Summary:

Ofc. O'Connell found Lance Anderson passed out on a sidewalk at 2nd & State. Anderson appeared intoxicated but couldn't be aroused. SFD Paramedics responded and were able to awaken Anderson. Once his vital signs were checked he was arrested for his DOC warrant and transported to jail. Ofcs. Donaldson and Brown-Bieber transported as O'Connell was at the end of his shift.

The jail nurse asked that Anderson be taken to a hospital due to his level of intoxication. This prompted Anderson to begin acting out. He yelled at everyone and refused to walk back to the police car. He kicked at Ofc. Donaldson when the officer bent down to pick up a key that had fallen to the floor. Donaldson was struck on the foot but not injured.

Anderson was taken to Deaconess where he had to be put in a wheelchair to get him inside. He was yelling and thrashing about. He was very volatile and the officers were concerned for their safety as well as the safety of hospital staff. Anderson was handcuffed to a gurney and asked to calm down and cooperate.

He responded by spitting at the officers. He was warned to stop several times. Anderson then yelled at Donaldson, "You're gonna listen to me bitch!" He then cocked his head as if to head butt Donaldson and puckered his lips in preparation to spit again. Donaldson then administered one short burst of pepper spray. It hit Anderson in the face and stopped the assault. Donaldson, Brown-Bieber and Anderson were the only ones present during this incident.

I responded to the E.R. and contacted the officers as well as Ofc. VanTassel who'd arrived to back them. VanTassel said he didn't observe the activity at jail or what had occurred in the E.R.

I found Anderson with both wrists handcuffed to the gurney. He was still being combative... flailing about as much as possible, thrashing his head and shoulders from side to side and kicking his feet in all directions. Officers had to hold him down so a nurse could safely check his vital signs and draw lab samples.

Anderson resumed spitting, once spitting directly at Ofc. VanTassel who was barely able to duck out of the way. A spit hood was placed over Anderson's head; it contained the rest of his spitting. I witnessed this incident and the placement of the spit hood.

A lab report indicated Anderson's blood alcohol level at .31. Upon release by a doctor, Anderson became fairly compliant and was taken to jail and booked without further incident.

Reviewer comment:

The suspect had assaulted Officer Donaldson before being transported to the hospital. The suspect's demeanor was volatile, he was assaltive and refusing to cooperate with the officers' directives. Once at the hospital, his demeanor did not improve and began spitting at officers who had taken him into the treatment room. The suspect was handcuffed when he was spitting and lunging toward them. Even though his movements were restricted to the degree that the handcuffs controlled him, he was still behaving in an assaultive manner. He was still capable of causing damage and injury even while handcuffed. His body was not completely restricted (i.e. he was not strapped down to the bed). Because of the suspect's actions and his escalation in assaultive behavior, officers had to take immediate action in order to keep his behavior in check. Officer Donaldson's short burst of OC-10 was an attempt to keep his actions under control. This did not have the desired affect on the suspect, so they did not administer any other OC-10 applications. Instead, when possible, a spit mask was placed on him. Officer Donaldson's short OC-10 burst was within policy and was reasonable considering the circumstances in his attempt to keep the suspect from continuing to be assaultive.

On 10/14/13 at 1939 hours I responded to the intersection of W. 2nd Ave. and S. Browne St. to assist Ofc. O'Connell with an unconscious subject at that location. Ofc. O'Connell had been on patrol when he observed the man lying on the sidewalk. When I arrived Ofc. O'Connell pointed out a male passed out on the sidewalk in front of the Public Market on W. 2nd Ave. just east of S. Browne St.

The male, later identified as Lance Anderson, was curled up in the fetal position on the sidewalk. He did not respond to officers attempts to wake him up by speaking to him or shaking him. Spokane Fire Department arrived to check on Mr. Anderson. When fire department personnel arrived, they were unable to rouse Mr. Anderson by rubbing on his sternum. Fire department personnel eventually were able to wake Mr. Anderson up using an ammonia inhaler.

