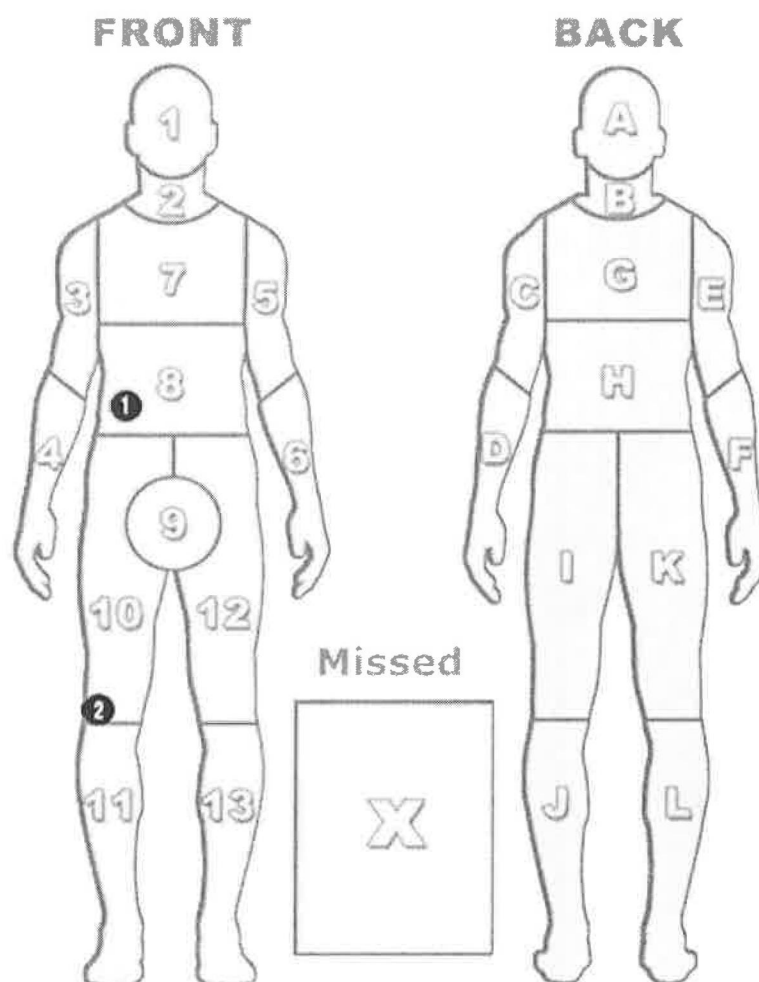

On 041314, I was on-duty as a Spokane Police officer, wearing a police duty uniform and riding in the passenger seat of a marked Spokane Police vehicle #362. Officer Groom and I responded to assist Officer Nevers with the report of a possible suicidal male in the area of Rosamond and Woodland. The complainant, Zach, called 911 stating he saw a male pacing on the bridge, yelling and making weird noises.

Officer Nevers arrived on-scene first and located the male on the bridge. Officer Nevers advised over the air that the male was on the bridge, making suicidal statements. He asked us to "step it up" over the radio, which is police code that he needed immediate assistance. As we were coming into the area, Officer Nevers stated he was chasing the male S/B on foot.

As Officer Groom and I arrived on-scene, I observed Officer Nevers in the street on 13th East of Rosamond, looking up an embankment into the wooded area. I exited the passenger side of our patrol car and heard a male yelling angrily from the woods. As I moved closer to Officer Nevers, I observed a very large male (later identified as Mathias) standing

in the trees approx 30 feet from me. He had a large tree branch (approx 4 inches in diameter and 5 feet long with several smaller branches extending out from the main branch). He was holding the branch at one end with a two handed grip, he was swinging the branch over his head in a threatening manner. Mathias was extremely agitated and his eyes were large and darting around. I thought he was possibly mentally ill or, based on my training and experience, under the influence of methamphetamine.

I told Mathias to drop the stick twice and he yelled, "Fuck you" in reply both times. I accessed my duty Taser from my pocket and armed it. He was waving the branch back and forth and over his head, much like the way a baseball player would warm up with a bat. He screamed something to the effect of 'lets fucking do this' and began running toward me with the branch above his head with a two handed grip. Mathias closed the space quickly and was about to come down the embankment. He was approximately 20 feet to the front of me and still running with the branch when I placed the Taser's laser targeting sight on Mathias' stomach area and yelled "Index" to inform other officers that I was planning on deploying the Taser's probes.

Because Mathias had armed himself with the large tree branch and was actively running at me with the stick above his head in a threatening manner, I believed he was going to strike me with the tree branch. Since I was on-duty as a police officer and wearing a clearly marked police uniform, any assault directed toward me is 3rd Degree Assault, a Class C felony under Washington law. Due to the size of the tree branch, if I were to be hit with it anywhere on my body, it would have caused substantial bodily injury. I believed the branch as it was being used was a deadly weapon, which is classified as 2nd Degree Assault, a Class B felony under Washington law.

