Reviewer comment:

The use of K-9 to contact an actively fleeing armed robbery suspect was appropriate and effective. Suspect had just deliberately injured and incapacitated several people minutes prior with bear mace, and was running from police despite the clear verbal warning that K-9 would be sent if he did not stop. Length of contact and severity of injuries were both due to suspect's active non-compliance, and were reasonably sustained given the circumstances. Application of K-9 was within policy, case law and use of force guidelines.

INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:

Type of Application: Running Take

Original Call:

The Walgreen's at 1708 W NW Blvd had just been robbed and the suspect used 'Bear Mace' to assault at least three employees. The suspect fled in a vehicle. Officer Gorman located the suspect vehicle a few blocks away at Belt/NW Blvd.

Suspect Actions:

The suspect vehicle pulled into the parking lot of the Cenex gas station on the s/w corner of Belt/NW Blvd. The van parked on the s/e corner of the building. Officer Gorman was behind the van as it parked. As it came to a stop, the front passenger door opened and the suspect jumped out. The suspect, later identified as Aaron Blaine, ran in front of the van to the south, then turned w/b directly behind the store.

Officer Gorman quickly parked and yelled at Blaine to stop running. Blaine made no attempt to stop. He jumped through a tall row of bushes and made it into the alley, then started running faster in an attempt to escape arrest.

Est. Time & Distance of Contact (if known):

The contact lasted approximately 15 seconds. It would have been less, but Blaine would not comply with commands to stop rolling onto K-9 Max in an attempt to get him to let go. Once Blaine complied with Officer Gorman's commands, K-9 Max immediately released his hold upon Officer Gorman's command.

Officer Safety Concerns/ Why was Canine used:

Blaine was a suspect in a First Degree Robbery, a Class 'A' felony since he used a weapon to assault at least three employees during the robbery.

Blaine posed a very high risk to both the pursuing Officers and the public. Just 4 minutes earlier, he had already shown his willingness to use a weapon during the commission of the robbery. Blaine assaulted at least 3 victims with Bear Mace. Officer Gorman is a certified OC (Oleoresin Capsicum) instructor for the SPD. He has been sprayed with OC, and knows even small exposures will impair Officers to the point in which they would have had a hard time defending themselves. Bear Mace has a much higher level of concentration than the department issued OC. If Blaine chose to use his weapon, it could have assisted his escape, given him the ability to easily assault Officers or even end up in a deadly force situation. Blaine had also shown his

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disregard for the public by spraying large amounts of the mace into a public store.
Blaine was actively attempting to evade arrest by fleeing on foot. Officer Gorman was in a marked SPD K-9 police vehicle. He was wearing a department issue K-9 jump suit with all of the department required markings. Officer Gorman gave Blaine a loud verbal warning to stop. Blaine chose to continue to flee, and actually sped up when he heard the announcement to stop.

INJURY DESCRIPTION:

Injury:

Injuries consisted of a puncture and deep scrape on the lower part of the right buttocks. There also several scrapes on his lower left back/hip area. None were bleeding and required only cleaning, no stitching.

TRAINING COMMENTS:

Canine Effectiveness:

The actions of Officer Gorman and K-9 Maximus were effective, fell within Spokane Police policy, and met department expectations. The use of the canine increased the likelihood that Blaine was apprehended.

Patrol Support:

The actions of Patrol Officers were effective, within Spokane Police policy, and met department expectations.

SUPERVISORY COMMENTS:

K-9 Supervisor Comments:

Officer Gorman responded to assist with a robbery cal. While checking the area Officer Gorman located the suspect vehicle. The suspect (Blaine) fled on foot from the suspect vehicle and refused to comply with Officer Gorman's commands to stop. Officer Gorman commanded K-9 Max to apprehend the fleeing suspect and K-9 Max chased and caught Blaine as he was running away from Officer Gorman. K-9 Max contacted Blaine on the buttocks. Blaine struggled with K-9 Max by intentionally rolling on top and he refused to get off when Officer Gorman told him to do so. Officer Gorman released K-9 Max as soon as Blaine complied and it was safe to do so. Blaine was taken into custody without further incident.

