Application of K-9 in this instance was not effective due to the suspect's ability to free himself from the contact and go over a fence high enough that the dog could not follow. Inspection of the suspect's injuries post-arrest indicated only a very minor contact. The use of K-9 was withing policy, case law and use of force guidelines.

#### INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:

Type of Application: Running Take

### Original Call:

Officer Gorman responded to 18109 E Alki to assist SPD PACT and US Marshalls in an attempt to locate and arrest a wanted subject. The subject was Anthony R Vasquez. Vasquez confirmed felony warrants for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm and Murder 1st degree. Vasquez fled from the Moses Lake area and was hiding out in Spokane.

#### Suspect Actions:

As Police were making announcements at the front of the residence, Vasquez opened the rear sliding door and ran from the house. He ran straight north, directly at Ofc Gorman, who was on the other side of a chain link fence. Vasquez started to climb the fence to get into the yard Ofc Gorman was in, then saw Ofc Gorman and quickly jumped off the fence and ran to the west instead. Ofc Gorman made a K-9 announcement, but Vasquez made no attempt to slow down and started to climb another 6' vinyl fence to the west.

#### Est. Time & Distance of Contact (if known):

Ofc Gorman was within 20-30 feet of Vasquez during the contact. The contact lasted approximately 5 seconds.

#### Officer Safety Concerns/ Why was Canine used:

Vasquez was obviously a huge risk to Officers and the public due to recently committing a murder with a firearm. It was unknown if he was still armed, but he had not been searched and Vasquez was wearing a large, baggy sweatshirt that could have easily concealed a weapon. It was also during the hours of darkness.

#### TRAINING COMMENTS:

#### Canine Effectiveness:

The actions of Officer Gorman and K-9 Maximus were effective, fell within Spokane Police policy, and met department expectations. The use of the canine increased the likelihood that Vasquez was apprehended

The actions of Patrol Officers were effective, within Spokane Police policy, and met department expectations.

#### SUPERVISORY COMMENTS:

## K-9 Supervisor Comments:

Officer Gorman was assisting SPD PACT and US Marshall's with locating and apprehending a wanted murder suspect (Vasquez). As Officers were in the process of containing the residence that Vasquez was hiding at, he fled out of the back towards Officer Gorman and K-9 Max. Officer Gorman gave a K-9 announcement and then deployed K-9 Max to apprehend Vasquez. K-9 Max chased and caught Vasquez as he was going over a fence. K-9 Max made contact with Vasquez's right foot, but Vasquez was able to break contact and get over the fence and continue fleeing on foot. By the time Officer Gorman and K-9 Max made it over the fence Vasquez was out of sight. Perimeter Officers were able to apprehend Vasquez without further incident.

ASSIST OTHER AGENCY

On 092113, Officers from the Spokane Police Department PACT assisted the US Marshalls Fugitive Task Force in locating Anthony R. Vasquez 012590. Anthony was a suspect in a recent Gang homicide in Moses Lake. He had warrants for felony 1st degree murder and unlawful possession of a firearm.

US Marshalls developed information that he was possibly at a gang safe house located at 18109 E. Alki in Spokane Valley Washington. Intelligence gathered indicated that "Candice" and "Ralph" live at that location. There was also information that a male named Michael T. Bellinger 060392 might be staying at the house.

It was known that Anthony shot a rival gang member in the face from point blank range. The shotgun had not been recovered and he was presumed to armed and extremely dangerous.

As Sgt. of the PACT team, I called in additional city recourses of a patrol K-9 and on duty SWAT team members with an armored vehicle, in addition to the US Marshall's already working the case. We determined the appropriate course of action was to surround the residence and attempt to call subjects out of the residence for their safety.

At 2126 hrs, all Officers and Marshalls arrived on scene. We used emergency lights and sirens as well as the PA to announce our presence. Officers advised that somebody looked out the front window nobody came outside. At 2136 hrs, I heard Officers advise by radio that they had somebody coming out the back door. The then advised that he was jumping fences WB and had clearly been able to escape our inner perimeter. Several Officers ran towards the NW and requested a perimeter. I heard Officer Gorman advise that there was a K-9 contact but the suspect was still fleeing the area.

