On 03-24-14 at approximately 2237 hrs I responded to 3250 N Ash Place in reference to an in progress car jacking at gun point. Complainant advised that her son was robbed at gun point of his vehicle described as a white 99 Pontiac Sunfire registered to an Erika Tibbetts. The registration provided for the vehicle was given as AKJ-7693. Complainant also advised that the suspect(s) drove up in a black SUV and took his vehicle which also contained a black Chihuahua. Suspects left in an unknown direction of travel.

Prior to arrival, Officer Anderson (F34) located the vehicle in the area of Howard/ Knox and after a pursuit of the suspect vehicle, it was eventually stopped at Perry/ Dalton and one suspect was taken into custody. The suspect was later identified as Jeremy F. Neal (09-10-85). Upon my arrival to the victim's address I contacted the male victim who identified himself as Joshua M. Tibbetts (09-29-72). Mr. Tibbetts was hysterical as he was already aware that his vehicle was located per information provided to him via dispatch. Mr. Tibbetts also provided permission to search his vehicle over the phone to dispatch prior to my arrival. Mr. Tibbetts asked repeatedly if his dog was located as the dog was 'his life'. In checking with officers on scene with the victim vehicle, the dog had not been located as of yet.

Mr. Tibbetts advised me of the following. At approximately 2230 hrs he drove up JSO of his residence (3250 N Ash Pl) and briefly sat in his vehicle with the dome light on as he was texting his girlfriend. While seated in the vehicle he noticed a black larger sized SUV, possibly a Lincoln Navigator 4 door with gold trim accents, drive slowly past his residence. During this time, Mr. Tibbetts proceeded to get out of his vehicle, gathering his wallet, cell phone, vehicle keys, and his black Chihuahua. The suspicious vehicle continued S/B on Ash Pl and drove to the end of the block before turning around and driving

quickly N/B on Ash PI back towards Mr. Tibbetts' vehicle. The suspect vehicle came to a quick stop behind Mr. Tibbetts' vehicle blocking the driveway to 3250 N Ash PI and a male wearing a white hoodie exited from the front passenger seat and quickly ran up to Mr. Tibbetts as he was standing at the open driver's side door. This first male was described as either a H/M or I/M approximately 5'6" tall wearing a white hooded sweatshirt. This first male suspect demanded Mr. Tibbetts' belongings (wallet, money, keys, and cell phone). As Mr. Tibbetts was giving the suspect the items he demanded, the second suspect exited from the driver's seat of the vehicle and approached Mr. Tibbetts with a black handgun drawn and pointed at Mr. Tibbetts head demanding his belongings. Mr. Tibbetts described this second suspect as either a H/M or I/M approximately 5'-8" / 160-180 lbs wearing a black hooded sweatshirt with either silver or copper pattern on the front.

Mr. Tibbetts was pleading with this second suspect not to shoot him as Mr. Tibbetts went down to his knees while the first suspect told him repeatedly to shoot Mr. Tibbetts. The suspect wearing the black hooded sweatshirt proceeded to rip Mr. Tibbetts' shirt off and attempted to rip his necklace off but was unsuccessful. One of the two suspects also forcibly removed Mr. Tibbetts' dog from his grasp as Mr. Tibbetts pleaded with him not to take the dog. As Mr. Tibbetts remained on his knees, the suspect wearing the black hooded sweatshirt held the gun to the left side of his head and racked the slide at least once as the suspect wearing the white hooded sweatshirt continued to encourage the other suspect to shoot Mr. Tibbetts. Mr. Tibbetts eventually got up and ran S/B around the empty lot JSO of his residence as the male wearing the white hooded sweatshirt (Jeremy Neal) got into Mr. Tibbetts vehicle and drove off in an unknown direction of travel. The second unidentified suspect also got in the black SUV and left in an unknown direction of travel. End of Mr. Tibbetts statements. During the entire interview, Mr. Tibbetts was very emotionally upset and was extremely concerned about the whereabouts of his dog which he advised repeatedly was his life.

