



On 01/16/2014 at approximately 2345 hours, Officer Spolski and I responded to two houses east of the Mallon House located at 1724 W Mallon Avenue on a report of a trespassing.

Dispatch advised that Beverly A Moore call 911 and reported she found a male subject inside with a resident in #3 but he did not belong at the location. The male was currently outside the location refusing to leave and was pounding on the outside of the door.

Upon arrival, I heard yelling from inside 1714 W Mallon Avenue. I heard a female voice say: you need to get out of here you, you need to leave. I walked up to the front door and noticed the glass in the front door was missing. I also saw a male subject run past the door and then run up the stairs. I made contact with two female subject's at the front door who informed me they were employees and the subject I was looking for just ran upstairs and his name was Wayne. One of the female subject's unlocked the door and opened the door so I could enter the residence. As I entered, I noticed there was an unbroken piece of glass laying on the floor just inside the doorway.

I went to the bottom of the stairs, looked up at the top, and saw a male subject standing at the top. I attempted a conversation with the subject and asked him to come down and talk to me but the male did not respond to me. He stood at the top of the stairs staring straight ahead mumbling something about being Jesus. Shortly after I attempted to engage the subject, Officer Spolski entered the residence and engaged the subject which allowed me to speak with the two employees.

The employees were Beverly A Moore and Nancy L Whitten of the Mallon House and its surrounding properties. I spoke with Beverly and Nancy and they told me the following: 1714 W Mallon Avenue is property of the Mallon House. It is a female only residence which does not allow visitors past 10 pm. Beverly was inside the Mallon House at 1724 W Mallon Avenue and was informed by a resident of 1714 W Mallon Avenue that a male was at the location visiting another resident, Jennifer Nichols. Beverly sent Nancy Whitten to 1714 W Mallon Avenue to have the male leave.

Nancy went to 1714 W Mallon Avenue at the request of Beverly and made contact with the male subject inside the residence at apartment #3. The male was at the location visiting his girlfriend, Jennifer L Nichols. Nancy told the male he was not allowed at the location because it was past visiting hours and he needed to leave. The male ignored Nancy and she continued to tell him to leave and he continued to ignore her. Nancy said she told the male to leave the property at least a dozen times but he ignored her.

While Nancy was trying to get the male to leave, Beverly came to the location to assist her. Nancy and Beverly were able to escort the male out of the building. Once the male was outside they locked the door to keep the male from getting back inside. The male began banging on the outside of the front door. As a result of his banging on the door he knocked the glass out of the door and then he climbed in through opening were the glass was. Once the male was back inside, Nancy and

Beverly told him to leave again several times but he ignored them again and ran upstairs.

Based on my investigation, I determined there was probable cause to arrest the subject for residential burglary because he forced his forced his way back into the residence by knocking the glass out of the door and then climbing though the open and entered the residence unlawfully.

While I was speaking with Beverly and Nancy, Officer Spolski attempted conversation with the male, see his report.

After speaking with Nancy and Beverly, I went to Officer Spolski's location to assist him. While Officer Spolski was speaking with the male, he asked him to come down stairs so he could talk to him. The male stood at the top of the stairs and did not respond to Officer Spolski's request. The stood at the top of the stairs with his hands balled into fists and starred blankly at Officer Spolski. Officer Spolski asked the male again to come down and speak with him and the male said something similar to: why don't you come up here so I can fight you. Officer Spolski responded calmly and asked the male again to come down stairs. The male walked down the stairs toward Officer Spolski and stopped about three or four steps from Officer Spolski. The male stood briefly on the steps above Officer Spolski and then tried to run back up the stairs. To prevent to male from running back up the stairs. Officer Spolski grabbed the male by the right arm. The male tried to pull his right arm away and Officer Spolski pulled the male toward him. The male fell against Officer Spolski causing him to fall backwards into a window causing it to break. I approached Officer Spolski and the male who were on the landing about four steps above me. I took control of the male's left are and guided him down the stairs. I attempted an arm bar takedown but the subject tried to pull away from me. As I attempted another arm bar takedown, the male's left hand made contact with my duty weapon for a brief moment. I felt the subject was trying to grab my gun and I quickly moved my gun side away from him and completed the arm bar take down by guiding the subject to the floor. As soon and the male was on the floor he balled up into the fetal position. I told the subject to stop resisting and give me his right arm but he refused. The subject trashed about on the floor, stood up, and tried to run away. I grabbed him by his right arm again and he continued to try and pull away from me. I pushed the subject forward and knocked him down onto the stairs. I told him to stop resisting again but he continued to thrash around in an attempt to get away. While I was trying to gain control of the subject's right arm, I heard Officer Spolski say "index" and he applied a drive stun to the male's back with his Taser. The subject continued to trash around and continued to try and pull his arm away from me. Officer Spolski applied another drive stun to the subject's back. After the second Taser application, the subject continued to trash about. Officer Spolski discarded his Taser and applied a neck restraint. After the application of the neck restraint by Officer Spolski, I was able to gain control of the male's right arm and place a handcuff on his right wrist. Officer Spolski brought the male's left arm toward the right arm and I placed the second cuff on his left wrist and double locked the handcuffs.

