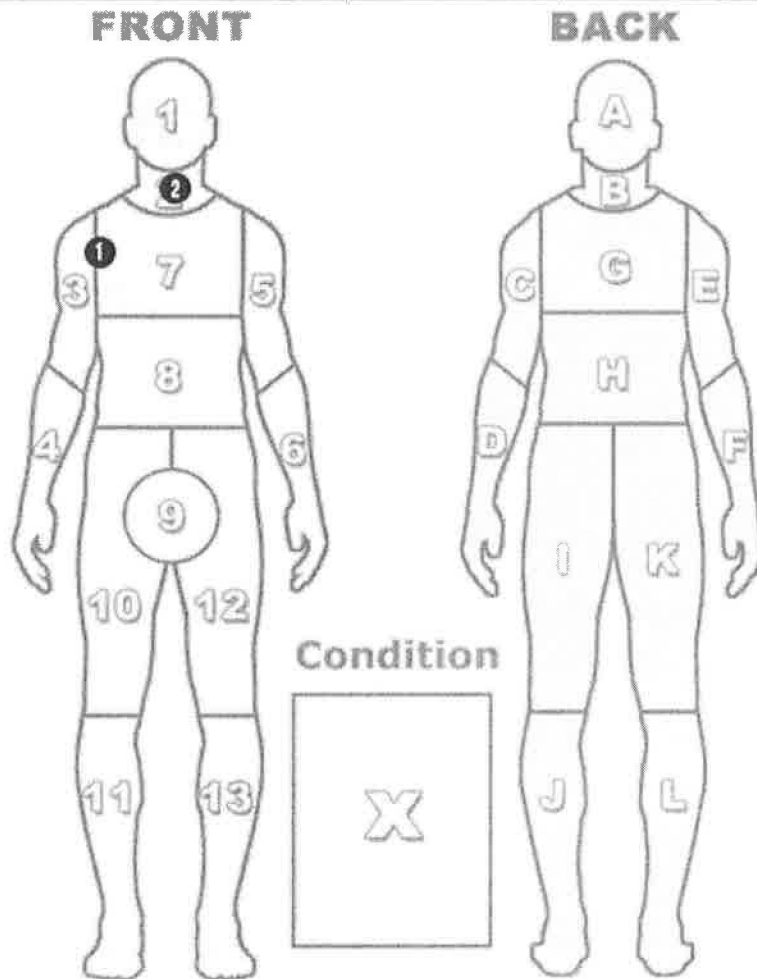

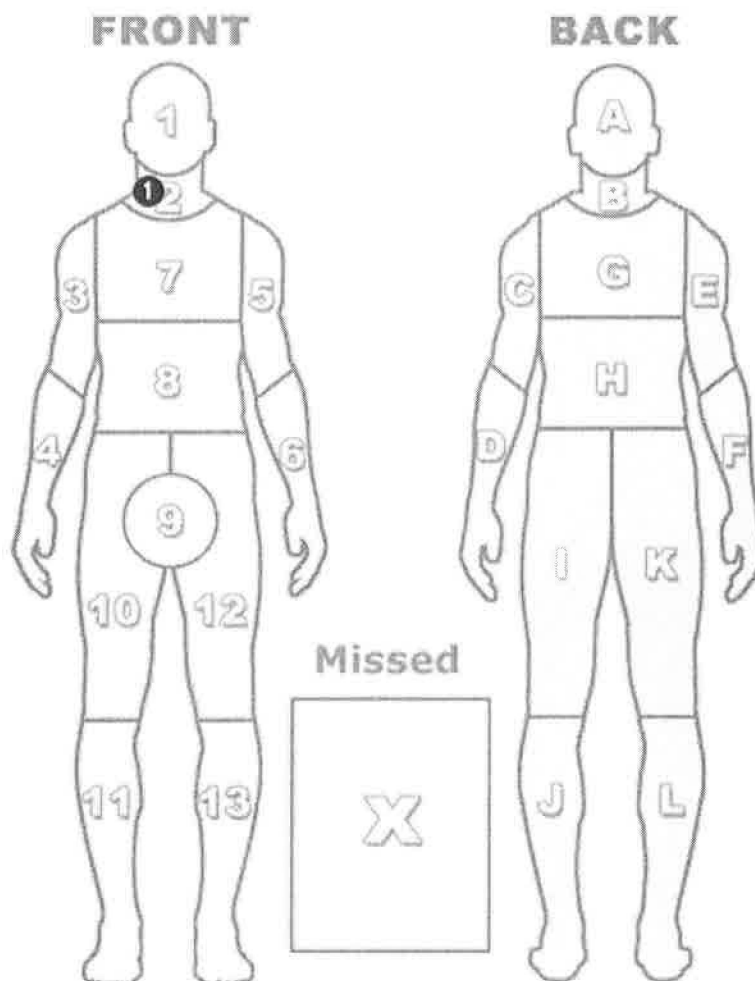

**Complainant Interview Summary**

I (Sgt. Kannberg) contacted [REDACTED] #14 at SHER. Mr. [REDACTED] #14 was visibly upset about something and stated he just wanted to go home. During the interview he started crying a couple times. I asked about the 911 call and he stated he should not have made the call. He indicted the only thing he is living for is his 6 yr daughter. If he did not have her he would have done it (Suicide). He indicated that no one could stop him. I asked what happened on the bridge. He stated he tried to walk past the officers because he wanted to go home. They grabbed on to him so he reached down to pick up the officer. He stated he use to work in a bar and that is what he did to get people out of the way. He again stated he just wanted to go home and that is where he was going.

I asked if was injured in the altercation. Mr. [REDACTED] #14 stated his shoulder hurt. I asked him about his shoulder. Mr. [REDACTED] #14 stated he had an on-the-job injury to his shoulder when he was carrying some pipes. Just before the injury was healed he was involved in a serious car accident where his shoulder was severely injured. Now his shoulder was hurting again. In talking to him about his shoulder, his shoulder had not healed from the crash. Mr. [REDACTED] #14 did not complain about the Lateral Neck Restraint. I concluded my interview with Mr. [REDACTED] #14

