



Report Narrative

On 06-18-14 at about 0103 hours, I responded to the alley south of Joseph on Stone reference a wanted male that fled from a car. Ofc. Daniel had just attempted to stop the car and the driver fled on foot.

The suspect was Christopher L. Olson, who is listed as a Repeat Offender. He had a confirmed felony DOC escape warrant where the original charge was for possession of a controlled substance w/intent to deliver. Olson has a very lengthy criminal history in Spokane and is known to run from the police whenever he has the opportunity.

I responded with K9 Leonidas "Leo". We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for over 5 1/2 years. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). I am a Master Handler with the WSPCA and a Master trainer. Leo is my second working dog in over 10 years of being a K9 handler.

I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" vehicle and wearing the uniform of the day. In addition, Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to his left side. We were clearly identifiable as police.

SPD radio assisted by quickly setting up a perimeter with additional responding officers.

I decided to track for the fleeing felon for the following reasons:

CRIME:

Felony DOC escape warrant (original charge was for possession of a controlled substance with the intent to deliver.

RESISTANCE:

The suspect was the driver of a car but then fled on foot into the dark of the night after Ofc. Daniel attempted to stop him.

THREAT:

The suspect posed an immediate threat to the community and searching officers. He was listed locally as a "Repeat Offender." In addition, he had a very lengthy criminal history, to include 1st and 2nd degree burglary, possession of stolen property, possession of stolen vehicles, and assaults. The suspect fled on foot into a dark residential neighborhood. Given his history of burglaries and thefts, he placed the nearby residents in danger. The suspect had not been searched and it was unknown if he was armed. It was unknown what his intent was or if he was planning to lay in wait for searching officers for a possible ambush situation. The alley and yards were very dark and provided countless places for him to hide. It was much safer for everyone involved to use K9 Leo.

The temperature outside was 50 degrees with a light rain and the humidity of about 93%. The wind was very low at about 3 mph. The conditions for tracking were great.

I cast Leo near the driver's door of the suspect car. Then from about 5'-10' away from the

vehicle, I yelled a K9 announcement prior to tracking. I yelled, "Attention in the area, this is the Spokane Police K9. Chris, you are being tracked by a K9, you need to give up now. When my dog finds you, he might bite you!"

There was no response and I could hear a perimeter car giving an announcement over their PA system so I began tracking for the suspect.

We worked our way E/B in the alley and Leo showed a change of behavior a short distance away, maybe 50-75' from the beginning of the track. He worked along a fence line and a garage but then crossed the alley and worked along the north side. His behavior wasn't such that I thought the suspect was extremely close nor did I have his location figured out. However, Leo worked N/B between a garage that bordered the alley and a 6' chain-linked fence. There was only about 18" between the two and the entrance was covered by heavy brush. Leo worked about 10' up the narrow way and then I heard the suspect screaming. I still couldn't see the suspect even with my flashlight illuminating the extremely dark location, the brush was too thick.

I began yelling at the suspect to show me his hands as I worked my way up to the corner of the garage. The suspect and Leo were about 10' up the small space that was very narrow and brush covered. I could then see the suspect's legs and I noticed he was kicking at Leo with his free leg. Leo had a hold of his other one. The suspect was face down with his legs towards me. Leo had control of one of his calves or ankles. The suspect yelled he was not armed and tried to show me his free hands. As soon as I could see they were free and he was cooperative, I ordered Leo to release, which he did immediately.

Leo and I backed out and Ofc. Daniel took over verbal commands and talked him out of the confined area.

The suspect was wearing shorts and bleeding slightly. I requested medics to tend to his minor injuries prior to transporting him to Deaconess hospital. They responded and wrapped up one of his lower legs.

Ofc. Daniel transported the suspect to Deaconess hospital where they treated his injuries. They were minor but both legs had contacts due too the suspect kicking at Leo after the initial contact.

The injuries consisted of some raking and a couple 1/2" punctures on his left lower leg. His right lower calf area had a couple 2" tears and another 1/2" puncture. His right ankle also had some rake marks.

Cpl. Busch took photos of the injuries.

I asked Olson if he heard me yell my K9 announcement prior to starting the track? He admitted he heard me yelling but claimed not to know what I was saying. He said he also heard "something over the loud speaker."

Olson only ran to the second yard east of Stone (2308 E. Joseph). He was about 50-75' from the car he ran from. There were also at least 3 perimeter units that gave announcements over their PA systems prior to Leo locating the suspect.

Olson was eventually booked into the SCSO jail for his felony warrant.

Sgt. Eckersley was aware of the K9 contact.

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

On 061814 at just before 0103 hrs, I was on proactive patrol in the NE quadrant of Spokane, WA. I was driving SPD patrol car #369 and wearing the SPD uniform of the day. I was driving NB on Crestline and in the process of making a left (WB) turn on to Central. I observed a white 2 door Honda Prelude EB on Central and slowing to stop for the stop sign at Crestline.

I immediately recognized the Prelude as being Angelic Cook's Prelude based on appearance and the WA lic plate of AFF3314. Recent information obtained was that Cook was dating local repeat offender Christopher L Olson (030481). I was aware that Olson had an outstanding DOC Escape warrant for his arrest.

I utilized my patrol car spotlight and illuminated the driver side window of the Prelude. I could see the left side face profile of the driver and I believed it to be Olson based on numerous contacts and prior arrests. I also could see an orange or yellow tint on the driver's hair which was also consistent with

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information that Olson had dyed his hair to aid in changing his appearance.