Mathias is a very large man, the Washington Department of Licensing describes him as 6'05 and 300 pounds. This is 11 inches taller than me. He is also 130 lbs heavier than me. He was running towards me from an elevated position and had a large tree branch over his head in a threatening manner. He was approximately 15 feet from me and closing the distance rapidly. I believed Mathias was going to assault me with the tree branch and a deadly force encounter was imminent if I were to do nothing.

Mathias was not trying to flee or evade arrest; he was on the offensive and actively trying to assault me with a deadly weapon.

I deployed my Taser in probe mode. Mathias was immediately affected by the current of electricity. He fell forward; his momentum caused him to tumble down an approximate 10 foot grade. He dropped the branch as he rolled. He came to rest on his back on the concrete sidewalk. The branch came to rest approximately three feet from Mathias. Due to Mathias' size and assaultive attitude prior to the deployment, I held the current on while Officer Groom, Officer Nevers and Deputy Edelbrock, rolled Mathias over and placed him in handcuffs. When reviewed later, there was one deployment of my Taser for one cycle that lasted 9 seconds.

I observed one probe struck Mathias on the left side of his stomach and the other stuck in his left knee. His mood

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changed completely and he became cooperative, obeying all our commands and answering questions.

I requested Spokane Fire Department medics respond to remove the probes and complete a medical clearance for jail.

I requested a Corporal respond to take photos of Mathias' injuries, the branch, and spent Taser cartridge.

I heard Mathias state to other officers that his plan was to whack me with the stick.

I briefed Sgt Gianetto on the facts and circumstances regarding the use of force.

Once cleared by medical staff, Officer Nevers transported and booked Mathias into Spokane County Jail.

Sgt Gianetto downloaded my Taser deployment information.

Spent Taser cartridge #C4102265T was placed on property as evidence.

on 04/13/2014 at approximately 0532 hours, I was dispatched to the area of W. Rosamond / W. Woodland Blvd reference a suspicious male pacing on the bridge over I-90. The complainant said the male was possibly high.

When I arrived in the area, I approached the bridge from the north side. I observed a male matching the description on the east sidewalk of the bridge. I later identified the male as Mathias Eli Peters. He was standing approximately in the middle of the bridge. I parked short of the bridge and called out to the male to come to me. I said "Hey man, can you come over here". He refused, faced the railing and looked out over the edge. He yelled "It's a good day to die".

I advised other responding units I had made contact with the male and he was making suicidal threats. I continued to ask him to come closer to me so we could talk. I shined my patrol vehicle spot light at him, which caused him to turn away from me and start walking south off the bridge. I was concerned he would jump off the bridge if I approached too closely. I returned to my patrol car and followed him once he had cleared the bridge and was walking on solid ground.

Once he was completely off the bridge, I raced up to him and gave him commands to stop and get on the ground. He turned away from me and began running SB on Rosamond from 13th Ave. I advised radio I was in a foot pursuit. As I was chasing after him, a Sheriff Deputy pulled up and assisted me.

I followed Peters up to a wooded/grassy area on the east side of the street. I stopped as soon as he picked up a large branch and began swinging it around. I backed down to the sidewalk and continued giving him clear, simple commands to drop the stick and get down on the ground.

He dropped the large branch and picked up a another longer branch. He held it in front of him in an "attack mode" while he began to approach me. Officer's Bode and Groom arrived and gave commands for him to stop several times. As Peters approached us with the branch, I observed his face to be heavily sweating. His eyes were wide, glassy, and "popped out." It appeared he was staring right through me with an unstoppable intent to charge and attack any one of us with the branch.

The branch was approximately 4-5 feet in length which gave Peters a significant reach advantage

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preventing us from employing a "hands on" control tactic. Any one of us could have been injured by the branch Peters was using as a weapon. As Peters closed distance while swinging the branch at us, Officer Bode deployed Taser probes. Peters immediately fell to the ground and slid down the grass onto the sidewalk. We immediately gained physical control of his arms while the Taser was cycling. While placing him into custody, I told Peters he was "under arrest" and to "stop resisting, put your hands behind your back!" Officer Groom, Dep. Edelbrock, and I were able to eventually put him into handcuffs (2-pair linked, DL). This situation could have easily turned into a deadly force incident if the Taser was ineffective.

Once handcuffed, we placed Peters on his left side (recovery position) while waiting for medics to respond. SFD and AMR arrived and removed the Taser probes from Peters.

While waiting for medics, I asked Peters why he acted the way he did. He replied "I was going to hit them with the stick." He said he had "a history of beating cops". I asked him if he was trying to hurt us and he replied "Fuck it, why not fight with the cops?"

Peters said he was from Tacoma, WA and had a history of Paranoia and Schizophrenia. He suffers from extreme depression and mood swings and has been "off his meds for a few months". He moved to Spokane to be with a friend, but things fell through and they are no longer friends. He told me he is currently homeless. Once in custody, his mood changed completely and he was much more cooperative. He made additional comments on how strong and effective the Taser was.

I transported Peters to Spokane County Jail and booked him on the felony charge of Assault 3rd.

Upon arrival I could see that Officer's Bode and Grooms and Reserve Officer Nevers had a male who was later identified as Mathias E. Peters in handcuffs sitting on the ground. I could immediately see that Mathias was very large, his eyes were wide and he was bouncing around with jerky movements and appeared to be under the influence of meth or another stimulant.

