



The new report reflects the information correctly and the TASER downloads and time sequence also support the narrative. | | Ernie Ofc Flynn's report indicates that the first application of the Taser did not make a proper connection with the suspect and appeared to have no effect on her. He then writes that she "stopped" and "looked at (him)". Subsequently he writes "the initial application and two separate attempts" appeared to be ineffective. Each and every deployment of the Taser requires independent justification for the subsequent deployments. Investigative Summary

Officer Flynn was dispatched to a possible DV at 1818 E South Riverton #B101 (see his attached report)

Based on officer Flynn's training and experience he believed that the suspect, Simpson, was an assaultive resistor (a reasonable perception that the actions of the suspect would result in an assault on an individual or officer, the scope and severity of the assault would support the reasonable assumption that the assault would not result in death or great bodily harm) and Officer Flynn deployed his TASER in dart mode. The use of a TASER in dart mode on an assaultive resistor is an objectively reasonable application of force.

The probes struck the suspect at the belt line and the middle of the chest. The chest strike was solid, however the lower probe struck the suspects belt and the TASER didn't arc past the heavy clothing and was unable to complete the circuit between the two probes.

Officer Flynn advised that due to the suspect's position and the fiancé's positions he was unable to deploy a second cartridge. He did cycle the TASER through three full cycles in hopes that the loose clothing would make a connection as the suspect moved, however the TASER probes never made a connection. (This would have been a good opportunity for a three point follow up technique; however the officer chose not to use this option)

The TASER logs show three consecutive 5 second cycles (see attached). The graphs show that on the first discharge, there was a completed circuit for approx. 1.5 seconds and then the circuit ends through the duration of the 5 second cycle. On the second and third cycles there was no connection at all (see attached TASER graphs)

Training Recommendation:

The application of force in this incident was objectively reasonable. However Officer Flynn had difficulty writing the report, which was his first TASER deployment. I would recommend that officer Flynn attend the use of force report writing class offered at the Spokane police training center by Sergeant Kendall and Lieutenant King.

I also counseled Officer Flynn on the appropriate targeting guidelines on the TASER and to avoid the "Dart to heart" area.

Use of Force analysis on Incident 14-184540

Type of forced used: Three consecutive TASER applications

Officer Involved: Officer Flynn #1165

The review of any application of force should be governed by the reasonably objective officer standard established in Graham v. Connor¹.

The Reasonably objective officer is established by a judicial model set forth in Graham that establishes that the reasonableness of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with the 20/20 vision of hindsight. With respect to a claim of excessive force, the same standard of reasonableness at the moment applies. The court went on to say that the calculus of reasonableness must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split second decisions, in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving, about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation.

The court defined the Graham Standard in relation to the application of force as,

- 1. The severity of the crime
- 2. Did the suspect pose an immediate threat
- 3. Did the suspect attempt to flee or resist
- 4. That the actions must be judged by that of a "reasonably objective officer" and without the benefit of 20/20 hindsight

The court created a judicial model to define what a reasonably objective officer is;

- 1. The officers experience
- 2. The officers training
- 3. The facts and circumstances
- 4. Was the officer operating within the law and policy and procedures

On 060914 at approx 2204 hrs Officer Flynn responded to the report of an assault at 1814 E South Riverton.

Officer Flynn is a lateral officer from Adams County Sheriff's Office. By Officer Flynn's own admission he has had very few use of force encounters, and very little experience writing use of force reports. Officer Flynn had attended the use of force report writing class during his pre FTO training held at the Spokane

Police regional training center. Officer Flynn commented that although the training in the class was very good, without having been in many use of force confrontations the material in the class was hard to place into context.

Officer Flynn arrived on scene of the alleged assault and contacted Douglas Burley who advised him that he had been assaulted by his step daughter, April Simpson, and commented that she had been drinking all day and was, "very drunk"

April Simpson is a black female, who is 5'11" tall and weighs approx 220 pounds.

While speaking to Burley, April exited the apartment carrying a duffle bag and she had a bottle of wine in her left hand. A male that was later identified as Justin Douget was leaving with April.

Officer Flynn was wearing the uniform of the day, and he told April to stop and. She refused to comply with his command and continued walking. Officer Flynn told her to stop and to a second time and to put the bottle down. April was arguing with Justin and then Officer Flynn witnessed April strike Justin with an open hand in the jaw with what he described as a glancing blow. The male turned around and began to walk back to the apartment.

