Incident Summary

This incident began as a call for service. A subject at location was reported to police by complainant as behaving strangely with a knife. He was observed stabbing the ground, talking to himself, and waving it around then holding the knife to his own body.

Patrol Officers made contact and asked for his cooperation. He identified himself as #14 t #14 s. He refused their help and would not put the knife down. They correctly identified this as a mental crisis situation and called for additional resources, including on duty SWAT and Negotiators. SWAT being best suited to deploy multiple less-lethal options simultaneously and therefore affording the best chance of resolving the situation without the need for deadly force. Negotiators being necessary in that they are the most highly trained in dealing with crisis interventions such as this.

Negotiators worked with #14 for 5 hours without gaining any sort of dialogue or cooperation with #14. Several times during negotiations he held the knife to his own body in apparently suicidal behavior. He also reached into a bag several times against the commands of officers who feared he may introduce additional weapons.

SWAT command had clearly communicated rules of engagement to its members. It was specifically said that negotiations would continue until he surrendered. However, it was also made clear that #14 would not be allowed to move toward officers or the many civilian onlookers with the weapon. Numerous SWAT personnel were equipped with Blunt Impact Munitions delivery systems and TASER's.

At roughly 2016 hours, #14 abruptly stood up and began walking to the west still armed with the knife. This was toward civilians.

At this point SWAT operators Bode, Johnson, and Kernkamp deployed Blunt Impact Munitions.

Bode fired 2 Super Sock bean bag rounds (12 gauge) at the primary target area on the back of his legs above the knee and below the buttocks. He estimated 30 feet between them when he deployed those rounds.

Johnson deployed 3 Super Sock bean bag rounds as well. Two hit the back of #14 right leg and the third hit the front of his left leg as he turned around while being hit. These are also considered primary targets. Johnson estimated he was 23 feet away when he deployed the rounds.

Kernkamp was using a 40mm launcher loaded with 40mm eXact iMpact (sic) sponge rounds. This is the designated less-lethal blunt impact munition for that system. He fired one round which struck his right inner thigh. This is also part of the primary target area. Kernkamp estimated his distance to be 26 feet from #14 when he deployed.

At the same time SWAT Operator Brasch deployed a TASER (probes). He stated that he believed it made contact with #14 baggy sweatshirt and may have contributed to him being knocked to the ground. He estimated his distance to be about 25 feet when he deployed the TASER.

The combined effects of the TASER and the multiple Blunt Impact Munitions did knock #14 down but he did not drop the knife. As he was being hit with the munitions, SWAT TL Preuninger deployed a NFDD, commonly known as a flash bang. This was another part of the multi-force response SWAT uses in situations

such as this to disrupt the subjects thought process and gain compliance. They began to move toward him with designated arrest operators to handcuff #14.

The SWAT operators recognized that although #14 had gone down, he did not drop the knife and began pointing it toward officers.

Brasch tried another TASER cycle, but the probes did not appear to have maintained proper contact for a circuit to be achieved.

Bode fired two more bean bag rounds into #14 inner thigh from a distance of approximately 15 feet.

Johnson fired 2 more bean bag rounds and hit #14 left bicep. He estimated he was 13 feet away.

Kernkamp fired one more 40mm sponge round, but was unsure if it made contact. This was from 12 feet away.

After the second group of Blunt Impact Munitions was deployed #14 dropped the knife and surrendered. He was taken into custody without further incident. Medical care was given immediately and he was subsequently taken to Sacred Heart for a Mental Health Evaluation.

It was later discovered that #14 had a very realistic air soft pistol in the bag he kept reaching in during the incident.

This Use of Force Incident demonstrated an objectively reasonable response by several officers in a coordinated effort. Each has had extensive training to recognize and react to threats such as this without waiting for a supervisor to make a decision. This affords them the luxury of using numerous less-lethal devices and greatly increases the chances of success before lethal force would have to be used. Each officer recognized that the situation, which was stagnant for an extremely long time, suddenly changed, and became life threatening. They used the appropriate tools to safely bring the man under control with the minimum amount of force necessary. No permanent injury was inflicted and the man was not able to injure himself or the officers.