I checked the area where Mr. Tibbetts pointed out as the scene and observed (1) bullet lying on the ground alongside the roadway and a Wal-Mart receipt that Mr. Tibbetts advised was not his as it was from the N. Colton store and he only shops at the store on W Wellesley. The receipt was dated 03-09-14 and both the bullet and the receipt were photographed by Cpl. Blessing (P313) and I seized both items and placed them on property for evidence. Cpl Blessing returned Mr. Tibbetts cell phone to him from his vehicle which I observed to be disassembled but after putting the pieces together it was in working order. Mr. Tibbetts advised that his dog's name was Cisco and he was a fully black Chihuahua with a black collar that had his name and Mr. Tibbetts' cell phone number on it. I provided Mr. Tibbetts with a completed victim's rights card at the end of my interview and advised him that his vehicle was undriveable and towed by Evergreen North. Without hesitation, Mr. Tibbetts advised that he wanted to press charges against both subjects. Based on the Mr. Tibbetts' statements and the subsequent attempt by Neal to elude officers, probable cause exists to charge Neal with 1st degree robbery and attempt to elude (police). Refer to completed probable cause affidavit. Neal was eventually booked into Spokane County Jail by Officers Bode and Groom (C461) after Neal received medical clearance at Deaconess ER.

On 03-24-14 at about 2239 hours, I heard a call of a car-jacking / robbery that had just occurred at 3250 N. Ash. The complainant reported that her son had just been robbed at gun point. She reported that there were two suspect's that had pulled up in a black SUV, while her son was on the phone. They apparently put a gun to his head and stole his wallet, phone, dog, and left in his car.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for nearly 5 1/2 years. I am also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA) as a Master Handler. In addition, I am a Master Trainer with the WSPCA. Leo is my second working dog in 10 years of being a handler.

I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car and wearing the uniform of the day. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to the left side of his chest. We were clearly identified as Spokane Police.

I was responding from the area of Market and Euclid. I could hear the vehicle pursuit heading east from Euclid and Division and then eventually terminated as the vehicle drove through Nevada on Dalton at a dangerously high rate of speed. I had turned N/B onto Perry from North Foothills and was approaching Dalton about the same time the pursuit had been terminated. Ofc. Daniel was the officer in the lead of the pursuit and he had advised prior to the pursuit ending that the suspect was at least three blocks in front of him, which put the suspect at about Perry.

As I approached from the south and just starting into the "S" curves on Perry, I saw some car tail lights bounce a little. The car was obviously facing N/B at Dalton but it looked like it was stopped and more to the east side of the road. I saw the reverse lights turn on as well as if it might have been stuck and was trying to free itself. Within a second or two, I had pulled up and saw it was the fleeing stolen vehicle and it had collided with a concrete retaining wall. The car had failed to make the corner N/B onto Perry from Dalton.

I saw no police cars in the area and momentarily waited to see what the suspect was going to do? My overhead emergency lights were still activated but I had stopped about 3 car lengths away. After a very brief moment, I saw the passenger door of the stolen car swing open and the male suspect jumped out of the passenger doorway and fled on foot, E/B down the alley north of Dalton and east of Perry. The suspect car was nearly lined up with the alley and the reverse lights were still on when

the suspect fled.

I jumped out of my patrol car and yelled, "Police stop or my dog will bite you!" However, the suspect failed to give up and disappeared from my view due to a garage and the darkness.

I decided to deploy Leo for the following reasons:

CRIME:

- There was probable cause to arrest the fleeing violent suspect for 1st degree armed robbery / car-jacking, which is a very violent crime. There was also probable cause to arrest the suspect for eluding a police vehicle, which is also a violent crime. Both of these crimes put the public in immediate danger.

THREAT:

- The suspect posed an immediate grave danger to the community. He was fleeing into the dark of the night and into a residential neighborhood after just taking part in a seemingly random armed robbery of an innocent victim where the suspects had put a gun to the victim's head and even threatened to shoot him. The suspect also showed an extreme level of desperation to escape being captured, by his willful and wanton disregard for the safety of the community, as he recklessly attempted to elude the pursuing officers. The suspect's actions appeared to be random, which meant anyone he came into contact with as he fled on foot, was in danger. I had no idea if the suspect was still armed with his gun but as he was running down the alley, I was able to light him up with my flashlight, which was the only way to see him. The alley was so dark, I couldn't see anything without my light, which also put me at a disadvantage and gave away my location. However, I could see as he ran, his right hand was tucked to the front of his waist area, while his left arm swung free. I thought he was most likely still holding the handgun that he had used in the robbery. The suspect was nearly 3/4 of the way down the alley / block and I likely would have lost him if not for using Leo to outrun and capture the extremely dangerous suspect.