After the subject detained his breathing became labored. Due to the physical altercation and

On 011614 I responded to 1714 W. Mallon. Radio advised that Beverly Moore stated she is an employee of the facility and stated a male named "Wayne" (Wayne Davis) was outside refusing to leave. She found him inside the building and was not supposed to be there.

Upon arrival Ofc. Matthew entered the building first. I came in behind him and heard Matthew state that Wayne had broken the window out. I saw an unbroken pane of glass from the front door lying inside on the floor. I heard the staff tell Matthew that the Wayne had just gone up the stairs.

There was a short stair case going up just inside the front door, then a landing. To the right of the landing from the front door is a stair case going up to the second floor.

I went up to the landing as I could not see Wayne from the main floor. From the landing I could see Wayne at the top of the stairs on the second floor.

Wayne appeared to be high or intox. He had a 1,000 yard stare and I could not tell if he was staring at me or through me. His fists were clenched in to fists with his arms outstretched to the ground and at his sides.

I heard Wayne state something to the effect of he was in control and he is god. I also heard him mention Satan and the devil.

I stood on the landing and leaned against the railing to present a more relaxed demeanor for Wayne in an attempt to get him to relax, calm down and be more compliant. I spoke to Wayne in a calm relaxed tone of voice and asked him his name. Wayne did not answer me.

I asked Wayne if he could walk down the stairs and talk to me. Wayne did not answer me. I asked Wayne if he could talk to me from where he was. Wayne did not answer me.

I continued to try and talk to Wayne but he refused. At one point I heard

a door open and Wayne turned and looked to the north of the hallway. I heard him ask a female, Jennifer Nichols, if she would come with him. I heard Jennifer tell Wayne something to the effect of she couldn't because she lives there and it is against the rules.

I told the female to go back in her room and keep the door shut fearing Wayne might attempt to hurt her in his current state of mind. She complied and I heard the door shut.

Wayne then turned his attention back at me, or through me. I continued to try and speak to Wayne in a calm tone and asked him several times to come down the stairs so we could talk.

Wayne then stated something to the effect of "your Satan, I want to fight you." I continued my calm voice and told Wayne that I did not want to fight him and that I just wanted to talk to him. Wayne then stated something to the effect of "why don't you come upstairs because I want to fight you."

I again told Wayne that I did not wish to fight him and that I just wanted him to come down the stairs and talk to me. Wayne then walked down the stairs. I repositioned myself towards the north wall of the landing so that Wayne would have clear access to walk all the way down the stairs. Wayne stopped approx 3-4 steps from the landing.

Wayne paused for a moment and then turned and started to run back up the stairs. Fearing that Wayne might be going to harm Jennifer or another resident and that an altercation with him on the second level with a whole flight of stairs to fall down would be more dangerous for all of us, I grabbed Wayne's right arm before he was able to get away.

Wayne resisted me and tried to pull away from me. I pulled Wayne's arm to get him off of the stairs and I fell into the west window of the landing, causing it to break. Officer Matthew came to the landing and together we were able to bring Wayne to the main floor.

Wayne continued to resist us pulling away, tensing his muscles. We wrestled with Wayne trying to get him to the ground safely so he could be detained. He was told to stop resisting and to get on the ground several times.

