### Incident Summary

Officer Brownlee was assisting Officer Erickson on a shoplift call. He found the suspect, Sonsaray Wynne walking in the 6700 block of North Atlantic. When he tried to arrest her she resisted. He used a arm bar take down. She ended up on the ground with her knee underneath her and basically in a seated position. He repeatedly told her to stop resisting as she pulled away. He was able to cuff her and get her in his car. Sonsaray told Officer Brownlee she was pregnant and not to hurt her after he arrested her. After being placed in the car she told him that her stomach hurt and she was bleeding. Brownlee called medics. When I responded she was in the police car being attended to by medics. She was uncooperative with them. I introduced myself and asked her if she had a complaint against the officer. She just moaned and wailed. I asked her if the officer hurt her and she again didn't respond. She was released from custody with her ticket for City Theft. Medics took her to the hospital. The entire time she was uncooperative and uncommunicative. I noticed no visible injuries to her face/head or arms which weren't covered by clothing. Medics had discovered no injuries either at during the time they were there. I spoke with 2 witnesses, Heidi Ostrup and Deborah Nowlin. They live at the apartment complex where the arrest occurred in the parking lot. Heidi told me she witnessed the entire arrest. She said the female was clearly resisting. She was pulling away from the officer. He kept telling her she was under arrest. She said the officer brought Sonsaray to the ground. She said this wasn't violent. She said she had her leg underneath her. She said the officer tried to calm her down. She said all the officer did was grab her arm. She said Sonsaray walked to the police car just fine. Deborah Nowlin came out of her apartment after hearing noise. She witnessed Sonsaray in a seated position on the ground and she was trying to get up. She said the officer didn't do anything to her. There was no claim of injury or of any complaint, but since Sonsaray went to the hospital with a possible pregnancy issue I am doing this use of force. The force used to make this arrest was minimal and within Department policy. Lt. Arnzen 095

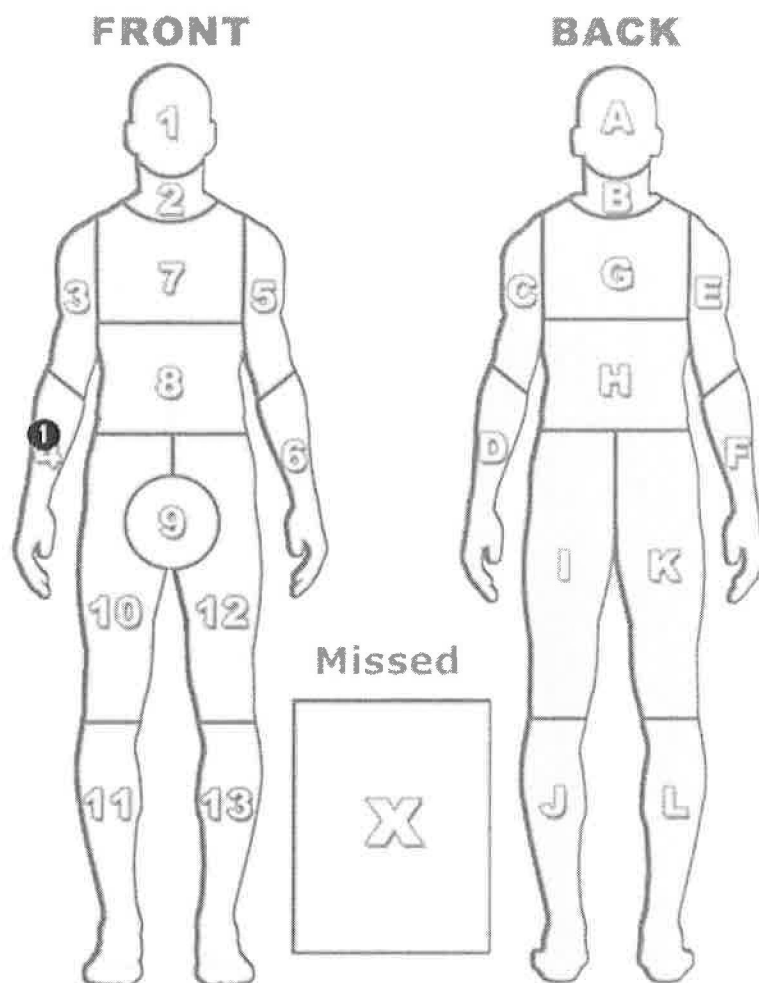

On 3/31/14 at 1020 hrs. I responded to 7706 N. division, Spokane, Washington the "Hobby Lobby" on the report of a shoplifter physically resisting her apprehension by store employees. The suspect was described as a Hispanic female, 26 years of age, thin build, with black hair, wearing a

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gold jacket and a teal shirt. The complainant, Joshua Watts, was a manager at the store, and said the suspect was walking away towards the Batteries Plus business just to the west of their location. I arrived on scene and contacted Watts. He was still standing out in front of the Hobby Lobby, and said he did not see the suspect go to the north or south of the Batteries Plus business. I relayed this information to radio, and advised that she may be heading towards the Cosco. Watts told me that there were two other subjects with the suspect, that were still in the store.

Officer Brownlee #478 came into the area, and was looking for the suspect (see his additional).

Watts said he began watching the suspect inside the store at approximately 0950 hrs. He said she selected a neon pink, puffy material handbag, and several other items; putting them into a shopping basket. He said he observed the suspect take the basket full of items into the women's restroom. He said this was against store policy. He said he got a female employee to go in and check on the suspect. He said the female employee went into the restroom, and came back out. He said the female employee reported that she saw the suspect in a bathroom stall. She told him that the suspect had the bright pink bag hanging on a hook in the stall, and was shuffling through items. He said the suspect exited the restroom several minutes later, and had a large bulge under her jacket. He said he peeked into the restroom and saw the empty basket on the ground, and no merchandise inside the basket or the restroom.