**Officer Interview Summary**

Officers were contacting a suicidal subject on the Sunset Bridge. The subject tried to walk away at which time they took arm control. The subject then turned toward officer Bode, reached down between his legs and started to pick him up. Seeing they were on a bridge this created grave danger putting the officers in a situation that was tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving. Corporal Ennis then placed Mr. [REDACTED] #14 in a Neck Restraint Hold for the following reasons.

Crime - Mr. [REDACTED] #14 had called 911 and stated life was not worth living and he was going to die now creating a community care taking function for Law Enforcement. Mr. [REDACTED] #14 assaulted Officer Bode when he tried to pick him up.

Threat Factor – Officers were on a bridge with a suicidal subject at night with limited lighting. Mr. [REDACTED] #14 tried to walk away from officers and was stopped in the roadway. Mr. [REDACTED] #14 grabbed on to Officer Bode's leg as if to pick him up.

Resistance – Mr. #14 had turned toward Officer Bode and reached for his leg attempting to pick him up.

Mr. #14 was rendered unconscious and placed in handcuffs by officers. Medics were summoned for him due to the altercation.

### Witness Interview Summary

There were no civilian witnesses to the incident.

### Physical Evidence

None

### Investigative Summary

There was reasonable cause to believe Mr. #14 was suicidal creating a need to take Mr. #14 into custody as an emergent detention.

(b) An emergent detention is defined as one where, as the result of a mental disorder a person presents an imminent likelihood of serious harm, or is in imminent danger because of being gravely disabled. In such cases, officers may take the subject into custody only under the following circumstances (RCW 71.05). 2. When the officer has reasonable cause to believe that the person is in need of emergent detention.