Officer Flynn then describes that he gave April a third command to stop and that she was, "standing with her feet shoulder width apart, she was moving her hands up and down, her hands were fisted and her jaw was clinching.

Officer Flynn also advised that he was the only officer on scene, and that the female had been assaultive and was still exhibiting assaultive behavior², and that he requested over the radio for his back up unit to step up his response. Officer Flynn noted that he was unsure of Justin's response to the arrest of April, and that he chose to use his TASER to control April while still being able to keep an eye on Justin and other members that were still inside the apartment.

Officer Flynn deployed the TASER in dart mode. Officer Flynn wrote that when the darts impacted April, she stopped her behavior and stood motionless, and that she didn't go to the ground but just "looked forward."

According the download from the officer Flynn's TASER, the TASER was fired at 21:59:10. The TASER pulse graph log shows that the TASER registered 50-60 coulombs of energy delivered but only for approx. 1.5 seconds, after 1.5 seconds that the delivered electrical charge drops down to 0 for the remaining 3.5 seconds.

Officer Flynn wrote that when the TASER cycle stopped, that April clenched both her fist and bent her knees and continued to scream at him, he noted that he was still the only officer on the scene and that Justin was still just 50 feet away.

Officer Flynn felt that the female was still continuing her assaultive behavior and he applied a second cycle of the TASER. Officer Flynn noted that the TASER made a snapping and popping sound that made him believe that there was no contact with the dart that was tangled in the female's shirt. He noted that the second application had no effect at all and that April's behavior continued with no interruption. That her hands were fisted and she was yelling.

According the download from the officer Flynn's TASER, the TASER was fired at 21:59:17. The second TASER application was less than 2 seconds after the completion of the first 5 second cycle. The TASER pulse graph log shows that the TASER registered 0 coulombs of energy delivered, which means that there was no electrical charge being delivered to April.

Officer Flynn then advises that Justin then comes over to April, and placed one hand on her shoulder and one on her side. Officer Flynn advised that he thought that Justin would be assaulted by the female again.

Under the Graham standard of the reasonably objective officer, the officer's experience is one of the factors to be used when determining the reasonableness of a use of force. Officer Flynn's experience can also be his experience with the call, in which in this case the last time that the male had been with the female and tried to intervene that the female had assaulted the male. The female's behavior had not changed from the first moment of the encounter to the present time, which had been less than two minutes from the first encounter.

With the male's hands on the female, Officer Flynn believed that would tighten the shirt on the female and allow the TASER to work effectively. Officer Flynn believed that the female was still being assaultive and that the male's safety was in jeopardy and Officer Flynn applied a third TASER application. The TASER made the same sounds as the second application and there was no change in behavior.

According the download from the officer Flynn's TASER, the TASER was fired at 21:59:44. The third application was approximately 27 seconds from the second application. Again the TASER download logs show that no electrical current was transferred to the female.

Officer Flynn then advises that another officer arrived on scene and that they were able to take control over the female and she was placed into handcuffs. Once in handcuffs, Officer Flynn advised that the female continued to yell and scream and that she had to be physically controlled by the back-up officer.

Applying the Beaver v. Federal way standard³ that each use of force [including each CEW cycle or 5 seconds of discharge] on a person that is a 4th Amendment seizure is the application of force and must be objectively reasonable.

Was Officer Flynn's first application of the TASER objectively reasonable? Yes, in that the female was had just assaulted the male and that her behavior and indicators never ceased. The Spokane Police

Department authorizes the use of the TASER in dart mode against an assaultive resistor, and that has been found to be an objectively reasonable amount of force.

Was the second application of the TASER reasonably objective? Yes, the second application would also be reasonable objective in that the first application failed to create any change of behavior, and that the female was still assaultive and there was less than 2 seconds between the first application and the second application.

Was the third application of the TASER reasonably objective? The third application was also reasonably objective, in that the females behavior and actions had not been impeded and the additional factor of the male coming into the equation. Officer Flynn articulated that that he felt that the male would be assaulted, and that belief would be considered reasonable given that the female had assaulted the male on the last encounter less than two minutes before and that the situation had become tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

All of the logs and data taken from the TASER downloads are consistent with Officer Flynn's description of the events and the time sequence of the events

Officer Flynn admittedly wrote an incomplete report detailing the incident (. Officer Flynn wrote the report again, which was also inadequate to describe what had occurred. Officer Flynn's report (080415) was complete. As stated earlier Officer Flynn has little experience with use of force and use of force report writing.

