Reviewer comment:

This was an effective use of K-9, and was successful when several other methods had failed (compliance directives, warnings, application of OC) and when other avenues to contact Burland were not feasible. Injuries to Burland were consistent with officer's reports, and were relatively minor. Burland is a violent criminal who had felony warrants for crimes of violence. He admitted knowing the K-9 was being deployed and deliberately chose not to comply and risk the K-9 contact, which did occur.

Use of K-9 was within department policy, case law and use of force guidelines.

Reviewer comment:

Considering the totality of the circumstances including the violent background of the suspect, his active resistance and refusal to adhere to the officers' commands and the fact that other tactics (verbal, etc.) had been used but had not worked, the application of the K9 was an appropriate use of force to ensure the safety of the officers, other citizens and the suspect. The injuries sustained by the suspect were minor. The applicaton was was within policy.

INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:

Type of Application: Building search

Original Call:

Officer responded to a report that a wanted subject was at the location. Corporal McCollough saw the suspect inside of this residence. The Officers told the suspect he was under arrest. He then failed to come out and hid in the crawlspace of the house.

Suspect Actions:

The suspect hid in the crawlspace and failed to give up after repeated announcements. Eventually three "T-16" OC canisters were deployed into the crawlspace but the suspect still refused to come out. Eventually, K-9 Leo was used to search for and locate the suspect who was found hiding under insulation in the confined crawlspace underneath the house.

Est. Time & Distance of Contact (if known):

Approx. $1 - 1\frac{1}{2}$ minutes at about 20' away, under the house in a crawlspace.

Officer Safety Concerns/ Why was Canine used:

There was a felony DOC warrant for his arrest and the original charge was for Riot with a deadly weapon. There was another felony warrant for 2nd degree Theft, and there was now probable cause for Resisting Arrest.

Burland was actively Resisting Arrest by hiding in the house and failing to comply, even after being told he was under arrest and given the opportunity to do so.

Burland posed an extreme risk to the searching Officers. Burland has a lengthy violent local criminal history, with charges including 1st degree armed Robbery, 2nd degree Robbery, 2nd degree Assault. **Here are an extreme** Burland was hiding inside of his house and knew the layout much better then any of the Officers. He was showing an extreme level of desperation by failing to surrender even after Ofc. Hamilton's announcements and K-9 Leo barking. The behavior he was showing raised the risk factors even more and it was unknown if he was armed with any weapons. At the very least, Burland had access to knives. It was unknown if Burland was planning on setting up an ambush for the searching Officers.

INJURY DESCRIPTION:

The Spokane Police Department assumes no liability for improper or incorrect use of materials or information contained within this report. This document and the information contained herein is strictly a tool used for internal administrative tracking purposes only.

Injury:

Burland's injuries were minor. He had a small tear on his left hand and some marks on his forearm. He had some scrapes on his inner right thigh, right foot, and several compression marks and rakes on his right lower leg, above the ankle. Burland's back and shoulder's were also scraped up but these injures were most likely from the tight confined crawlspace and not from the K-9 contact.

SUPERVISORY COMMENTS:

K-9 Supervisor Comments:

Officer Hamilton responded to assist with locating a wanted suspect (Burland) who was hiding in his temporary residence after contact with the Police. Prior to deploying K-9 Leo Officer Hamilton gave several K-9 announcements into the residence. After Burland refused to surrender Officer Hamilton deployed K-9 Leo to locate Burland. K-9 Leo searched and Burland was discovered to be hiding in a confined crawlspace under the house. Several more K-9 announcements were made in the crawlspace but Burland still refused to comply. Officer deployed OC into the crawlspace in an attempt to get Burland to comply but he refused. K-9 Leo was deployed into the crawlspace and he located, and apprehended Burland by contact on his leg as he was hiding under insulation in the crawlspace. K-9 Leo was immediately released as soon as it was safe to do so. Burland was taken into custody by back up Officers without further incident. Burland admitted that he knew the Police and the K-9 were searching for him but hoped they would just go away.

