Officers Roberge, Woodyard, and Corp. Ferguson responded to the Boulevard Motel reference a subject refusing to leave. The subject (Kelly George) continued to refuse to leave even after officers told her to leave. She became assaultive and went after the officers. Officers told her she was under arrest and used several verbal warnings in an attempt to deescalate the situation. George continued to struggle and fight scratching and biting Officer Roberge. A LVNR was attempted but was not successful. A Taser was deployed in direct contact with the suspect's leg. George became cooperative after the Taser application and was taken into custody. George complained of injury. She was transported to hospital and cleared before she was booked into jail for 3rd assault and PCS meth.

I talked to the George. She said the officers told her she needed to leave or she would go to jail. She told them that she paid for the room this morning and could stay there. I asked her if she knew what day it was and she was unsure. The nurse came in during the interview and checked George's hands and feet because she complained of numbness and no feeling in them. The nurse applied pressure on each hand causing George to sit up and yell. The nurse did this to both of George's feet and got the same response. In other words she had no issues feeling pain. I asked George if she was injured. She said she was not injured. Then she asked me if I thought she was dead. This seemed to be an odd question. George said she felt she was getting closer to being dead every time she made contact with an officer. I asked her if she was working. She said yes, that she was working for "The World", and every time the world was out of balance she had to go out and work. I asked her what work she did. She could not explain only that what she did put the world back in balance.

After review of this incident it appears that George may have mental health issues combined with the use of illegal street drugs. She did not listen to officers commands and attacked the officers. Officers used several different tactics in order to take the subject into custody. In my opinion all of these tactics comply with policy and procedure.

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On 6-2-14 at 1114 hours, Kyung Choi, who is the owner and manager of the Boulevard motel at 2905 W Sunset called the police to advise that check out time was at 11:00 and he had a person refusing to leave one of the rooms.

Due to the call load, Ofc. Roberge and I were unable to get to the hotel until 12:12 hours, and contacted Choi. He said that the female was still in room #6 and she refused to pay for another day, open the door or leave.

Choi said that the female (unknown name) checked in with a male named Archie M Knerr around 0300 hours. Choi told the couple several times that he would rent the room, but that check out time is at 11:00 regardless of check in time. The couple agreed. Choi said that the male left before check-out time, so he assumed the female left as well. He went to the room to clean it and set it up for the next guest, but found the interior chain locked and the female who refused pay for another day, open the door, or leave. He called the police.

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Ofc. Roberge and myself went and knocked on #6, with no answer. There was a television on inside the room. Choi used a key to open the door, and the interior chain was still locked. I could see female's bare feet on the bed. I announced myself as the Spokane Police and told the female to answer the door so we could talk. The female was mumbling and slurring and said that she had paid for the room and that she was not going anywhere. I asked the female several times to answer the door and she just kept telling us in an angry tone to go away. I told her that we would not be leaving and that she needed to open the door or she would be arrested. The female refused and then stopped answering questions. Choi said that the window was unlocked.

We slid open the window, which allowed me to reach over and unlock the chain on the door. We opened the door, and told the female that she was no longer welcome to stay at the location and that she was going to have to leave. The female was laying on the bed in a pajama top with brief style underwear. I suggested that she put on her pants as she was going to be leaving the room. She told us several times that she was not going to leave. I used several different verbal de-escalation techniques towards the female asking her why she didn't want to leave, and explaining the consequences if she did not leave. I used a calm, explaining manner. The female refused all of these tactics and adamantly said she was not going anywhere, and commanded me to leave the room. I asked the female several times for her name and she refused to provide her name. She just kept saying, "I am not leaving." I explained to her that she was remaining unlawfully and would be arrested for trespass. I also observed a glass methamphetamine smoking pipe with heavy white residue inside on the table on top of her clothing. I told her that I could also charge her for the drugs if she did not cooperate, and simply leave the room. She refused to identify herself and she verbally stated that she was not going to leave. I told her that she was going to be arrested. She acknowledged that and said she did not care if she was arrested.