NARRATIVE

On the 13 Jun.2014 at 1503hrs Officers were called to the area of Brown/Sprague reference a male laying in the bushes holding a butcher knife while pointing it at himself. Martina at 41 W. Riverside #310 was watching the male who was later identified as **#14**. He was waving a knife around and pointing it at himself. She said he was either crying or laughing. She said it was a big butcher knife. He began stabbing the ground with the knife. Officers arrived and contained **#14**.

I arrived onscene at 1634hrs. I observed **#14** holding an approx. 6 inch blade knife. He continually waved the knife around and refused commands. I observed him scratch his head with the knife and place it against his neck and legs several times. He also pointed the knife at his stomach numerous times. We told **#14** several times he was not in trouble and to put the knife down. We told him several times we were the Spokane Police. He was given the option to have a pop, water and sandwich if he would put the knife down. He would look at us and ignore us. Twice he

At one point he ignored commands and dug in a small backpack. He had his hand in the backpack for at least 30 seconds while starring at LE. It should be noted we later located a realistic looking BB gun pistol with the orange tip cut off in the backpack.

#14 appeared to be impaired on drugs. We were told he had mental illnesses and had gone through drug treatment in the past. We were told he had schizophrenia and talked to himself and saw Goblins. He continued to talk to himself and stare at objects that were not in the area.

At this point #14 had a large knife and appeared suicidal. He made numerous actions of trying to stab himself with the knife. He had initially waved the knife around and was scarring people. #14 continually waved a knife around and refused commands by LE. He would not drop the knife. He appeared to be high on drugs and continually talked to himself. He was a danger to himself and others. He was told several times he was not allowed to leave and had to go to the hospital. As he was suicidal and had waived the knife around before being contacted by LE we could not allow him to leave the area and possibly hurt civilians. He was impaired by drugs, had mental illnesses and was suicidal with a knife. I was given command authority by Team Leader Austin we were to deploy non lethal force if #14 stood up or tried to leave to prevent him from hurting himself or others.

After several hours of numerous Hostage Negotiators talking with him he jumped up and began walking west where numerous civilians were.

I deployed three Super Sock rounds from a dedicated bean bag shotgun 23 feet from #14. Two of my rounds hit the right rear thigh as he was walking away. One round hit the front left thigh when he turned back towards us. I stopped firing as #14 fell to the ground. He rolled onto his back and I could see he was still holding the knife in his left hand. I did deploy two more rounds to his left bicep 13 feet from #14. He dropped the knife after I fired my second round.

Ofc. Everly rode with AMR to the hospital. #14 was committed to SHMC on an MHP hold.

Ofc. Everly placed the BB gun, knife, bean bag rounds, blue nose round and Taser cartridge onto property as evidence.

When I arrived I was asked to contact the original witness and get a statement.

I contacted Iribarren in her office at 41 W Riverside Suite #310 which over looks the area South of Sprague at Browne. She said she was looking out her window when she saw a male staggering thru the weeds. She said he fell down and rolled around for a few seconds. She said he then started waving a butcher type knife over his head. She said the male then rolled over on his stomach and started stabbing the ground. She said he then rolled over onto his back and grabbed the knife with both hands and held it over his throat in a manner that she thought he was about to stab himself. Iribarren said she called 911 at his point to report what she had seen. She said the male continued to wave the knife over his head and then act as if he was about to stab himself. She said she saw two people walk by on the sidewalk and the male stopped doing what he was doing and just watched the people as they walked by. She said the people never looked at the male and the male never made any type of movement toward the people. She said when police arrived the male became very lethargic in movements.

Witness Lyon and Davis heard what was going on so they looked out the window and saw the male stabbing the ground with a knife and then hold the knife over himself as if he was going to stab himself. They said he was very animated in his movements while rolling around on the ground and holding the knife over himself. They said when police arrived the male seemed to become lethargic.

I relayed the information I received from the witnesses to Lt Meidl and Sgt Keller.

I was released from the inner perimeter by Lt Meidl at about 1640 hrs.

I then moved to Riverside and Browne where i blocked all vehicular traffic from going South on Browne. I opened to roadway back up at 2110 hrs. I was then cleared to secure.

On 06-13-14 at approximately 1535 hours I was working as a Sgt. in the Spokane Violent Crimes Gang Enforcement Team. I am also assigned to SWAT as a Cadre member. I heard over the radio that officers were out with a suicidal male with a large knife at Browne and Sprague in Spokane, WA. I also heard that officers were requesting Blunt Impact Munitions at the scene.

