun. Pleasant was also intoxicated. He was considered a violent offender and was a convicted felon. Pleasant was also wanted on a DOC escape warrant. With those facts, Officer McMurtrey approached the residence with his rifle. A male walked out of the residence that Officer McMurtrey recognized as Pleasant. It was dusk, there were bystanders in the area, it was unknown who else was in the house, and there had been a violent crime committed by Pleasant. Officer McMurtrey pointed his rifle at Pleasant and ordered him to the ground. At first Pleasant did not comply, but McMurtrey and Officer Dollard were able to arrest Pleasant. The resident at that address, Pleasant's mother gave search consent. Two guns and the knife were found inside along with drugs Pleasant had asked his mom to hide. There were someone hiding in a closed that had a warrant.

Reviewer comment:

The information received by the responding officers was that the suspect was armed with a handgun and a knife. Additionally, the suspect had assaulted and robbed a female identified as his girlfriend. Officers were also advised that the suspect was intoxicated. Officer confirmed a felony DOC warrant for the suspect and were aware of his appearance based on the SPRS booking photo that officers had available to them. Additionally, Radio had advised that the suspect was a violent offender and convicted felon.

When Officer McMurtrey observed the suspect leave the residence, he recognized him as the suspect. He was also aware of the background information on the suspect and his current state including the information about the weapons he had. Officer McMurtrey pointed his department issued rifle at the suspect, identified himself as the police and told him he was under arrest. The suspect eventually complied and was taken into custody. Two firearms were subsequently recovered from inside the residence.

Officer McMurtrey's response and actions were very reasonable considering the situation and information he had recieved. He took actions necessary to keep all citizens, including himself and other officers safe from harm. His actions were within policy.

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On 09/12/13 at approx. 1915 hrs, I was dispatched to a report of a possible robbery that just occurred outside of 1104 E. Indiana Ave. A female named Nicole Abraham told 911 that her boyfriend took her purse and pulled her out a car. She identified her boyfriend as Rondale Pleasant and told the dispatcher that Pleasant was armed with a handgun and ran back into the residence at 1104 E. Indiana Ave.. Abraham said she would be waiting at a nearby intersection for contact with officers.

Ofc. C. McMurtrey and I were the first to arrive, but could not locate Abraham. Cpl. Dahle and Ofc. A. Ross also arrived to help set up containment on the residence to prevent anyone from entering it or a suspect(s) from escaping. Dispatch advised over the radio that Pleasant had a confirmed DOC escape warrant as well.

In the process of getting in position, I had dispatch call Abraham to attempt to locate her, but they were not having any luck. Less than ten minutes into this call, a male walked out of the house and toward the street. I recognized the male from a SPRS booking photo as Rondale Pleasant. Ofc. McMurtrey began issuing commands for Pleasant to put his hands in the air and to get on the ground. Pleasant appeared agitated at our demands, but complied and was detained in handcuffs.

I asked Pleasant who was inside the residence and he hesitated as he said, "Just my mom."

At this point we had not located Abraham and there was some suspicion that she may have gone back into the residence or was in need of assistance. I directed the other officers to attempt to make

contact with anyone inside the house and enter if neccessary based on the exigent circumstance that someone inside needed our assistance.

I remained outside with Pleasant and advised him of his miranda rights which he said he understood. I explained to him why we were there and asked who "Nicole" Abraham was. He said, "I don't know who the fuck your talking about. I have nothing to say to you."

After approx. ten minutes, a female walked outside who identified herself as the homeowner, Monet Averill. I explained to Monet why we were there and asked her if she had information about Abraham or an earlier incident. She said she knew her as Pleasant's girlfriend. However she did not know anything about a fight or gun. I asked her if she or anyone else in the house owned a gun or knew of any inside the house. She said, "There shouldn't be any." I asked her why and she indicated she and her husband had previous felony convictions and could not possess them.