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On 10/12/2013, at 2041, Kathy Oberst called from the Walgreens on Northwest Blvd to report that someone ran into the store, pepper sprayed everyone, and ran out. Oberst believed that two store employees needed medical attention.

At 2043, an employee, Hanna, called to report that a male wearing a hoodie took a basket, and that they robbed the store. She added that two employees needed medical attention, and that the suspect had left, and that all of the employees were coughing too much to call 911. She also reported that there was one suspect and maybe a second waiting in a car outside to drive him, and that someone got the plate.

At 2044, Andrew Perry called to report that three employees were maced, and that the suspect stole merchandise. He added that the suspect left going WB in an older brown Ford van, WA license #ABP5195.

Perry described the suspect as a W/M, 40-50, 5-03, 120, wearing a gray hoodie and baggy jeans. He described the spray as "Bear Mace". Perry said that the employees were too sick to tell him what was taken from the store, but that the suspect had a shopping basket. Perry also said that the manager was on the ground and was unable to stand.

When I arrived at 2047, the suspects were gone. The manager, Joel Martin, was lying on the sidewalk in front of the store entrance. He was moaning and writhing in pain. He was coughing and holding his hands to his face. His employees handed him some bottled water in order to rinse his eyes out. Medics arrived and began to treat Martin.

Several more persons had been hit by the "bear mace". They were also experiencing pain. They were treated by medics as well.

The suspect did not strike or push anyone during the robbery.

The air coming from the store was permeated with "mace" particles. I could smell it and slightly feel the effects even standing 10-15 feet outside of the store.

I interviewed several persons, which included employees and patrons,

Andrew Perry was seated in his car, preparing to leave the parking lot. His car was parked as close to the front door as possible, to the east of the front doors. This is a summary of what he told me:

I saw someone in the driver's seat of the van while it was parked in the lot. I saw a W/M (S-1) calmly walk out of the store and get into the van. It was over there. (He pointed to the south and indicated that the van was parked in that area of the lot.) A short time after S-1 walked out. another W/M (S-2) came running out of the store, carrying a shopping basket that was full of merchandise. The manager came out after him. S-2 ran to the van, got in, and the van left, going WB. I got the plate because I knew something was going on. I called 911 and told them what was happening. I saw S-2s face and I would recognize him if I saw him again. S-2 was a W/M, 35-40, 5-04, 180, with a goatee, wearing a beanie, and a gray hoodie, with a black Dickies work coat. The top part of the hoodie was gray. S-1 was a W/M20-30, 5-08, blondish, wearing a navy blue beanie, and a gray hoodie. He also had a goatee. The guy in the driver's (S-3) had short hair and may have been wearing glasses. He was clean-shaven and was about 40-45 years old.

Kathleen Oberst was in line at the checkout counter with her grandson, Chauncey Ramos. She saw S-2 walking away from the manager with a shopping basket, and heard the manager say "stop him". She saw the suspect raise the mace and spray the manager and nearly everyone else's in the store. She was not struck by the spray, but her grandson was slightly. Medics checked him, Oberst only saw the back of S-2s head. She said that he had brown hair. She could not described him further.

Travis Book was shopping in the store. He was waiting in line at the checkout counter. He saw S-2 walk past the checkout counter with a shopping basket full of electronics. He heard the manager say "Stop that guy". Book saw S-2 spray the manager and the rest of the people at the front of the store. Book was struck by the spray and was treated by medics. He said that he would recognize S-2. Book described S-2 as being about 5-02 or 5-03, wearing a beanie, and as having a pretty full beard.

