Reviewer comment:

This was an appropriate and effective use of K-9. Suspect was wanted for an assault, and knowingly ran from law enforcement to avoid capture, secreting himself in a neighbor's dog house. Suspect sustained injuries consistent with a K-9 contact to his heel, and was treated for the heel injury as well as other much more severe cuts sustained when he punched through a pane of glass. Application of the K-9 was within policy, case law and use of force guidelines.

Reviewer comment:

Officers on scene had an obligation to make any efforts necessary to apprehend the suspect. The DV victim would remain risk if the suspect remained at large. Additionally, other citizens and neighbors could also be negatively affected by the suspect. In fact, the suspect was apprehended hiding on the property of a neighbor. The use of the K9 was effective and within policy.

INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:

Type of Application: Track

Original Call:

Ofc. Ames and Ofc. Baldwin were both on scene at a domestic violence call. The male suspect (Kimrey) fled on foot out the back door. Ofc. Ames pursued him for a few blocks but eventually lost sight of the suspect as he jumped a chain link fence at Howard and Heroy, which was on the north west side of an elementary school.

Suspect Actions:

The suspect fled on foot after intentionally punching out a window and assaulting his girlfriend. As soon as the Officer's knocked on the door, the suspect fled.

Est. Time & Distance of Contact (if known):

Less than 5 minutes and Ofc. Hamilton was about 15 feet away, at the end of the tracking line.

Officer Safety Concerns/ Why was Canine used:

There was probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violent crime of city assault-DV, which had just occurred and was within the 4 hour mandatory arrest time frame. There was also probable cause to arrest the suspect for malicious mischief-DV. There was also probable cause for obstructing a police officer.

The suspect was actively fleeing on foot to avoid getting arrested.

The suspect posed an immediate threat to the victim of the crime. If not located and arrested, he could have easily returned to the original location and done further harm to the victim. He already showed a propensity for violence and even punched out a window, demonstrating his extremely belligerent and violent behavior. It was unknown what the suspect's intent was? The suspect posed a threat to the searching Officer's and fled into the dark of the night. The suspect disappeared into the residential neighborhood, also putting the residents in unknown harm.

INJURY DESCRIPTION:

Injury:

Kimrey had numerous cuts from punching the window. He had a large cut on his right inner elbow area, scrapes on both wrists, and one on his left shin, which was most likely from jumping the fence. His left heal had a tear about 2" long, which is where Leo had made contact.

Officer Hamilton responded to assist Officers with locating a DV suspect that had fled on foot when Officers arrived. Officers had chased the suspect (Kimrey) but had lost him and could not locate him. Prior to deployment Officer Hamilton gave a verbal K-9 announcement. Officer Hamilton then deployed K-9 Leo to track Kimroy from his last known location. K-9 Leo tracked, located, and apprehended Kimroy by contact on his foot as he was hiding in a dog house. Officer Hamilton released K-9 Leo as soon as it was safe to do so. Kimroy was taken into custody without further incident.

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On 09-16-13 at about 0224 hours I was dispatched to a possible domestic violence call at 4212 N. Wall. An anonymous neighbor was calling to report hearing a lot of yelling and the sounds of things being broken at the house.

I arrived with Officer Ames and could hear immediately the sounds of arguing between a male and a female at the address. I heard the female say, "thats why I wanted you to just leave, you're scaring me to death, I don't know what you are going to do next", "I am scared for my life with you some times".

I knocked on the door but no one answered right away. I then heard a noise near the side door. I looked over the fence and saw a white male exit out the side door and run toward the alley. I velled at him, "police stop, come back here". The male ran east to the alley and then north up the alley.

Officer Ames heard me yelling and went to the north trying to contact the male, see Ames' report.

I then saw the female run out the side door and run toward the back alley too. I yelled at the female to stop too, but she kept running. I ran around to the alley to try to contact the female and then she ran back toward the house. I finally contacted her near the side door. I could see right away that she

was covered in blood. She denied being hurt and didn't need any medical attention.

I identified the female as Kayla Petty. She confirmed that she had been assaulted by the male, her boyfriend of two years, and that he had smashed the back door window out, which caused a laceration on his arm.