I was close to the station so I called dispatch and advised them I would obtain a designated Blunt Impact Munitions shotgun in order to assist officers at the scene. At approximately 1535 hours I drove to the scene and contacted Lt. C. Meidl. I performed a two man loading drill with Lt. Meidl on the Blunt Impact Munitions shotgun and requested Lt. Meidl announce, "Index", over the radio to notify other officers that Blunt Impact Munitions might be deployed.

I contacted Ofc. Heuett at the scene to obtain more details on the incident. Ofc. Heuett advised the male at the scene, later identified as [REDACTED] #14 (10-17-87), reportedly threatened himself and others with the knife he was holding. Hedricks was sitting down in the grass on Burlington Northern Property behind a no trespassing sign as they were trying to talk to him. He still had a large butcher style knife in his possession and refused to drop the knife.

I observed [REDACTED] #14 sitting on the ground with a large butcher style knife in his hand. He was pointing the knife towards his thigh at one point, he pointed it towards his chest at another point, and then held it next to his right wrist. Each time it looked like he might cut or intentionally stab himself at any moment.

I requested Ofc. M. Kernkamp bring a patrol car up into the field to provide some form of cover for the patrol officers trying to deal with [REDACTED] #14. I could hear Ofc. K. Gately continually trying to talk to [REDACTED] #14 but it appeared she was having difficulty hearing him due to our location. Browne and Sprague is very busy with vehicle traffic, train traffic, and there was a large crowd that gathered in the area. All of these factors made it extremely difficult to hear and communicate with [REDACTED] #14 at times. I requested Lt. Meidl call the on duty SWAT Team members to the scene so we could utilize the teams training, experience, and equipment to assist with resolving this situation. It should be noted that this situation had the potential to be very tense, uncertain, and dangerous. This is a very busy intersection in the downtown core. I was concerned that [REDACTED] #14 could hurt himself or attempt to flee the area and could potentially pose a lethal situation to any number of

people in the surrounding area if we were not able to effectively contain / stop him.

#14 remained on the ground while officers continued their attempts to negotiate with him. #14 would move from sitting, to laying down on this side, to laying down on his back. He maintained possession of the large knife the entire time I observed him on the ground. He pointed the knife at his chest multiple times and even appeared to make a cutting motion with the knife on his right wrist. At the moment he was making these cutting motions I moved the barrel of my Blunt Impact Munitions shotgun up to the thigh area of his legs in case I needed to deploy this type of munition in an attempt to stop him from killing himself. I also announced, "Index", to the officers at the scene. However, I noticed that the movements with the knife were slow and he did not appear to be actively cutting himself at that moment. It appeared as though he was only acting like he was going to cut himself.

Based on my observations I chose not to deploy any rounds at that moment in order to allow negotiators to continue to work with #14. #14 made several more threatening moves towards different parts of his own body with the knife and each time these movements raised concerns that he may seriously injure himself with the knife. However, each time he would lower the knife back down.

Members of the SWAT Team arrived and took over positions on the inner perimeter. Over a period of hours I transitioned in and out of a Blunt Impact Munitions position with members of the team. I could hear negotiators pleading with #14 to drop the knife for hours yet he refused. Negotiators also clearly told #14 numerous times not to stand up at any point with the knife. I heard negotiators offer #14 a variety of items in an attempt to resolve the situation but he would not acknowledge them. #14 would stare at his knife and stare off into the distance at times. He appeared to be talking to his knife and laughing on numerous occasions. I could not hear or understand anything that #14 said during this incident. It appeared to me that #14 would have been able to clearly hear and understand the negotiators during the majority of the time they were speaking to him. However he continued to refuse all of their directions.

I was standing behind the contact team to the east of #14 when he chose to stand up with the knife at about 2016 hours. I don't recall which hand he had the knife in at that moment because he switched the knife back and fourth numerous times during this incident over four plus hours. Other officers were operating the Blunt Impact Munitions weapons systems at this time. I heard multiple Blunt Impact Munitions deployed as well as a distraction device. #14 appeared to go to the ground but spun back towards officers and I could see the flash of his blade near his waist band as he turned back towards our general direction in the seated position. I heard multiple Blunt Impact Munitions deployed again and I observed the knife fall on the ground. He said something to the effect of, "O.K., stop."