At this point, Cpl. Ferguson arrived and also tried to verbally de-escalate the female, and he got the same response that I did. See his report. Cpl. Ferguson shut off a television that was playing loudly in the room. At that point, the female fixated on him and told him not to turn off the television. When he refused, the female got up off the bed quickly and went towards Cpl. Ferguson in an angry manner. At that point, Ofc. Roberge and Cpl. Ferguson grappled with the female and took her to the floor. I told her several times during this that she was under arrest and that she needed to stop resisting. I could see that the female was a very large framed female, who easily outweighed me by 50-60 pounds, and was 5-6 inches taller than me. Once they were on the ground, the female kept thrashing about. Ofc. Roberge was attempting to control her upper body, and Cpl Ferguson was attempting to control her midsection. I again told her several times that she was under arrest and that she needed to stop resisting. I attempted to grab onto and control the female's legs, and she kept kicking them out of my grasp, rolling around, and was kicking at me as I was attempting to control them. After several long moments without successfully detaining the female, Ofc. Roberge urgently advised me that he needed the female to be tasered. I accessed my taser, announced, "index" and removed the cartridge from the front. I conducted a drive stun to the female's upper left thigh for one complete cycle. The female then relaxed slightly and started to listen to our verbal commands. She started saying, "okay, I'm complying!" and we were not having to physically restrain her as vigorously. She eventually rolled onto her stomach and we were able to handcuff her. The

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verbal and physical resisting by the female had stopped and she was now apologizing. We assisted her in standing up and we had her sit down on a curb out front. We requested a supervisor and medics as well. Cpl. Ferguson photographed the red marks left by the taser. I assisted the female in putting on her sweat pants. She advised that her name was Kelly George and she could provide no explanation as to why she did not simply leave the hotel room when asked. George said that she was diabetic as well as pregnant. Medics did not find any diabetic symptoms, and it was apparent that George could not be pregnant due to the fact she was obviously menstruating at that time (she had an obvious maxi-pad and blood stains on her underwear, and I was also asked to assist jail staff with her eventual strip-search.) I collected George's belongings out of the hotel room which included a backpack and some clothing. There was nothing else in the hotel room that indicated any one other than her was staying there. I collected the glass pipe and tested the white substance inside, which immediately and quickly field tested positive as methamphetamine.

George was found to have no warrants. She was complaining of neck and back pain and was taken to SHMC via ambulance. She was cleared by the hospital and was taken to jail. George's items were brought with her and her pipe was later placed onto property as evidence. She was booked for 3rd degree assault on Ofc. Roberge (see his report and pictures of his arms,) Possession of Controlled substances- methamphetamine, trespassing, and resisting arrest.

On 06/02/14 I responded to 2905 W. Sunset Blvd to assist Officer Roberge and Officer Woodyard with a subject refusing to leave a motel room. When I arrived Woodyard was standing by the door of room 6 and Roberge was standing inside on the opposite side of the room. I entered the room and stood near the foot of the bed, near the television.

The subject, later identified as George, was lying on the bed. She was wearing a shirt but no pants. She was yelling at the officers telling them to get the "fuck" out of her room. She made other comments concerning the fact that she "worked for the world".

Woodyard and Roberge were talking to George in very calm voices. They were explaining to her that all she needed to do was get her stuff and leave the room. George continued swearing at us and refused to give her name. I learned that the room had been rented out by a male and check out time was nearly an hour and a half earlier at 11:00.

George continued her hostile attitude. At this time we were standing well away from her and using verbal commands trying to get George to cooperate. I turned the television off to cut down on the noise in the room.

George who had been lying on the bed the whole time, making no attempt to get up, jumped out of the bed near Roberge. She walked rapidly past Roberge and headed towards me. She said, "Don't turn off my fucking television". As she passed Roberge I thought she was going to assault me because I turned off the television. Due to her size, nearly six feet tall and two hundred and fifty pounds I was concerned.