I responded to the scene on the night of the incident and downloaded the data from the TASER, I also interviewed Officer Flynn. Officer Flynn's verbal statement was much more detailed than the original narrative, and his verbal statement was much more consistent with the report approved on 080415.

Due to the Officer Flynn's deficiency in report writing Officer Flynn was enrolled and attended the use of force report writing class again. Officer Flynn advised that he got a significant amount more out of the class after having the use of force incident and having a way of contextualizing the concept of the use of force. Officer Flynn also attended a one day reality based training class, dealing with the proper application of force under situations that are considered an open skills environment. Officer Flynn received 16 hours of additional use of force training.

CONCLUSION:

The application of force use by Officer Flynn was reasonably objective; his ability to accurately report the incident was what was hampering Officer Flynn, in addition to technical issues of the most current and accurate report not being attached to the blue team report.

On 06/09/14 at 2200 hours Officer Rodriguez and I responded to 1814 E. South Riverton #B101 Spokane WA. To investigate a reported assault between a step dad and his step daughter.

When I arrived, I contacted Douglas Burley who told me the following. He was on the sidewalk outside the apartment and was assaulted by his step daughter April Simpson. He told me she hit him two times and she went back in the apartment. He said she has been drinking a lot today and is very drunk.

While I was speaking to Douglas, April came out of the apartment followed by her boy friend Justin Douget. April had a duffel bag over her right shoulder and a handbag. In April's left hand she was carrying a large bottle of wine.

I told April to stop I needed to talk to her. April was yelling about not being able to stay in the apartment and walking s/b away from me. April's speech was slurred and loud. I could tell she was intoxicated. I told

April to put the bottle down and stop. April was 17' to 20' away from me and said she will hit me with the bottle. Justin took the bottle from April and walk towards the apartment. April was yelling at Justin about taking the bottle from her and she hit him in the jaw with an open hand. The strike glanced off of Justin and he walked away to the apartment.

I closed distance on April and told her I needed to talk to her. April was very loud and yelling about why the police were called. She was yelling at Douglas and Justin about being bitches for calling the police. I had my TASER in my left hand and told April I needed to talk to her about the assault. April told me she didn't do anything and wasn't going to talk to me. April was standing with her feet shoulder width apart. She was moving her hands up and down. April was leaning forward, yelling that she didn't do anything. April was setting her jaw and clinching her fists telling me she didn't do anything.

Based on my training and experience April was assaultive as I had just witnessed April assault Justin. I was the only Officer on scene and wasn't 100 % sure if Justin would attack me if I went hands on with April and knowing the emotionally charged events that domestic violence presents. I advised Radio for my backup Officer to step it up because of April's assaultive behavior and my fear that things were deteriorating rapidly. I was 8' to 10' from April and made the choice to use the TASER. I could control April and still keep Justin in my view without going hands on with her.

April still had her hands clenched into fist, I could see the muscles standing out on her forearms and she was gritting her teeth. I deployed the TASER and saw both darts impact her. One in her upper left chest and one near her belt line. April was standing up a small incline from me. The TASER affected April as she stopped being assaultive and stood motion less. April didn't go to the ground she just looked forward.

When the TASER cycle stopped April again continued her resistive behavior. April still had her fists clinched and was standing with her knees bent. April continued to tell me she didnt do anything and to get away from her. April was still not listening to my commands. I was still the only Officer at the scene and Justin was in the front of the apartment about 50 feet away. April still continued her resistive behavior.

I cycled the TASER a second time. The TASER made a snapping / popping sound indicating to me there was no connection with April's skin. I could see the lower dart was caught in April's Tee shirt and not making

connection with her skin.

April continued her behavior. She was yelling, "What now dude?" Justin walked up to April's side and had one hand on her shoulder and the other on her side. He was trying to calm April down. April continued her resistive behavior. I felt Justin could be assaulted again.

I thought by Justin having April by the shoulder her shirt would tighten and the TASER connection would complete the circuit with April's skin.

I applied the TASER a third time and it again made the snapping/ popping sound indicating to me there was no connection with April's skin.

Officer Rodriguez arrived and I told April she was under arrest and to put her hands behind her head. April lifted her hands and Officer Rodriguez took control of April.