I moved forward with the team and assisted in grabbing control of #14 left arm as he

was moved to the prone handcuffing position. I kneeled on #14 lower back to assist in controlling his body and assisted in moving his left arm behind his back so he could be handcuffed. Officers at the scene took control of #14 and medics were immediately brought to his location once the scene was secure.

I assisted officers in measuring the approximate distances of the Blunt Impact Munition deployments while Cpl. Adams photographed the scene. I assisted in collecting the spent munitions at the scene that we could find. Ofc. Johnson took possession of the munitions in order to place them on property as evidence.

On 061314 at about 1715 hours I was called out from home to assist SWAT with a suicidal male who was refusing to drop a knife at Browne and Sprague. I arrived on scene at about 1755 hours and contacted Sgt. Kendall who advised me to have my K9 ready in case the male decided to flee on foot armed with the knife.

The male, who had been identified as [REDACTED] #14 was sitting on the ground just to the SE of Browne and Sprague. I observed the male was holding what appeared to be a 5 inch fixed blade butcher's type knife in his hand. The male was refusing to drop the knife and had made gestures to himself as if preparing to stab or cut himself. SWAT team leadership had summoned me to help contain the male in case he decided to run on foot. The area was downtown and there were lots of people around that the male could potentially harm.

I stood by with K9 Cruz behind SWAT members, keeping K9 Cruz out of the male's sight. At about 2015 hours, I observed the male stand up and heard SWAT members beginning to yell commands at the male to drop his knife and not to move. As I moved up to a position where I could deploy K9 Cruz in case the male ran, I heard numerous blunt impact munitions deployed on the male. I observed the male then fall to the ground on his side. I observed the male was still holding the knife in his left hand. I could hear other officers yelling for the male to drop the knife and he did not. I then heard more blunt impact munitions deployed and the male then threw the knife away. The male was taken into custody and he received immediate medical attention.

I did not deploy K9 Cruz on the male. See other officers' reports.

On 061314, I responded to Browne and Sprague, reference a suicidal male. The complainant, later identified as Martina, was calling from 41 W. Riverside #310. She advised that she could see a male laying in the bushes holding a butcher knife pointing it at himself. They advised that he was on southeast corner of Sprague and Browne, by the railroad tracks, just east of the big billboard signs. While enroute to the call, they then advised that the male was waving the knife around and then pointing it at himself. At different times he was crying and laughing and was wearing dark clothing with a checkered flannel shirt. He was also described as stabbing the ground with the knife.

Upon arrival, I did not observe the male, because of the tall grass growing on the hillside. I stopped my patrol vehicle at the south curb on Sprague, just east of Browne. As I crested the hill to the east of the billboards, I observed the male, later identified as [REDACTED] #14 partially laying on the ground. #14 was laying on his right side, with his head off the ground looking around and was holding a large butcher knife in his left hand. As soon as he observed me, he immediately sat up and rotated the knife in his left hand, placing the blade against the back of his forearm, in attempt to conceal the weapon.

I identified myself as the Police and told him to drop the knife. He looked at me with no response and continued to hold the knife as he looked down at it. His movements were slow and he was mumbling to himself. I asked him his name and he identified himself verbally as [REDACTED] #14. The male was wearing a flannel jacket, black shirt and gray pants. He had grass all over his clothing as if he had been laying in the tall grass for a while. He appeared to be under the influence of a narcotic, based on him not being able to focus on my verbal commands and his no responses to my questions and commands.

I asked [REDACTED] #14 several times if he was suicidal. Every time I would ask the question, he would look up towards the sky and start counting to himself or start saying letters to himself. He refused to drop the knife after several more attempts and would look past me for what appeared to be an escape route. There were several times when his eyes would get big as he was looking around and refused to answer questions.

Other Officers arrived on scene and I set up a contact team. As I was talking to him, he would lean up into a sitting position and then lay back down with his head off the ground.

Lt. Meidl and several other units arrived on scene to assist with the call.

Several times throughout the call, I attempted to talk to #14. At one point he told me to "fuck off." I offered him a cigarette, beer or food, all of which he said "no." I also threw a bottle of water to him, which he refused. At several points throughout the call, he went from a sitting position to laying down onto his side and back. He kept looking up towards the sky and mumbling to himself and talking to the butcher knife.