Joel Martin is the manager of Walgreens. He was severely affected by the Bear Mace. He was continually flushing his eyes with water, even after being treated by medics. SGT Staben took photos of Martin. He remained in a state of discomfort for at least 30 minutes after he was sprayed. This is a summary of what Martin told me:

I saw that guy (S-2) run into the store and start ripping electronics items off of our locked display. He was filling one of our shopping baskets. As soon as the basket was full, he turned and started walking toward the door. I ran over to him and told him to stop. I reached out to try to get our property back. We cannot put hands on shoplifters, but we can try to get them to leave the property in the store. When I grabbed the basket, he turned toward me and sprayed me dead in the face with the mace. This happened between the registers and the first set of doors. It took a second for that spray to kick in, but then it did, and I could not see, or stand.

Martin could not give a description of S-2 at that time. He was still being affected by the spray.

Martin told me that there is a video surveillance system in the store, but he needs to contact Walgreen's security to access it, and the store was so full of mace that no one could remain inside for more that a few minutes.

SGT Staben and OFC Green also interviewed several witnesses.

While I was at the scene, several other officers, including OFC Gorman, CPL Dahle and OFC Jones located the van (at Belt & Northwest) and detained two suspects.

A show-up identification was conducted.

CPL Dahle advised me that Aaron D. Blaine was identified as the S-2, and that the driver was Tim Gilfoy. CPL Dahle also advised that the shopping basket full of loot was found inside the van.

Based on the fact that Blaine used force in order to retain the property that he was stealing from Walgreens, and that he used a weapon to inflict bodily injury upon Martin and others to effect the robbery, I determined that PC existed to arrest him for 1st Degree Robbery. Based on the fact that Gilfoy had knowledge of what Blaine had done and that he was the "get-away" driver for the robbery, I determined that there was PC to arrest Gilfoy for 1st Degree Robbery as well for being an accomplice.

On 101213 at approx 2043hrs, I responded to the area of 1708 W NW Blvd to assist other officers with a possible commercial robbery. While enroute, radio advised responding officers that the employees of Walgreens called in to report the robbery. A male entered the store, loaded a hand cart with items, then used 'Bear Mace', which is a very high potency pepper spray, to assault several employees. The male fled to a waiting vehicle, which left the parking lot w/b on NW Blvd. Radio updated with more information that the employees were requesting medical attention, and the plate of the get away vehicle was WA LIC#ABP5195, on a silver Ford Aerostar van.

Upon arrival into the area at approx 2045hrs, I decided to check the neighborhood to the west for the suspect vehicle. I turned westbound off NW Blvd and onto York. As I approached Belt, I observed a silver van matching the suspect's van n/b on Belt. The van had no exterior lights on. As I reached Belt and turned north behind the vehicle. I observed the front passenger door closing as if someone had exited. I observed the back of a subject walking w/b on York. That subject was wearing what appeared to be a grey jacket and a black backpack. At this time I was unable to confirm if that subject came from the vehicle or not. The van continued n/b on Belt with no lights on. I confirmed the license plate on the van was the same given by witnesses.

The van pulled into the parking lot of the Cenex gas station on the s/w corner of Belt/NW Blvd. The van parked on the s/e corner of the building. I was behind the van as it parked. As it came to a stop, the front passenger door opened and a suspect jumped out. The suspect, later identified as Aaron Blaine, ran in front of the van to the south, then turned w/b directly behind the store. I quickly parked and yelled at Blaine to stop running. I grabbed my partner, SPD K9 Maximus and started to run after Blaine. As I reached the s/e corner of the store, I yelled at Blaine "Spokane Police K9 Unit! Stop now or I will release the dog! He will bite you!" Blaine made no attempt to stop. He jumped through a tall row of bushes and made it into the alley, then started running faster in an attempt to escape arrest. I deployed K9 Max for the following reasons;

Blaine was a suspect in a First Degree Robbery, a Class 'A' felony since he used a weapon to assault at least three employees during the robbery.