I advised radio and responding units that there was PC for City Assault DV, City Malicious Mischief DV and Obstructing Police. Other officers assisted the K-9 and soon located the suspect male, Joseph Kimrey, and he was taken into custody. See Officer Ames and Officer Hamilton's report.

I was able to interview Kayla completely. She did admit that she and Joe were drinking alcohol tonight, both at a local bar and at home. She also admitted that they both had smoked marijuana earlier in the night.

Kayla said that when they got home from the bar, they began arguing and she said she did not even remember what the argument was about. She said that she knew Joe was very drunk, because she can see it in his eyes when he crosses the line and gets out of control.

Kayla said that she told him to just leave and to go to his mom's house, which is just a few blocks away. She said that Joe would not leave and kept getting in her face and getting louder and louder, yelling and screaming at her.

Kayla said that she was very scared for her safety and fully anticipated being assaulted by Joe, because of the way he was acting. Kayla said that she finally got him to leave out the side door, which made him even more mad. She said that he was yelling at her through the door, and then punched the window glass of the door. She said the glass shattered and it cut Joe's arm immediately. She said that he came back into the house and grabbed her in the kitchen. She said he shoved her backwards by the shoulders and then grabbed her wrists and pushed her up against the kitchen counter. Kayla said that she kept yelling at him to, "stop, stop, just leave".

She said that she did get away from Joe, and they yelled at each other for a few minutes until going back into the living room, which is when the police knocked on the door.

Kayla said that Joe has never assaulted her in the past but the way he was acting tonight really scared her. She was crying and very upset as she talked to me.

I could see bloody hand marks on Kayla's wrists and on her upper arms, just like she had explained, from Joe grabbing her. I could also see blood spread all over her neck, shirt and down her legs, obviously all from direct contact with Joe, who was bleeding badly.

It was clear that there was a domestic violence situation tonight between Kayla and Joe, her live in

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boyfriend for over two years. It is clear that the side door window was shattered out and that Joe had assaulted Kayla by grabbing her and shoving her around multiple times, leaving his blood all over her. There is clear PC for Joe for one count of City Assault DV, City Malicious Mischief DV, and Obstructing Police. Kayla did not know the value of the door window when I asked. It is believed to be less then a couple of hundred dollars.

Joe was transported to Deaconess Hospital by AMR for treatment, and medical care. Photographs were taken of Joe's injuries and the blood all over Kayla. Other photos were taken of the broken door window and the blood and disarray in the house. At the hospital Joe admitted to hearing both myself and Officer Ames yelling at him as the police to stop running. He said that he just didn't want to go to jail.

Joe was treated and released from Deaconess. He was transported to jail and booked on the above charges. See other officers reports.

Cpl. Cordis and Cpl. Kakuda both took photos of this case. Cpl. Cordis was notified of the arrest and booking.

Kayla was left at the house with the report number and a crime victim card.

On 09-16-13 at about 0239 hours, I responded to the intersection of Howard and Heroy, reference a DV suspect that had just fled from the victim's house at 4212 N. Wall. I heard Officer Ames in foot pursuit of the suspect and last saw the him on the north side of the school after jumping a fence. leaving the school yard.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). I am accredited as a Master Handler. Leo and I have been a team for about 5 years. He is my second working dog in my 9 years of being a canine handler. I am also a Master Trainer with the WSPCA.

I responded in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car. I was wearing the uniform of the day. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to the left side of his chest. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

After I arrived on scene, I was advised there was probable cause to arrest the fleeing suspect for city assault-DV and malicious mischief-DV. I was told the suspect was not wearing a shirt and was bloody from punching a window. Ofc. Ames pursued the suspect for several blocks but then stayed at the last known location where he saw the suspect.

With the help of SPD Radio, a perimeter was quickly set up by responding patrol officers.

I decided to track for the fleeing suspect for the following reasons:

- There was probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violent crime of city assault-DV, which had just occurred and was within the 4 hour mandatory arrest time frame. There was also probable cause to arrest the suspect for malicious mischief-DV. There was also probable cause for obstructing a police officer.

