Reviewer comment:

I have reviewed this incident and find that the responding officers were faced with a volatile and potentially deadly situation. They attempted to de-escalate the situation with verbal commands. The suspect failed to cooperate with the officers commands, so Officer Raleigh deployed his taser because of the facts and circumstances known to officers at the time. The initial deployment was unsuccessful, so he deployed his taser a second time and this allowed officers to control and take the suspect into custody. Officer Raleigh used a minimal amount of force to control the suspect and this force was in accordance with SPD policy.

NARRATIVE							

On 022614 at approximately 1514 hours, I responded to the residence located at 1214 East Bismark Avenue in the City/County of Spokane, WA along with several other officers of the Spokane Police Department reference a possible suicidal person call for service.

While enroute, Spokane Police Radio advised the complainant, later ID'd as Kristina R Kitchens (111282) had called Spokane 911 to report the fact her brother was intoxicated and was talking about hurting himself. Spokane Police Radio stated Kristina stated her brother; later ID'd as **#14** (032385) had a small knife on his person, but later accessed a handgun which he placed in his waistband.

Spokane Police Radio stated Kristina advised she did not know if the handgun was real or not, but Kristina was going to try to disarm **#14** of the handgun if possible.

Spokane Police Radio further advised **#14** had placed the handgun in his front waistband, but later left the residence to walk to the neighbor's residence at 1207 East Bismark Avenue for some reason. Spokane Police Radio reported **#14** had returned to the original residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue and was continuing to make statements that he "was going to blow his head off."

Upon arrival at 1524 hours, I stood-by to the west of the target location until several other officers were able to respond and arrive at the location.

I observed as Ofc Zinkgraf and Ofc Lamanna arrived at the location a short time later and assisted me at the front of the residence.

Ofc Zinkgraf and I approached the front of the residence on foot and began to walk to the front door of the target residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue when I heard an adult white female exited the residence directly to the west and contacted myself and Ofc Zinkgraf.

I heard the adult female immediately contact officers and stated **#14** was inside the residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue. The female continued to state **#14** was extremely intoxicated, but she did not want officers to shoot or hurt him.

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As I was listening to the female provide a description of #14 and how he was armed with possibly a handgun, I heard what sounded like a male voice begin to yell in the back yard of the residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue.

Roughly at the same time, I heard as Ofc Coleman advised via the police radio she was also on scene at the target residence in the rear of the residence in the alley. I heard as Ofc Coleman stated she observed the suspect male, #14 was outside of the residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue and had walked into the backyard of the residence.

I was unable to observe #14 at the time from my vantage point at the front of the residence. I continued to hear Ofc Coleman advise over the police radio she could observe #14 in the rear of the residence and #14 was armed with a "black handgun in his left hand." I heard as Ofc Coleman continued to advise she could observe #14 was also armed with a "big" knife at the time as he was seen in the rear of the residence.

At this time, Ofc Zinkgraf and I entered the back yard through the gate on the west side of the residence and began to walk into the backyard of the residence in an attempt to ascertain #14 exact location and what he was doing.

As Ofc Zinkgraf and I entered the back yard, I rounded the southwest corner of the residence to observe the back yard of the house and back porch in an attempt to locate #14

I was able to observe an adult white female, later ID'd as Kristina R Kitchens (111282) standing on the rear elevated porch of the house with what appeared to be a cordless telephone in her hand. Kristina observed officers she motioned to go back into the residence and began to walk back into the rear door of the residence. Ofc Zinkgraf was able to stop her and instruct her to walk over to the southwest corner of the residence where officers could provide some protection and security to Kristina.

I observed as Kristina cooperatively complied with Ofc Zinkgraf's instructions, but I still was unable to observe #14 in the back yard of the residence.

Just as I was looking through the back yard of the residence for #14 from the corner of the house, I observed an adult white male, later ID'd as #14. #14 was on the outside of the back man gate of the backyard leading into the alley. I observed #14 standing on the outside of the gate and reached over the gate to unlock the gate with his hand. I watched #14 quickly and purposefully walked into the backyard of the residence from the alleyway and aggressively walked directly towards the back door of the residence.

I heard as #14 yelled some indiscernible statements as he entered the backyard and immediately and quickly powered towards the back door of the residence, but I was unable to understand what he was yelling or saying.