Blaine posed a very high risk to both the pursuing Officers and the public. Just 4 minutes earlier, he had already shown his willingness to use a weapon during the commission of the robbery. He already assaulted at least 3 victims with Bear Mace. I am a certified OC (Oleoresin Capsicum)

instructor for the SPD. I have been sprayed with a small application of OC, and I know it impairs me to the point in which I would have a hard time defending myself. Bear Mace has a much higher level of concentration than our department issued OC. If Blaine chose to use his weapon on me, it could have assisted his escape, given him the ability to easily assault me or even end up in a deadly force situation. Blaine had also shown his disregard for the public by spraying large amounts of the mace into a public store.

Blaine was actively attempting to evade arrest by fleeing on foot. I was in a marked SPD K9 police vehicle. I was wearing a department issue K9 jump suit with all of our department required markings. I gave Blaine a loud verbal warning to stop. Blaine chose to continue to flee, and actually sped up when he heard my announcement to stop.

K9 Max was running by my side as Blaine made it to the alley. When Blaine sped up and it was obvious he was not going to surrender peacefully, I gave K9 Max the command to contact Blaine. Blaine tried to run to the south side of the alley and just started to enter a driveway as K9 Max contacted him on his right buttocks. Blaine fell to the ground on his stomach, then immediately rolled to his back in an attempt to either roll on top of K9 Max or have him release his contact. K9 Max was able to maintain his hold as Blaine started to roll onto K9 Max's head. When I arrived to them, I ordered Blaine to roll onto his stomach. He put his hands up but refused to roll off of K9 Max's head and onto his stomach. I grabbed his hands and rolled him onto his stomach. When he stopped trying to roll back over and listened to my commands to stop rolling, I gave K9 Max the command to release and he did immediately.

It took several minutes for another officer to arrive. During that time, I ordered Blaine to remain on his stomach and to keep his hands straight out to his sides. Blaine made several verbal attempts to get me to leave him and return to the van. He told me there were several suspects in the van that were armed with guns. While talking, Blaine tried several times to work his hands close to his stomach. Each time I had to order his hands back out to his sides. Ofc Jones arrived and handcuffed Blaine. A quick pat down of his stomach area revealed a large can of Bear Mace. It was photographed in place.

Several witnesses were brought for show ups of Blaine, all confirmed 100% that he was the robbery suspect. I assisted Cpl Dahle contact the driver of the van. The driver Tim Gilfoy had already given Cpl Dahle a statement, see his report for details. I also asked Gilfoy a few questions. When I advised him I observed the van door open while they were on Belt, prior to the stop, he advised there was no one else in the van besides himself and Blaine. He advised Blaine was attempting to exit the van but didn't.

I was given information from victim/witness accounts that there was definitely a third person involved with the robbery. Once confronted with that information, Gilfoy admitted he was lying and trying to cover for the third male. He was adamant that male and him had nothing to do with the

robbery, and had no knowledge Blaine was going to rob the store. Once Gilfoy was caught in the lie, he seemed flustered and his story unbelievable. It would have been impossible for him not to have knowledge of the robbery.

I also asked Gilfoy why he was approaching a gas station with his lights off. I asked why he would drop off one male a block away from the gas station, then park on a unlit side of the gas station. It seemed very suspicious, as if the three males were also attempting the same type of robbery at the gas station. He didn't have any answers to those questions.

Both Gilfoy and Blaine were arrested. Blaine was transported to Deaconess for treatment of the K9 contact. He was quickly cleared and booked into jail. I responded with Cpl Dahle to observe and photograph the injuries.

Injuries consisted of a puncture and deep scrape on the lower part of the right buttocks. There also several deep scrapes on his lower left back/love handle area. None were bleeding and required only cleaning, no stitching.

Lt. Meidl and Sgt Staben were present on the call.

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On 10-12-13, at approx. 2052 hrs, I responded to Walgreens, 1708 W. Northwest Blvd, to assist officers on a Robbery call.