On 10/23/2013 at about 1905 hours Ofc. Uberuaga and I responded to 1512 N. Ash on an anonymous report that wanted subject. Kenneth Burland, was at that location.

There were lights on inside the residence and I could see movement from inside the residence. Ofc. Uberuaga and I approached the north side of the residence. The shades on two of the north windows were partially open.

Ofc. Uberuaga and I had both viewed a recent jail booking photo of Burland, prior to arrival.

While looking through the open shades, Ofc. Uberuaga and I both saw a male inside the residence that we positively id's as wanted subject Kenneth Burland.

As we were watching the residence a female walked out of the front door. Ofc. Uberuaga contacted the female, who identified herself as Summer Henderson. Henderson stated that she is the resident of the house. She stated that Burland and his wife Charity are inside the residence. She advised that they do not live there, but have been staying there for the past two days.

While Ofc. Uberuaga was contacting Henderson I went to the south side of the residence. There was a kitchen window that had the slider open. I could hear the sound of a male voice inside. After a few moments, Kenneth Burland, looked out this window and looked directly at me. I identified myself as police and told Burland that he was under arrest. He immediately turned around and walked away from the window.

K-9 Ofc. Hamilton and Ofc. Kernkamp responded to the scene.

Henderson gave permission for Officers to enter the house to take Burland into custody.

Charity Burland came out of the back door of the residence. She initially denied that Kenneth was inside. She then admitted that Kenneth had went into the crawl space of the residence. She said that there is an access door to the crawl space under the refrigerator.

Radio confirmed that the arrest warrants for Burland were valid.

Ofc. Hamilton and Ofc. Kernkamp eventually took Burland into custody from the crawl space. See their reports for more information.

On 10-23-13 at about 1912 hours, I was requested by the Patrol Anti-Crime Team (PACT) to assisted with locating and arresting a wanted felon that had hid himself inside of a house at 1512 N. Ash.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). I am accredited as a Master Handler. Leo and I have been a team for nearly 5 years. He is my second working dog in my 9 1/2 years of being a canine handler. I am also a Master Trainer with the WSPCA.

I responded in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car. I was wearing the uniform of the day. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to the left side of his chest. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

When I arrived on scene, I spoke with Cpl. McCollough. He told me he saw the suspect, Kenneth A. Burland, inside of this house. He said Burland was living at this address but they also had concent to search for Burland from the resident, who was also Burland's wife. She was in the back yard during this incident. There were also several SPD officer's on scene and had the house locked down prior to my arrival.

Cpl. McCollough told me Burland had a felony Department of Corrections warrant, which the original charge was for riot with a deadly weapon. Burland also had a felony warrant for 2nd degree theft. Burland has a violent local criminal history and has prior arrest's for 1st degree armed robbery, 2nd degree robbery, 2nd degree assault, #3e

Leo and I made our way to the back door of the house. We had walked past Burland's wife as she sat in the back yard. Ofc. Kernkamp and Sgt. Keller were at the back door. I was told they had been yelling announcements into the open back door prior to my arrival but Burland refused to give up.

This house was fairly small in size, it was a single level, approx. 800-1000 sq. feet. The back door led into the kitchen area and then from there it broke off into the living room, bedrooms, and bathroom. There was also a crawlspace with access from the kitchen and an attic access in a closet. The access door to the crawlspace was only a few feet away from where I made several

announcements from the back door. There was, however, a refrigerator partially over the access door but it was not pushed all the way against the wall.

Once at the doorway, I yelled into the house, "Attention in the house, this is the Spokane Police K9 Unit. Kenneth Burland you are under arrest. You need to come out now or I'll send in my dog and when he finds you he might bite you!" Leo barked after my announcement and then I paused for approx. 30 seconds to listen for Burland to give up or respond. However, there was no response. I repeated my announcement and again had Leo bark and then paused another 30 seconds for any reaction from Burland. I also yelled into the house pleading for Burland to give up and avoid getting bit. However, he never responded to me so I decided to search the house with Leo for the following reasons:

- There was a felony DOC warrant for his arrest and the original charge was for riot with a deadly weapon. There was another felony warrant for 2nd degree theft, and there was now probable cause for resisting arrest.

