Summary:

Officer Raleigh responded to 3111 E. Wabash on a suspicious vehicle call. The employees of the business there, Master Blasters, said a male had been to their business four times and was asking questions about the business. They felt he was casing the business to possibly rob it. When Officer Raleigh arrived the suspect male, Justin M. Corporon, was walking from the business and getting into an older Ford Mustang. The Mustang was parked facing E/B on the East side of the business. It was right on the corner of Wabash and Greene. Officer Raleigh turned his overhead emergency lights on and stopped behind the Mustang. He exited his patrol vehicle and walked toward the Mustang. He had taken several steps and was three to four steps in front of his patrol vehicle when Corporon started the Mustang and left at a high rate of speed N/B on Greene. Officer Raleigh ran back to his patrol vehicle and activated his emergency lights and siren. Officer Raleigh was in a fully-marked patrol vehicle. He turned N/B on Greene and was about a quarter of a block North on Greene when Corporon turned W/B on Olympic. As Officer Raleigh approached Olympic, he saw Corporon had lost control and spun out. Corporon spun a complete 360 degrees as the driver continued to accelerate to try and gain control of his vehicle. The Mustang stalled and rolled back into some pieces of lumber on the South side of Olympic. Officer Raleigh saw Corporon was trying to get the Mustang started again, so he placed his patrol vehicle in front of the Mustang to box it in and keep it from fleeing again. Officer Raleigh did not know if Corporon had committed a crime at the business and did not know if he was armed. Corporon had driven recklessly to attempt to flee from Officer Raleigh and now Corporon had shoved his hands down where Officer Raleigh could not see them. With the circumstances of the call and for his safety Officer Raleigh drew his weapon to try and get Corporon to comply with his orders. Once Corporon complied with Officer Raleigh's orders, Officer Raleigh lowered his weapon to the quard position until other officers arrived. With the circumstances know at the time, Officer Raleigh acted appropriately. The Mustang turned out to be a stolen vehicle. Officer Raleigh did not know that until after Corporon crashed. On 102813 at approximately 1143 hours, I heard as Spokane Police Radio advised of a general broadcast of the male at the business located at 3111 East Wabash Avenue in the City/County of Spokane, WA acting suspicious.

Spokane Police Radio stated the male suspect had driven to the location and asking what type of work the employees at the business did. Spokane Police Radio further stated the male suspect was driving an older Ford Mustang and was described as being an adult white male, approximately 35 years old with a tattoo on his neck.

I observed as was traveling eastbound on Wabash Avenue from Haven Street and was only approximately one block away from the suspicious person general broadcast just as Spokane Police Radio was dispatching the information.

I travel eastbound on Wabash Avenue towards area of the complainant's business located at 3111 East Wabash Avenue where I observed a maroon Ford Mustang parked at an odd angle on the north curb line of Wabash Avenue directly in front of the business and only approximately five to six feet from the corner of Greene Street.

I further observed as what appeared to be a male subject walking towards the vehicle as traveled eastbound on Wabash Avenue towards the location. I witnessed as the male subject got into the vehicle and sat in the driver seat.

Due to the fact Spokane Police Radio had broadcast a suspicious person report at the business and stated the male suspect was being suspicious and acting oddly inside the business, I activated my overhead red and blue flashing lights to contact the male subject and inquire what he was doing at the business.

I further advised Spokane Police Radio of the license plate regarding the Ford Mustang, which I observed was WA passenger vehicle license AAJ8526.

At this time, I exited my patrol vehicle and began to walk towards the suspect's Ford Mustang who I observed as the subject sat in the driver's seat facing forward.

As I was walking towards the driver's side of the suspect vehicle, I had only taken approximately two to three steps away from my patrol vehicle, but observed as the driver quickly sat up in his seat and reached for the ignition. I witnessed as the driver suddenly started the vehicle with the ignition; and with one swift and fluid motion, applied the accelerator to rev the engine and placed the vehicle in gear.

