



offenders frequenting the residence. Approximately 10+ days ago, a black male possibly named "Mark" fled from me on a bicycle and I believe he went to this problem house but I could not be certain at the time.

The following day after "Mark" fled from me, I contacted neighbors who are extremely tired of the amount of traffic and problems that arise in the neighborhood due to the problem house. I explained to them that a black male had fled from me and I provided them a description. They advised they would call crime check if there was any suspicious activity or if they saw anyone matching the description of "Mark."

Today at 1654 hrs, the neighbors saw enough activity to call to report the activity. Myself, Cpl Oien, Ofc Anderson, Sgt Eckersley all responded to the residence. Myself and Cpl Oien were able to make contact with the property owner, Patricia Bruns. I recognized her from prior contacts and began explaining to her the complaints on her residence and that I was looking for a black male named "Mark."

Bruns was cooperative and agreed that her house is a problem and she is trying to clean it up. Bruns admitted that her house can be out of control at times and she wouldn't mind our assistance in getting wanted/problem subjects out.

Bruns stated there were 4 adults in the residence. One being a black male named Mark Atchison. I utilized my in car SPRS jail booking photo program and confirmed that Atchison was the same black male that had recently fled from me. I warrant check showed that Atchison had a valid/confirmed outstanding Felony warrant for his arrest.

Bruns stated a second male that was inside the residence like had warrants as well. She identified this male as Wade "sparky" Phillips. I am very familiar with Phillips as he is a prolific repeat offender in Spokane. A warrant check on Phillips revealed that he had a 1 valid local Felony warrant for his arrest and 2 misdemeanor warrants. Phillips also has prior contacts of being armed with dangerous weapons such as firearms.

I immediately requested for K9 assistance in the event a K9 would be needed, taking in to account Officer safety concerns in attempting to arrest both Atchison and Phillips.

The other 2 subjects inside, Bruns identified as Cheryl Dick and Jason Priest.

I explained to Bruns my desire to arrest both Atchison & Phillips on their warrants. She understood and even expressed her willingness to cooperate to help clean up her problem house. I asked Bruns if she would consent to Officers entering her residence to locate and arrest Atchison & Phillips if need be. With no hesitation, Bruns consented to any and all Officers to enter her house to locate the wanted subjects.

K9 Officer Buchmann arrived to assist. With the front door already open/ajar, Officers made countless announcements for people to show themselves. Cheryl Dick appeared at the front and exited the residence without incident. Cheryl also confirmed that Atchison Phillips were inside the house. We remained cautious at the front of the residence as no one else was making themselves known from inside. We made numerous other announcements identifying ourselves as "Spokane Police" and our intentions of entering the residence. Ofc Buchmann gave several K9 announcements. Still, any remaining occupants made no attempt to show themselves or make verbal contact.

Officers at the front were joined by Ofc Hamilton and Ofc D. Lesser. After no cooperation from any remaining occupants, myself, Cpl Oien, Lesser, Hamilton, & Buchmann all entered the residence on Bruns' consent. We began a slow and deliberate search due to obvious Officer safety concerns.

During the search and for likely fear of a K9 contact, Atchison advised he was coming out of the SE bedroom. He was arrested and taken in to custody without incident.

We were also able to make contact with Jason Priest and have him exit the residence.

This left only Phillips as the remaining occupant. Ofc Buchmann and his K9 located Phillips hiding in a closet in the same SE bedroom. See Ofc Buchmann's report.

Phillips was placed under arrest on his warrant, searched incident to arrest, and escorted outside to Cpl Oien's patrol car.

I later booked Atchison in to Spokane Co. Jail on his Felony warrant.

Phillips was transported to Deaconess Medical Center due to a K9 contact and to receive medical clearance to be booked in to jail. After receiving minor treatment and getting medically cleared, I took custody of Phillips and transported him to Spokane Co. Jail where he was booked on his local Felony warrant.

Sqt Eckersley (L235) and Sqt Kendall (L205) were made aware of the entire incident.

The front door of the house was already standing open. Cpl. Oien was able to call the dog and secure it to a fence with a leash. He then knocked on the door and announced our presence. After only a brief time, the female with no warrants came out of the house, but no one else responded from inside.

I moved up to the doorway and made three loud and distinct announcements of "Attention in the residence. Spokane Police K9 Unit! You are under arrest. You need to come out now or make yourself known. The residence will be searched by a Police Dog and when he finds you, he will bite you." After the announcements, Talon barked several times loudly. I waited well over 30 seconds between each announcement, hearing no response from inside the house.

From the open doorway, I could see into a living room, which was cluttered with mattresses, furniture and other items. In one corner of the room, I observed an axe, sledge hammer, baseball bat and other items that could easily be used as weapons.

After several minutes, we entered the residence. Due to Priest's misdemeanor warrant, I did not release Talon initially and followed other Officers inside to search. We had received information that Phillips and Atchison were likely in the back southeast bedroom. We cleared up to a hallway that led to two bedrooms and a bathroom on the south side of the residence. At this hallway, I made another loud announcement. As I was still giving the announcement, I heard a male call out that he was coming out and to keep the dog back. Other Officers continued verbal contact with the male and I moved back with Talon. Atchison came out of the southeast bedroom and was taken into custody without incident.