I drove W/B on Alki and then turned N/B onto Long Rd and advised county dispatch of the situation. I was requesting additional units for a larger perimeter when I observed Anthony Vasquez running W/B on Broadway at Long. Officer Dollard was chasing directly behind him.

As I pulled quickly and close to Vasquez I saw Officer Dollard trip and fall. At that moment Vasquez stopped and turned around towards Officer Dollard. I saw Vasquez hands come up as if he was giving up but I was still concerned about Officer Dollard's safety since he was carrying a long rifle and was now exposed and on the ground. I did not see any guns in Vasquez' hands but he could have quickly gotten to Officer Dollard.

I slammed the breaks on my car and jumped out as quick as I could. I learned shortly after that I had inadvertently failed put the gear in park. Vasquez went to the ground a few feet in front of my patrol car. I began prone cuffing by pulling his right arm behind his back. One Officer (Possibly Dollard) came to assist to get his left arm that he had tucked under his body.

That is when I heard an Officer yelling for us to "Watch out". I looked back and saw my patrol car rolling very slowly towards us. I reached back with my left arm and pushed on my front bumper. The car slowed even more but the push bumper was pushing into my left forearm. I looked down and saw that Vasquez legs and buttocks were under the front end of the car and between the front tires. I let go of the car, grabbed him by his sweatshirt and pulled him forward out from under the car and then towards the passenger side away from the tires. An unknown Officer stopped my car and put it in park.

At no time was he actually struck by the vehicle or run over by any part of the vehicle as I was

sitting on his torso the entire time and had a clear view of his body and the vehicle. After dragging him out of the way I was able to get him into handcuffs without incident. He did have minor abrasions on his right foot, right schin, left knee, and scratches on his forehead. Those minor injuries were most likely caused by dragging him, prone cuffing, and the fact that he was bit by a K-9 and ran through a few fences.

Vasquez was transported to Deaconess and cleared for the K-9 bite. He was transported to jail and booked his murder warrant. Grant County was advised by the US Marshalls and they advised they would be there the following day.

It is unknown if there was anyone else in the house because nobody came out and we did not have enough information to go in. Grant County did not want us to hold the house for a search warrant. There were two cars parked in the driveway (see vehicle section). One of them is registered to Candice Beckham. "Ralph" was never identified and Bellinger was never contacted. This report is informational only.

On 092113 at approx 2004hrs I responded to 18109 E Alki to assist SPD PACT and US Marshalls attempt to locate and arrest a wanted subject. The subject was Anthony R Vasquez, dob 01-25-1990. Vasquez had confirmed outstanding felony warrants for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm and Murder 1st degree. Vasquez fled from the Moses Lake area and was hiding out in Spokane.

US Marshalls developed information that Vasquez was hiding in a residence at 18109 E Alki. Vasquez was most likely armed, due to the use of firearms in the murder. We responded to the area to arrest Vasquez.

Upon arrival, SPD K9 Maximus and I took up a position in the back yard of the residence to the north, 18106 E Springfield. From my position, I could see the entire back of the suspect house. The two back yards were separated by a 6' chain link fence. Ofcs Buchmann and Dollard joined me in the back yard. Several other officers responded to the front, including several marked Police vehicles and the SPD 'Bearcat' armored vehicle.

From my position, I could see the flashing lights on the vehicles, and I heard several PA announcements from the vehicles. The announcements were ordering the residence of 18109 E Alki to exit the front of the residence with their hands up. After approx 5 minutes of announcements, I observed Vasquez open the rear sliding door and run from the house. Vasquez was wearing a large, baggy sweatshirt and it was unknown if he was still in possession of a firearm. He ran straight north, pretty much right at me. Vasquez started to climb the fence to get into the yard I was in, then he saw me through the chain link fence and quickly jumped off the fence and ran to the west. I yelled, 'Police! Stop running or I will send the dog! He will bite you!' Vasquez made no attempt to slow down and started to climb a 6' vinyl fence to the west. I deployed K9 Maximus for the following reasons:

#### Severity of the Crime-

Vasquez was wanted for 1st Degree Murder. He also had a confirmed outstanding DOC warrant for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

#### Risk to Officers and Public-

Vasquez was obviously a huge risk to Officers and the public due to recently committing a

Murder with a Firearm. It was unknown if he was still armed, but he had not been searched and was wearing baggy clothing.

