Use of Force-Taser application (probe), Pointing Firearm

On 05/18/14 at 1812 officers responded to the area of Broadway and Cedar for a suicidal male.
Spokane Transit Authority was reporting a male, #14 on the bus was suicidal and was threatening the bus driver with a firearm. The driver did not see the firearm but #14
indicated he had one in his backpack. #14 was intoxicated and said he was going to hurt
himself and police. #14 got off the bus at Boone and Ash where he was contacted by police.
#14 was uncooperative by not following verbal commands. #14 reached behind his
back and pulled out an object, took and an isosceles shooting stance with both hands clasped
together in front of him, pointing the object directly at Officer Johnson. Officers Johnson and
Briggs were pointing their firearms at #14 while giving verbal commands to drop the object.
#14 refused to drop the object and continued to point it at Officer Johnson. Officer
Matthew deployed his Taser in the probe mode at #14 which ended the confrontation.
Complainant Interview Summary
was crying and repeatedly saying he wanted to die. I asked him why he had pointed the
object at the officer. He stated that he wanted the officer to shoot him and he wanted to die. I
asked #14 if he was injured and he replied that he did not know. I asked him if he was in
any pain and he again said he did not know.
Officer Interview Summary
Matthew arrived on scene from the east on Boone and saw #14 pointing an object at Officer
Johnson like it was a gun. He deployed his Taser from 10-15 feet. He saw #14 fall to the
ground.

Officer Johnson confronted #14 with the information that he could be armed with a firearm.
#14 did not follow verbal commands. He pointed his firearm at #14 before and after
#14 pointed an object at Officer Johnson as if it were a firearm.
See Attached Supplemental Report written by Officer Johnson

Officer Briggs arrived at the same time as Officer Johnson. He took cover behind a concrete sign to the north of #14 and west of Johnson. Initially he had his weapon at the low ready while giving verbal commands. When #14 began reaching behind his back, he pointed his

firearm at #14 while giving verbal commands.

Investigative Summary

I was on scene and witnessed this incident. See attached Supplemental Report.

Officer Johnson's and Briggs' action of pointing their firearms at #14 was reasonable and within department policy. #14 was potentially armed with a firearm when they first contacted him and he pointed an object at Officer Johnson as if it were a firearm.

Officer Matthew's use of force was reasonable given the circumstances. He responded to Officer Johnson's request for a control device. When he arrived on scene he made his own assessment of the threat and chose a minimal amount of force to gain compliance which was effective and resulted in only minor injuries to the suspect. His actions were reasonable and within the department policy.

On 05-18-14 at approximately 1812 hours, myself and multiple other officers were advised of a person with a weapon/suicidal subject on an STA bus near the intersection of Ash and Boone. An STA bus driver advised that a subject on the bus told him that he had a gun in his backpack, and that he was planning on hurting himself and police. The male also threatened to shoot the bus driver, then stated he would wait for police, and the bus driver indicated he was last seen standing at the northwest corner of Boone and Ash.

The subject was described as a White male, mid to late 40s, wearing sunglasses, a blue shirt and a red backpack.

Officer Johnson and I arrived on scene from the north, and I immediately saw that a male matching the description was standing on the Northwest corner of the intersection.

Officer Johnson stopped his vehicle in the curb lane on Ash, while I positioned my vehicle in the parking lot just to the west, about ten yards from Officer Johnson.

Officer Johnson and I both began giving the subject verbal commands to show us his hands, with my firearm out at the low ready. The male initially complied and put his hands up, palms towards us. The subject then began to disobey our commands, as he reached his left arm to the back of his waistband. I moved my firearm from the low-ready to pointed in at the subject as I repeatedly yelled at him to stop digging into his waistband, and to show us his hands. The subject continued to disregard the commands, and I could tell he was attempting to grasp an object. The subject then was able to grasp the object, and pull it out of his waistband. The object appeared to be grey in color, and was shaped like a handgun with a handle the extended vertically down, and a cylindrical portion that extended horizontally from the handle portion.

The subject gripped the object with both hands and extended his arms from his body in the common handgun shooting stance known as isosceles.

While the object appeared to be the general shape of a firearm, I noted that it did not appear like a conventional gun. Despite its unorthodox appearance, I was aware based on my training and experience that many firearms have been altered in appearance to conceal their identity, or designed specifically to appear like something other than a gun.

While standing holding the object like a gun the man repeatedly yelled statements such as "fucking shoot me" and "just kill me." The subject had the object pointed directly at Officer Johnson.

I continued to give the subject commands to drop the object, which he did not do. Officer Matthew was able to approach from the east and deploy a Taser, which was effective and the subject dropped the object. My sidearm was pointed at the subject from the time he began obtaining an object from his rear waistband, until the Taser was deployed.