I moved back up to the hallway and covered that area as Officers made contact with Priest in the attic of the house through a hole in the kitchen ceiling. He was removed from the house without incident.

Believing that Phillips was the only person left in the house, I gave another announcement, advising him by name that he was under arrest and that the house would be searched by a Police Dog. I then deployed Talon to search for the following reasons:

CRIME: Phillips had an active Felony Warrant for Attempt to Elude a Police Vehicle, a violent felony. He also had two misdemeanor warrants for driving on a suspended license.

confirmed that he was inside the house where weapons had already been seen and he was refusing to come out. He had not been searched and could be armed. Cpl. Oien also informed me that Phillips had resisted arrest on a previous occasion and had fought with Officers. Phillips had been in the house for several minutes, knowing that Police were there. This allowed him plenty of time to fortify a hiding location or set up an ambush for Officers.

RESISTANCE: Phillips did not live at the residence and refused to come out despite repeated loud announcements. It was confirmed by other people that he was inside and likely hiding in the southeast bedroom.

I deployed Talon to search for Phillips. There was a sheet covering the bedroom to the southeast. Talon went through the sheet, partially pulling it down and allowing me to see into the room. I saw Talon working the bedroom and he showed a good change of behavior at the closet area. Another sheet was covering the closet but Talon went through it. He pulled over a mesh collapsible laundry basket with clothes that had been in the closet. He then entered the closet and appeared to be trying to work his way in to get to something or someone. Talon continued pulling at something in the closet, acting like he was still trying to get to someone. I could not see Talon's head, which was in the closet, but could see his body. It appeared that he had ahold of something in his mouth and was pulling with his body, trying to pull it out of the closet. Based on his behavior, it appeared that he was contacting someone and trying to pull them out of the closet.

Based on Talon's behavior, I called out something similar to, "If the dog is biting you, call out so we know and we will come get him off." I heard no verbal response or other yelling. I thought I heard a faint moaning. I moved forward with other Officers to the closet. I pulled down the sheet covering the closet and observed Talon biting the coat of a male that was sitting on the floor of the closet. Talon had ahold of the right sleeve of a Carhart style coat that the subject was wearing. It appeared the male had a coat or blanket over his head.

I commanded Talon to release and he did so immediately. I re-directed him away from the male and other Officers took him into custody.

The male was confirmed to be Phillips. He had two folding pocket knives, a multi-tool with a knife and a larger hunting style fixed blade knife in a sheath on his person.

Phillips was very lethargic and said that he was not feeling well. He said that had been ill for several days and that his liver hurt badly from complications from Hepatitis.

Cpl. Oien photographed the hiding location where Phillips had been taken into custody. He also

photographed the knives that had been removed from Phillips.

Sgt. Eckersley was on scene and was aware of the use of force applied.

Phillips was transported to Deaconess Hospital for treatment. At Deaconess, I observed injuries to Phillips' arms from being contacted by Talon. I observed punctures, minor tearing and raking on his right wrist and hand, punctures and raking on his right arm near his elbow and a puncture with raking on his upper right arm. He also had raking and punctures on his left wrist, left forearm and a puncture with tearing on his upper left arm. He also had some minor scratch marks on his forehead.

Cpl. Oien photographed the injuries.

I spoke with Phillips. He said the other people in the house told him that the Police were there and told him to hide. He got into the closet and tried to hide there. He said that he heard the announcements I made and heard Talon barking. He said he did not come out because he did not want to go to jail and because he was not feeling well. He said he did not know that he had the warrants.

Phillips continued to be very lethargic and would answer my questions with only minimal responses.

After being treated and released from Deaconess, Phillips was booked into jail.

See Ofc. Daniel's report for more information.

Sgt. Kendall also responded to the hospital and was advised of the K9 contact.

Estimated Distance from announcements and release to contact was about 10 feet. Approximate duration of contact was 10 to 15 seconds due to Phillips making no noise to alert us that Talon had contacted him.

Report Narrative

On 04-23-14 at about 1745 hours, I responded to 4808 N. Martin to assist PACT with the apprehension of subjects with warrants. PACT Officers advised that they had confirmation that three subjects were inside the house and that they had search consent from the homeowner to go inside to arrest them. The subjects inside were identified as Wade Phillips, Mark Atchison and Jason Priest. Another female and a dog were also inside the residence. The female was not wanted at this time.

Phillips had a felony warrant for Attempt to Elude a Police Vehicle and two misdemeanor traffic warrants. These warrants were confirmed. #3a

I responded with K9 Talon. We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). Talon and I are in our first year as a team.

We responded in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9"car and parked in the front of the address. I was wearing the uniform of the day, which clearly identified me as a Police Officer. It was my training uniform, which was a K9 ball cap, black sweatshirt with a tactical vest over it with "Police" clearly printed on the front and back, camouflaged pants and duty belt. Talon was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch on the left side of his chest. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

The front door of the house was already standing open. Cpl. Oien was able to call the dog and secure it to a fence with a leash. He then knocked on the door and announced our presence. After only a brief time, the female with no warrants came out of the house, but no one else responded from inside.

