### Incident Summary

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Officers Groom, Donaldson and Rosenthal went to Chief Garry Park on a report of a drunk and disorderly male bothering spectators at a baseball game. Arriving officers were contacted by several more complainants who pointed out the suspect. The suspect was contacted and officers immediately observed that he was intoxicated and drinking beer from an open container.

Ofc. Groom recognized the suspect from a recent contact. He knew the suspect had communication difficulty... was partially deaf but could read lips. Ofc. Groom contacted the man who was identified as Troy Vanschoiack. Troy refused to follow Groom's hand signals and verbal directions to stop. He turned and began walking away. When asked to stop and sit down, Troy grew angry and began yelling. He became very aggressive. When officers Groom and Donaldson took arm control of Troy he tried to pull away. Donaldson then escorted Troy to the ground using a hair hold. Troy was then handcuffed while prone out.

He was arrested for Obstructing and placed in a patrol car without further incident.

Troy sustained injuries consisting of redness/possible bruising on his forehead, a sore right knee, and redness on his right wrist. The injuries were photographed by Cpl. Denton.

Cpl. Denton called me from the jail. Although Troy's injuries were consistent with prone handcuffing, it was agreed that I would go to jail and attempt to speak with Troy about the incident. I found Troy passed out in his jail cell. Denton and I woke him up. Troy was extremely intoxicated and very agitated. He indicated that he felt he should not have been contacted by police for, "Half a can of beer." I explained by written note that its against the law to drink beer in the park and that people had complained about it. He indicated that he didn't stop for the officers because he felt he wasn't doing anything wrong.

I asked Troy if he had any injuries besides those that were visible; he replied, "No."

Asked if he had any questions for me, Troy said, "No."

This use of force was appropriate and within policy.

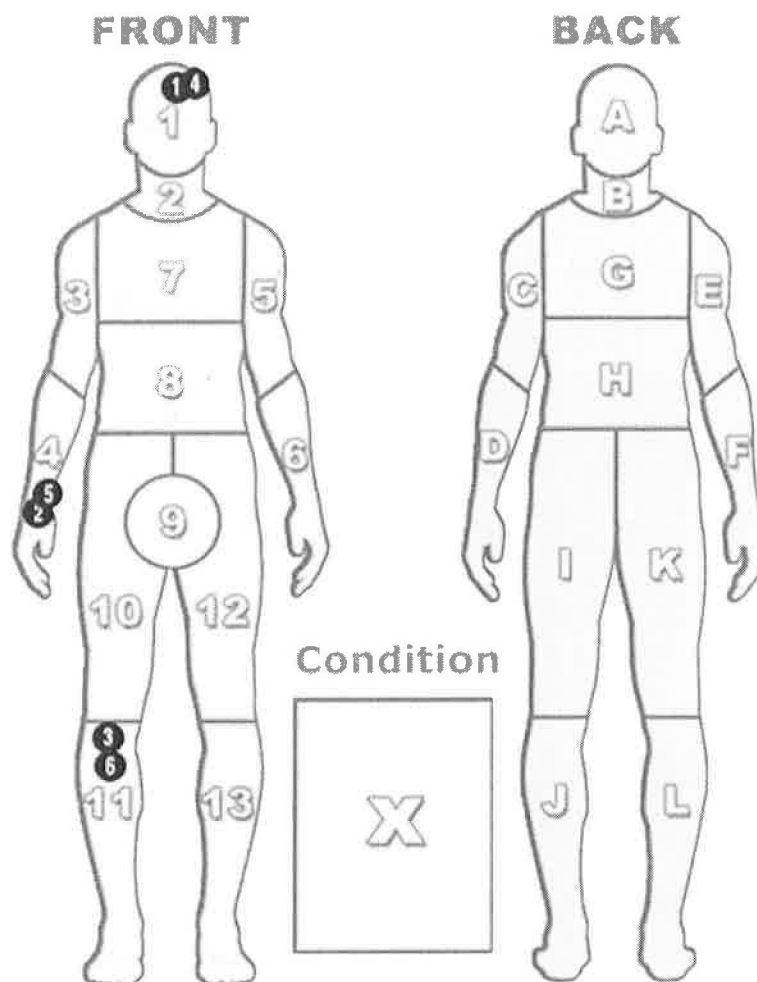

On 05/25/2014 Ofc. Donaldson and I (Officer Groom) were on scene at a collision at the intersection of Cook/Mission in Spokane WA. I was working on the collision report when a concerned citizen approached my patrol car and advised me that there was a drunk disorderly at Chief Garry Park. The citizen advised me that the disorderly man, (later identified as Troy VanSchoiack) was at the baseball field where kids were playing baseball. The citizen advised that VanSchoiack was drinking in the park.