As I got out of my car I could hear Mathias talking very fast. I walked up and Mathias told me that the cops had done a very good job. I said, "Oh yeah?" and Mathias stated, "I was gonna wack a mole, with that" and motioned towards a large stick lying on the ground that was tangled in taser wire. I pointed to Officer Bode and asked if he was the mole and Mathias said, "yup". I asked Mathias if he was trying to get killed by the Police and he said, "yup". Mathias bragged that he had been in fights with lots of Police Departments and that it took 5 cops in Tacoma to arrest him. Mathias stated that he figured he would give Spokane PD a go and decided he wanted to die.

I asked Mathias if he was using drugs and he advised that he relapsed with meth.

On 04/13/2014 Officer Bode and I were dispatched to W. Rosamond and W. Woodland area, reference a person pacing on a bridge yelling and making noises. Reserve Officer Nevers arrived on scene first and reported that there was a male on the bridge looking down and pacing. Shortly after Ofc Nevers arrived he requested I step it up due to the male's reaction to him being on scene. See Reserve Officer Nevers's report.

Deputy Edlebrock arrived on scene to assist. See Deputy Edlebrock's report.

I arrived on scene with Officer Bode, and I observed a large male about 6'5" 300 pounds, in the woods north of Rosamond/13th. The male was later identified as Mathias E Peters. Mathias was standing in the woods with a large branch (about 4 inches in diameter and 4 feet long). Ofc Nevers was giving commands to put the branch down and Officer Bode secured his taser for less than lethal coverage. Mathias was yelling, screaming and not obeying commands from Officers. I gave Mathias a verbal command to put down the branch. Mathias started to walk towards the street with the branch raised over his head in an attacking manner. I ran up to the right side of Officer Bode to take lethal coverage just in case the taser failed. Mathias began to run towards us and screaming that he was going to take us on. Mathias's eyes were bulging and his face was flush red. Mathias was tense and had made the choice to attack us.

Officer Bode deployed his taser probes at Mathias and it was a successful contact and Mathias dropped the branch and rolled down the hill towards the sidewalk. See Officer Bode's report for further.

Mathias came to a stop at the sidewalk and Ofc Nevers, Deputy Edlebrock and I went hands on with Mathias. We gave commands for Mathias to roll onto his stomach. Mathias did not obey and we had to physically roll him onto his stomach. We handcuffed F/S and D/L Mathias using a three officer prone cuffing technique.

Mathias was rolled onto his side to make sure he could breath. Mathias was sat up and he seemed to have calmed down.

Mathias said that he was going to fight us and that he has a history of police encounters that ended in fights. Mathias said that he was going to "wack us", with the branch. Mathias explained that he

Suspect Interview Summary

Mathias Peters stated "I had a mental break down and I am under the influence of Meth. I threatened the officer with a log. Guess I deserved it. Your officers were very polite with the situation. They gave me multiple warnings." Peters further stated "Officers were very good and very professional. I had plenty of chances before it was deployed."

Peters stated he had a key and when he saw that would not work; he grabbed a "log". Peters stated our tasers were more powerful than Tacoma and Lakewood. He stated he had been tased before but it took five officers and the ambulance people to keep him under control. Peters was very impressed with the officers on how they treated him politely and how they were able to control him.

Peters stated he has schizophrenia and is off his medication. He was at a party last night and he took meth. He stated he normally does not take meth. When he is on his medication and is going to a counselor this will keep his schizophrenia under control. He stated he has not taken his medication and has not seen a counselor recently.

Officer Interview Summary

Reserve Officer Nevers when he arrived on scene observed Mathias Peters looking out over the edge of the bridge. Peters yelled "It's a good day to die." R.O. Nevers tried verbal commands to get Peters off the bridge but he refused. Peters did start to walk off the bridge. When Peters was off the bridge R.O. Nevers attempted to approach Peters. Peters took off running. R.O. Nevers and Deputy Edelbrock chased after Peters. Peters picked up a large branch and stated swinging it around. R.O. Nevers gave commands for Peters to drop the stick. Peters dropped one large branch and picked up a larger branch. Peters was approaching the officers and was given several commands to drop the stick and get down on the ground. Peters keeps approaching the officers swinging the stick. Officer Bode deployed his taser. Peters fell to the ground and officers were able to gain physical control. Peters was cuffed.

Investigative Summary

Officer Bode deployed his taser as Mathias Peters was charging the officers. Mathias Peters is 6'05" and at least 300 lbs. Peters was holding the stick over his head in a threatening manner running towards Officer Bode. It appeared that Peters was going to assault Officer Bode with the stick. Officer Bode yelled "Index" to inform other officers that he was deploying his taser. Officer Bode targeted Peters stomach area. The taser probes struck Peters on the left side of his stomach and in his left knee. The deployment was for one taser cycle of nine seconds. Peters immediately went down and officers were able to safely take him into custody.

Officer Bode was justified in using his taser. The taser prongs being deployed caused Mathias Peters to be taken safely into custody without injury to him or the officers.