Officer Rodriguez broke the copper leads of the TASER darts and escorted April to my patrol car. When we attempted to search April incident to arrest she again became resistive. April started to clinch up and attempt to twist away from us. I had April's left wrist in a goose neck and moved her arm towards her head. April stopped attempting to twist away and I let off the pressure. April calmed down and Officer Rodriguez had her sit on the push bars on the front of my car.

April was sitting there calm speaking to Officer Rodriguez when all of a sudden she started yelling at Douglas and Justin who were on the porch to the apartment. April wanted to know why she was being arrested. I again told her city assault DV. April again started to yell calling Douglas and Justin bitches for having her arrested. Officer Rodriguez and I had to hold April down until she calmed down. See Officer Rodriguez's report for details.

I spoke to Justin who told me the following. He is the boy friend of April and they have a child in common. They recently came to Spokane from Seattle and are trying to make a life here.

I asked Justin about being hit by April. He told me it was because he took the wine. April has a drinking problem and is very nice when she isn't drunk.

I asked Justin the domestic violence lethality assessment questions. Based off of Justin's answers he doesn't screen into the program. Justin was

given a Crime victim card with the case number on it.

I spoke to Douglas again. He told me he is April's step dad as he was once married to her mother.

Medics arrived and removed the one TASER probe. April was looked over and medically cleared to be booked into jail.

Sergeant Boothe arrived on scene and was briefed of the incident. See Sergeant Boothe's report for details.

Corporal Kakuda arrived and took photographs of the wine bottle, the TASER marks. He also took the TASER probes and wine bottle to property.

I took April to the Spokane County jail to be booked.

On 6/9/14 at about 2243 hrs I assisted Officer Flynn on a domestic violence report from 1814 E. South Riverton Avenue apartment B101. The complainant advised that his step daughter April Simpson was trying to assault everyone at that apartment.

While enroute to the incident I heard Officer Flynn advised to 'step it up' as he arrived onscene. I arrived on scene to the West side (Magnolia St.) of the apartment complex and first noticed Officer Flynn's patrol vehicle parked there. I pulled up ahead and noticed him standing in front of a male and female(Simpson). I could see the red laser dot on the Simpson's stomach area. As I got out of my patrol vehicle I could hear Officer Flynn yelling orders to Simpson to get on the ground. I heard her yell some profanities back to Officer Flynn. Next to the Simpson was a male standing next to her at this point I wasn't sure who he was, but it appeared as if he was possibly escalating the situation by attempting to hold on to her. I later found out it was Simpson's boyfriend. After several orders were given to Simpson to get on her knees she refused. I noticed that she placed her hands behind her neck. I grabbed onto her arms and placed her into handcuffs. Officer Flynn advised her she was under arrest. I noticed she had one taser probe near the left side belt line that was just hanging on her shirt. The other taser probe was on her left side about 8 inches above her belt line. I did not disrupt the probes and pulled off the taser wire and escorted Simpson to the front of Officer Flynn's patrol vehicle. As I escorted her to the vehicle she attempted to pull out of my grasp and yelled to the occupants of the apartment. I turned her back in the direction of the vehicle as Officer Flynn had her from the left side. At this point Simpson was very volatile velling profanities and Said, "Fuck you I can punch you right now right in the face." I advised her to calm down. Search incident to arrest I attempted to search Simpson's right front pocket and down her right pant leg. I place my foot on top of hers with minimal pressure. From my training and experience I have seen law enforcement officer's kicked while conducting a through search by not bracing the foot. She yelled for me to get off her foot I advised her I would as soon as I finished the search. All of the sudden she pulled her foot from under my foot and reared back and kicked in my directly, only slightly making contact with the tip of my front right boot and kicking the patrol vehicle tire. Officer Flynn and I had to place her upper body over the hood of the patrol vehicle to prevent a possible assault. After reasoning with her I had her calm down and had her sit on the front of the push bars. I asked her if she was hurt or injured she replied she wasn't and mentioned the problem was she had too much to drink. I noticed a large glass bottle of alcohol was nearby on the sidewalk. Through my conversation with Simpson it was obvious that she was intoxicated; her eyes were watery and bloodshot, her breath smelled of an alcoholic beverage. At one point she would be cooperative and the next she would yell profanities at the apartment occupants who were nearby. I