RESISTANCE:

- The suspect had just fled in a vehicle and crashed the car he just stole at gunpoint. He then fled the stolen vehicle on foot into the dark of the night and into a residential neighborhood. He was still actively fleeing after the commission of his crime and failed to give up when ordered to do so.

After jumping out of my patrol car and yelling an announcement for the suspect to stop or my dog would bite him, he disappeared from my view. I sent Leo after the suspect down the dark alley. The suspect had a big lead on me but after Leo saw him when I lit the suspect with my light, Leo gave chase. At the east end of the alley, the suspect turned S/B around some hedges and I lost sight of him. However, I knew he would not outrun Leo and it would be over momentarily. I also lost sight of Leo as he too turned S/B around the hedges. As I got to the hedges, I heard the suspect screaming but I couldn't see where they were. I made my way around the hedges, ran between some cars

parked in a driveway, and saw the suspect laying down on the ground with Leo controlling one of the suspect's hands. Leo had captured the suspect on the east side of the house at 1427 E. Dalton and the suspect had fallen onto their lawn.

As I approached, I saw the suspect laying on his side with his hands up around the back of his head, almost in a "loose" fetal position. Leo had the suspect's right wrist / forearm but I couldn't tell at the time. I yelled for the suspect to show me his hands. He was screaming and trying to push Leo off but he also complied and I saw his left hand extend out and it was free of any weapons. Leo still had control of his right hand. The suspect also rolled to his stomach at the same time.

I was still by myself at this point and nobody knew exactly where I was. I never had time to get out all the information. Due too the suspect likely being armed and the nature of the violent crime, which he was still in the commission of fleeing from, I left Leo on the suspect's right wrist, while I handcuffed him. I was able to handcuff the suspect's free hand first. While I was trying to cuff his right arm, Leo gave up his control of the right arm and repositioned onto the suspects right ankle. This actually worked out very well and provided a distraction for the suspect, while I got him handcuffed by myself.

As soon as both of his arms were cuffed, I took control of Leo and ordered him to release, which he immediately did.

The suspect compliantly laid on the lawn as I directed the responding units into our location. Cpl. Cordis was the first to respond and took control of the suspect from there.

The suspect was the only occupant in the vehicle that I saw.

Medics were requested for the suspect due too the vehicle collision. He was treated then Ofc. Wheeler transported him to Deaconess hospital so his minor injures could be treated more thorough.

By the time I got to the hospital, Sgt. Kendall was already there and briefly interviewed the suspect (see his report for further info). However I did speak with the suspect a little myself. He verbally identified himself as Jeremy F. Neal and told me he has no place to live. He did give me his family's address at 2911 E. Cleveland, which is where he says he gets him mail. Neal denied hearing my announcement but did tell me he could "hear the dog coming." He said he turned to see where he was and then Leo got him by the right wrist and took him down to the ground. He also said, "The dog wasn't attacking me or anything, he was just doing his job. I love dogs, man."

Neal's injuries were pretty minor. He had several compression marks and a few punctures around his right wrist and right ankle. His head was also bleeding behind his right ear. He had a couple tears in his scalp that appeared to be about 3/4" in length. They most likely were caused by Leo, due too the suspect's hands being up behind his head when he was laying in a "loose" fetal position.

It looked like Leo's front teeth might have caught Neal's scalp a little while biting his write wrist, since his hands were up near the back of his head.

Neal denied any other injuries and I did check his back as well.

Cpl. Cordis took photographs of Neal's injuries.

Neal was later transported to the Spokane County jail and released to the jail staff. He was booked on several violent felony charges.

I estimated Leo was on the contact for about 15 seconds total and I was about 100' away when Leo initially captured the suspect.

On 032414 I was responding to 3250 N Ash reference a carjacking. A car had been stolen at gunpoint. Officers advised that they may have located the car going n/b on Howard from Knox. They soon advised that it was the vehicle and that they were in pursuit. The pursuit went to the area of Nevada/Euclid where it was terminated. As it was terminated the ended up driving into other officers who were located near Perry/Dalton, where the car crashed.