- The suspect was actively fleeing on foot to avoid getting arrested.

- The suspect posed an immediate threat to the victim of the crime. If not located and arrested, he could have easily returned to the original location and done further harm to the victim. He already showed a propensity for violence and even punched out a window, demonstrating his extremely belligerent and violent behavior. It was unknown what the suspect's intent was? The suspect posed a threat to the searching officer's and fled into the dark of the night. The suspect disappeared into the residential neighborhood, also putting the residents in undo harm.

After getting Leo out of the car and ready for a track, I yelled a loud announcement in the intersection of Heroy and Howard. There was a perimeter car at Washington and Heroy when I gave my announcement (it turned out to be Lt. Sprague and he told me he heard me make an verbal announcement from his location).

After making the announcement a resident at 4404 N. Howard opened his door and asked if we were looking for someone? He said he heard some noises on the north side of his house, which was fenced.

I cast Leo around the chain linked fence on the south side of the intersection, which is where he was last seen by Ofc. Ames. Leo immediately began tracking and worked N/B towards the north side of 4404 N. Howard. There was a wooden privacy type fence separating the front a back yards. Leo jumped over the fence on his own. Ofc. Ames noticed there was gate in the back yard that led to the alley and it was wide open. As Ofc. Ames ran around the fenced yard to the open gate, I jumped the fence after Leo. I saw a shoe in the back yard which confirmed the suspect had jumped the fence where Leo and I just had. I thought the suspect just ran through the yard but as soon as I got into the backyard, Leo dove into a dog house and located the hiding suspect.

Leo made contact with the suspect's left foot, which was the foot without a shoe. The suspect had positioned himself by sitting on his rear with his feet towards the door of the dog house. The suspect did not fight and cooperated with my orders to show his hands. He had to be illuminated with a flashlight due too the dark. After I saw he wasn't holding a weapon, I ordered Leo to release, which he immediately did.

The suspect came out of the dog house on his own. He was covered in blood and was not wearing a shirt. His arm was bleeding pretty bad from when he punched the window and broke it. The

suspect was taken into custody without further incident.

Medics were requested. They responded and tended to his injuries. He was eventually transported to Deaconess hospital and treated. He was transported by ambulance because of his large cut and he was covered in blood.

I went back and looked at the dog house further. There was smeared blood all over the face of it. Both fences also had blood on them, which I didn't see till I went back to retrace his steps.

Cpl. Kakuda took photos of the suspect's hiding location and eventually his injuries.

I spoke with the suspect at the hospital. He verbally identified himself to me as Joseph M. Kimrey. He told me he had "drank way too much." He told me he had been drinking Fireball and Captain Morgans.

Kimrey had numerous cuts from punching the window. He had a large cut on his right inner elbow area, scrapes on both wrists, and one on his left shin, which was most likely from jumping the fence. His left heal had a tear about 2" long, which is where Leo had made contact. That was the only location Leo contacted Kimrey. Kimrey confirmed this as we spoken further.

Kimrey was treated, photographed, and then booked into the SCSO jail.

Kimrey was extremely intoxicated and denied hearing my announcement, even though he wasn't more then about 50 yards away, but in a dog house.

On 09/16/13 around 0227 hours Ofc. E. Baldwin and I were dispatched to 4212 N. Wall, reference the report of a DV incident occurring at the location. Dispatch received an anonymous complaint call, stating a male and female could be heard arguing at the 4212 N. Wall address.

The anonymous complainant advised there were sounds of things being thrown, and items being broken from inside the residence. The anonymous complainant also claimed that the female was heard screaming "your going back to prison," while she was crying and sounded as if she was being hit.

Ofc. Baldwin arrived on scene first, and approached the residence from the north. I arrived on scene a few moments later, and approached the residence from the south. I could clearly hear a male and female screaming and yelling at each other outside the 4212 N. Wall address, and I was still at least one or two houses to the south.

I heard the female yell out, "I was afraid for my life," and the male replied "I know...I'm sorry." I then heard the female scream for the male to leave, however he was refusing and they kept arguing. There were 6' vinal fences surrounding the 4212 N. Wall address, and some signs posted regarding "Beware of Dogs."