As I watched #14 walk towards the rear of the residence, I was unable to observe #14 holding a handgun or knife in either of his hands at the time. I could see #14 was wearing long pants and a bright orange shirt which was un-tucked and hanging over his waistband. I immediately recalled the complainant had advised the 911 operator that #14 had hidden the handgun in his waistband prior to law enforcement responding. I believed #14 was still armed with a firearm and still in possession of the handgun which he reportedly had hidden in his waistband.

I continued to hear #14 yell at someone or something as he power walked towards the back door of the residence. I witnessed #14 was extremely upset at the time as he swung his arms back and forth in what looked to be a military stride as he powered through the back yard. I observed #14 face was red and had a

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clear grimace expression as he stared directly at the ground in front of him and ignored all other outside influences.

I immediately yelled, "Police, Stop" and ordered #14 to "Stop" and "Get on the ground." I repeatedly my commands to "Stop" and "Get on the ground" several more times in an attempt to gain verbal compliance and stop #14 from advancing towards the residence. I observed #14 refused to comply and blatantly ignored everyone around him as he continued to quickly walk towards the back door of the residence.

At this time, based on several of the following facts and circumstances which had unfolded within a matter of seconds, I determined to take immediate and emergent action:

- The complainant, Kristina Kitchens had called Spokane 911 to request the assistance of law enforcement officers of the Spokane Police Department regarding her brother, #14 who she reported was threatening to harm himself if not kill himself
- #14 had subsequently armed himself with several different weapon systems to include a knife of some unknown style and size as well as an unknown handgun which he reportedly secreted in his waistband with the full intent to either cause harm and possibly death to himself or possibly anyone else near him including responding law enforcement officers
- Ofc Coleman was able to observed #14 and report to other officers on scene via her police radio at the exact time that #14 in the rear of the residence with a handgun and a "big" knife and was still armed while law enforcement was on scene
- From my vantage point in the backyard of the residence, I was able to observe #14 from approximately 20 feet away and see he was not holding anything in his hands, but I was unable to observe #14 waistband where the complainant had reported #14 had hidden his handgun or knife since his shirt was un-tucked and was wearing long pants at the time
- I was unable to determine if there was anyone else inside the residence such as any other family members or children which #14 may have had knowledge of and was trying to gain access to by walking directly towards the rear door of the residence
- I fully believed #14 was solely intent on ending his life and possibly causing harm if not death to anyone else he could access based on the fact #14 had armed himself with several different weapons systems and knew law enforcement had been notified and continued to make statements that he was going to "Blow his head off," and "Where are the cops?"

Based on these facts and circumstance, I believed #14 was currently armed at the time of my contact with either a handgun or knife of some nature on his person and was completely intent on getting back into the residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue for some unknown reason. I observed #14 completely disregard and ignore the presence of law enforcement officers and pay no attention to the lawful commands myself or Ofc Zinkgraf were repeatedly yelling at him to "Stop" and "Get on the ground."

Also, since I was unable to enter the residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue and was contacting Robert in the backyard, I further believed there to be other occupants or potential victims still inside the residence at 1214 East Bismark Avenue. It appeared #14 had knowledge about something or someone inside the residence which he was attempting access and possibly cause harm to if not death being that he was armed with

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a handgun.

I determined it was critical and imperative to take immediate action and stop #14 from accessing the residence via the back door to protect any potential occupants still inside. I fully believed #14 was armed at the time with either a handgun, large knife or both and was fully intent on causing injury to someone or anyone, including himself.

I continued to yell verbal commands at #14 ordering him to "Stop," but watched as #14 continued to walk towards the residence and disregard anything I said.

At this time, I drew my Taser and attempted to apply a Taser probe application to #14 left side. I left cover from behind the southwest corner of the residence and deployed the Taser probes, but watched as #14 just stopped and looked at me as the Taser took no effect.

I observed the Taser probes impacted behind #14 and had no effect on his person what-so-ever.

I continued to order #14 to "Get on the ground," at which time I removed the discharged Taser cartridge in an attempt to reload and re-apply the Taser.

As I was removing the Taser cartridge, I could feel the Taser was still active and discharging as it energized my right hand for a brief second. I successfully removed the spent cartridge from the front of the device and reloaded the Taser with my second cartridge. I re-applied a Taser probe application.