K9 officer Hamilton advised he was chasing the suspect e/b from Perry near Dalton. He then advised he was contacting the suspect near the alley east of of Perry and north of Dalton. I located him in the yard of 1427 E Dalton. Jeremy Neal was in custody and we called medics for a k9 contact. After being evaluated by the medics ofc Wheeler transported him to Deaconess for treatment.

At the hospital I was looking at his injuries. He had two head injuries that I initially thought he had received from being in the car, the windshield of the car he was driving had damage that could have been consistant with his injuries. He even told me while I was looking at him that he was hitting his head when he was being chased through the park and through town. We later discovered that his injuries were not caused by his contact with the car.

I took photos of his injuries to his right leg, right forearm and back of his head.

On 3-24-14, at approx 2236 hrs, Officers were dispatched to 3250 N Ash Place for a report of a robbery in progress. The complainant advised police that her son was being robbed at gunpoint and his vehicle was being taken. The complainant further advised 911 that her sons vehicle was a white 1999 Pontiac Sunfire and the vehicle had left in an unknown direction. Numerous officers were enroute to the location of the incident, so I decided to check the surrounding area for the victims vehicle.

I had just turned S/B on Post to check a white vehicle that had popped out behind me on Post and verified it was not a Pontiac Sunfire. I was still S/B on Post, just past Indiana, approx 4 minutes after the call was received when I observed a white 2 door vehicle cross in front of me E/B on Augusta. I only caught a brief glimpse of the vehicle and made a E/B turn on Augusta to verify make/model of the vehicle. It had turned N/B on Wall and I was approx a block behind it, without a clear view. I had just caught glimpse of taillights around the corner. I followed from and was approx a block behind the vehicle. The vehicle turned E/B on Nora and again N/B on Howard. I was behind the vehicle by a little more than a block through the residential neighborhood and it turned N/B on Howard. The traffic light on Howard was green as I made the same turn and the vehicle was already through the intersection. I began to gain ground on the driver of the vehicle on the straight path it was taking N/B on Howard.

I was driving a unmarked patrol SUV at that time, which is equipped with emergency lights and sirens. Initially I was just trying to verify the make of the vehicle. I am familiar with the make and model of vehicle that was stolen and know that the center mounted brake light/taillight is illuminated in red letters reading "Pontiac". I was able to verify it was in fact a White Pontiac Sunfire as we were North on Howard. I notified Dispatch and assisting units over my primary radio channel that a matching vehicle was N/B on Howard from Knox at approx 55 mph. The vehicle was well ahead of me traveling at close to double the posted speed limit. Due to the nature of the crime and the speed the vehicle was traveling for no other apparent reason it suggested to me that it was in fact the vehicle from the reported Robbery. I had not activated my emergency lights at that time and as we approached Buckeye another patrol vehicle pulled in the gap between my vehicle and the suspect vehicle. At that time I activated my emergency lights along with the assisting unit.

On 032414 at 2237 hrs, Officers were being dispatched to 3250 N Ash PL on the report of a Carjacking (with gun involved) that had just occurred. I immediately attached myself to the incident and began heading toward the victim's location. I was coming from the area of North Foothills Dr and Perry. I was driving SPD patrol vehicle #369 which is fully equipped with emergency lights and audible sirens. I was also wearing my SPD issued uniform of the day.

As I drove WB on North Foothills, updated information from the complainant was being relayed by SPD Dispatch. The information relayed was that the suspects arrived in a dark colored SUV and stole the victim's vehicle, a white 1999 Pontiac Sunfire.

I was now driving WB on Buckeye from Division, when Ofc JC Anderson (F34) advised over police radio that he saw what he appeared to be a white Pontiac Sunfire NB on Howard from Knox. I arrived at Howard and turned SB on Howard from Buckeye to ensure I could see any possible oncoming vehicles.

I could see two sets of headlights approaching NB on Howard. The first set appeared to be travelling above the speed limit and the second set appeared to be Ofc Anderson in his SPD police Tahoe. I began to pull to the right side of the road in preparation to make a quick U-turn and to better confirm the make & model of the approaching vehicle.

As the approaching car passed by me NB near York, I was able to positively confirm the vehicle was a white Pontiac Sunfire. I made a quick U-turn and watched as the suspect driver drove through the stop sign at Buckeye & Howard NB, without slowing.