At one point during the altercation I heard Officer Matthew state something to the effect of "quit grabbing for my gun." Fearing that Wayne was gaining control of Matthew's gun I reached for my gun. I then saw

Matthew turn his gun away from Wayne while holding on to his right arm.

Wayne had his left side somewhat pinned against a wall. I pulled my taser out of its holster and took the probe cartridge off. I decided to use my Taser on Wayne in the drive stun mode for the reasons stated above and for the following reasons:

- -Wayne was wanted for Burglary.
- -Wayne had stated his intent to fight with us prior to the altercation.
- -The altercation was going on for an extended time. My training and experience has taught me that the longer an altercation goes on there is an increased risk of injury to both Officer's and Offenders.
- -Wayne had attempted to gain access to an Officer's gun which shows and intent to kill.
- -Wayne was continuing to resist us by attempting to stand up and pull away from us.

I advised "index" and activated a cycle with my Taser to Wayne's lower back but because Wayne was still actively resisting and moving I am not sure how many times it actually came in contact with him. I activated a second cycle to Wayne's upper back which I believe was able to make better contact.

It did not appear that the Taser was working so I tossed it aside and advised Officer Matthew I was going to attempt a neck restraint. I applied a level 1 neck restraint on Wayne; no attempt was made to render him unconscious.

I told Wayne several times to place his hands behind his back. Matthew was able to gain control of his right arm. I reached down and pulled his left arm behind his back and we were able to arrest, handcuff (DL), Wayne.

After Wayne was arrested he was lying on his side towards the stair case. Wayne started to breath heavily and it sounded labored and consistent with Exited Delirium. I advised Radio of the situation and to expedite Medics. I sat Wayne up and his breathing improved dramatically and appeared to be fine.

Medics arrived and AMR transported Wayne to Deaconess as a precaution. Sgt. Kannberg responded and was debriefed of the events. A corporal was requested for photos of Wayne and the broken windows.

On 01-16-14 at approximately 2354 hours, I arrived at 1714 E Mallon Ave to assist officer Matthews and Officer Spolski who had just been in a physical altercation with a burglary suspect.

After arriving I noticed that the suspect, Wayne Davis, was detained in handcuffs and sitting up. Davis was breathing heavily and kept chanting to himself that he was god, and that some unknown person was the devil.

I assisted in getting Davis onto AMR's stretcher, and he was subsequently transported to Deaconess medical center for an evaluation.

I met Officer Fairbanks at the hospital in room #9 where Davis was being evaluated. Officer Fairbanks and I stood by while Davis received treatment, and were advised that he had been cleared medically for jail booking.

Officer Fairbanks and I explained to Davis repeatedly that he needed to cooperate when he was removed from restraints to be placed in handcuffs. Davis offered muscular resistance and attempted to pull his arms away during the handcuffing process, however Officer Fairbanks and I were able to hold his arms behind him and I placed him in handcuffs (D/L) without any use of force.

Officer Fairbanks and I then escorted Davis to my patrol vehicle. Davis attempted to drag his feet and pull away from us in order to avoid being transported to jail. We were able to escort Davis to the vehicle and place him in the backseat without using any force other than escort holds.

I transported David to Spokane County Jail where he was booked for residential burglary. The medical information provided by hospital staff was given to Corrections officers and they were made aware that he had been evaluated by the hospital and VNR had been applied but the subject was not rendered unconscious.

On 01-16-14 at approximately 2352 hours, I responded to 1714 W Mallon to assist officers who were on scene with a male.

Upon arrival, I observed that Ofc. Spolski and Ofc. Matthew had a male, who was later identified as Wayne Davis, handcuffed in the prone position. Wayne was conscious and was sat up into a seated position. I stood by with the male as medics arrived on scene. Wayne said multiple times, "I am God" and was looking at the wall saying, "He is the devil."

When medics arrived on scene Ofc. Spolski and I stood Wayne up. He stood in the hallway of the residence. When we started walking out of the door of 1714 W Mallon, Wayne planted his feet and refused to walk. Ofc. Spolski and I had control of his arms and AMR staff lifted his legs and we placed him onto the stretcher. Wayne was released from handcuffs and secured to the stretcher by medics.