He was holding the knife in his left hand and pulled up his sleeve on his right cuff. He placed the knife against his right wrist and slowly started making a cutting motion against his wrist. The knife was not held hard enough against his wrist, but it appeared that he was trying to cut his wrists in attempt to harm himself. I told him several times to drop the knife and to not harm himself. He also head the knife against his chest as he looked around at all the units on scene.

At one point throughout the call, we had a friend of #14 talk to him. He still refused to place the knife on the ground.

#14 had a nylon bag sports bag sitting in front of him that he picked up and started removing the knot. I told him several times to place the bag on the ground and to not reach inside it. I also asked him to tip the bag over removing all the contents. He refused all commands and started reaching into the bag very slowly. At one point he had half his hand inside the bag as he looked around at Officer's. He then threw the bag down in front of him to the west. He later picked the bag back up the bag and started reaching inside. I again gave him verbal commands and told him to stop reaching into the bag. When he threw the bag down to the ground, I could hear what sounded like a metal object and landed as if the bag contained a heavy object.

It should be noted that it appeared #14 was suffering from a mental illness and was suicidal. He was a public safety risk in the core of Downtown Spokane and was a danger to himself, with a large butcher knife. He refused to cooperate and follow commands the entire time I was on the call.

I cleared the scene and advised Captain Cummings.

On 06/13/14 at about 1503 hrs., I responded to Browne/W. Sprague reference a possible suicidal male lying in the bushes holding a butcher knife to his chest.

City Radio advised there were numerous complainants reference a male holding a butcher knife to his chest. The male was seen either crying or laughing as he was waving the knife around, pointing it at himself, and stabbing the ground with the knife. The male was described as being a white male, 30 years old, wearing dark clothing.

The male was later identified as being [REDACTED] #14 (10/17/87). [REDACTED] #14 showed to be status "O" with a criminal history.

Upon arrival, I observed [REDACTED] #14 sitting on the S/E corner in a grassy knoll holding the knife to his stomach. Officer/SPD Negotiator K. 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MHP caseworker and she would have the most updated information. I called Berdais for follow up. Berdais informed me that #14 has been an MHP client since 2012. He was diagnosed with being a paranoid schizophrenic, he's alcohol dependant, uses drugs (methamphetamine), and has no family members listed.

Officer Gately & Sgt Waters were advised of the above information.

I was advised that #14 initially gave his name to officers but then refused any further verbal communications. One of #14 friends, Tyrone Asterino, attempted to talk with him but he didn't respond. #14 continued to laugh, smile and talk under his breath to himself.

Mental Health employee, "Mariah" responded to the scene to assist us with any information we needed to help defuse the situation and get #14 to put down the knife. Mariah advised me that #14 has been off his prescription medications since January 2014 and he's been missing his meetings. #14 admits to hearing voice in his head and seeing goblins. He often sings or counts to himself to get the voices in his head to stop talking to him.

During the standoff, I was also asked to talk with #14. During my contact with him, he never spoke to me but smiled, laughed, and spoke to himself underneath his breath. I told him that he wasn't under arrest, officers were there to help him, we didn't want him hurting himself nor did we want to hurt him.

#14 never even acknowledged that I was evening talking to him. I observed he held the knife to the back of his head, as he laid on his right side.

Officer Everly arrived and took over talking with #14. The standoff with #14 came to a conclusion after he quickly stood up with the knife in his hands and stepped towards officers. Swat Team members deployed blunt impact munitions rounds and he was detained without further incident.

On 06-13-2014 at approx. 1620 hours I responded to the area of Sprague and Brown as a member of the Spokane Police Dept SWAT team. Patrol was on scene with a male identified as #14. He was armed with a large knife and pointing it toward his chest. He was sitting in the grassy area in the southeast corner of the intersection.

Upon arrival Officer Pavlishak and I took a perimeter spot to the N/W of #14. We were approx. 30 feet from him during this time. After several hours of negotiations #14 stood up and attempted to walk away with the knife still in hand. During this time there was a crowd of citizens around watching from across the street. In addition down town Spokane is always busy with vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

Several Officer Used blunt impact munitions and #14 was taken into custody without further incident.

Officer Brasch deployed a taser. I received the Taser from him and Sgt. Gately uploaded the data from it. I received a copy of the upload and forwarded it to Sgt. Storment for the use of force report.