Actively resisting arrest or fleeing-

Vasquez already fled Moses Lake after committing the murder. It was very likely he would flee Spokane if not arrested guickly. During this incident, Vasguez observed the Police vehicles in front of the house and decided to flee out the back door. Vasquez observed me and K9 Max, then decided to run the other direction in an attempt to escape.

K9 Max was given the command to contact Vasquez. I assisted K9 Max over the 6' chain link fence. K9 Max ran towards Vasquez, who was already climbing over the vinyl fence into another yard to the west. K9 Max was able to contact Vasquez on his right foot, through his shoe. Vasquez violently kicked his foot back and forth and was able to shake K9 Max off. Vasquez fell off the fence and into the yard to the west, 18021 E Alki. He immediately turned back north and kicked out several panels in a wooden fence, and entered the vard of 18020 E Springfield.

As Vasquez was getting into that yard, I was assisting K9 Max over the vinyl fence and into the back vard of 18021 E Alki. By the time we got over, I lost sight of Vasquez. Other officers observed him run to the north, and were able to detain him.

Sqt Eckersley and Sqt Kendall were advised of the contact. Vasquez was transported to Deaconess for treatment of his injuries. Injuries consisted of two small scratches that broke the skin but were not bleeding on the top of his right foot. Due to the thickness of his leather shoes, there were very slight injuries. Injuries were photographed by Cpl Oien.

Due to the nature of his warrants and the ongoing investigation, I did not read Vasquez his constitutional rights or ask him and questions regarding the K9 contact. Vasquez did tell me he didn't know he had been contacted by a K9 and wasn't having any pain on the contact location.

On 09/21/13 at approx. 2030 hrs, I was dispatched to thearea of I90 and Barker Rd. to assist Spokane PD P.A.C.T officers and U.S. Marshalls in the capture of a suspect wanted for homicide.

I was advised that Anthony Vasquez was wanted out of Grant Co. for homicide and there was information that he was hiding out at a residence located at 18109 E. Alki Ave, in the Spokane Valley. Prior to going there, I looked at a drivers license photo of Vasquez.

We arrived at the residence at approx. 2115 hrs and myself, along with Ofc's P. Buchmann and P. Gorman and I took up surveillance of the back of the house from a neighboring yard.

Shortly after getting into position, the other officers on the front of the house began P.A. announcements identifying them as police and ordering Vasquez to come out. Minutes later, I saw the rear slider door open and a male stuck his head out and was looking around. The male, who I could see had a bald head began running straight toward the fence Ofc P. Gorman, with his police K9, and I were standing near. Just as the male started to go over he became startled and jumped off the fence and ran back into the yard. I lost sight of him and could hear him jumping another fence.

Within seconds, I heard one of the officers say, "he's headed north!" I ran along the fence until I came out onto Springfield Ave. and could see the male running north between the houses.

As I gave chase, I announced several times, "police! stop!" I could the see the male was wearing a grey hooded sweat shirt and black shorts, and he looked back over his shoulder at me several times.

The foot pursuit continued into an undeveloped field south of I-90, going northwest toward Long Rd. Eventually I caught up to the suspect behind the parking lot of a church near Long Rd. and Broadway Ave. and he put his hands on top of this head and said, "I'm done."

Due to the severity of the crime he was alleged to have committed and the fact that I was still alone, I directed him to the ground in a prone handcuffing position and placed my knee on the back of his neck, while giving him the command to "not move".

At the same time, Ofc. Buchmann ran up as well as Sgt. Eckersley and they assisted in handcuffing the suspect. This was my first opportunity to clearly see his face and I was certain it was Vasquez. No weapons were found on him during a search of his person.