I followed the ambulance to Deaconess. Once in the emergency room, Wayne was conscious staring at the ceiling and would not respond to medical staff. RN Ken Rickel conducted a sternum rub on Wayne during his assessment. Wayne still would not respond to any questioning by medical staff. Wayne had a red mark on his chest from the sternum rub conducted by medical staff.

I stood by in the Emergency Room with Wayne until Sgt. Kannberg came to the location to talk to Wayne. Ofc. Briggs arrived on scene and advised that there was probable cause to arrest Wayne for Residential Burglary. Sgt. Kannberg advised Wayne that he was under arrest for Residential Burglary.

When Deaconess medically released Wayne, Ofc. Briggs removed him from his restraints. He initially tensed up and tried to pull his left arm away from me. Ofc. Briggs and I placed him back into handcuffs (dl) without incident. He was advised that he was under arrest for Residential Burglary and was going to jail. Ofc. Briggs and I escorted him to Ofc. Briggs's patrol car. Ofc. Briggs transported Wayne to the Spokane County Jail.

- -She is an employee of the Mallon House, a business that cares for mentally ill residents.
- -The residents are not allowed visitors after 2200 hrs.
- -The defendant was inside the facility located at 1714 W. Mallon on 011614 at approx 2330 hrs.
- -The defendant was asked to leave several times and they eventually had to escort the defendant out of the facility.
- -After shutting and locking the front door to the facility after escorting the defendant outside, the defendant banged on the window to the door several times and the glass popped out and landed on the floor inside the facility.
- -The defendant crawled through the opening and entered the facility after being told several times to leave.

### Nancy Whitten can testify to:

- -She is an employee of the Mallon House, a business that cares for mentally ill residents.
- -The residents are not allowed visitors after 2200 hrs.

- -The defendant was inside the facility located at 1714 W. Mallon on 011614 at approx 2330 hrs.

On 1-16-2014 Officer Spolski and Officer Matthew responded to 1724 W. Mallon (Mallon House) reference a subject refusing to leave the location. Wayne Davis had been visiting Jennifer Nicholas at the location. Mr. Davis was asked to leave and did not. Staff from the Mallon House escorted Mr. Davis out of the building, asked him to leave and locked the door. Mr. Davis refused to leave the property. Mr. Davis was asked to leave numerous times; however, he refused to leave and police were called.

Once Mr. Davis was outside he began banging on a window next to the front door. The window fell out of the frame and Mr. Davis then entered the residence. Officers arrived on scene to find two employees inside the residence telling Mr. Davis to leave. Mr. Davis then ran up stairs to the second floor of the residence.

Officer Spolski entered the residence, and while standing on a landing leading to the second floor, he could see Mr. Davis in the hallway on the second floor. Mr. Davis had his fists clenched and down to his sides, he was staring at Officer Spolski and he appeared high or intoxicated. Mr. Davis said he was in control and was God. He also mentioned Satan and the devil.

Officer Spolski attempted to communicate with Mr. Davis and have him exit the building; however, he refused. Ms. Nicholas opened her door and Mr. Davis asked her to go with him. Ms. Nicholas said she could not because it was against the rules. Officer Spolski asked her to close her door and she did.

Officer Spolski continued asking Mr. Davis to come down and talk with him. Mr. Davis stated, "You're Satan. I want to fight you. Why don't you come upstairs because I want to fight you." Officer Spolski continued asking Mr. Davis to come down to talk with him.

Mr. Davis started walking down the steps and Officer Spolski stepped back so Mr. Davis could go by him and continue walking down the steps. Mr. Davis then stopped and turned to go back upstairs.

At this time Mr. Davis had been asked to leave and was escorted out of the residence. Mr. Davis broke out a window and crawled through the window to gain entry into the residence. Officer Spolski asked Mr. Davis to leave and he refused. Officer Spolski did not know what he would do to Ms. Nicholas or other occupants in the residence. Mr. Davis also asked to fight. Because of this, Officer Spolske attempted to take arm control of Mr. Davis, as he was committing burglary.

Mr. Davis resisted and pulled back. Officer Spolski pulled back and ended up falling back into a window on the landing he was standing on. Officer Matthew came up to the landing and assisted in guiding Mr. Davis down the steps to the main floor.