On 6-13-2014 at approximately 1620 hrs, I arrived on scene at Browne/Sprague to assist patrol with a suicidal male at the location who had a knife. I was assigned to the SWAT detail for the incident as part of the contact team. I observed the male refuse to converse or comply with negotiators for a few hours as he repeatedly held a 5" fixed blade knife to his chest and other parts of his body. The male also made a couple attempts to access a black bag that he had in his possession as he sat on the ground.

At one point in the incident the male went to his feet with the knife in hand. Blunt impact munitions were deployed by officers and the male dropped the knife. He was pinned to the ground with ballistic shields until I was able to step in to assist in placing handcuffs on the male by taking right arm control as he was face down. After he was cuffed he was rolled onto his right side where he was checked for any further weapons. Medics were on scene and transported the male to the hospital for treatment.

On 061314, I was on-duty as a Spokane Police Dept SWAT team member. We were at the police academy conducting training when we were called to respond to assist patrol officers out with a suicidal male armed with a knife at Sprague and Browne.

I was wearing a black BDU SWAT uniform and a black ballistic vest that says POLICE on the front, sides and back in white letters.

I observed a male later identified as #14 laying in a grassy lot on the southeast corner of Sprague and Browne. He had a large kitchen style knife with an approximately 6 inch long blade and a wooden handle. I estimate the blade to be about 1 inch wide.

There was an unmarked police Crown Victoria in the lot with other officers standing behind it using it as cover. I heard Ofc Gately and Sgt Gately taking turns talking to the male. (Both Gately's are hostage negotiators.) I took a position near the trunk of the patrol car on the driver's side. I was initially part of an apprehension team if it were necessary to take #14 into custody.

Over the next few hours, I saw #14 put the knife to his wrists, or hold it to his leg and chest. At one point he was scratching his head with the point of the knife. He was mumbling to himself and would laugh at odd times. He would stare at his reflection in the knife while laughing. I heard negotiators give him several clear commands to put the knife down, which he refused to comply with. I heard them offer #14 food, beverages, cigarettes, beer and were even going to help him get back into the House of Charity if he would put down the knife. He would not throw the knife away.

One of our SWAT squad leaders, Sgt Austin, advised Lt C. Meidl advised we were not to let #14 leave the containment area with the knife due to the proximity of innocent people in the downtown core. Based on #14 actions of laughing at himself in the knife and refusing to comply with simple commands, I believed #14 was a danger to the citizens if allowed to leave. I believed #14 would be a danger to himself as well if allowed to leave.

Several times I saw #14 attempt to smoke rolled cigarettes he made with wild grass that was growing in the area. Twice #14 reached into a small backpack he had. He was told several

times not to get into the bag but did so anyways. He had his hand in the bag for several seconds and was looking around at all the officers on the perimeter positions. He was smiling as he was looking around. The backpack was later found to contain a replica handgun. I believe #14 was contemplating pulling out the gun and forcing a suicide by cop situation.

During the drawn out incident, I rotated from the apprehension team, to operating the ballistic shield and finally manning a blunt impact munition shotgun loaded with Super Sock beanbag rounds.

At one moment, without warning, #14 stood up with the knife in his hand and refused several orders to drop the knife. I yelled at him to drop the knife. He turned to the west and began walking away. I feared #14 would hurt or could potentially take a random citizen as a hostage if he were allowed to leave. I deployed two beanbag rounds to the primary target areas on the back of Roberts legs between his buttock and knee. Both rounds impacted in the desired area. I was approximately 30 feet from #14 when I deployed the rounds. Other officers were deploying blunt impact munitions at the same time as I. A taser was used as well.

#14 fell down on his back, coming to rest on a hill that lead to the raised railroad tracks.

Several team members began to walk past me to take #14 into custody. I followed the group up toward #14. #14 swung the knife up in his right hand. He had the knife extended in his hand pointing it at officers. I took this as an immediate threat to the team members moving forward. I side stepped to the right around other officers and fired two more rounds onto the front and inside of #14 legs between his hip and knee. I was approximately 15 feet from #14 when I fired rounds three and four. Several other officers deployed a second round of blunt impact munitions. A distraction device was also deployed. #14 threw the knife away from himself and was taken into custody by the apprehension team.