George immediately turned into Roberge and began to struggle. I grabbed George's left arm in an attempt to gain control of her. We gave several commands to George telling her to get down, stop fighting and quit fighting. George started pushing towards the small kitchenette area. Roberge was able to stop that momentum. As I worked to control her arm, Roberge was able to get George to the floor. George immediately began digging her fingernails in to Roberge's arm. I unsuccessfully tried use an arm control to get George to comply with our orders to stop fighting.

Woodyard was trying to control George's legs when Roberge called for a taser deployment. I moved to put my weight on George's legs while holding on to her arm. I watched Woodyard make a probe contact application with the taser after yelling index.

George began to weaken and Roberge and I were able to get her arms in to a handcuffing position and we were able to handcuff her. Roberge and I assisted George to her feet and escorted her out of the room. We sat her on the sidewalk in front of the room. Woodyard handled the radio traffic and requested medics. George had calmed down and identified herself.

I photographed the room, Roberge's injuries and George. George was transported to SHMC prior to booking.

On 06/02/2014 Officer Woodyard and I responded to 2905 W. Sunset Hwy to the report of a person who was refusing to pay for another day and refusing to check out of a motel room at the location. Upon arrival we were contacted by the owner/operator Kyung Choi. Choi stated that a couple had checked into the motel early in the morning and he advised them that checkout was at 11 am. They agreed and he rented them the room. Later in the morning, Choi observed the male leave the room, driving out of the parking lot and he did not return. At approximately 11 AM Choi knocked on the room and was greeted by a female who refused to leave. He advised her that checkout was at 11 and that if she wanted to stay she needed to pay for another day. The female refused to leave and Choi called police.

Choi indicated that the female was in room 6. Officers knocked on the door and received no response. After 6 separate attempts, Choi produced the key and unlocked the door. The door was stopped by the security chain, but a female leg was clearly visible. Officer Woodyard contacted the female verbally and the female refused to speak with police at the door. The female refused to move from her resting position. She demanded that police leave her alone and stated that she was not leaving.

Choi advised that he wanted the female removed from the room.

Officer Woodyard checked the window and slid it open. She pulled the curtains aside and directed

the female come to the door and unlock the safety chain. The female refused. Officer Woodyard reached in and removed the safety chain from the door. I swung the door inward so that I could see the interior of the room.

The female was directed to sit up and collect her belongings approximately 6 times or more, and warned that if she did not comply she may be arrested. The female refused. She was later identified as George.

I entered the room and conducted a protective sweep of the kitchen and the bathroom. No one else was inside. I retrieved a pair of pants from the nightstand and ensured that the pockets were empty. I handed these pants to George and asked her to put them on. She refused and flung them back in my direction.

Cpl. Ferguson arrived and turned off the TV that was playing loudly in the corner in order to better facilitate communication in the room. George immediately sprang up from the bed, pushing past me and closed the distance to Cpl Ferguson.

I attempted to place her in right arm control but she immediately turned on me and began pushing against me. Based upon the quick change of direction and the intentional closing of distance to police officers, it was very evident that George's intention was to cause physical injury to officers.

I spun George around and placed her in a Neck Restraint. George began to attempt to spin into me and I guided her to the ground. I advised her that she was under arrest and to stop fighting. She did not comply.

George dropped her chin and began to bite my left wrist. I pulled my left arm back from her mouth and began to attempt to render her unconscious. From the position we were in, the Neck restraint was not effective and served only to hold her in a prone position. George moved both her hands up to my left forearm, positioned across the left side of her head and began to scratch at my forearm wildly with her nails.

I directed Officer Woodyard to apply the Taser, as the Neck Restraint was not effective, and I was now being assaulted. The application was successful and George was rolled onto her belly and handcuffed (DL-SFS). After approximately 30 seconds, I rolled George onto her right and sat her up on her butt, this was done to assist in her respiration.

After a couple of moments, Cpl. Ferguson and I stood George on her feet and escorted her out of the room. I had her take a seat on the sidewalk in front of the hotel room. Her pants were retrieved and she was assisted in putting them on. Cpl. Ferguson photographed injuries to my forearm.

Medics were summoned to treat her Diabetic reaction to the struggle and to examine her injuries she