I completed the collision investigation around 1806 hours and drove eastbound on Sinto on the south side of the park. I traveled east on Sinto in a fully marked police car and several citizens stopped me as I drove pointing out an individual wearing a Seahawks shirt with a black backpack that was causing a scene as he drank in the park. I contacted VanSchoiack who matched the description that was given and asked for his identification.

I recognized VanSchoiack from a previous encounter and I knew that he was partially deaf. I made a strong effort to stand directly in front of him so that he could read my lips and I used hand signals along with verbal commands to direct him. I held my hand up for him to stop along with verbal commands. I explained to VanSchoiack that I was contacting him because he was consuming liquor in a public park which is a violation of Spokane Park Rules.

VanSchoiack yelled at me and waived a wallet in front of my face. VanSchoiack turned and walked eastbound through the Park holding an open alcoholic container. I told VanSchoiack to stop and sit on the sidewalk along with hand signals. VanSchoiack ignored my command and tried to continue eastbound. VanSchoiack became very angry, was yelling and was tensed up. I asked VanSchoiack to just sit down where he was at and pointed at the open can of beer in his hand. VanSchoiack immediately threw the beer can down to the ground with what seemed to be all his might and stomped on it with his right foot. The beer was about half full and when VanSchoiack stomped on the can, the beer was sprayed all over Ofc. Donaldson who was standing about 6 feet away.

VanSchoiack had not been searched and was getting very agitated and acting in a very aggressive manner (balled up, clenched fists and flushed face). VanSchoiack is a very large man and was very intoxicated making it hard to predict how he was going to react.

Ofc. Donaldson went to remove VanSchoiack's backpack, because it was hanging down on his left shoulder and could have been used as a weapon. VanSchoiack let go of the backpack, but then turned and tried to walk away. I took arm control of VanSchoiack's right arm who immediately tensed the muscles in his arm and tried to pull away from me and Ofc Donaldson. VanSchoiack continued to pull against my grip until VanSchoiack was guided to the ground. Ofc. Donaldson and I voiced to stop resisting and that VanSchoiack was under arrest. I assisted in handcuffing/DL and FS VanSchoiack in the prone position.

I asked VanSchoiack if he was injured or needed any medical attention. VanSchoiack advised me

On 052514 at approximatley 1800, Officer Groom and I were at Cook and Mission in our fully marked patrol car. We had been investigating a collision when citizen approached us. He advised Ofc Groom and I that a disorderly male was drinking beer in Chief Garry Park.

Ofc Groom drove our patrol car E/B on Sinto from Cook. There multiple baseball games currently being played. As such Sinto had many cars parked on it and there were multiple pedestrians. As Ofc Groom continued E/B I noted multiple people pointing at male near a white minivan. I noted the male, later identified Troy Vanschoiack, was talking to the family near the van. Vanschoiack was gesturing with his hands wildly. I noted the woman gave our patrol car a nervous look.

Ofc Groom parked our patrol car just east where Vanschoiack was standing. We walked to Vanschoiack and Ofc Groom contacted him. Vanschoiack yelled at Ofc Groom and did not respond further. Ofc Groom again requested Vanschoiack's ID. Vanschoiack responded by raising his wallet in his right hand and shaking it a foot from Ofc Groom's face. Vanschoiack was holding an open Hurricane brand beer can in his left hand with a bag of chips. He was also carrying a backpack over his left shoulder.

Vanschoiack turned and walked E/B from Ofc Groom. Ofc Groom ordered Vanschoiack to sit on the curb. Vanschoiack did not continued walking E/B. Ofc Groom moved in front of Vanschoiack and told him to sit down where he was. He advised that Vanschoiack was drinking a beer in the park and he needed to stop.