I advised Sgt Keller and Sgt Preuninger of my use of force. Corp Adams responded and took photographs and measurements of my firing position.

On 061314, at 2017 hours, I was notified by Sgt. Preuninger that the SWAT Team was needed for a male armed with a knife in the downtown area.

SPD Radio advised the male was on BNSF property next to a "No Trespassing" sign and had been swinging a knife around and also holding the blade towards himself. The male was also described as stabbing the ground with the knife.

Patrol Officers had responded and were standing behind police vehicles, using them as cover and creating an area where the suspect could not rush towards them with the weapon.

I arrived and took a Taser X-2 #X290020EM from Officer Kernkamp. Being a member of CART (Chemical Agent Response Team) and SWAT, I am certified to use the X-2 Taser.

I stood next to Officer Heuett near one of the patrol vehicles. I observed several different Officers attempt to negotiate with the male, who was identified as #14

I observed that #14 did not respond to much of anything the officers were saying to him. It appeared that #14 was talking to himself and at times seemed to be singing and talking to people that only he could see.

I observed that #14 was armed with a very large, wooden handled, knife. At one point #14 picked up a black bag that was near his feet. #14 kept the knife in his left hand as he used his right hand to untie the top of the bag. #14 started to place his right hand in the bag. Officers gave commands to #14 to put the bag down and not to put his hand inside the bag.

I was concerned that #14 might try to access another type of weapon from inside the bag. #14 looked around him at all of the officers on scene and kept his hand just in the top of the bag. #14 then finally followed commands and dropped the bag, without accessing anything inside of it.

SPD Hostage Negotiators were on scene and tried to get #14 to drop the knife, but he would

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not listen to them or acknowledge them in anyway. #14 refused to put the weapon down and at times held it up to his chest, as if he was going to stab himself.

After several hours, #14 stood up suddenly and began to walk westbound towards Browne Street. During the incident there had been many bystanders watching and standing on the sidewalks in the area. I was greatly concerned that if #14 contacted anyone he might harm them with the knife.

#14 had been acting in an irrational manner and I had no idea what kind of behavior he was capable of at this time.

#14 refused to drop the knife and was walking away from officers towards an unsecure area where innocent people were located.

I announced the command of "index" so that the officers around me would know that I was deploying the Taser. I activated the Taser and placed the laser sighting system on #14 back, which is the primary and recommended targeting area.

I deployed the Taser X-2, which is equipped with 35 foot cartridges. These Tasers are carried by CART members.

The Taser appeared to make contact with #14 baggy sweatshirt. It appeared that #14 reacted to the Taser and other officers on scene deployed blunt impact munitions.-See their reports for further details.

#14 fell to the ground, but turned over and sat up while still holding onto the knife. I deployed another 5 second round of electricity through the deployed probes. It did not appear to have any effect on #14. It appears that the probes fell out of the sweatshirt when #14 fell to the ground. I switched to the second undeployed Taser cartridge, but did not pull the trigger again.

#14 finally complied with commands and dropped the knife. He was taken into custody without further incident.

A realistic looking replica BB gun type handgun was found in the bag that #14 had been opening. I thought the BB gun was real at first and could not tell it was not a firearm until it was unloaded.

I had a corporal measure the distance that #14 was at when the Taser was deployed. The distance was 25 feet. This is much further than the standard issue Taser would have been effective. Because of the 35 foot X2 Taser cartridges I was able to reach #14 and help diffuse this volatile situation.

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I gave the spent cartridge, #C61000C27, to Officer C. Johnson to be logged onto Spokane Police Property.

On 6/13/14 at 1506 hours I responded to the south east corner of Browne/Sprague to assist in units responding to male sitting in a vacant grassy area. The male, later identified as **#14** was holding a large 6" steak knife to his wrist/ and chest, threatening to harm himself.

Upon I arrival I saw that Officers were already attempting to negotiate with **#14** and have him put the knife down. He was sitting down with his legs crossed in front of him. From time to time he would reposition his body and lay out on the grassy area.

Being on the SWAT Team, I have been trained to deal with high risk situations, rescue, and resolve them without anyone being harmed, including **#14**. I am also an EMT and a SWAT Medic. Because of that, I started communicating with Officers, a safety plan, an emergency response plan, as well attempting to keep everyone involved safe, including **#14**.

