



On Wednesday April 2, 2014 at 1645 hours I responded to the report of Domestic Violence at 811 S. Cowley #42. The complainant, Allison Chapman, reported that her boyfriend, Bob Lindenmann, had punched two holes in her bedroom door.

I contacted Allison at the Sacred Heart Emergency Room. She told me that she had left her apartment because she was afraid of Bob. Allison said she was speaking on the phone to her bank. Bob was getting frustrated with her because he did not feel that Allison was expressing herself clearly. She then went into her bedroom to get away from Bob. Bob then followed her to the bedroom. Allison closed the door to prevent Bob from following her into the bed room. Bob then stood outside the bedroom and began pounding on the door. When Allison opened the door she noticed that there was new damage to the outside of the bedroom door. She described the damage as fist size holes. Allison estimated the damage to the door to be approximately \$25-\$50. Allison believed that Bob was still at the residence and she was afraid to go back to her apartment.

I then drove back to Allison's apartment. I knocked on the door several times without response. As I was walking away from the apartment I heard a Male voice yell "Allison". I called back to the male, "BOB." Bob then answered in the affirmative and invited me into the apartment. He began telling me about Allison's mental health issues. When I finally convinced Bob just to tell me about what happened today he informed me that he received a package from Amazon. He wanted to open the package on a table that he keeps in the living room. He was frustrated because Allison was talking on the phone in the living room. He told Allison to take her phone call in the bedroom so that he could open his package. Allison eventually agreed to talk on the phone in the bedroom. Bob was still frustrated with Allison because she was talking to loud and he couldn't focus on the package. Bob initially told me that He told Allison to be quite and then she came out of the bedroom and put a hole in the door. Bob showed me the bedroom door and there were two holes in the door.

The holes I observed were very high on the door. They were about six to ten inches from the top of the door frame. They appeared to be caused by someone taller than Allison. I then asked Bob to show me his hands. I observed a small cut on Bob's left hand that appeared to be still bleeding. Based on the cut to Bob's hand and the height in which the holes appeared on the door I determined that I had probable cause to arrest Bob for City Malicious Mischief (D.V.). I ordered Bob "to turn and face away from me." I then took control of his left arm. Bob then stated, "I am not going to be arrested today." As he tensed his arm and tried to suck it into his body. I immediately used a Straight Arm Bar Take Down to lower Bob to the ground. While on the ground Bob continued to try to suck his arms under his body. I was able to pull both arms out from under his body and secure them behind his back in handcuffs (D.L.). Bob then began to complain that I broke his nose. I rolled Bob on to his side and observed blood coming from the bridge of Bob's nose and chin. There was also a blood spot on the carpet where Bob hit his nose during prone cuffing. I advised Bob that he was under arrest for City Malicious Mischief and Obstructing a Police Officer. I then called for Medics to treat Bob's Medical Issues. I also requested a CPL respond to the apartment to take pictures of the damage to the door and to Bob's nose and chin. CPL Bartlett responded to the scene to take the necessary photographs.

While we were waiting for medics, I advised Bob of his Constitutional rights. Bob refused to tell me if he understood his rights, so I decided not to ask anymore guilt seeking questions. Bob told me that he did not understand his charges. After I described what Malicious Mischief meant he told me unprompted that he did not mean to break the door. He stated that he only pounded on the door twice and he didn't think it was so easy to break.

After Medics evaluated Bob they determined that he probably should be checked out at one of the local hospitals. I transported Bob to the Deaconess Emergency Room where he was evaluated by an Emergency Room doctor. After being cleared from the hospital I transported Bob to the Spokane County Jail where he was booked for the above mentioned charges.

It should be noted that I also gave Allison a crime victim card with the appropriate report number. I did not complete a Lap assessment card because the incident did not meet the necessary requirements.

I notified Sgt Griffin about the incident. Sgt Griffin then interviewed my Civilian Rider who witnessed the incident and Bob Lindenmann.