While on the main floor Mr. Davis tensed up his muscles and began pulling away. Mr. Davis was told to stop resisting and to get on the ground. Mr. Davis refused. Officer Matthew attempted a straight arm bar takedown; however, this failed. He attempted another straight arm bar takedown, and at this time he felt Mr. Davis make contact with his duty weapon on his hip. Officer Spolski heard Officer Matthew state, "Quit grabbing for my gun." Mr. Davis was guided to the ground and went into a fetal position. Mr. Davis thrashed around as officers attempted to gain control of his arms. Mr. Davis then stood up. Officer Matthew took arm control as Mr. Davis pulled away. Mr. Davis was pushed into the stairs and

fell to the ground. Officer Spolski announced "index" and deployed his TASER in touch stun mode to Mr. Davis' lower back for the following reasons:

Crime: Mr. Davis was asked to leave the residence and was escorted out. Mr. Davis broke out a window and entered the residence. He was told to leave again and ran up to the second floor. Officers asked Mr. Davis to come down and talk with them and he refused. Mr. Davis was committing burglary.

Threat Factors: Mr. Davis was inside a residence with other occupants. He referred to himself as God and officers as Satan, and he told officers he wanted to fight. He balled up his fists and refused to exit the building. When first contact was made he pulled back from officers and resisted officers' control techniques. He continued to resist officers' control tactics, prolonging the altercation and increasing the danger to officers and Mr. Davis.

Resistance: Mr. Davis was physically resisting officers' control tactics and grabbed at an officer's gun.

Officer Spolski did not see a reaction by Mr. Davis and did not know if the TASER had made contact with Mr. Davis, as he continued thrashing around on the ground. He then activated a second cycle to Mr. Davis' upper back for the same reasons.

Mr. Davis continued to thrash about and fight with officers. Office Spolski's application of the TASER did not appear to stop Mr. Davis. Officer Spolski then applied a level 1 neck restraint to control Mr. Davis. Mr. Davis was not rendered unconscious. Officer Matthew was then able to gain control of Mr. Davis' arm and he was handcuffed.

Because of the prolonged fight, medics were called for Mr. Davis. Mr. Davis was transported to Deaconess Hospital for evaluation.

I contacted Mr. Davis at Deaconess Hospital. He was restrained to the bed with soft restraints. I introduced myself to Mr. Davis and he just stared at the lights in the ceiling. I asked what happened and he continued staring at the ceiling wile blinking, but not saying anything. I continued talking to Mr. Davis and he did not say anything. I asked if he was injured and he turned his head and said something, but I could not understand him. He then went back to staring at the ceiling.


I could see Mr. Davis had a bump over his right eye. His face was a bit red and his lips appeared to have dried blood. I asked him to sit up so I could see if there were any injuries on his back and he refused. There was a red mark on his chest. I was informed this was from a sternum rub that a nurse did. Photos were requested.

The TASER device is intended to control a violent or potentially violent individual, while minimizing the risk of serious injury. The appropriate use of such a device should result in fewer serious injuries to officers and suspects. **309.5.1 APPLICATION OF THE TASER DEVICE:** The TASER device may be used in any of the following circumstances, when the circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application is reasonably necessary to control a person:

- (a) The subject is violent or is physically resisting.
- (b) The subject has demonstrated, by words or action, an intention to be violent or to physically resist, and reasonably appears to present the potential to harm officers, him/herself or others.

Officer Spolski deployed his TASER on Mr. Davis because he committed burglary and was physically resisting officers' control tactics and grabbed at an officer's gun. He was not able to give Mr. Davis a warning that the TASER was going to be deployed due to the tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving situation. He announced "TASER" just prior to deploying the TASER to inform Officer Matthew of the deployment. The first deployment of the TASER in touch stun mode did not yield a response from Mr. Davis and it was unknown if contact was made because he did not respond. Officer Spolski deployed the TASER in touch mode a second time to Mr. Davis' upper back. Officer Spolski did not see a response from Mr. Davis. He transitioned to a Level 1 Neck Restraint. After this officers were able to gain control of Mr. Davis and handcuff him. Officer Spolski's actions were objectively reasonable based on the totality of the circumstances. The officers' actions were within departmental guidelines and state law.