I observed as the probes successfully impacted #14 left torso and immediately caused #14 to pull his arms in towards his body and rigidly stiffen his upper body. I witnessed as Robert made no further movement, but stiffly fell backwards onto his back in the snow on the ground as the Taser was able to make successful contact with #14.

Ofc Zinkgraf and I immediately contacted #14 as he laid in the snow during the remaining Taser cycle and rolled #14 onto his stomach. Ofc Zinkgraf and I placed #14 into a prone handcuffing position and placed #14 hands behind his back without incident. Ofc Zinkgraf and I detained #14 by placing him in handcuffs (double locked).

Ofc Zinkgraf and I escorted #14 back to his feet and walked #14 out of the backyard of the residence to the alley behind the residence where we contacted #14 regarding the incident.

It should be noted during Ofc Zinkgraf and my contact with #14 I could hear as the original adult female from the residence directly to the west repeatedly yelled at us to stop hurting #14 and that we were going to kill him.

I directed responding officers to contact the adult female at the back door of her residence to gather her statement and advise her of the potentially armed circumstances of the incident.

At this time, I confirmed officers on scene had requested medics of the Spokane City Fire Department as well as American Medical Response respond to the location to remove the Taser probes from #14 body.

I inspected #14 for any possible signs of physical injury to his person, but was unable to observe any.

I was able to observe one Taser probe was in the rear left side of #14 shirt and a second Taser probe was in the top of #14 pants on his left side. I further witnessed one Taser probe was stuck in #14 left side and had impacted #14 left torso and was still in #14 flesh.

I further requested a Spokane Police Department Corporal respond to the location to take photographs of #14 and results of the Taser deployment to be held as evidence.

At this time, I contacted Lt Singley and Sgt Ervin of the Spokane Police Department and advised them of my actions and subsequent Taser application involving #14.

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I observed as medics of the Spokane City Fire Department and AMR arrived at the location and were able to remove the Taser probes from Robert's person and provide #14 with a band-aid without incident.

I further requested Ofc Heuett and Ofc Lamanna transport #14 to Sacred Heart Medical Center for psychiatric evaluation due to #14 suicidal statements to his sister and actions regarding arming himself with a handgun and knives in an effort to harm himself.

As I was contacting #14 in the rear alleyway of the residence, I located two large knives, one a metal straight bladed wood handled Winchester knife approximately eight to ten inches long next to a black nylon sheath and a second black and gray camouflage colored Buck knife on the southwest corner of #14 detached garage next to the alley. I observed black and gray folding knife was open at the time next to the straight bladed knife.

I observed both knives where open, out of the sheath and were completely accessible and in an easy to retrieve location and position for #14 as he planted and positioned them in the alley in what possibly could have been an attempt to attack responding officers or citizens in the alley.

I later responded to the Spokane Police Department where I downloaded the activation data/information regarding my Taser deployment.

I further placed the two knives, spent Taser cartridges, probes and leg wires as well as a black metal BB gun/handgun Ofc Lamanna located inside the residence on Spokane Police Department Property to be held as evidence of the suicidal incident. (See also Spokane Police Department Property Report #14-61075)

I later completed this informational incident report documenting my contact with all the parties involved in the incident and my actions regarding the incident and cleared the call.

On 022614I was dispatched with other officer's to 1214 E Bismark regarding a suicidal male, #14 While en route to the call, dispatch advised of the following [but is not limited too], information per the compl, Kristina Kitchens. The compl advised her brother was intoxicated and talking about hurting himself. They had a hard time waking him up. He had a small knife on him and minutes later had a gun in the waistband of his pants. The compl did not know if the gun was real. He asked her where the cops were and 2 minutes later told her he was going to blow his head off. He left the house about 3 minutes later. At approx 1519 hrs the compl called back to report her brother was across the street and the gun was hidden at her location. She thought he went to get another gun. He came back to 1214 about 1 1/2 minutes later and now everyone was at this location, [1520 hrs].