I assisted in placing the subject in the prone handcuffing position, and handcuffs were applied. Once detained the male repeated that he wished we had shot and killed him, and that he just wanted to die. The male made dozens of comments to the effect of wishing we had killed him.

The object was determined to be a phone charger.

I spoke with Michael Kerber, the bus driver. Kerber stated that the male, who was identified as #14 told Kerber "I have a gun in my backpack, I don't want to hurt you, call the police I want to hurt myself and them."

SFD and AMR arrived to evaluate #14 Handcuffs were removed and AMR put their restraints on Lindsey. I followed the ambulance to the hospital, where he was brought to the psych unit and I completed the patient report by law enforcement form. I also contacted Frontier behavioral help, and spoke with their representative about the incident. They indicated they were familiar with #14 and would contact the hospital to determine what additional resources could be utilized.

On 05/18/14 at 1812 I responded to the area of Broadway and Cedar for a suicidal male. Spokane Transit Authority was reporting a male on the bus was suicidal and was threatening the bus driver with a firearm. The driver did not see the firearm but the male indicated he had one in his backpack. The male was intoxicated and said he was going to hurt himself and police. While enroute to the location the complainant advised the male got off the bus and was at the northwest corner of Boone and Ash.

I arrived on scene at 1817. I approached the location from the west using an apartment building at the northwest corner of Boone and Ash as cover. The male came into view when I reached the southwest corner of the building. The male was facing Officer Johnson who had just arrived from the north. I was approximately 25 feet from the male and had a view of his back and left side. Officer Johnson was outside of his vehicle standing behind the open driver's door approximately 10 feet from the male. Officer Johnson was pointing his firearm at the male giving him loud and clear verbal commands to show his hands and drop to his knees. I saw the male reach behind his back with his left hand and had his right hand above his head. He lifted the back of his shirt up and I could see a white cylindrical object in the waistline of his shorts. The object appeared to be possibly made of plastic but it was not easily identifiable.

Throughout my career in law enforcement I have seen many safety bulletins warning officers of all types of objects that have been transformed into a firearm, explosive, or other deadly weapon. Even though the object the male was not readily identifiable, I did not discount its potential to be a deadly weapon. It was with this knowledge and at this moment that I feared this encounter could easily become lethal.

The male pulled the object from his waistband and pointed it at Officer Johnson as if the object were a gun. The male was now holding the object with both hands in an isosceles shooting position pointing the object directly at Officer Johnson. Officer Johnson asked over the radio for a control device to subdue the male. Officer Johnson gave the male repeated loud and clear verbal commands to drop the object. I heard the command "index" and a Taser discharge. The male stiffened and fell backwards to the ground. I joined Officers Johnson, Matthew, and Briggs in rushing to the male. The male was handcuffed in the prone cuffing position without further incident.

I requested medics to have the male checked after the Taser application. The probes had dislodged from the male on their own prior to medics arriving. The probes had made contact with the male's right upper arm and right buttocks. I did not view the buttocks but I did note a small puncture wound on the male's upper right arm. The male had no other visible injuries.

The object that he had been pointing at Officer Johnson was a car cell phone charger. It was

On 05/18/2014 at approximately 1817 hours, I responded to Boone Ave and Ash Street on a report of a suicidal male who had threatened an STA bus driver.

Dispatch advised a male was on an STA bus threatening the driver with a firearm. According to dispatch, the subject said he had a gun in his backpack and the subject indicated he was going to hurt himself and police. While enroute, dispatch also advised the subject exited the bus at Boone Ave and Ash Street and would wait there for police and continued to make threats to harm the police as he left the bus.

Officer C. Johnson, Officer Briggs, and Sergeant McNab arrived onscene prior to me and engaged the subject.

Upon arrival, I approached the scene on Boone Avenue from the east. As I arrived at Boone Avenue and Ash Street I observed Officer C. Johnson and Officer Briggs addressing a white male subject on the NW corner of Boone Ave and Ash Street.

As I exited my vehicle, I saw a white male subject was in a shooters stance with his arms fully extended in front of him and he was holding an object in his hands. The subject was pointing the object directly at Officer C. Johnson. As I moved closer on foot, I observed the object was white, cylindrical, and had a silver tip. Based on my training and experience, which has included training in improvised firearms and other deadly weapons, I believed the object the subject was pointing at Officer C. Johnson was an improvised weapon and he was trying to force Officer C. Johnson into a lethal encounter.

As I approached the subject from his right, I heard him say something similar to: "Fucking shoot me, just kill me" several times.

I continued approaching the subject from his right side and slightly behind, I drew my Taser, continued my approach, and when I was about 15 feet from the subject, I deployed my Taser in probe mode. The probes made contact on the right side of the subject's upper back. The subject fell backwards onto the ground and was detained in handcuffs (dl) without further incident.

After the subject was detained he continued to say, "why didn't you kill me, why didn't you