Ofc. McMurtrey was walking a male out in handcuffs who was identified as Hymatoya Rickard. He was apparently hiding in a closet and had several felony warrants for his arrest. Ofc. McMurtrey advised me at this time that no firearms were seen in plain view, but he did come across some bullets and a handgun case on the floor of a bedroom. (See Ofc. McMurtrey's report)

I asked Monet about this information and she seemed surprised and said she had never seen those items prior to today. She said the last gun that had been in the house that she knew of was over three months ago when her brother brought one over, but then shortly after sold it. In the interest of satisfying my suspicions, I called Monet's brother, Edward "Buck" Jackson, to confirm her story.

Jackson said he used to have a revolver that he kept there for a short period of time, but sold it approx. three months ago. When I asked him what caliber and make it was, he seemed unsure and said it was a ".38"

I asked Ofc. McMurtrey what caliber the bullets he located were and he said they were .40 caliber for a semi-auto.

At this point, I had probable cause to believe there was a gun inside the residence and based on all the information I had of the people who had been inside, no one could legally own or possess one. I explained this to Monet and asked her for her consent to search her residence for any firearms. I also advised her of her right to refuse, restrict or revoke the search at any time (See attached consent card). I told Monet if she did not want to give me consent I could apply for a search warrant.

Monet agreed to the search and explained that she did not want to cover for anyone and had no knowledge of any guns inside her home.

Monet accompanied us into the home. At the same time, her	#2d , ca	me up to

the door and asked if he could come in to use the bathroom. I wanted to accommodate him but stated I first had to confirm there were no hidden weapons in there before he went in.

I first scanned the bathroom and counter top. I then opened the sink cabinet and almost immediately I saw the butt of a brown handled revolver. It appeared to have been hastily stashed behind some items. I called for a Corporal to take a photo of it before collecting the gun.

I asked Monet about this new development and she maintained her innocence and further added that she saw Pleasant run into the bathroom just moments before he walked outside. I asked her if he directed her to hide the gun for him and she said, "No he didn't. The only thing he wanted me to hide were some drugs he had on him."

Monet took me over to the bedroom and pointed to the mattress as she explained she hid them underneath. Ofc. McMurtrey pulled the mattress back and there I saw a small balled up baggy with numerous round-white pills inside. Next to the pills were two rolled up twenty dollar bills.

Based on my training and experience, I recognized these as prescription drugs and in the manner in which they were stored, were indicative of controlled substances packaged for sale. I noted there were numbers on the pills and I asked dispatch to call poison control to determine what they were. Dispatch confirmed they were Morphine Sulfate, 30 mg, a schedule 2 narcotic.

I seized these items which were in plain view, as evidence of the crime of Possession with intent to deliver-narcotics. Monet at this point dropped her head and said, "My son's a junkie. I didn't want him to get in trouble again because he's going away for a long time."

I then continued my search of Monet's bedroom and upon entering the closet, I looked up on the shelf. There I saw the but end of another revolver inside a nylon holster.

Corporal B. Kakuda arrived and took photos of the guns before I seized them. Upon checking the .22 revolver under the sink, I noted it was loaded with one round ready to fire. The .357 was unloaded.

At this point, I explained to Monet that charges would be pending against her or any other person in the house who was prohibited from possessing firearms if latent fingerprint evidence was obtained from them.

Ofc. A. Ross transported Pleasant to the Spokane Co. Jail and booked him for his warrant and PCS Intent to deliver. Rickard was also booked for his warrants.

I took the two guns, pills, money and ammo, out to SPD Property and placed them on as evidence.

I later went back to the residence and contacted Monet's husband, Ronald Averill, and Edward

Jackson. Ronald denied any knowledge of the .22 revolver but admitted he was aware of the .357. He further explained Jackson had left it there and he placed it high up in the closet because they watched their daughter's three year old son often. Ronald was aware he was a convicted felon and said he forgot to tell Jackson to take it away.

I spoke to Jackson who confirmed the story about the .357. He also indicated the .22 revolver was likely his that he usually kept at his house. He would not go so far as to say someone stole it from there, but he could not account for the last time he saw it and did not give anyone permission to have it.

At this time no further arrest were made. Both guns were not listed as stolen. All persons with the exception of had all had previous felony convictions.