I arrived on scene at approx 1529 hrs. Ofc's Raleigh, Zinkgraf and myself walked together toward the house and I advised them I would be in the back alley of the house as they approached the front. I confirmed the color of the house with them and saw there was an approx 6-7 foot wooden fence in the backyard. I could not see between the boards of the fence at all. There was a white garage to the east of 1214. I started to approach the fence to tell the other officer's my location. I could see the entire south side of the house and saw the back door open. I saw a male who matched the SPRS photo I saw of the susp prior to my arrival. He flung open the screen door and started down the stairs. I heard him yell something that I could not understand due to his slurred speech but did hear the word, "bitch" that he yelled louder than the other words. I believed there might be a female inside the house. I went to cover on the south side of the garage behind the neighbors to the west. I heard the gate latch as if the gate had been opened. I moved to the northwest corner of the garage for cover. I could hear the males' footsteps. I looked around the corner of the garage into the alley and saw #14 holding what I believed to be a handgun in his left hand. It looked like he was holding a black gun holster that contained a handgun that had a slightly worn black metal finish on the end of the gun magazine. I advised radio that he had a gun in his left hand. He started walking e/b into the alley only a few steps then stopped and turned back toward the house. A few seconds later, I saw him draw a large hunting type knife from a sheath. He drew the knife out very quickly and dramatically as he stood in a bladed stance with his right foot back and left foot forward as if ready to attack. He was facing the house at this time. I advised radio of the large knife in his hand. He had an extremely angry look on his face and his eyes were squinting as if he were determined to hurt someone. I was just starting to yell at #14 when I heard Ofc Raleigh yelling at #14 to show him his hands. Since I was the only one in the alley and Raleigh had a much better position for

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communication with #14, I ended my attempt with verbals. At this time, I heard and saw #14 yell, "Fuck you!" and then he took off at a dead run towards the back yard of the house where I had seen Raleigh and Zinkgraf just at the south west corner of the house. I thought he was charging at the Officer's with the large knife. I stayed at my position for cover because I believed shots may be fired by Officer's due to #14 attacking them with the knife. I heard a sound that I thought might have been a cap gun that I thought #14 may have fired to make Officer's think he was shooting at him so they would shoot back at him and have his death threat be carried out by Law Enforcement. I heard Raleigh yell again at #14 twice, telling him to get on the ground. I came around to the gate area to see #14 refusing to obey commands as he headed toward the back door of the house. I did not see anything in his hands. #14 was by a swing set when Ofc Raleigh deployed his taser which did make contact with #14. #14 fell backward to the snow covered ground, [about 4 inches of snow] and was taken into custody by Ofc's Raleigh and Zinkgraf. After the taser circuit ended, #14 immediately began talking. I could tell by his speech he was extremely intoxicated but was able to carry on a conversation. Officer's were talking to him, re-assuring him he was ok. #14 was assisted to his feet and walked to the alley to standby for medics for probe removal from the front of his torso. After walking #14 to the alley, I noticed the large hunting type knife, black knife sheath and another smaller black knife laying next to the southwest corner of the garage at 1214. Neither knife was in a sheath. The smaller black folding knife was open and had a metal grip area that was worn, [not totally black]. #14 must have thrown the knife, [knives] to the ground as he ran toward the backyard. I did not see this as his body would have shielded the action

While waiting for medics, #14 kept asking if he couldn't just pull the probes out himself. I heard Sgt Ervin talking to #14. #14 commented something to the effect that he actually liked the feeling of being tased. #14 continued talking with officer's in a sensible manner the entire time while waiting for medics. He was transported to the hospital for evaluation based on his suicidal statements.

On 022614 at approx. 15:30 hours I responded to 1214 E. Bismark for the report of a suicidal male with knives and a gun. Ofc. Raleigh and Coleman also responded.

When I arrived Ofc. Raleigh and I went to the front of the residence. Ofc. Coleman went to the back. While we were waiting for an officer with a bean bag device a female identified herself as the subject, #14, mother (Elizabeth Mertens). She came out from the house directly to the west. She stated her son, was in the house with her daughter. They got the kids out. She said she was going to call her daughter and get her to exit the house, leaving #14 in the house alone. I advised her if she did that, not to mention we were out front. She said, "OK". She then started to walk back towards the rear of her house. As she walked towards her back porch I heard a males voice, coming from the backyard of 1214 E. Bismark. He was yelling something and sounded intoxicated. I then heard Ofc. Coleman say the suspect was coming out the back.

Ofc. Raleigh and I then started to open up the gate to the backyard. I then heard Ofc. Coleman say in an elevated voice (over the radio), that the male had a "gun". She then said it could possibly be a "knife". As Ofc. Raleigh and I made our way to the backyard I could still hear the male yelling. Mertens was on her back porch. I told her to go inside her house. She stated she would not go inside. She then stated, "Don't kill him. That's what he wants you to do. It's a "BB gun". She then began screaming at us.