The officers detained Mr. #14. Mr. #14 assaulted Officer Bode by picking him up while they were in the roadway on a bridge creating the possibility of great bodily injury to the officers. Seeing the danger, Cpl. Ennis performed a Neck Restraint Hold to control the volatile situation under the following guidelines:

(b) The neck restraint may only be used when circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application reasonably appears necessary to control a person in any of the following circumstances:  
2. The subject, by words or actions, has demonstrated an intention to be violent and reasonably appears to have the potential to harm officers, him/herself or others.

Cpl. Ennis' actions were objectively reasonable based on the totality of the circumstances. The officers' actions were within departmental guidelines and state law.

On 060514, Corporal Ennis and I responded to the report of a suicidal male in the area of Third and Jefferson.

A male identifying himself as **#14** called 911, saying, "Life isn't worth living and I'm going to die now." While enroute, 911 received another call from his cell phone, this time they were able to place it in the area of Inland Empire and I-90. Corporal Ennis said he was going to check the Sunset Bridge and I checked W/B I-90.

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Corporal Ennis located #14 on the Sunset Bridge. It appeared #14 had been crying. His eyes were red and puffy. #14 stated he wanted to go home and feed his dog. I told him that based on his statements to 911 and the fact that we found him on the bridge i was concerned he was not thinking straight and might harm himself. #14 began crying again and said he did not want to go to Sacred Heart that he had been there before and he didn't like it. I told him we didn't have a choice. #14 stood up quickly from the concrete barrier he had been sitting on and proclaimed he was walking home. He began to walk in between Corporal Ennis and I.

Based on #14 suicidal statements to 911 and his current location on the very tall Sunset Bridge, I believed he was in imminent threat of death by his own hand if we were not to immediately take him into protective custody under our community caretaking function.

I told him to stop and grabbed ahold of his jacket near his left arm. He did not stop but instead lowered his center of gravity and reached his left arm through my legs and grabbed my left leg in what I thought was an attempt to pick me up. I told him not to grab a hold of me and placed him in a "bear hug", pinning his left arm to his body. I used my body weight to pull him to the ground. I wanted to get him on the ground as quick as possible to delay his efforts to run to the edge of the bridge.

When we came to rest on the ground, I was near #14 waist on his left side. I grabbed control of #14 left hand and told him to give me his other hand. I looked up and we were on the ground, in the lane of vehicle travel, in the dark. Although traffic was light on the bridge, we were in danger of being hit by an inattentive driver. Corporal Ennis rendered #14 unconscious and I was able to get both of his hands in handcuffs. Reference Corporal Ennis' report for more information.

SFD personnel responded and cleared #14 medically for transport to the hospital.

While in custody, #14 was complaining of shoulder pain from a pre-existing condition involving a motor vehicle accident. To make him as comfortable as possible, I used three sets of handcuffs to increase his range of motion.

I transported and released him into the custody of SHMC MHP staff.

#14 stated his dog had food and water, he was going to call his girlfriend later to take care of the dog.

I received an abrasion to my left elbow during the struggle. The injury was minor and did not require medical attention.

On 060514, at about 0240 hrs, I was dispatched, along with Officer Bode, to the area of 3rd and Jefferson for a suicidal subject. Dispatch advised that a male had called 911 and stated that "life isn't worth living and he is going to die now." Dispatch did not have an exact location for the male but cell phone information placed him in the area of 3rd and Jefferson. Dispatch was able to get the subscriber info for the phone and advised that it was registered to a male named **#14**. **#14** showed to be about 6'00" tall and 155 lbs. As I responded to the area, dispatch updated the male's location to I90 and Inland Empire. He had called again and continued to state, "that life sucks and he wants to die." When 911 attempted a call back, the male said, "he was going to die and that we don't need to know anymore."