By running the stop sign, the suspect showed an obvious wilful disregard for the safety of the community. Due to the vehicle being a positive match on the vehicle that had just been stolen in a 1st degree Robbery Carjacking, I initiated a vehicle pursuit by activating my emergency lights and audible sirens.

I was now in pursuit of the Robbery suspect NB on Howard from Buckeye and through Cleveland. As the suspect approached a 'T' in the road at Waverly PL, he drove straight in to Corbin Park dispartate to avoid apprehension. Due to the nature of the crime, I elected to continue pursuit of the suspect through the park. The suspect took a fairly direct NB path through the park before exiting out EB

onto Park PL near 522 W Park PL.

The suspect came out of the park at slightly lower speeds before accelerating to 45+ mph EB on Park PL. He continued EB a few blocks where there was no vehicle and/or pedestrian traffic. He slowed to negotiate a left (NB) turn on to Atlantic. Speeds remained reasonable as he made an immediate right (EB) turn onto Euclid, up the hill toward Division.

The suspect was unable to accelerate to a higher rate of speed due to the hill up Euclid. This allowed the suspect to run the stop sign at Euclid & Division at safer speeds. As I arrived at the top of the hill, I could see the suspect continue EB on Euclid through all lanes of Division. As I cleared both NB and SB traffic, I observed that there was very little vehicle traffic on Division.

I continued pursuit of the Robbery suspect EB on Euclid at an estimated 45 mph. The suspect travelled a short distance before making an aggressive left (NB) turn on to Mayfair. The suspect had difficulty making this turn and nearly lost control and struck the east curb. It looked as if the suspect may try to flee on foot at this point but he choose to accelerate and make an immediate right (EB) turn on to Dalton.

He accelerated back over 45 mph EB through Lidgerwood. He continued EB on Dalton, increasing his speed upwards of 60 mph at Addison. He remained on Dalton which is a residential side street with uncontrolled intersections and no traffic control devices. There was no other vehicle traffic during this portion of the pursuit.

After passing through Addison, the suspect began to pull away from me and I knew we would be approaching Nevada so I elected to slow my speed in hoped the suspect would make a turn and/or slow before reaching Nevada. The Robbery suspect further showed his careless & reckless desperation as he drove through the stop sign at Nevada.

I immediately provided the update that the suspect drove through Nevada at an extreme high rate of speed and he was now roughly 3 blocks ahead of me. Sgt Griffin advised to terminate the pursuit at which time I immediately deactivated my all of my emergency equipment and watched as the suspect began making a left (NB) turn on to Perry. I advised I was terminating near Morton & Dalton and observed an SPD K9 unit arriving at Dalton & Perry. I saw K9 Ofc Hamilton exit his patrol car which led me to believe the suspect likely crashed the car.

I drove down to Perry & Dalton and I did not see any suspect or Officers. I stopped my car to scan the stolen car for any potential victims of a collision. The airbags had deployed and no one was inside the car. I heard K9 Ofc Hamilton advise that he took the suspect in to custody down the alley to the east. See Ofc Hamilton's report.

Assisting Officers completed a WA State Collision form due to the suspect colliding with a retaining

wall at 1403 E Dalton.

Other Officers completed the arrest, medical treatment, transports, and booking of the suspect who was identified as Jeremy Neal.

Based on the suspects above described Reckless Driving during his fleeing from Police after the commission of a Robbery, I determined PC existed to arrest/charge Neal with Attempt to Elude. This information was passed along to primary Officer Juarez.

I briefed Sgt Griffin and Lt Sprague on my role in the apprehension of Robbery suspect Jeremy Neal.

On 03-24-14 at about 2239 hours, I heard a call of a car-jacking / robbery that had just occurred at 3250 N. Ash. The complainant reported that her son had just been robbed at gun point. She reported that there were two suspect's that had pulled up in a black SUV, while her son was on the phone. They apparently put a gun to his head and stole his wallet, phone, dog, and left in his car.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for nearly 5 1/2 years. I am also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA) as a Master Handler. In addition, I am a Master Trainer with the WSPCA. Leo is my second working dog in 10 years of being a handler.

I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car and wearing the uniform of the day. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to the left side of his chest. We were clearly identified as Spokane Police.