Ofc. Raleigh and I got to the outside back corner of the house, on the N/W side. I could see a w/m, later identified as #14, in the back yard. He was wearing blue jeans, and an orange sweater that hung below his waistline. It was also baggy around the waist line, so I could not see if he might have a weapon secreted somewhere on his person. #14 was walking towards the back door of the house.

Mertens continued to scream at us from her back yard, making the situation even more hectic. Ofc. Raleigh immediately started telling #14 to stop. I was yelling at #14 to let me see his hands. #14 ignored Ofc. Raleigh and my commands and stepped up his pace and began quickly walking to the open back door. Ofc. Raleigh and I did not want #14 to make it back into the house. I did not know if there were any accessible weapons inside, or people.

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Ofc. Raleigh and I were close enough to #14 that after he ignored several of our commands to stop and to show us his hands, Ofc. Raleigh deployed his tazer. The tazer prongs hit #14 in the torso area. It appeared that they did not penetrate his loose sweater. #14 just looked down at his torso and tore the prongs out. He still continued to try to get to the back door of the residence and Ofc. Raleigh quickly deployed another round from his tazer (prongs). This application hit #14 in the torso area again and was effective. #14 fell backwards onto the ground. I could hear Mertens screaming, "You ass hole". Ofc. Raleigh and I put #14 in the prone position and safely handcuffed him.

We sat #14 up. I asked if he was ok. He stated he was fine. We then stood him up on his feet and walked him towards the alley, where Ofc. Coleman's vehicle was. Once out in the alley I noticed 2 knives near the garage. One appeared to be a pocket knife, with a silver blade, and the other was a large black hunting style knife in a black sheath.

While we were waiting for paramedics to remove the tazer prongs from #14 he told me this was not the first time he has been tazerred and would not be the last. Once paramedics arrived I cleared the scene.

Upon arrival to the area I took up a containment position to the East at 1300 E. Bismark. As other officers moved on the residence, I heard officers say, "the subject was loud and yelling and went out the back door of the house". The next air-traffic I heard was that the subject had a "huge" knife.

Next officers called for a unit to come down the alley from the East. I adjusted my position and came down the East alley from 1300 E. Bismark.

As I was coming down the alley I noticed officers with weapons drawn moving toward the backyard.

As I was exiting my vehicle, another officer said over the air, "we have a Taser deployment".

As I entered the backyard the subject was on the ground with officers in the prone cuffing technique.

I was asked to interview a female that was one house away to the West yelling at officers and highly agitated. I went over to approach the female and she began yelling and screaming and cursing at me.

After talking to a second female that was on the porch, I quickly learned the agitated female was the mother of the suspect had been tased.

While speaking with Elizabeth she calm down and apologized for yelling at me she hoped I could understand for her, as a mother, to see her son get tased was very traumatic. Elizabeth reiterated several times her son needs to go to the hospital and I assured her, that's what we were going to do.

On 022614 at about 1522 hrs I responded to 1214 E Bismark with Ofc Raleigh and several other officers on the report that a male at that location had a knife and spoke of hurting himself. While I was enroute I heard Radio advise that the male also obtained a handgun.

On arrival I contacted Ofcs. Raleigh and Zinkgraf on the west side of the residence where we could look at a portion of the back yard. Ofc. Coleman, who was in the alley to the south of the residence, yelled that the male was in the back yard and had a gun.

I followed Ofcs. Zinkgraf and Raleigh to the SW corner of the house. I saw a WF walk from the back of the house and go to the house to the west where an older female was yelling. I saw Ofc. Raleigh pull out his taser and walk into the back yard and begin yelling at someone. I rounded the corner and saw a WM in an orange shirt whom Ofc. Raleigh appeared to be yelling at. I saw Ofc. Raleigh's taser deploy and then saw the WM appear to pull taser wires away from his body as if he was unaffected by the taser. I saw Ofc. Raleigh deploy the taser a second time at which point the WM tensed up and fell to the ground. I stood by Ofcs. Raleigh and Zinkgraf as they put handcuffs on the male and kept my focus on a very upset WF who was yelling at us from the house directly to the west. The male, identified as #14 was taken into custody.