Upon arrival, I contacted Sgt. Staben who said there were several witnesses who needed to be transported to Northwest Blvd and Belt, where possible suspects were being detained.

I transported a witness, Hannah Ruble, to the location at approx. 2104 hrs. She positively identified the suspect that Ofc. Gorman had detained in the south alley, Aaron Blaine. Ruble said that she was 100% sure that Blaine was the subject that sprayed the store employee with pepper spray/mace. Ruble did not recognize the driver of the van, Tim Gilfoy.

I transported Ruble back to Walgreens. See Sgt. Staben's report for Ruble's statement.

officers on a reported Robbery of the Wal Greens located at 1708 W. Northwest Blvd, and more specifically, to help Officer Gorman with a male who he had detained in the South alley S/W of Belt/Northwest Blvd. Please see Officer Gorman's report for additional details.

Upon arrival I observed Officer Gorman to be in the alley just S/W of Belt/Northwest Blvd. He had a male detained in the alleyway proned out on his stomach. I immediately noticed that the male matched the description given of the Robbery suspect, which had just occurred in the same vicinity.

I handcuffed the detained male (DL) and identified him as being Aaron D. Blaine. Dispatch advised us that Aaron D. Blaine had an active Felony warrant for Identity Theft 2nd Degree, and also for DV Malicious Mischief. After Blaine's warrants were confirmed I advise him he was under arrest and began searching him incident to arrest. I asked him if he had any syringes on his person that I needed to be careful of while I was searching him. He advised that he did have several syringes on him. He advised that one of the syringes was located in his front jacket pocket. I opened up Blaine's front right jacket pocket and observed a syringe with an orange cap on it, and also a large black cannister of Bear spray, which the suspect reportedly had just used in the Robbery of the Wal-Greens.

I had Cpl. Dahle respond to my location to photograph the Bear Spray before I removed it and recovered it as evidence. I also located a shaved key in Blaine's front pants pocket. I asked him what the key was used for and he told me that he had just "found" it earlier that day. In my training and experience these "shaved" keys are very commonly used to steal vehicles and also illegally gain entry into buildings to commit burglary's. I recovered the shaved key for evidence. I read Blaine his Constitutional Rights and asked if he was willing to waive them and speak with me about what had happened at the Wal-Greens. Blaine chose not to waive his rights and did not want to talk about it.

Before placing Blaine in the back of my patrol car, several officers came to my location for witness show ups. Blaine was positively identified by the witnesses as the person who had just used the Bear Spray and Robbed the Wal-Greens just down the road. Officer Haney later advised me that there was probable cause to arrest Blaine for 1st Degree Robbery.

I then transported Blaine to Deaconess Hospital to get medical treatment for the wounds which he sustained after he ran from the police K9. Please see Officer Gorman's report for additional details. It should be noted that while we are the hospital, Blaine began crying uncontrollably to the point where he had snot coming out his nose and down his face. I asked him if he was ok and he replied several times "I am so fucked. I am so fucked."

I transported Blaine to the Spokane County Jail where he was booked in on his warrants and for 1st Degree Robbery.

I had jail staff recover Blaine's outer clothing and I placed it on police property as evidence. I also placed Blaine's stocking cap, bear spray cannister, and shaved key on property as evidence.

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On 10/12/2013 at about 2055 I responded to assist officers with a Robbery at 1708 W Northwest Blvd, Walgreens.

When I arrived, I interviewed Robert Hoffman. Robert is an employee of Walgreens and was working the cash register at the front counter when everything happened. A male walked up and asked him about a toy helicopter, then walked out soon after. Moments later, a second male walked toward the door past the front counter with one of the gray portable baskets Walgreens provides customers. "Joel", the store manager, walked up behind the male and said something to the effect of "you gotta pay for that". The male with the basket turned, pulled out a "huge" can of pepper spray and sprayed Joel with a large quantity of pepper spray. Robert said he reacted by jumping over the counter to help Joel with the suspect, but was quickly hit by the effects of pepper spray as the suspect ran outside. Robert did not follow outside and did not see the vehicle they left in.