Once Mr. Anderson woke up, he was able to stand up and speak with police. While speaking with police, he placed his hands in his pockets. Since I was concerned that Mr. Anderson might have weapons in his pockets and he had not been frisked, I asked him to remove his hands. He ignored me and I had to remove his hand from his pocket. At that point I patted him down to check for weapons but did not locate any weapons.

Since Mr. Anderson was slurring his speech and was unsteady on his feet, I asked him to sit on a nearby concrete planter so that he would not fall and hurt himself. He was eventually able to locate his ID card. I waited with Mr. Anderson while Ofc. Donaldson checked his wanted status. While I was waiting with him Mr. Anderson stood up twice. Both times that he stood up I told him to sit down. He ignored me both times and I had to physically assist him in sitting down again.

Ofc. Donaldson learned that Mr. Anderson had an outstanding felony Department of Corrections warrant. Ofc. O'Connell and I then placed Mr. Anderson in handcuffs (DL) and placed him in my patrol car. I then transported him to Spokane County Jail. While transporting Mr. Anderson he urinated in the back of the police car.

Upon arrival at jail Mr. Anderson requested to be seen by the jail nurse. While waiting for the nurse to arrive, Mr. Anderson was placed in the officer area in booking. He was told to stand with his back against the south wall of the room, but refused to stand and instead chose to sit on the floor. While Mr. Anderson was sitting on the floor, Ofc. Donaldson dropped a key on the ground near him. Ofc. Donaldson covered the key with his foot and moved it away from Mr. Anderson. While Ofc. Donaldson was moving the key, Mr. Anderson kicked Ofc. Donaldson in the foot.

When the jail nurse arrived he stated that he wanted to have Mr. Anderson medically cleared at a hospital before he would admit him to jail. I told Mr. Anderson I was going to take him to the hospital to be medically evaluated, but Mr. Anderson refused to walk out to my police car. He had to be carried out by jail officers, who then placed him in the back seat of my cruiser.

I transported Mr. Anderson to the Deaconess hospital emergency room for medical clearance. Upon arrival at the hospital I searched the back seat of the cruiser and located a handcuff key under the rear seat. I had searched the back seat area before Mr. Anderson was placed in it and no handcuff key was present. I placed Mr. Anderson in a wheelchair and took him into the emergency room. Inside the emergency room Mr. Anderson repeatedly tried to stand up from the wheelchair and I had to hold him down to keep him in the chair.

Hospital staff showed us to a room, and I was able to have Mr. Anderson sit in the bed. I handcuffed both of his hands to the rails of the bed. Mr. Anderson then urinated in the bed. He also stated he had left the handcuff key in my police car.

I was standing to Mr. Anderson's left, and Ofc. Donaldson was standing at the foot of the bed near the door. Mr. Anderson then spat in Ofc. Donaldson's direction, but the spittle landed on Mr. Anderson's legs. He then spat again in Ofc. Donaldson's direction, and this spittle landed on the floor next to Ofc. Donaldson.

Mr. Anderson then lunged out of the bed at Ofc. Donaldson. Ofc. Donaldson deployed a short (about 1/2 second) dose of OC spray to Mr. Anderson's face to stop him from spitting and lunging at Ofc. Donaldson.

Ofc. Van Tassel and Sgt. Lee responded to assist with Mr. Anderson. While waiting in Mr. Anderson's room, Mr. Anderson spat at Ofc. Van Tassel. The spittle missed Ofc. Van Tassel and landed on the counter at the foot of the bed.

Hospital staff advised that Mr. Anderson was medically cleared and that the only drug in his system was alcohol. A spit hood was placed on Mr. Anderson, and he was walked back out to my police car and transported back to jail. Mr. Anderson was booked into jail without further incident.

Mr. Anderson's handcuff key was turned in to the property section as evidence. I completed a charging document for Mr. Anderson's assaults on Ofc. Donaldson and Ofc. Van Tassel.

On 101413 at approximately 1939, Officer Brown-Bieber and I dispatched to 2nd and Browne to assist another officer. We arrived to find Officer O'Connell out with an unconscious male, later identified as Lance Anderson.

