





At the moment Radio advised that the male had a warrant the male began running NB from the location.

Ofc. Heuett and I pursued the male on foot NB across Boone. I saw the male run WB through a yard to the north of Boone and west of Nettleton. I then lost sight of him and ran to Sharp where I

continued WB. There were several neighbors in the area advising that the male was continuing through yards and between houses on the south side of 2000 W Sharp. I was approaching 2027 W Sharp when I saw Ofc. Heuett who asked me to maintain my position just to the east of the location. I observed Ofc. Heuett remove a folding pocket knife from the right front pants pocket of the male, identified as Gared Tilch-Bryant. The knife had a black plastic handle with a shiny metal clip on the side of it. I asked Tilch-Bryant why he reached for his knife and he said, "I never reached for the knife." Tilch-Bryant was then transported to jail by Ofc. Heuett and booked on his warrant for reckless driving.

On 041514, Officer Lamana and I responded to 1915 W. Boone #1, reference a juvenile runaway report.

Upon arrival at the residence, Officer Ponto, came in from the south. She advised that she was contacting a vehicle, that had just pulled up to the residence, to the south of unit #1.

I contacted a male, who exited the vehicle on the passenger side and started walking towards unit #1. He fit the description of the juvenile runaway that we were looking for and stated, "Are you here for the female in #1." I asked him if he knew who was in #1 and if he was going to the location.

The male verbally identified himself as Tommy T. Bryant (030389). He advised that he did not have identification and then quickly started asking if he could use the bathroom across the street. He stated, "I have Diarrhea." I ran the name through dispatch. Dispatch advised that the name came back as an alias for Gared T. Tilch-Bryant. As soon as he heard the alias over my portable radio, he took off running to the north across Boone. I immediately told him to stop as he ran away. He almost caused a collision on Boone and went between two vehicles as he continued north through houses. He ran to the northwest to Sharp and into several backyards on Sharp. He was discarding several items from his pockets as he ran through backyards and over fences. He stopped and looked directly at me two separate times, and I told him both times to stop running and to get on the ground. He refused to take his hands out of his pockets and was reaching deep into both pants pockets.

I heard Officer Lamana advised that he had the suspect in the front yard of 2027 W. Sharp. He also advised that the suspect was reaching for a knife. When I came around to the northwest corner of 2027 W. Sharp, I observed the male standing in the front yard. He was not listening to Officer Lamana's commands to get on the ground and I observed a pocket knife in his right front pants pocket. I removed my weapon from my holster into a low ready position as the male continued to be looking for an escape route. He was frozen for several seconds and eventually went down onto the ground into a prone cuffing position. I advised the male to place his hands out to the side and to not move. I observed fresh blood on his left hand. I placed plastic gloves on for my protection and advised the male that he was under arrest.

I handcuffed the male and advised him that he was under arrest for making false and misleading

Officers Lamana and Heuett were at 1915 W. Boone reference a juvenile runaway when this incident occurred. That is why there are several CAD reports attached to this report. Officer Ponto the driver and Officer Heuett contacted the passenger. The male passenger ran away as he heard his real name on the radio chased him. When officer Lamana was approaching him Officer Lamana saw the suspect reach for a knife that was clipped on his pocket. Officer Lamana pointed his gun at him and ordered him to the ground. The suspect hesitated for a moment, then as other officers arrived he did get on the ground, and was taken into custody. The suspect did have a knife.

The suspect did sustain an injury but that was due to climbing over a fence as he ran away from the officers.

The suspect had warrants, ran from officers, and did not listen to commands. As Officer Lamana approached the suspect reached for a knife, (a deadly weapon). This is an aggressive move which threatened the officers involved with eminent harm. Officer Lamana drew his weapon and pointed it at the suspect and ordered him to the ground. Officer Lamana's use of force in this case is consistent with training and policy.