I was responding from the area of Market and Euclid. I could hear the vehicle pursuit heading east from Euclid and Division and then eventually terminated as the vehicle drove through Nevada on Dalton at a dangerously high rate of speed. I had turned N/B onto Perry from North Foothills and was approaching Dalton about the same time the pursuit had been terminated. Ofc. Daniel was the officer in the lead of the pursuit and he had advised prior to the pursuit ending that the suspect was at least three blocks in front of him, which put the suspect at about Perry.

As I approached from the south and just starting into the "S" curves on Perry, I saw some car tail lights bounce a little. The car was obviously facing N/B at Dalton but it looked like it was stopped and more to the east side of the road. I saw the reverse lights turn on as well as if it might have been stuck and was trying to free itself. Within a second or two, I had pulled up and saw it was the fleeing stolen vehicle and it had collided with a concrete retaining wall. The car had failed to make the corner N/B onto Perry from Dalton.

I saw no police cars in the area and momentarily waited to see what the suspect was going to do? My overhead emergency lights were still activated but I had stopped about 3 car lengths away. After a very brief moment, I saw the passenger door of the stolen car swing open and the male suspect jumped out of the passenger doorway and fled on foot, E/B down the alley north of Dalton and east of Perry. The suspect car was nearly lined up with the alley and the reverse lights were still on when the suspect fled.

I jumped out of my patrol car and yelled, "Police stop or my dog will bite you!" However, the suspect failed to give up and disappeared from my view due to a garage and the darkness.

I decided to deploy Leo for the following reasons:

CRIME:

- There was probable cause to arrest the fleeing violent suspect for 1st degree armed robbery / car-jacking, which is a very violent crime. There was also probable cause to arrest the suspect for eluding a police vehicle, which is also a violent crime. Both of these crimes put the public in immediate danger.

THREAT:

- The suspect posed an immediate grave danger to the community. He was fleeing into the dark of the night and into a residential neighborhood after just taking part in a seemingly random armed robbery of an innocent victim where the suspects had put a gun to the victim's head and even threatened to shoot him. The suspect also showed an extreme level of desperation to escape being captured, by his willful and wanton disregard for the safety of the community, as he recklessly attempted to elude the pursuing officers. The suspect's actions appeared to be random, which meant anyone he came into contact with as he fled on foot, was in danger. I had no idea if the suspect was still armed with his gun but as he was running down the alley, I was able to light him up with my flashlight, which was the only way to see him. The alley was so dark, I couldn't see anything without my light, which also put me at a disadvantage and gave away my location. However, I could see as he ran, his right hand was tucked to the front of his waist area, while his left arm swung free. I thought he was most likely still holding the handgun that he had used in the robbery. The suspect was nearly 3/4 of the way down the alley / block and I likely would have lost him if not for using Leo to outrun and capture the extremely dangerous suspect.

RESISTANCE:

- The suspect had just fled in a vehicle and crashed the car he just stole at gunpoint. He then fled the stolen vehicle on foot into the dark of the night and into a residential neighborhood. He was still actively fleeing after the commission of his crime and failed to give up when ordered to do so.

After jumping out of my patrol car and yelling an announcement for the suspect to stop or my dog would bite him, he disappeared from my view. I sent Leo after the suspect down the dark alley. The suspect had a big

lead on me but after Leo saw him when I lit the suspect with my light, Leo gave chase. At the east end of the alley, the suspect turned S/B around some hedges and I lost sight of him. However, I knew he would not outrun Leo and it would be over momentarily. I also lost sight of Leo as he too turned S/B around the hedges. As I got to the hedges, I heard the suspect screaming but I couldn't see where they were. I made my way around the hedges, ran between some cars parked in a driveway, and saw the suspect laying down on the ground with Leo controlling one of the suspect's hands. Leo had captured the suspect on the east side of the house at 1427 E. Dalton and the suspect had fallen onto their lawn.

As I approached, I saw the suspect laying on his side with his hands up around the back of his head, almost in a "loose" fetal position. Leo had the suspect's right wrist / forearm but I couldn't tell at the time. I yelled for the suspect to show me his hands. He was screaming and trying to push Leo off but he also complied and I saw his left hand extend out and it was free of any weapons. Leo still had control of his right hand. The suspect also rolled to his stomach at the same time.