Watts said he followed after the suspect, who was heading towards the farthest north emergency exit. He said he caught up with the suspect just prior to her exiting the door. He said she stopped briefly then went through the emergency exit. He said he followed after the suspect, and got her stopped just outside the emergency exit. He said he could see the bright pink bag rolled up for under the suspects coat. He said he questioned her about the bag, and she told him the bag was hers. He said he asked about the merchandise inside the bag, which she said was also hers. He said he could see price tags on some of the merchandise, that were Hobby Lobby price tags. Some of those items were duct tape that had multiple colors and patterns on them (that they sold in their store). He said he questioned the suspect about those items, and she said the items were hers. He said he attempted to grab the bag in merchandise from the suspect, but she pulled away and ran off to the west. Watts was unsure about the total number of items stolen, but said that the bag was worth \$15, and the rolls of custom duct tape were approximately \$5.

Based on the information available I determined that I had probable cause to arrest the suspect for City Theft. I advised radio, and Officer Brownlee, of this information.

Watts and I went back into the store. He pointed out one of the subjects that was associated with the suspect, and I contacted her. The subject identified herself as Henrietta Wynne. She said it was her daughter, Sonsaray Wynne, that had been with her. She said she had no idea that her daughter was going to steal anything. She stated at first that she did not remember what Sonsaray's

birthday was, then told me it was 10/10/83 (real date of birth of 10/10/94). As I was talking with her, Sonsaray called her. She said Sonsaray told her she was over by Cosco, but hung up on Henrietta.

Ofc. Brownlee located Sonsaray At 6723 North Atlantic St. I responded to that location. When I arrived on scene, Sonsaray was in handcuffs in the back of Ofc. Brownlee's patrol vehicle. The bright pink, puffy bag was on the hood of Ofc. Brownlee's patrol vehicle. Sonsaray's gold jacket was also on the hood of the patrol vehicle, along with a balled-up teal shirt. The bag was open, and there were many items in the wrapper, with price tags on them, inside the bag. I called Watts to have him respond to our location to identify the items. He responded to the scene, and found the following items inside the bag that belonged to his store: two pink bandannas (\$1 each); an "Apple Byte" pink music system(\$15); 2 patterned duct tape rolls (\$5 each); 1 role of patterned duct tape (\$9); 3 mini rolls of duct tape (\$3 each), 1 mini duct tape (\$4); 4 charms (\$3 each); 1 charm (\$3.50); 1 charm (\$6); 2 charms (\$2 each); a pack of silver Sharpie markers (\$5); a roll of tape with owls on it (\$3); and a sticker of an owl (\$2).

Cpl. Beckley took photos of Sonsaray's clothing that was on the hood, as well as all of the recovered items (see his photo log). I returned the recovered items to Watts.

Ofc. Brownlee had requested medics as Sonsaray was claiming she was pregnant, and was having stomach pains. It should be noted that Henrietta never mentioned Sonsaray being pregnant. Officer Brownlee informed me that when he contacted Sonsaray she had resisted arrest, trying to pull away from him. He said he applied a arm-bar take-down to Sonsaray, and took her into custody. He said he had probable cause to arrest Sonsaray for Resisting Arrest.

I cited Sonsaray for City Theft and Resisting Arrest. I gave her her citation. She was transported via ambulance to Holy Family Hospital for further evaluation.

I picked up Watts report and surveillance video of the incident and booked it on property as evidence.

I got out of my car and began walking toward Wynne. She began walking slowly backward and for a moment, it appeared as if she was going to run. I reached out and grabbed hold of her right arm, telling her that she was being detained as a theft suspect and to not run from me. She immediately began to pull away, saying that she had done nothing wrong and that the purse was hers. I told her that she was under arrest for Theft, to quit pulling away from me and to put her hands behind her back. She continued to argue and twist away from me as I tried to get her arm behind her for handcuffing. I repeated that she was under arrest, to stop fighting and to put her arm behind her back. She did not, instead saying that she had done nothing wrong and attempting to pull away.

I extended Wynne's arm out straight and performed an arm bar take down, moving her to a prone position in the dirt. She ended up with her knee bent underneath her body, so she was sitting on her hip, not flat on the ground. Her other hand was in front of her, as she tried to push herself up into a seated position. I told her to give me that hand for handcuffing, but she would not. I handcuffed the arm I had, then pulled her other arm out and around to complete handcuffing. Wynne struggled to pull away continually. During this entire process, I was telling Wynne repeatedly to stop fighting me and that she was under arrest.

Once she was handcuffed, Wynne told me that she was pregnant and didn't want me to hurt her baby. I stood her up and she walked to my patrol car. I placed her in my patrol car, where she began yelling that she wanted her attorney. I walked over and contacted tenants of the apartment building, who had gathered in the lot. I contacted Deborah Nowlin and Heidi Opstrup, who told me that they had witnessed the incident and saw Wynne fighting me.

When I went back to my car, Wynne said that her stomach hurt, that she was bleeding and that she wanted to go to the hospital. Ofc. Erickson arrived on scene. I requested medics and a supervisor. Medics and Lt. Arnzen arrived on scene. Both attempted to talk with Wynne, but she would not cooperate. Ofc. Erickson issued Wynne a citation for City Theft and Resisting Arrest. I advised Lt. Arnzen what happened and pointed out the witnesses to him. We got Wynne out of my car so that she could be transported to the hospital by ambulance. I did not see any visible injuries on her, nor any evidence that she had been bleeding.