I decided to check the Sunset Bridge because of its popularity with suicidal individuals and its proximity to I90 and Inland Empire. As I drove west onto the bridge, I saw a male about a third of the way across the bridge on the north sidewalk. When the male first saw my car approaching, he walked toward the railing at the edge of the bridge. I stopped my car about 30 feet from the male and exited my car. I called out to the male, saying "**#14**, what's going on?" The male immediately walked toward me and I could see he was sobbing. I notified dispatch that I believed I was with **#14**.

I was able to persuade **#14** to step over the concrete barrier between the road and the sidewalk and have him stand in front of my car (in the roadway). **#14** continued to sob and said he couldn't "go on any more." He was talking about a number of bad things that had happened recently, including being kicked out of his house, being in a bad car accident, having his girlfriend break up with him, and being very depressed. He did mention that it was his 33rd Birthday but continued to sob. He asked me how I knew his name because he refused to identify himself to 911.

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Officer Bode arrived and I quickly recounted what had happened and #14 depression. We told #14 he would have to go to the Hospital. He became agitated and said he did not want to go to Sacred Heart because the last time he went there, they kept him for several days and once the medication was gone, everything was bad again. I told him if he remained cooperative, we could take him to Deaconess instead. #14 did not want to go to any Hospitals and asked us to take him home instead. We both told him that based on the suicidal statements, his very apparent depression, and the fact that he was on a bridge when we contacted him, we had to take him to a Hospital. This discussion went on for a few minutes. We were able to learn that he was in a collision in April where a school bus rear ended his Ford Focus. We also learned that he had to move out of his current residence on Friday and that he had a black lab puppy in a crate back at his house. He had been drinking for his birthday and was walking home when he made the phone calls. He said he would be alright if we just took him home and let him sleep. He said he has been this way before and sleeping always helped him. While talking to us he would compose himself for a short time and then start sobbing again. We tried to get him to cooperatively go to the hospital and told him he could not go home without talking to a doctor first.

#14 said he wanted to go home, and tried to walk between Officer Bode and me into the traffic lane. There was no way we could let him go. As we told #14 to stop, Officer Bode took control of #14 left arm and I took control of his right arm. #14 immediately tensed up and tried to pull his right arm into his body hunching over slightly. He was trying to turn toward Officer Bode. I heard Officer Bode yell, "let go of my..." I wasn't able to understand what Officer Bode said #14 was grabbing.

#14 had stated that he was suicidal to 911, he continued to demonstrate being very emotionally distraught, he was on a very high bridge, he was walking into the traffic lane, he was physically now fighting with us and I was afraid he may be trying to access Officer Bode's weapon. I decided to apply a lateral neck restraint as Officer Bode grabbed #14 around his body. We tripped him forward and lowered him toward the pavement. #14 was on his stomach and I wrapped my right arm under #14 chin. I told #14 to stop fighting with us but he continued to struggle. We were now in the traffic lane and on the ground making us less visible to approaching traffic. I decided that we had to stop this struggle as fast as possible so I applied more pressure and rendered #14 unconscious with the Lateral Neck Restraint. After he was unconscious, we were able to get him handcuffed. #14 was unconscious for about 5 seconds.

#14 woke up and was disoriented. We told him he was ok and everything would be alright. He was confused as to how he had been handcuffed and had no memory of it. He told us "sorry, I kinda blanked out there for a minute." After he was stood up, Officer Bode requested medics and a supervisor for the LNR application. After being in handcuffs for a few minutes, #14 began complaining that his right shoulder was locking up and was very uncomfortable. He claimed it was related to the collision he had been involved in with the bus. He continued to complain when the medics arrived, and we eventually placed him in 3 sets of handcuffs in an attempt to alleviate the

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reported pressure in his shoulder.

Medics cleared him and he was transported to Sacred Heart Medical Center for an evaluation. Sergeant Kannberg responded to the hospital to interview #14 for a use of force report. It should be noted that while walking through the emergency room #14 was limping as if his right leg was injured as well. When we got to the room, he used the bathroom. While walking back from the bathroom, he limped as if his left leg was the injured one.