During the capture, Sgt. Eckersley's car rolled ahead into us so I quickly jumped into it and placed into park.

I retraced my foot chase to attempt to locate any evidence or property that may have been thrown and none was found.

On 09-21-13 at about 2021 hours, I responded to the area of Barker Road and I90 to assist PACT units and US Marshals in the apprehensions of a homicide suspect out of Moses Lake. Earlier in the week, we had received information that there had been a homicide in Moses Lake and the suspect, Anthony Vasquez, was possibly in Spokane. Officers received information on his possible location and called for assistance.

Upon arrival, we were briefed that Vasquez was possibly in a house at 18109 E. Alki. Officer Dollard and I, along with Officer Gorman and his K9 went to a yard behind the suspect location to establish a rear perimeter. Other Officers went to the front of the address and began making announcements for everyone inside to come out. Officers in the front advised that a male quickly looked out the window but went back inside.

A couple minutes later, I observed the curtains move at a sliding glass door at the rear of the residence. A male opened the slider and came into the back yard. He began running north, directly toward the yard where we were. He started to jump the fence but saw Officers Gorman and Dollard and jumped back down. I heard Officer Gorman giving commands to stop and then saw the male jump over a fence to the west. I jumped up on the fence and saw the male now north through the neighboring yard.

Officer Dollard and I gave chase of the male, northbound through more yards, crossing Springfield and Broadway Avenues and into a large field just south of I-90. The male then went to the west, between I-90 and a church. As he came to another fence, he slowed and put his hands up in the air. Sgt. Eckersley pulled up at that point and stopped his patrol car just to the south of the male. Officer Dollard and Sergeant Eckersley started to take the male into custody and I observed Sgt. Eckersley's patrol car rolling towards them. I yelled to them and Officer Dollard ran to secure the car. The vehicle continued to roll forward, rolling into them. Sgt. Eckersley and I pulled the male away from the rolling car.

Once the male was secured in handcuffs, I observed him and confirmed that it was Vasquez. He was placed in a patrol car.

Officer Dollard and I walked back along the route that we had run to check for any items that may have been discarded by Vasquez as he ran. We did not locate anything.

On 09-21-13 myself along with other PACT members assisted the US Marshalls office in trying to locate a homicide suspect, Anthony Vasquez, that was reportedly in the Spokane area.

We ended up responding to 18109 E Alki Ave where we believed Vasquez to be hiding. Several members of the Spokane Police department surrounded the house and began making verbal requests, Via P.A., for the homeowners to come out and talk to us. At one point the blinds moved in the front window, so we knew someone was inside, but had yet to come out. We continued to do verbal requests, but did not get a response.

A few minutes after seeing the blinds move I heard the rear containment team yelling that they had a runner from the house. I saw Vasquez jump over the white 6 ft vinyl fence on that side. Vasquez rolled over the fence and fell onto his side. He immediately got up and ran northbound into a wooden fence that he broke as he ran into it. It appeared he hit the fence unintentionally with his right shoulder and possibly his head. He hit the fence again, deliberately with his hands, breaking more boards so he could continue northbound into the yard of 18020 E Springfield.

At that point I saw Ofc Gorman's K9 come over the vinyl fence towards me. I stood by and waited for Ofc Gorman to lead his dog through the broken wooden fence, then joined him as we began to try and locate Vasquez.

As we were trying to locate Vasquez I heard other officers advised they had taken him into custody at Long and Broadway.

As I was walking back to my car I attempted to contact the residents of 18020 E. Springfield and let them know how their fence got broken, but did not get an answer. I took photos of the damage to their fence, then continued into the yard that Vasquez fell into after crossing the vinyl fence. Where he landed was a pair of shoes, a cellular phone, some rolled up paper money, a cigarette box and a small baggie of suspected marijuana. I took photos of these items and then collected them. The marijuana was placed on property to be destroyed and the rest of the items were taken with him to jail.

Once I got back to my car I was informed that Vasquez was in the back seat. I transported him to Deaconess medical center to be checked out. He had been contacted by Ofc Gorman's K9