Two individuals were detained by officers at nearby locations at the time.

I conducted a showup with Robert. At the first location, the Conoco at Belt/Northwest, Robert said he was certain he did not recognize the individual (later identified as Tim Gilfoy). Gilfoy was standing by himself near the back of a patrol car. There was only one officer (standing several feet away) present during the showup.

At the second location, in the alley to the south of that Conoco, Robert immediately identified the male as the one who had asked him about the toy helicopter in the store just prior to the second

male pepper spraying Joel. He said he was certain this male had been in the store at that time (later identified as Aaron Blaine). There was only two officers, both standing several feet away from Aaron, during the showup.

I conducted a showup with Travis Book (interviewed by Ofc. Haney, see his report for additional information).

At the first location, the Conoco at Belt/Northwest, Travis said he did not recognize the individual (later identified as Tim Gilfoy. Gilfoy was standing by himself near the back of a patrol car. There were two officers (standing 20-30 feet away) present during the showup.

At the second location, in the alley to the south of that Conoco, Travis immediately identified the male as one of the involved suspects. (the man did not have a beanie on) Travis said he was certain this male (later identified as Aaron Blaine) was in the store, and had been wearing a dark beanie at the time. (Aaron had been wearing a dark beanie when he was detained by officers) Officers then replaced the beanie on Aaron's head and Travis told me "that's it, that's the one". Travis may have been the one with the gray shopping basket. There were only two officers present, both standing several feet away from Aaron, during the showup.

On 10-12-13 at approximately 2043 hours, I responded to the report of a commercial robbery at 1708 W Northwest Blvd (Walgreens). It was reported that a male had stolen some items from the business, and pepper sprayed employees. The suspect was report to have fled in a Ford Astro van. A witness had given the license plate of WA.ABP5195.

I heard over the radio that Officer Haney had arrived on scene at the business. Officer Gorman then advised that he was with the van at Belt/Northwest. He further advised that he had contacted one in the alley, and was being told that there were guns in the van.

I arrived on scene and observed the listed van parked in the gas station lot. Officer Gorman's patrol vehicle was parked to the side of it, but I did not know his location. I drew my duty weapon to a low ready position and approached the van. I then observed a male walk from in front of the vehicle.

I asked the male if he had been in the vehicle, and he replied, "yes." I had the male face away from me and place his hands onto his head. The male complied with my commands. I approached the male and cleared the vehicle at the same time. I noted that there were no other people in the vehicle, but I did see a Walgreens basket on the floor of the front passenger seat. I then holstered my duty weapon and handcuffed (dl) the male.

The male was then identified as Tim Gilfoy. I advised Gilfoy of his constitutional rights by reading off a department issued card. Gilfoy stated that he understood his rights and waived them.

I asked Gilfoy what was going on. Gilfoy stated that he was giving his friend "Aaron" a ride. Gilfoy described Aaron as a W/M, "fat", 5-07, with a bald head. Gilfoy reported that he had picked up Aaron at Nevada/Empire, and was transporting him to the area of Maple and Mallon.

Aaron asked Gilfoy to pull into the Walgreens lot, so he could get something. Gilfoy stated that he parked on the south side of the building near the entrance. Gilfoy could not remember if he parked head in, or backed into the space. Aaron then got out and went into the store.

Aaron returned a few minutes later and got back into the vehicle. Gilfoy stated that Aaron was carrying the Walgreens basket. Gilfoy began to drive out of the parking lot, and Aaron stated, "I just jacked all this stuff."

Gilfoy reported that he was very upset by this news, as he did not want to get into trouble. Gilfoy reported that he was turning around to go back to the store when he observed the Officer pulling up behind his vehicle. Gilfoy then pulled into the gas station, and Aaron fled on foot into the alley.