Use of Force: Arm Bar Technique

Complainant Interview Summary

I contacted Robert (Bob) P. Lindenmann at Deaconess Hospital after being made aware of the incident by Officer Wilkinson. Lindenmann had his eyes closed and when I spoke to get his attention, he said he was "tired and in so much pain" he didn't know if he would be able to talk to me.

I could see a cut on the bridge of Lindenmann's nose from where his glasses were sitting and a scrape on the end of his nose and what looked like a rug burn on his chin. I asked Lindenmann what had happened tonight between him and the officer. Lindenmann began talking about how long he and Allison Chapman (victim) had been together, that they were common law married, about her mental health issues, about his health and back issues without ever answering my original question.

I redirected Lindenmann to my original question. Lindenmann began talking about unrelated issues Chapman was having with friends of hers stealing from her. He indicated they had reported the incidents so I directed him back to my question again. Lindenmann stated Chapman and he were in an argument and she went into her bedroom and locked the door and began screaming.

It was difficult to keep Lindenmann on topic. Every time I tried to re-direct Lindenmann I would get a short answer on topic and he would then go immediately off topic. It took about 15 minutes talking with Lindenmann to get to this point. During that time Lindenmann was tuning his head to his right to look at me and then back to center quite often. None of the movements looked strained or appeared to cause any discomfort to Lindenmann. Many of the head movements were very quick. He was also making hand and arm gestures as he talked to me. The hand and arm gestures also did not seem to be causing Lindenmann any pain or discomfort.

The following is not the order Lindenmann told me the events but I have placed them in chronological order for easier readability:

Lindenmann admitted he has been diagnosed as Bi-polar and takes medication. He admitted to damaging the door tonight and said that Chapman came out of the bedroom saw the damage and left. Lindenmann told me in 2012 he was arrested for breaking Chapman's arm and does show an

arrest on 12-14-2012 for 2nd degree assault. Lindenmann indicated he was in a panic over Chapman leaving. Chapman called him in a panic prior to Officer Wilkinson arriving telling him to leave the apartment because the police were on their way over to get him. When Officer Wilkinson arrived he took a klonipin for what he described as an anxiety attack before opening the apartment door.

Lindenmann initially said, "I stood up and he put the cuff on my left arm and then my right." Lindenmann said he was feeling light headed and dizzy and asked for help getting to the ground and was told by Officer Wilkinson, "You can get on the ground if you can do it yourself." Lindenmann said he fell forward onto the ground.

This made no sense based on the statement from Officer Wilkinson and the witness Dodson. In talking with Lindenmann, it was becoming obvious his recollection of events was not completely accurate. Lindenmann said, "He tackled me. It looks like a pretty clear case of excessive force."

Lindenmann indicated he was sitting down and Officer Wilkinson asked him to stand up. Lindenmann said, "I knew he (Officer Wilkinson) was going to put the cuffs on, so why fight him." Lindenmann claimed he asked Wilkinson "You're not going to arrest me...?" before being "tackled" to the ground.

I asked Lindenmann where Officer Wilkinson was in relation to him and he said Wilkinson was to his left. When confronted with the discrepancy between Lindenmann's statement and Officer Wilkinson's and Dodson's statements, Lindenmann said, "I raised my right or left arm before getting pushed to the ground." I asked Lindenmann if he thought Officer Wilkinson might have mistook Lindenmann's action of raising his arm as pulling away from him and he said, "Yes, Probably." I went on to ask if Lindenmann could see why that action coupled with his statement about not being arrested would lead Officer Wilkinson to believe Lindenmann was trying to fight or resist being arrested. Lindenmann agreed and went on to say his recollection of events might not be as accurate as they could be because "I was in a panic over Allison. I was shaking and sweating."

Lindenmann couldn't remember exactly when Officer Wilkinson advised him he was under arrest but said, "I remember him telling me I was under arrest." Lindenmann said, "I didn't think about what I needed to do. Just do what the officer asks." I asked Lindenmann if he thought the argument and being in a little bit of a panic caused him not to understand what Officer Wilkinson was asking him to do. Lindenmann said, "Yes, absolutely."