I exited the patrol car from the passenger side. I noted Anderson was curled up in the fetal position on the sidewalk. He was curled around a coat and a backpack. Spokane Fire Department arrived and were able to wake Anderson with smelling salts.

Officer Brown-Bieber spoke with Anderson. I noted Anderson seemed to respond to questions slowly and had very slurred speech. He denied consuming any alcohol or drugs. Officer Brown-Bieber had Anderson sit on a nearby flower pot. Anderson sat for several minutes but stood up after being told not to. He was placed back onto the flower pot.

A namecheck of Anderson confirmed him to have an outstanding DOC arrest warrant. Anderson was arrested by Officer Brown-Bieber and placed in the back of our patrol car. See Officer Brown-Bieber's attached report.

When we arrived at Spokane County Jail the nursing staff denied to accept Anderson due to his physical state. Officer Brown-Bieber and I transported Anderson to Deaconess Hospital. During transport I plainly heard Anderson's cuffs clanking but could only see him moving around in the back of the car. When we arrived at the Jail sally port I used my flashlight to check Anderson in the back of my car. From the driver's side of the car I noted he was still handcuffed behind his back. While in the officer area I moved past Anderson. I dropped my gun locker key on the ground near Anderson. I reached out with my right foot and pushed the key away from Anderson. As I did so Anderson kicked one of his feet towards me, striking me on the right small toe.

The Jail Nurse declined to accept Anderson. We transported him to Deaconess Hospital for clearance. Anderson was disorderly while at the hospital. He refused Off Brown-Bieber's repeated commands to sit in the wheelchair and repeatedly called us "bitches." Hospital staff placed us in a room and we handcuffed Anderson to the bed by both hands.

Off Brown-Bieber and I were both on Anderson's left hand side in the small room. Anderson began spitting in our direction and I moved towards the door. As I passed near the foot of the bed Anderson spat at me one more time. I moved quickly through the door to avoid being struck. I checked my uniform to determine I had not been hit by spittle.

As I stood in the doorway Anderson looked at me and said I would do as he said. Anderson then suddenly lunged forward sitting up in the bed and looking directly at me. I note the muscles in his lower right arm were clenched on the bed and his face was contorted.

Anderson was already under arrest for a felony warrant. He had physically resisted our efforts to control him and had attempted to access a hidden handcuff key. Anderson had also kicked me and had attempted to spit on me seconds earlier.

To prevent Anderson from attempting another assault on me I accessed my OC spray and deployed a short burst to his face/head. Anderson closed his eyes and yelled "Spray me again!" As he did this Anderson kicked blindly with his left foot, striking a nearby machine. Anderson then began screaming, saying his face was burning. I holstered my OC and then placed a wet rag on Anderson's face. Off Brown-Bieber joined me outside of the room.

I stepped outside of the hospital and requested Sgt Lee and another officer join us. A short while later Off VanTassel arrived along with Sgt Lee. I briefed both to the situation. Anderson continued to spit randomly. At one point he looked directly at Off VanTassel near the foot of the bed, and spit a large amount of saliva at Off VanTassel. Had Off VanTassel not moved quickly he would have been struck in the upper chest or face.

Anderson was released and we escorted him out of the hospital. We then transported him to Spokane County Jail where he was booked without further incident.

On 10-14-13 I responded to Deaconess Hospital to assist Ofc Donaldson. Lance Anderson was in a bed being treated. Anderson was very vocal, swearing over and over.

I was standing at the foot of the bed, against a counter. I was about 8 feet away from Anderson. Anderson had been spitting on the ground over and over. A couple times he had spit several feet, towards Officers and nursing staff. We told Anderson over and over to stop spitting.

Anderson then spit again, which went several feet. I told Anderson to stop it or we were going to put on a spit mask. He turned his head in my direction. I could hear him hawking up flem into his mouth. He reared his head back, opened his mouth and spit right at me.

I saw a large, thick spit coming right at me. I was able to dodge the spit barely, which went over my shoulder and hit the wall and counter. If I did not move, it would have hit me. I placed a spit mask on Anderson until he was released from the hospital.