The Prelude made a right (SB) turn on to Crestline. I made a quick U-turn in an attempt to maintain visual contact on the Prelude as Olson typically runs for the police. I observed the Prelude accelerate quickly two blocks and make an aggressive left turn (EB) on to Joseph, failing to use a turn signal.

I accelerated quickly in an attempt to close distance on the Prelude. As I arrived at Joseph and looked to the east, I could see the Prelude already preparing to make a right (SB) turn on to Stone. I drove EB on Joseph to Stone and looked to the south where I observed the Prelude stopped at the alley. The driver's door had just opened and the male driver exited and ran EB down the alley. I drove up behind the prelude, exited my patrol car, and ran to the alley to see no signs of the driver.

I then made contact with the female who I identified as Angelic Cook. Angelic immediately confirmed that the driver was Christopher Olson. I notified SPD dispatch that I had a wanted subject run from me and requested a police perimeter to contain Olson.

I maintained my position at the alley as I awaited the arrival of K9 Ofc Hamilton. Additional units were responding to the area and giving a PA K9 announcement.

Due to being in the hours of darkness at 0103 hrs, the alley having insufficient lighting, and Olson being a known heavy Methamphetamine abuser with very unpredictable tendencies, I elected to utilize a police K9 to assist me. When he is on the run, he has shown to take desperate measures in order to avoid apprehension. I felt it was paramount to utilize a K9 to ensure the safety of citizens and responding Officers.

K9 Ofc Hamilton arrived and we began tracking Olson utilizing his K9. A short time later we located Olson hiding and were able to take him in to custody and place him under arrest. See Ofc Hamilton's report.

Due to a K9 contact, Ofc Hamilton and I requested medics respond to give Olson initial minor treatment before being transported to the Hospital for further treatment. After receiving the minor treatment, I transported Olson to Deaconess Medical Center for additional treatment and to receive the proper clearance to be booked in to Jail.

Cpl Busch responded to Deaconess and took photographs of the contact.

Olson received the Jail clearance and I then transported him to Spokane Co. Jail where he was booked on the DOC warrant.

Sgt Eckersley was aware of the incident and warrant arrest & booking.

On 06-18-14 at about 0103 hours, I responded to the alley south of Joseph on Stone reference a wanted male that fled from a car. Ofc. Daniel had just attempted to stop the car and the driver fled on foot.

The suspect was Christopher L. Olson, who is listed as a Repeat Offender. He had a confirmed felony DOC escape warrant where the original charge was for possession of a controlled substance w/intent to deliver. Olson has a very lengthy criminal history in Spokane and is known to run from the police whenever he has the opportunity.

I responded with K9 Leonidas "Leo". We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for over 5 1/2 years. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). I am a Master Handler with the WSPCA and a Master trainer. Leo is my second working dog in over 10 years of being a K9 handler.

I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" vehicle and wearing the uniform of the day. In addition, Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to his left side. We were clearly identifiable as police.

SPD radio assisted by quickly setting up a perimeter with additional responding officers.

I yelled, "Attention in the area, this is the Spokane Police K9. Chris, you are being tracked by a K9, you need to give up now. When my dog finds you, he might bite you!"

There was no response and I could hear a perimeter car giving an announcement over their PA system so I began tracking for the suspect.

We worked our way E/B in the alley and Leo showed a change of behavior a short distance away, maybe 50-75' from the beginning of the track. He worked along a fence line and a garage but then crossed the alley and worked along the north side. His behavior wasn't such that I thought the suspect was extremely close nor did I have his location figured out. However, Leo worked N/B between a garage that bordered the alley and a 6' chain-linked fence. There was only about 18" between the two and the entrance was covered by heavy brush. Leo worked about 10' up the narrow way and then I heard the suspect screaming. I still couldn't see the suspect even with my flashlight illuminating the extremely dark location, the brush was too thick.

I began yelling at the suspect to show me his hands as I worked my way up to the corner of the garage. The suspect and Leo were about 10' up the small space that was very narrow and brush covered. I could then see the suspect's legs and I noticed he was kicking at Leo with his free leg. Leo had a hold of his other one. The suspect was face down with his legs towards me. Leo had control of one of his calves or ankles. The suspect yelled he was not armed and tried to show me his free hands. As soon as I could see they were free and he was cooperative, I ordered Leo to release, which he did immediately.

Leo and I backed out and Ofc. Daniel took over verbal commands and talked him out of the confined area.

The suspect was wearing shorts and bleeding slightly. I requested medics to tend to his minor injuries prior to transporting him to Deaconess hospital. They responded and wrapped up one of his

lower legs.

Ofc. Daniel transported the suspect to Deaconess hospital where they treated his injuries. They were minor but both legs had contacts due too the suspect kicking at Leo after the initial contact.

The injuries consisted of some raking and a couple 1/2" punctures on his left lower leg. His right lower calf area had a couple 2" tears and another 1/2" puncture. His right ankle also had some rake marks.

Cpl. Busch took photos of the injuries.

I asked Olson if he heard me yell my K9 announcement prior to starting the track? He admitted he heard me yelling but claimed not to know what I was saying. He said he also heard "something over the loud speaker."

Olson only ran to the second yard east of Stone (2308 E. Joseph). He was about 50-75' from the car he ran from. There were also at least 3 perimeter units that gave announcements over their PA systems prior to Leo locating the suspect.

Olson was eventually booked into the SCSO jail for his felony warrant.