The male and female then moved the arguing inside the house, and Ofc. Baldwin went up to the front door. I then tried making my way around to the north side of the house, and could see the male and female subject now arguing on the couch through the front window.

The male stood up for a moment, and I immediately noticed he had a bath towel wrapped around his right arm which appeared to be soaked in blood. I then informed Ofc. Baldwin of what I observed, and he knocked on the door to announce our presence as "Spokane Police."

I watched the female stand up from the couch, and she started walking towards the back of the house. I could see that the male then got up and followed the female, and so I quickly tried getting around to the back of the residence. I heard Ofc. Baldwin yell out "Police...stop," and I paused near the north side of the house for a moment.

I then saw the male running N/B in the alley, and I noticed that he was the same male I saw in the living room. I ran towards the alley and yelled to the male "Spokane Police...you need to stop." The male did not stop running, and he continued N/B out onto Longfellow.

I followed the male in foot pursuit, and kept yelling for him to stop over and over again. I knew that K-9 Ofc. C. Hamilton was currently working, and I even yelled at the male to stop because the K-9 was coming and he would most certainly get caught. The male did not stop.

I observed the male run into the playground at Willard Elementary, and I saw him drop the bloody towel draped over his right arm. I continued following the male until he rounded the N/W

corner of the school, and I finally lost sight of him at Heroy / Howard.

I then decided to stay where I had last the male, and just direct units in to start setting up a perimeter. Ofc. Hamilton arrived at my location a few moments later, and I asked Ofc. Baldwin if he was with the female back at the house. Ofc. Baldwin confirmed he was with the female, who was identified as Kayla M. Petty (071892).

Ofc. Baldwin verified that he had probable cause to arrest / charge the male for City Assault DV and also City Malicious Mischief DV. The male was identified as Joseph M. Kimrey (042592), and Ofc. Hamilton yelled out a loud verbal K-9 announcement at the corner of Heroy / Howard prior to us starting the K-9 track for Kimrey.

The K-9 track led right from the corner of Heroy / Howard to the fence on the north side of 4404 N. Howard, and I observed blood on the fence. Ofc. Hamilton said he could see a shoe lying on the ground in the back yard of the location, and I saw the back fence was also open.

Ofc. Hamilton then had his K-9 jump the fence, and he directed me to go around the house to the other side since we could see the back gate open. I quickly ran around to the alley behind 4404 N. Howard, and heard Ofc. Hamilton advise that he had the suspect hiding in a dog house in the back yard only a few seconds later.

Ofc. Hamilton informed me that the male was extremely bloody, and so I took the time to put on rubber gloves. I then placed the male in custody, and he was verified to be Kimrey. Kimrey was bleeding heavily from a very large laceration on his right arm, which apparently occurred from him punching a glass door / window at the residence.

Kimrey also had a large cut on his left foot, and some other injuries. I called for medics to respond to check on Kimrey, and for Cpl. B. Kakuda to respond and take the initial photographs of Kimrey at the scene.

I also asked Cpl. Kakuda take photographs of the back yard at 4404 N. Howard, and the bloody towel Kimrey dropped in the school yard. As we waited for medics to arrive I read Kimrey his Constitutional Rights, which he confirmed understanding and agreed to waive to answer questions.

Kimrey admitted he and Petty were "fighting," and when I started asking him to elaborate the medics arrived on scene to treat him. The medics confirmed Kimrey would need stitches, and so he was loaded into an ambulance and taken up to Deaconess Medical Center for treatment.

Ofc. Hamilton then followed the ambulance up to the hospital. I went back to the residence and contacted Ofc. Baldwin, and saw blood / glass all over the floor inside the location. Cpl. T. Cordis was at the house taking more photographs, and documenting the scene there.

I informed Ofc. Baldwin of what occurred with Kimrey after I chased him, and that I also had probable cause to arrest / charge Kimrey for Obstructing on top of the two DV charges. Ofc. Baldwin stated that he would go up to the hospital and wait for Kimrey, and he would book him into jail when he was released from the hospital accordingly.