I asked Lindenmann if he knew he was going to get arrested and he had no intention of fighting with the officer (his words), why he continued to struggle with Officer Wilkinson when they were on the ground. Lindenmann said "I was in a state of shock and not rational at that point."

I talked with Lindenmann about Officer Wilkinson's actions after Lindenmann was in handcuffs. I asked him if Wilkinson had medics come and treat his injuries at the scene and he said, "Yes." I asked him if he felt the officer treated him well and he said, "Oh, Yes."

Lindenmann never did say he wanted to complain on Officer Wilkinson and other than a headache and the injuries to his nose and chin from prone handcuffing, the only complaint of injury he had was right hip pain from landing on it when he was taken to the ground. At the end of our hour long talk, Lindenmann seemed satisfied that what Officer Wilkinson did to take him down was reasonable given Lindenmann's statement about not being arrested coupled with Lindenmann's actions.

Officer Interview Summary

Officer Wilkinson investigated a DV call, spoke to the victim, Allison Chapman and went to contact the suspect, Robert Lindenmann, at 811 S Cowley. Wilkinson determined there was probable cause to arrest Lindenmann for City Malicious Mischief DV. Wilkinson had Lindenmann turn away from him. Lindenmann said, "I am not going to be arrested today!" Officer Wilkinson went to take arm control of Lindenmann's left arm and Lindenmann tensed his left arm and tried to pull it in against his body.

Officer Wilkinson used an arm bar technique and took Lindenmann to the ground into a prone handcuffing position. Once on the ground, Lindenmann continued to try to prevent the arrest by pulling his arms under his body. Wilkinson stated it took about 10 seconds to get Lindenmann into handcuffs. Officer Wilkinson advised Lindenmann he was under arrest and the charges he was arrested for.

Lindenmann was treated by medics at the scene and then transported to Deaconess Hospital at the suggestion of the medics at the scene.

Witness Interview Summary

Witness, Katie Dodson, a 911 operator, was on a ride along with Officer Wilkinson. She was standing by the front door of the apartment when this incident occurred. Dodson stated Officer Wilkinson was standing on Lindenmann's left side. Dodson heard Lindenmann say, "I am not being arrested!" and saw Lindenmann was partially turned away from Officer Wilkinson. Officer Wilkinson took Lindenmann to the ground and they both went mostly out of her view.

Dodson did not see the technique used and could not tell if Lindenmann turned or pulled away from Officer Wilkinson because they went mostly out of view . What Dodson did see was Lindenmann's feet and body at an angle as he was being taken to the ground. Dodson said the move was rapid and it over quickly. Dodson said she stepped inside so she could see what was happening and heard Officer Wilkinson say something to the effect of "I'm putting you under arrest." Dodson stated Lindenmann was still struggling with Officer Wilkinson at this point and was pulling his arm under his body. Dodson estimated it took about 30 seconds for Officer Wilkinson to get Lindenmann in handcuffs. Dodson said Lindenmann had an abrasion to his chin and a cut on the tip of his nose and also on the bridge of his nose.

Dodson said Officer Wilkinson did not say or do anything to provoke what happened. Dodson indicated Officer Wilkinson acted professionally towards Lindenmann before, during and after the incident. Dodson indicated Lindenmann was "compliant" after he was in handcuffs.

Physical Evidence

Cut/scrape on bridge and end of Lindenmann's nose and abrasion/rug burn on Lindenmann's chin.

Investigative Summary

As Officer Wilkinson's supervisor, the one concern I have with this situation is Officer Wilkinson went to contact the suspect in a DV without back up. The night of the incident, I counseled Officer Wilkinson about having back up anytime he was going to make an arrest or going to be in a situation that could potentially lead to an arrest. I covered how having two officers as opposed to just one, might completely eliminate the need to force at all.

Having said that, the force used by Officer Wilkinson in this situation was within policy and justified. I have addressed the officer safety issue of not bringing back up with verbal counseling.