I was still by myself at this point and nobody knew exactly where I was. I never had time to get out all the information. Due too the suspect likely being armed and the nature of the violent crime, which he was still in the commission of fleeing from, I left Leo on the suspect's right wrist, while I handcuffed him. I was able to handcuff the suspect's free hand first. While I was trying to cuff his right arm, Leo gave up his control of the right arm and repositioned onto the suspects right ankle. This actually worked out very well and provided a distraction for the suspect, while I got him handcuffed by myself.

As soon as both of his arms were cuffed, I took control of Leo and ordered him to release, which he immediately did.

The suspect compliantly laid on the lawn as I directed the responding units into our location. Cpl. Cordis was the first to respond and took control of the suspect from there.

The suspect was the only occupant in the vehicle that I saw.

Medics were requested for the suspect due too the vehicle collision. He was treated then Ofc. Wheeler transported him to Deaconess hospital so his minor injures could be treated more thorough.

By the time I got to the hospital, Sgt. Kendall was already there and briefly interviewed the suspect (see his report for further info). However I did speak with the suspect a little myself. He verbally identified himself as Jeremy F. Neal and told me he has no place to live. He did give me his family's address at 2911 E. Cleveland, which is where he says he gets him mail. Neal denied hearing my announcement but did tell me he could "hear the dog coming." He said he turned to see where he was and then Leo got him by the right wrist and took him down to the ground. He also said, "The dog wasn't attacking me or anything, he was just doing his job. I love dogs, man."

Neal's injuries were pretty minor. He had several compression marks and a few punctures around his right wrist and right ankle. His head was also bleeding behind his right ear. He had a couple tears in his scalp that appeared to be about 3/4" in length. They most likely were caused by Leo, due too the suspect's hands being up behind his head when he was laying in a "loose" fetal position. It looked like Leo's front teeth might have caught Neal's scalp a little while biting his write wrist, since his hands were up near the back of his head.

Neal denied any other injuries and I did check his back as well.

Cpl. Cordis took photographs of Neal's injuries.

Neal was later transported to the Spokane County jail and released to the jail staff. He was booked on several violent felony charges.

I estimated Leo was on the contact for about 15 seconds total and I was about 100' away when Leo initially captured the suspect.

Incident Debrief 14-0906690

At approximately 2239 on 3/24/14 Officers responded to N. 3250 Ash on report of an armed robbery. The victim stated that he was robbed at gun point. The suspect took his, dog, wallet, keys and vehicle. (See related reports).

Officers Anderson and Daniel located the victim vehicle in the area of Post and Augusta. The suspect, Neal, resisted arrest by driving recklessly from the pursuing officers. This vehicle pursuit was later terminated by Sgt. Griffin. (See related reports and Sgt. Griffin's pursuit review.)

Officer Hamilton was responding to the area N/B on Perry from North Foothills. As he approached Dalton he observed the suspect vehicle just north of Dalton on Perry on the east side of the street. The vehicle had collided with a concrete wall. Officer Hamilton observed no other police vehicles in the area. It appeared that Neal was attempting to free the vehicle. (Observed reverse light activation on vehicle.) Moments later Neal exited the passenger side of the vehicle and fled E/B on foot through the alley east of Perry and north of Dalton.

Officer Hamilton exited his vehicle and gave Neal a K-9 announcement ordering him to stop. Neal refused. Based on the severity of the crime, the threats involved in this incident and Neal's resistance, Officer Hamilton utilized Leonidas as an apprehension tool. (See Officer Hamilton's documentation).

Leonidas apprehended Neal in the yard of E. 1427 Dalton.

Neal was contacted by Leonidas on the right wrist, right ankle and scalp area. (See contact details in Officer Hamilton's report).

Neal was taken into custody. He was cleared for police transport from the scene by medics. He was transported to Deaconess MC and treated for the K-9 contact.

I contacted Neal at Deaconess MC. He told me, "That dog kicked my ass!" He told me that he heard the dog coming but denied hearing Officer Hamilton give the K-9 announcement. He also told me, "You need to keep that dog. He is really good."

He was later booked into jail on felony charges.

Based on the documentation of the involved officers, the seriousness of the offenses, the threat factors involved with this incident and Neal's resistance, I find that Officer Hamilton's deployment of K-9 Leonidas was within State and Federal law, within Department Policy and met Department expectations.