Concerns that I had were the safety of **#14** the citizens that were starting to assemble all around the Police Barricade and for that of other Officers on scene. It was obvious **#14** was extremely delusional and started amusing the crowd and laughing to himself anytime the Police had to address crowds on the sidewalk.

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Sgt. Keller and I had all Officers on scene step back and ensure they were behind some form of cover. In addition Blunt Impact Munitions were given to 3 different Officers, staged at different angles. This was to ensure if #14 became mobile, and or other Officers could not see a threat from their angle. In addition ballistic shields were staged to protect Officers, and citizens nearby if #14 accessed another weapon on his persons, to include a firearm. A medic bag was also staged near Officers in case they need to respond treat #14 or others at anytime.

Hostage Negotiators repeatedly attempted to talk to #14. He would barely respond to them and continually would start talking to himself, laughing, and staring at his knife. It appeared he was very delusional. After laughing he would start talking to himself, however he was not making any sense to what he was saying.

A SWAT contingency was developed to ensure the safety of everyone involved. Our goal was to have #14 surrender, unarmed. He was not under arrest, however in his current mental state, he needed to be examined by mental health. He was a danger to himself and others if not helped.

Officers determined that #14 was not going to be allowed mobile while armed with the knife for the safety concerns of himself and the community with the large amount of people downtown on a warm Friday summer evening. A multi-force option was developed to use blunt impact munitions that included 12 gauge bean bag rounds, as well as 40mm (blunt impact munitions) blue nose sponge rounds. Both are designed to resolve scenes without having to use lethal force.

After hours of negotiations that started around 1500 hours and went until 2030 hours, lasting over 5 hours #14 was still not willing to drop the knife. He would continually hold it up to his chest and threaten to push the knife into his torso and wrist.

#14 was given clear, simple commands. Do not stand up with the knife. Drop the knife, stand up, and come and talk with Officers.

As Negotiators continued to get #14 to surrender, he refused. At approximately 2020 hours, #14 stood up while armed with the large knife and stepped forward towards Officers.

I was assigned to a 40mm Blunt Impact Munitions blue nose sponge round, standing on the north west corner of the scene. If #14 made it passed my team, he would be a direct line to innocent civilians across the street.

I fired 2 40mm blunt impact munitions, blue nose. My initial round was fired from a measured 26 feet away. This struck his right inner thigh. At the same time a flash bang and bean bag rounds were deployed at #14. He still refused to let go of the knife and was holding it in an assaultive position. I deployed a second round from a measured 12 feet away while he was still armed with a

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knife from behind a ballistic shield. The second round, in combination with the other blunt impact munitions caused him to drop the knife and surrender peacefully. Officers detained #14

KNOWN THREATS:

1. #14 was armed with a large knife capable of harming himself any anybody nearby.
2. #14 was extremely delusional and his exact mental state was unknown.
3. #14 had possession of a bag, with unknown contents.
4. It was unknown if #14 had consumed any drug or alcohol. It is not uncommon for a transient individual to have an adverse reaction to even the simplest of drugs/alcohol.
5. Numerous citizens were nearby onlooking at #14 and scene he had created. Keeping them safe was a huge concern.

CRIME/DANGER TO SELF

1. At the time of the incident there was no known crime. However, #14 was causing harm to himself, and had easy access to others nearby. He was obviously not of sound mind and the Police had an obligation to care for his own well-being. Due to the length of the situation, dehydration and exhaustion for #14 were becoming a concern.

RESISTANCE:

1. #14 refused to listen to commands.
2. #14 refused to drop the knife and walk towards Officers.
3. #14 did not accept water/food from Officers.
5. #14 continued to hold the knife up to his wrist and Chest.
6. #14 stood up, refusing to listen to commands while still armed with a knife and started to walk towards Officers.

#14 was handcuffed (DL). and patted down for weapons. in his bag was a replica pistol, similar to threat of an FN model handgun. This gun was very realistic looking and without a doubt would have made Officers fear for the lives.

He was transported via AMR to Sacred Heart Medical Center for a Mental Health Evaluation.

The scene was processed, measured, photographed and the spent casings collected for evidence.

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Cpl. Adams photographed #14 superficial skin abrasions caused by the blunt impact munitions at the hospital.

No one was hurt, and #14 was able to obtain the treatment he needed.

Sergeants Keller and Gately were advised of the call.