- Burland was actively resisting arrest by hiding inside of the house and failing to give up, even after being told he was under arrest and given the opportunity to do so.

- Burland posed an extreme risk to the searching officers. Burland has a lengthy violent local criminal history, with charges including 1st degree armed robbery, 2nd degree robbery, 2nd degree assault, **and the searching officers**. Burland was hiding inside of his house and knew the layout much better then any of the officers. He was showing an extreme level of desperation by failing to surrender even after my announcements and Leo barking. The behavior Burland was showing raised the risk factors even more and it was unknown if he was armed with any weapons. At the very least, Burland had access to knives. It was unknown if Burland was planning on setting up an ambush for the searching officers so the use of the canine was much safer for everyone involved, including Burland.

After yelling several announcements from the back door of the house and getting no response, I released Leo to search. Leo cleared all of the main floor but was showing a strong change of behavior as he searched. Several times he worked the crawlspace access door and several places along the floor. By Leo's behavior, I was confident Burland was hiding in the crawlspace under the house.

We were able to push the refrigerator off the access door and then pulled it open. The ground/dirt/plastic vapor barrier was only about 18" below the bottom of the floor joists. It was extremely dark but once the immediate area was illuminated with a flashlight, I could see plumbing and insulation. The crawlspace appeared to go all the way under the house but I couldn't tell for sure and it was too dangerous to stick my head in and peak.

Once the access door was open, I yelled numerous more announcements into the crawlspace. I was trying to get Burland to give up so I didn't have to send Leo down there to locate him. I warned Burland that the space was extremely tight and if I had to send Leo in to locate him, Leo would bite him and its possible he would be on the bite for an extended period of time. I yelled down into the crawl space for at least a couple of minutes and even put Leo down into the crawlspace but still attached to my 3' lead so he couldn't go anywhere. When I did this, Leo was barking and trying to search. I was hoping that Burland would hear and see Leo so he would know that I wasn't bluffing. I explained to Burland that he was under arrest and we weren't leaving but if he would just come out, he wouldn't have to go to the hospital first prior to going to jail. Even with Leo barking and my pleading, Burland never responded.

I pulled Leo back out of the crawlspace and then we decided to toss in a couple T-16 OC cannisters. Ofc. Kernkamp did this and I heard the fuse "pop" prior to releasing the food born substance. This was another step taken to avoid having to send Leo into the crawl space, and minimize the amount of force necessary to take Burland into custody.

After the OC was tossed into the crawlspace, I used Leo to clear the attic so that area could be ruled out, while we let the OC disperse throughout the crawlspace for about 10 minutes. However, Burland still refused to surrender, which again raised the threat level even higher. His willingness to withstand being exposed to OC was extreme and not normal behavior.

After about 10 minutes of the OC dispersing throughout the crawlspace, I again yelled a couple more announcements. Burland never responded so I put Leo back down into the opening and released him to search for Burland. A few seconds later, I heard Burland start screaming from the far side of the crawlspace, which was back towards the front of the house and about 20' away from the crawlspace access door. I had to expose myself but Burland was distracted by Leo. I took the opportunity to put my head down into the opening and with a flashlight, I illuminated in the direction of the screaming. I saw Burland's head sticking out of some insulation batting but I couldn't see Leo, Burland's lower body, or his hands. I had to get most of my body down into the opening and I screamed at Burland to stop fighting Leo and to stop screaming or Leo would not come off the bite. I could see that Burland's head and upper body were fine and Burland yelled Leo had his leg. However, Burland kept screaming and wouldn't calm down so Leo wasn't able to hear any of my commands. I yelled to Burland he had to crawl to me, which he did but continued screaming the whole time. Burland made his way to the opening and Leo kept control of his right lower leg. Once at the opening, several officer's took control of Burland's hands/arms and pulled him out of the crawlspace, while I took control of Leo. Leo then immediately came off the bite.

Burland was taken into custody without further incident.