Nicole Abraham called 911 to report that her boyfriend, Rondale Pleasant took her purse out of her hands and punched her. She reported he was armed with a knife and a gun. He was reported to be inside 1104 E Indiana. The 911 call recorded his clothing as being a blue and white plaid shirt and blue jeans. I accessed pleasant's booking photo via computer.

Rondale showed to have a felony warrant for DOC escape community custody. He was reported to be intoxicated. SPD dispatch advised that Rondale is considered a violent offender and a convicted felon, making it unlawful for him to possess a firearm.

Abraham was reported to be at the corner of Morton and Indiana with another male.

Upon arrival, I attempted to contact Abraham at Morton and Indiana. She was never located. We officers on scene requested SPD dispatch call her phone with no success. She was never located.

Officer Dollard met me on the SW corner of Morton and Indiana. Officer Dollard and I are both SPD SWAT team operators.

I deployed to the house with my department issued M4 carbine rifle based on the report that Rondale was reportedly armed with a pistol, intoxicated, I was investigating a violent crime (robbery and domestic violence) and he had a felony warrant for his arrest.

We approached the house from East to West in the front of the residence.

We contacted an unidentified white male in the front of the house, who drive up in a pickup. He stated he was called to the residence to see if everything was okay. While Officer Dollard was debriefing the male, I observed a male walk out of the front door of the target address, 1104 E Indiana.

The male was wearing a white and blue plaid button up shirt and blue jeans. He was a black male fitting the listed booking photo physical description. I recognized the male's face as being that of the Rondale's booking photo.

It was about 1925 hours and dusk. I was investigating a report of a violent felony crime of robbery and domestic violence. The suspect, Rondale Pleasant was currently wanted for a felony DOC escape warrant. He was reported to be armed with a gun and intoxicated. We were in front of a house with an unknown number of people in an uncontained area. There were uninvolved and innocent bystanders outside in the are and in the path of any traveling bullets. It was my intent and duty to take Rondale Pleasant into custody with minimal risk to the safety of civilians/innocent bystanders, police officers on scene as well as the suspect.

I pointed my rifle at Rondale and announced his name, that I was the police and that he was under arrest. I illuminated Rondale with my weapon mounted light.

I ordered him to place his hands in the air. He immediately looked at me and reached in to the front breast pocket of his shirt. He threw out some cash and other unknown items. I gave him a clear and concise verbal warning to place his hands in to the air and not reach in to his pockets. I ordered Rondale to lie in the ground (prone position) with his arms out to his side.

Officer Dollard and I approached Rondale. I provided cover for Officer Dollard while he detained Rondale in handcuffs.

Officer Woodyard and I then approached the house and knocked on the door.

I contacted Rondale's mother (Monique Averioll), who answered the door. She stated there was nobody inside the house other than she and her 4 year old grandson (later identified as #2

I asked them both to come outside and explained the crime I was investigating.

Monique, while sitting on the porch, stated she had to go to the bathroom and that it was emergent.

Officer Woodyard, being a female, offered to escort Monique in to the bathroom of the house. We were still unsure if the victim, Abraham was inside in danger, as she was yet unaccounted for. We were concerned that there was a gun or guns inside the residence based on the initial 911 call.

I entered the front foyer of the home with Officer Woodyard to provide security, as the house was yet cleared of persons hiding.

Officer Woodyard then alerted that there was male hiding in a closet near her. He was directed out and detained. While detaining the male, he made an unsolicited statements, "Damn, I have a warrant". Officer Gately identified him as Matoya Rickard. His warrants were later confirmed and he was booked in to jail.

We then cleared the house for additional persons with none found. I located a marijuana growing operation in the basement. This consisted of two separate rooms with exhaust fans, light ballasts and two marijuana plants. Each plant was about two to three feet in height. One plant was thick with buds.

Officer Dollard obtained a signed search consent card from Monique to search the house for guns and evidence of the robbery, see his report. I heard Officer Dollard twice remind Monique of her right to restrict or revoke the search at any time. She stated she understood.