I contacted Kristina Kitchens at the house next door. She advised that #14 is her brother. She said that #14 was making suicidal statements earlier to her. She said she knew he had a knife and also saw him look for and produce a black pellet gun handgun. She said that #14 initially put the gun in his waistband inside the house and sat in a chair. She said "he moved it from hand to hand and said he was going to make the police shoot him. Then he put it on a table and walked over to my house to get his daughter. I picked it up and hid it in the bathroom."

I asked Kristina if I could see the handgun. She then led me to the bathroom and told me it was in the cabinet below the sink. She allowed me to open the cabinet and I saw a black pellet gun handgun. The gun could easily be mistaken for a semiautomatic handgun, similar in appearance to a .45 semiauto. I took custody of the pellet gun.

I contacted Ofc. Raleigh outside who asked me to transport #14 to SHMC for a mental health evaluation. I gave Ofc. Raleigh the handgun to put on Property.

Investigative Summary

On 2/26/14 at approximately 14:55 hours officers responded to a suicide call at 1214 E. Bismark. The initial report advised officers that the subject was intoxicated and talking about hurting himself. It further advised subject had a small knife on him. Later in the call officers were advised that the subject had a handgun and it was unknown if it was real. Officers were further advised the complainant was going to try and take the gun away. Further information advised the subject had the gun in his waistband of his pants and that he said he was going to blow his head off. Complainant advised subject, #14 picked up the knife and was leaving out the back door. As officers were responding further information came out advising the gun was now hidden at one address and that #14 said he was going to get another gun.

As officers arrived on scene #14 was last known to be going out the back. Officer Coleman went to the back and saw #14 as he went out the back of the house. She went to the back of the garage by the alley. She saw him come out the gate. It appeared he was holding a handgun in his left hand. She advised radio that the suspect had a gun. She saw him draw a large hunting knife from a sheath. She advised radio he had a large knife. Officer Coleman noticed that the subject took a bladed stance as if ready to attack. #14 looked extremely angry and his eyes were squinting as if he was determined to hurt someone. She attempted to make verbal contact with him at about the same time Officer Raleigh began giving him commands. #14 yelled back, "fuck you", and took off at a dead run towards the back yard of the house. Officer Coleman kept her position of cover and believed that other officers may fire shots at him due to

him charging with a knife. She did hear Officer Raleigh yell at the subject twice telling him to get on the ground.

Officers Raleigh and Zinkgraf were in the back yard and saw #14 as he was coming through the back gate. #14 was yelling something that they could not understand due to his slurred speech and intoxicated state. #14 walked swiftly towards the back door of the residence. Officer Raleigh could see #14 hands and did not see any weapons in them. #14 was wearing long pants and an orange shirt that was un tucked and hanging over his waistband. Officer Raleigh believed #14 was still armed with a firearm which may have been hidden by his shirt. Officer Raleigh was concerned for the safety of the people in the house. He believed that they would be at risk of injury if #14 were allowed back in the house. He told #14 "police stop, get on the ground" several times. #14 continued to advance towards the residence. Officer Raleigh deployed his Taser. Only one of the darts made contact and had little effect. Officer Raleigh deployed his Taser a second time. This time both darts connected. #14 fell backwards in the snow. Officers Raleigh and Zinkgraf conducted prone cuffing and took #14 into custody.