From the time I arrived on scene to the time I actually released Leo into the crawlspace, it was between 40-45 minutes and I exhausted all reasonable options prior to using Leo.

I noticed Burland was wearing blue jeans and leather shoes, his injuries appeared to be very minor. He was transported to Deaconess hospital to be treated.

At the hospital, Burland had calmed down substantially. He told me he obviously knew the police were there and he did hear Leo running around on the floor directly above him so he was aware that a K9 was being used. He said he did hear me make an announcement right before he heard the OC canister go off. Burland said he had covered himself with insulation and there was a crack in the old rock foundation wall that he was able to breathe through so the OC didn't affect him till he came out of the crawlspace. He said he was hoping we would just go away. He also said that Leo actually ran over the top of him, they looked "eye to eye" then Leo bit his leg. Burland said he began screaming and tried pushing Leo off his leg and that is when Leo transitioned to his left forearm and hand. The struggle continued between the two and eventually Leo took control of Burland's left lower leg and stayed there.

Burland's injuries were minor. He had a small tear on his left hand and some marks on his forearm. He had some scrapes on his inner right thigh, right foot, and several compression marks and rakes on his right lower leg, above the ankle. Burland's back and shoulder's were also scraped up but these injures were most likely from the tight crawlspace and not from the contact.

Cpl. Cordis took photographs of Burland's injuries.

After Burland was treated and released, he was transported to the SCSO jail and booked for the listed warrants.

Sgt. Keller and Lt. Lundgren were at the scene and were aware of the contact.

On 10/23/13 at 1905 hours I responded to 1514 N. Ash to assist Cpl. McCullough reference a male hiding in the residence.

While en route, Officers on scene advised Kenneth Burland, a wanted subject was seen inside the residence. He had a confirmed DOC warrant and a felony warrant for drugs, as well as theft.

Burland has an extensive criminal history involving gangs and drugs. He is also well known to Officers for criminal activity. #3e

Once inside the residence, Kenneth could not be located. I observed in the kitchen where he was last seen, the refrigerator was at a 45 degree angle against the wall, in a very small kitchen. In a house of this size I felt that the residents would want to maximize there floor space, making the fridge look out of place.

Under the fridge was a hatch door into the dirt crawl space. Once the main floor was cleared, Officers made several more announcements for Kenneth to surrender. I opened the hatch door and saw dirt and insulation with only a 2 foot deep, uneven crawl space.

Due to Kenneth's criminal history and lack of space for Officers to maneuver it was not safe for Officers to enter the crawl space.

K9 Officer Hamilton attempted to make announcement's with his K9 however there was still no response from Kenneth.

A plan was developed to deploy 2 x T16's into the crawl space. This would hopefully drive Kenneth out from hiding, enabling him to be taken into custody without further incident.

T16's are a non pyrotechnic, expulsion (hand held) device that disperses powdered OC, a food grade product. Similar to what Officers carry on their duty belts known as pepper spray.

I initially deployed two T16's into the crawl space. One did not deploy for an unknown reason. I deployed a third, only to replace the hand held that did not deploy. After waiting for 5 minutes there

was still no response, and Kenneth was not being affected by the OC that was filtering through the crawl space.

The entire time, announcements were being made by Officers for Kenneth to surrender. To ensure Kenneth was apprehended and would no longer be running, hiding from the Police, K9 Officer Hamilton used his K9 to assist in clearing the crawl space. See his additional.

Once Kenneth had crawled to the opening of the crawl space I placed him in right arm control and guided him out of the crawl space onto the kitchen floor. Once on the main level, I arrested, handcuffed (DL) and search him.

The crawl space was mainly a self contained space. After Kenneth was out, the door was shut, preventing any OC to enter the main residence. To ensure the house was safe for the residents to enter, Fire responded and ventilated the residence. The residents were advised as well if any decontamination was needed.

Kenneth was transported to DMC where he was cleared for booking in the Spokane County Jail.

I then transported Kenneth to SCJ and booked him on his warrants.

I responded back to the 1514 N. Maple to check on the residents. While inside the house I did not indicate any signs of OC.