I observed as the vehicle engine revved to a high RPM, the driver quickly placed the vehicle in gear and accelerated away from the location and sped around the corner of Wabash Avenue and Greene Street. I witnessed as the vehicle instantly accelerated to a high speed as it began to travel northbound on Greene Street from Wabash Avenue.

I quickly ran back to my fully marked black and white Spokane Police Department patrol vehicle where I got back into my patrol vehicle. I activated my siren and emergency red and blue overhead lights in possibly any attempt to signal the driver to stop and pull to the side of the roadway to be contacted by law enforcement.

As I started my patrol vehicle and began to travel northbound on Greene Street, I observed I was approximately thirty to forty feet behind the suspect Ford Mustang as the Mustang accelerated northbound on Greene

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Street from Wabash Avenue away from my location. I observed as I was approximately a quarter of the distance of the block as the fleeing Ford Mustang began to turn westbound onto Olympic Avenue from Greene Street.

I further followed the vehicle northbound on Greene Street from Wabash Avenue at a distance since I had not contacted the driver and did not know if he had just committed a crime or was involved in another other criminal activity at the victim business at the time.

As I traveled northbound on Greene Street and approached Olympic Avenue, I observed as the suspect Ford Mustang attempted to turn westbound onto Olympic Avenue from Greene Street at a high rate of speed. I witnessed as the driver of the vehicle was traveling too fast as he or she attempted to complete the right turn, but quickly lost control of the vehicle and began to spin out of control.

I witnessed there were no other vehicular or pedestrian traffic around the intersection or in the area at the time and the suspect Ford Mustang spun violently out of control. I observed as the rear of the vehicle came around the outside of the vehicle during the process of the turn and completed a full three hundred and sixty degree revolution in the roadway as the drive continued to accelerate and regain control of the vehicle.

I witnessed as the vehicle continued to spin and end its revolution in the roadway with the rear of the vehicle facing to the south and the front of the vehicle facing to the north. I watched as the vehicle also stalled as it rolled backwards in the roadway and collided with several large pieces of lumber stacked on the sidewalk in front of a business on the south side of Olympic Avenue just to the west of Greene Street.

I observed as the male driver, later ID'd as Justin M Corporon (051485) was seated in the driver seat of the vehicle and began reaching for the ignition of the vehicle in what I believed to be an attempt to restart the vehicle and continue to flee.

I drove my patrol vehicle to the front of the suspect Ford Mustang and blocked the path of the Mustang from continuing to flee. I further observed as Corporon threw his hands up in the air as if to give up but immediately drop them back down.

I immediately placed my patrol vehicle in park which deactivated the siren and exited my vehicle. I witnessed as Corporon threw his hands down by his waist area at this time as he clearly was upset and angry for being stopped and contacted by law enforcement.

Due to several reasons including the fact Corporon had just attempted to flee the business located at 3111 East Wabash Avenue where the employees had called Spokane 911 to request law enforcement assistance in contacting Corporon to determine what he was doing and if he was committing any crime or just about to commit a crime coupled with the fact Corporon had lost control of his vehicle and collided into several large pieces of lumber as he attempted to flee the location at a very high and erratic rate of speed once law enforcement had arrived and attempted to contact him, I did not know Corporon's mindset and determination to escape or continue to resist my actions to stop and contact Corporon, I felt my safety as well as the safety of the public was highly at risk. I also did not know if Corporon was armed with any unknown weapons at the time which could have been secreted on his person or in the passenger compartment of the vehicle which Corporon still had full access to or if Corporon would attempt to continue to utilize the vehicle as a weapon at this point to assault me or anyone else in the area in an attempt to flee.

As I observed Corporon lower his hands and have full access to his person and the contents inside the vehicle

which he may have been attempting to access a weapon or firearm of some nature and fact I was alone contacting Corporon in the roadway, I drew my Spokane Police Department issued service handgun and pointed my handgun at Corporon as I ordered him to raise his hands and place them above his head.