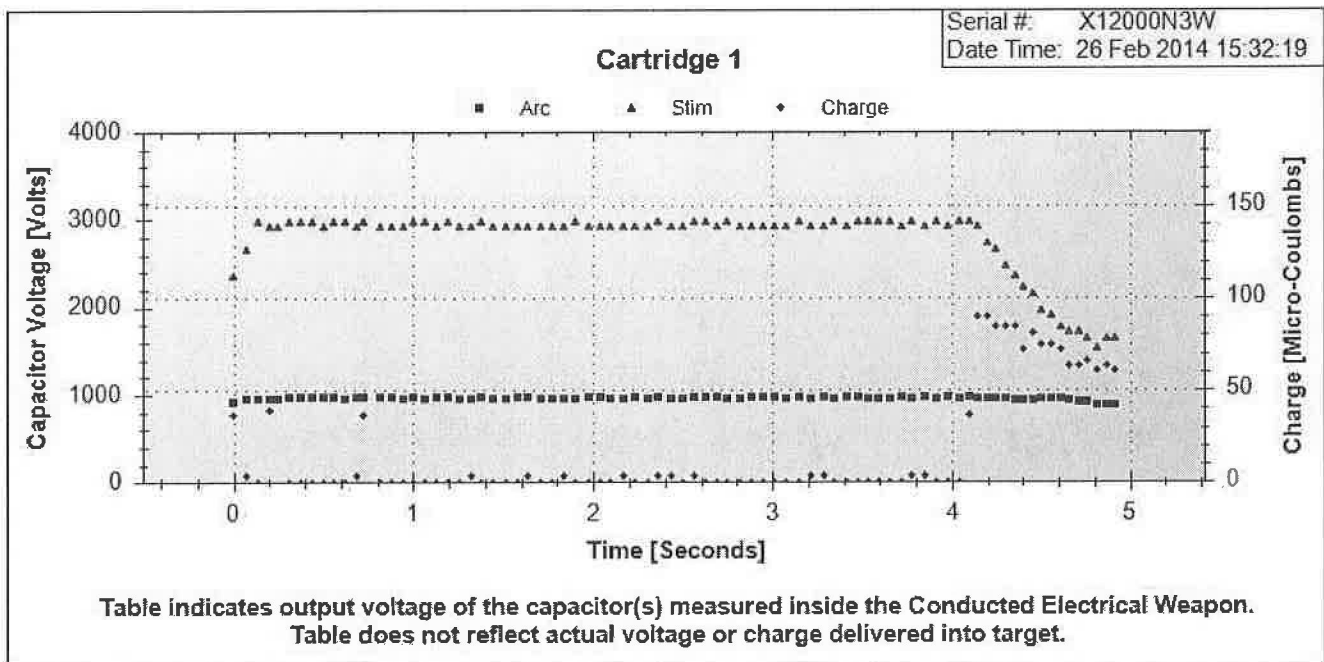
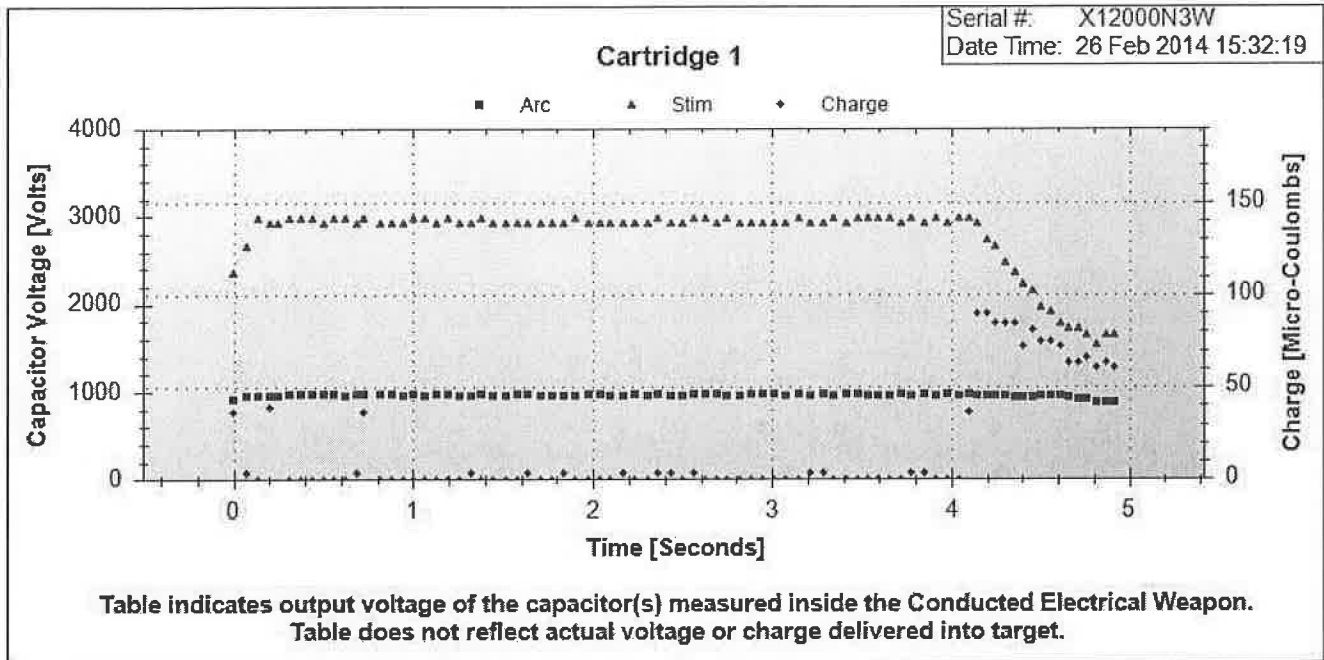
I talked to #14 shortly after the incident. We were waiting for medics to respond to remove the probes. He did not have any apparent injuries on him. I asked him what had happened. He told me that he had been arguing with his mom and his sister. He said he had been drinking. It was apparent to me that he was intoxicated. I asked him what had happened outside. He said he could not remember. He said he did not mean to hurt anyone. I asked him about getting tased. He said, "I kind of liked it". He asked me if he could get his knife back that was on the ground. I told him it was going to police property. Medics came and removed the probes without any issue.