I noted Vanschoiack turn towards Ofc Groom suddenly. He raised the open beer can above his head and threw it down onto the sidewalk, seemingly with all of his might. Vanschoiack then stomped on the beer can with his right foot. The beer from the can was forced out and covered me, even though I was standing approx. six feet away.

Vanschoiack turned to yell at Ofc Groom. He had not been frisked for weapons and still had his backpack. I stepped in to him and pulled the backpack from his left shoulder. Vanschoiack did not notice me and as the pack's strapped neared his hands, Vanschoiack brought his hands together. To prevent him from grabbing backpack I pulled it through his hands and placed it on the ground.

Vanschoiack turned and then took a step E/B. I moved in and took left arm control of Vanschoiack

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as Ofc Groom took right arm control. I noted Vanschoiack tensed all of the muscles in his arm. He attempted to pull his left arm into his centerline where he would have a leverage advantage against me. I noted his left hand was clenched in a fist and his knuckles were white as if he were squeezing his hands very hard. Vanschoiack leaned towards me, trying to distance himself from Ofc Groom.

I was required to apply a forward takedown technique for the following reasons:

-Vanschoiack was obstructing Ofc Groom's lawful orders to stop and sit down so that Ofc Groom could further his investigation.

-Vanschoiack had not been frisked for weapons. He was carrying a backpack which could contain or be used as a weapon. He was very animated and was yelling loudly at Ofc Groom's calm requests. Vanschoiack was intoxicated and physically larger than Ofc Groom.

Based on my experience and training intoxicated persons can rapidly become violent and are unpredictable. As such he was an immediate threat to our safety if not quickly detained.

-When I took left arm control of Vanschoiack he immediately tensed the muscles in his left arm and pulled his arm into his centerline where he had a leverage advantage and possibly a concealed weapon. When he was not successful he leaned his whole body towards me, in an attempt to get away from Ofc Groom who had right arm control of him

I took hold of Vanschoiack's long hair with both of my hands and guided him to the ground with a forward takedown. I guided Vanschoiack away from the sidewalk and onto the grass of the Park.

I placed my knee on the back of Vanschoiack's neck and upper back to restrain his movements. I told Vanschoiack that he was under arrest and ordered him to stop resisting. He did not listen to me and he continued to tense his left arm and tried to reach under his body. I was required to pull his left arm behind his back and Ofc Groom and I handcuffed him in the prone position.

We escorted Vanschoiack to our patrol car where he was placed in the back.

We transported Vanschoiack to Spokane County Jail where he was booked.

I was working as the team corporal and out of grade sergeant in the team sergeant's absence. Ofc. Groom, working as a probationary officer with Ofc. Donaldson in a field training car, notified me that he had arrested Vanschoiack for obstructing in Chief Garry Park. He requested a booking exception because of Vanschoiack's intoxication and likelihood to continue his disorderly conduct. He informed me that officers had used a defensive tactic to effect the arrest which resulted in injuries consistent with prone cuffing. I called the jail sergeant and obtained a booking exception. I notified Ofc. Groom of the booking exception and told him that I would meet him at the jail.

Meanwhile, I phoned Sgt. Lee and informed him of these details. He directed me to notify him if the details change.

I met Ofc. Groom and Ofc. Donaldson at the jail where they explained the situation further, including that Vanschoiack had smashed a beer can on the ground and stomped on it while close enough to spray Ofc. Donaldson with beer, had actively resisted arrest, and was taken to the grass covered ground by use of a hair takedown to prone cuffing. They further explained that Vanschoiack is deaf.

I contacted Vanschoiack as he lay on the cement floor of a jail holding cell. Jail staff members were present. The holding cell smelled heavily of alcoholic beverages. Vanschoiack and I communicated verbally best we could, and he pointed to a mark and redness on his forehead, a small abrasion on his left hand, slight redness on his right wrist, a tear on the right pant leg of his pants, and an old injury covered by a thick dried scab on his right knee under the tear in his pants. I photographed these as he pointed them out. It had become obvious to me that he was heavily intoxicated. It had also become obvious that Vanschoiack was probably deaf.

Vanschoiack's injuries looked to be consistent with use of a hair takedown to prone cuffing as Ofc. Groom and Ofc. Donaldson had explained.

I recontacted Sgt. Lee by phone and informed him of these new details. Sgt. Lee responded to the jail for further investigation.