I observed as I was able to gain Corporon attention and Corporon cooperatively complied and raised his hands above his head. I ordered Corporon to not move and remain inside his vehicle for the short time until other officers were able to arrive at the location. I lowered my handgun to a guarded position as I stood by with Corporon at the location for other officers of the Spokane Police Department to arrive.

I witnessed as Ofc Atkins of the Spokane Police Department arrived at the location a short time later, Ofc Atkins and I ordered Corporon out of the vehicle and to a kneeling position in the roadway adjacent to the suspect vehicle.

Ofc Atkins and I detained Corporon by placing him in handcuffs (DL). I searched Corporon for any possible weapons or contraband on his person, but was unable to locate any. I further confirmed Corporon was alone in the vehicle and there was no one else in the vehicle or involved in the incident.

I further learned from Spokane Police Radio the vehicle had been reported stolen and was listed as stolen with the Spokane Police Department.

I checked Corporon's name via Spokane Police Radio and

On 102813 at approximately 1155 hours, I advised Corporon of his United States issued Constitutional Rights. I advised Corporon he had the right to legal representation as well at the right to remain silent. I asked Corporon if he understood his rights, at which time Corporon stated he did and wished to speak with his attorney.

At this time, I placed Corporon under arrest for Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle and escorted him to my patrol vehicle where I placed him in the back seat.

I requested Ofc T. Ponto of the Spokane Police Department to contact the victim/complainant regarding the incident and determine what Corporon had been doing at the business.

I heard as Ofc Ponto advised a short time thereafter that she was able to locate and contact the complainant son regarding the incident, Patrick A Lehan (100187). Ofc Ponto advised Patrick had told her Corporon did not commit any crime at the business, but was only behaving strangely and he would walk in and out of the mechanical business but would not make any sense when he spoke with him. Ofc Ponto stated Patrick told her Corporon moved his vehicle out of the way of their driveway, but kept being in their way as they worked and asking odd questions about the business and what the employees did at the mechanical shop. Ofc Ponto further stated Patrick reported to her that Corporon behavior was so suspicious and odd he even thought Corporon may possibly be casing the business or working up the nerve to rob the business.

I searched Corporon's stolen Ford Mustang, but was unable to locate any illegal contraband of any kind. I did locate a set of stainless-steel throwing knives in a black nylon sheath on the passenger seat just adjacent to the front driver's seat clearly in arm's and grabbing reach of Corporon as he was seated in the vehicle.

I later transported the knives to the Spokane Police Department Property Facility where I placed the knife set

on property to be held as evidence. (See also Spokane Police Department Property Report #13-363602)

I confirmed with Spokane Police Radio they were able to locate and contact the victim of the original vehicle theft, which Spokane Police Radio advised they had. I heard as Spokane Police Radio advised the victim of the vehicle theft would respond to the location to recover their vehicle in a short time, but was advised of the vehicle's location.

I completed a WA State uniform collision report documenting the collision the vehicle was involved in and requested a Spokane Police Department Corporal respond to the location to take photographs of the vehicle and minor damage sustained to the rear of the vehicle as a result of impacting the lumber.

I confirmed via the internet site Kelley Blue Book the approximately value of the Ford Mustang was approximately \$7,000.00.

I transported Corporon to the Spokane County Jail Facility where I booked Corporon in for Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle (9a.56.068). I completed an affidavit of probable cause regarding the incident and charging Corporon with the felony violation of Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle.

I completed this informational arrest report documenting my contact with Corporon and investigation and actions regarding the suspicious person/stolen vehicle recovery call for service and cleared the call.

PERMISSION TO SEARCH A STOLEN VEHICLE

I obtained permission from the registered owner (or the person authorized to possess the vehicle by the registered owner) to conduct a search of the stolen vehicle at the time that it is recovered for the purpose of discovering evidence of the theft and to assure that no additional stolen items and/or contraband/weapons remain in the vehicle. I additionally advised the registered owner that they had the right to refuse such a search.

On 10-28-13 at 1128 hours I responded to 2619 E. Mission in reference to a vehicle theft report.