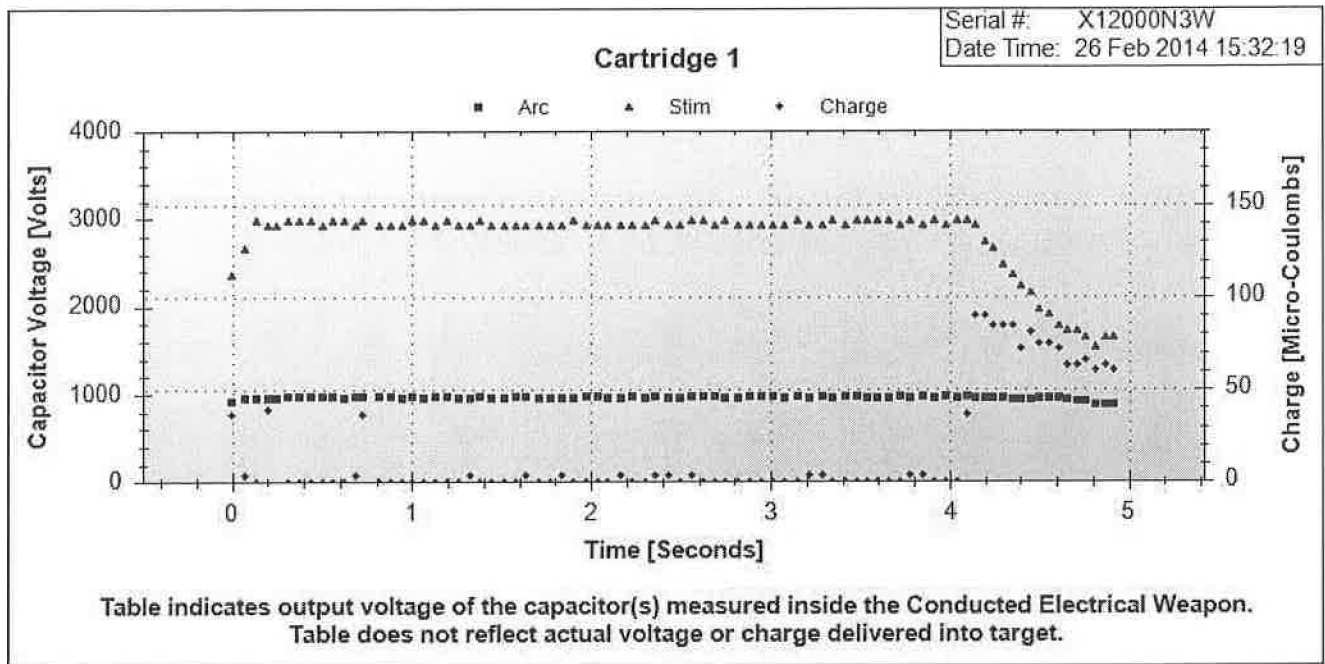
In review of this incident it was apparent that officers were responding to a report of a suicide call. Officers received information on the way to the call that #14 had a knife and later a handgun. Officer Coleman observed #14 holding what she believed to be a pistol which later turned out to be a knife. She advised officers via radio about the pistol and knife. Officers attempted to control and de escalate the situation using verbal commands. #14 ignored the commands, appeared angry and kept walking fast towards the house. Officer Raleigh was concerned for the safety of the people in the house. He believed #14 was still armed therefore to stop #14 he deployed the Taser. On the first deployment one of the probes missed so he deployed a second cartridge. This time the probes connected causing #14 to fall backwards. They used prone cuffing and took #14 into custody.

In my opinion officers followed policy and this is a proper use of force when taking all information into consideration.