I moved up to the doorway and made three loud and distinct announcements of "Attention in the residence. Spokane Police K9 Unit! You are under arrest. You need to come out now or make yourself known. The residence will be searched by a Police Dog and when he finds you, he will

bite you." After the announcements, Talon barked several times loudly. I waited well over 30 seconds between each announcement, hearing no response from inside the house. From the open doorway, I could see into a living room, which was cluttered with mattresses, furnature and other items. In one corner of the room, I observed an axe, sledge hammer, baseball bat and other items that could easily be used as weapons.

After several minutes, we entered the residence. Due to Priest's misdemeanor warrant, I did not release Talon initially and followed other Officers inside to search. We had received information that Phillips and Atchison were likely in the back southeast bedroom. We cleared up to a hallway that led to two bedrooms and a bathroom on the south side of the residence. At this hallway, I made another loud announcement. As I was still giving the announcement, I heard a male call out that he was coming out and to keep the dog back. Other Officers continued verbal contact with the male and I moved back with Talon. Atchison came out of the southeast bedroom and was taken into custody without incident.

I moved back up to the hallway and covered that area as Officers made contact with Priest in the attic of the house through a hole in the kitchen ceiling. He was removed from the house without incident.

Believing that Phillips was the only person left in the house, I gave another announcement, advising him by name that he was under arrest and that the house would be searched by a Police Dog. I then deployed Talon to search for the following reasons:

CRIME: Phillips had an active Felony Warrant for Attempt to Elude a Police Vehicle, a violent felony. He also had two misdemeanor warrants for driving on a suspended license.

THREAT FACTORS: #3a

Multiple people had confirmed that he was inside the house where weapons had already been seen and he was refusing to come out. He had not been searched and could be armed. Cpl. Oien also informed me that Phillips had resisted arrest on a previous occasion and had fought with Officers. Phillips had been in the house for several minutes, knowing that Police were there. This allowed him plenty of time to fortify a hiding location or set up an ambush for Officers.

RESISTANCE: Phillips did not live at the residence and refused to come out despite repeated loud announcements. It was confirmed by other people that he was inside and likely hiding in the southeast bedroom.

I deployed Talon to search for Phillips. There was a sheet covering the bedroom to the southeast. Talon went through the sheet, partially pulling it down and allowing me to see into the room. I saw Talon working the bedroom and he showed a good change of behavior at the closet area. Another sheet was covering the closet but Talon went through it. He pulled over a mesh collapsible laundry basket with clothes that had been in the closet. He then entered the closet and appeared to be trying to work his way in to get to something or someone. Talon continued pulling at something in the closet, acting like he was still trying to get to someone. I could not see Talon's head, which was in the closet, but could see his body. It appeared that he had ahold of something in his mouth and was pulling with his body, trying to pull it out of the closet. Based on his behavior, it appeared that he was contacting someone and trying to pull them out of the closet.

Based on Talon's behavior, I called out something similar to, "If the dog is biting you, call out so we know and we will come get him off." I heard no verbal response or other yelling. I thought I heard a faint moaning. I moved forward with other Officers to the closet. I pulled down the sheet covering the closet and observed Talon biting the coat of a male that was sitting on the floor of the closet. Talon had ahold of the right sleeve of a Carhart style coat that the subject was wearing. It appeared the male had a coat or blanket over his head.

I commanded Talon to release and he did so immediately. I re-directed him away from the male and other Officers took him into custody.

The male was confirmed to be Phillips. He had two folding pocket knives, a multi-tool with a knife and a larger hunting style fixed blade knife in a sheath on his person.

Phillips was very lethargic and said that he was not feeling well. He said that had been ill for several days and that his liver hurt badly from complications from Hepatitis.

Cpl. Oien photographed the hiding location where Phillips had been taken into custody. He also photographed the knives that had been removed from Phillips.

Sgt. Eckersley was on scene and was aware of the use of force applied.

Phillips was transported to Deaconess Hospital for treatment. At Deaconess, I observed injuries to Phillips' arms from being contacted by Talon. I observed punctures, minor tearing and raking on his right wrist and hand, punctures and raking on his right arm near his elbow and a puncture with raking on his upper right arm. He also had raking and punctures on his left wrist, left forearm and a puncture with tearing on his upper left arm. He also had some minor scratch marks on his forehead.

Cpl. Oien photographed the injuries.

I spoke with Phillips. He said the other people in the house told him that the Police were there and told him to hide. He got into the closet and tried to hide there. He said that he heard the announcements I made and heard Talon barking. He said he did not come out because he did not want to go to jail and because he was not feeling well. He said he did not know that he had the warrants

Phillips continued to be very lethargic and would answer my questions with only minimal responses.

After being treated and released from Deaconess, Phillips was booked into jail.

Sgt. Kendall also responded to the hospital and was advised of the K9 contact.

Estimated Distance from announcements and release to contact was about 10 feet. Approximate duration of contact was 10 to 15 seconds due to Phillips making no noise to alert us that Talon had contacted him.
