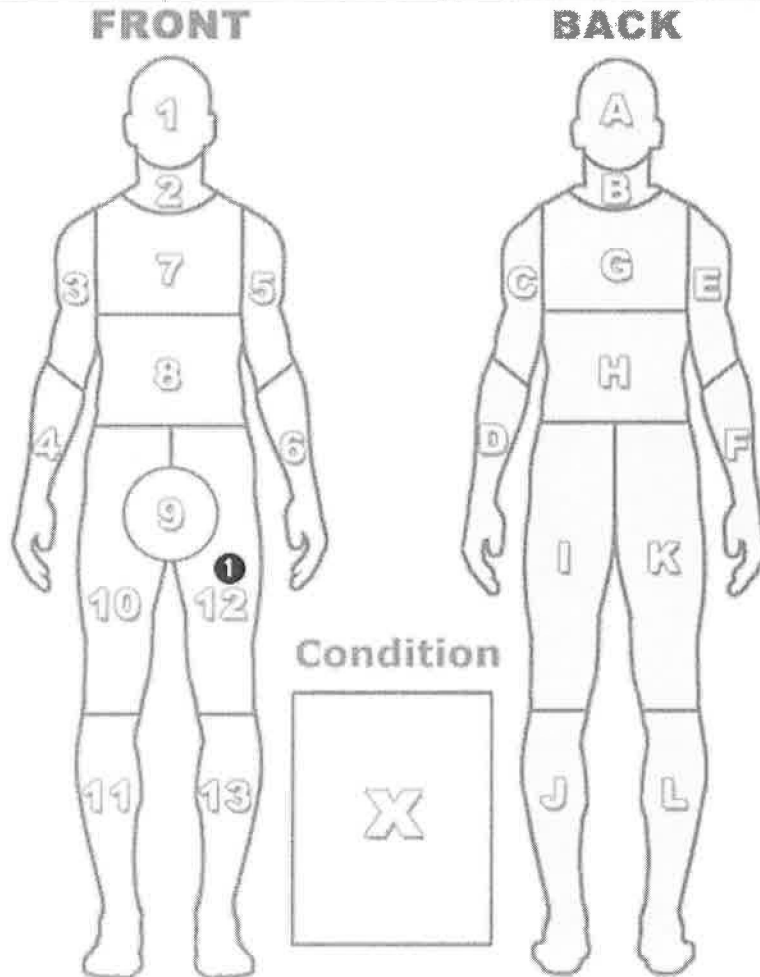

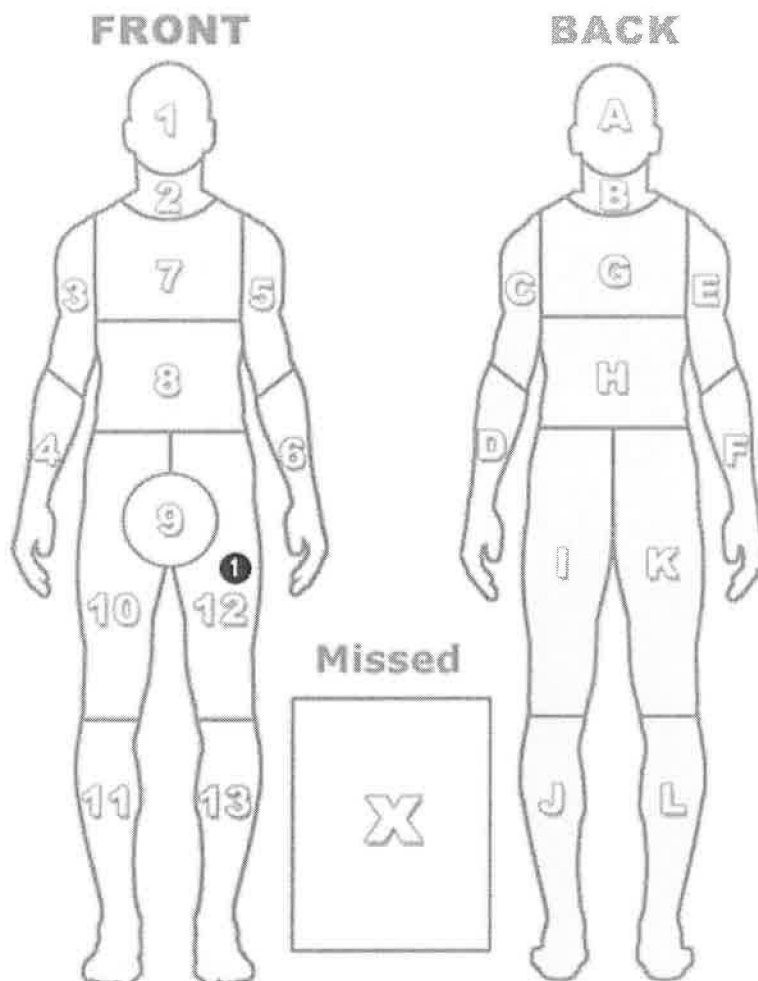

**Witness Interview Summary**

I (Sgt. Hallock) contacted Barry B. Newman regarding this use of force incident. He is a security guard with Kodiak Security and was in his car in the parking lot at 6100 N Division when this incident occurred. He gave the following account:

Newman was sitting in his car in the parking lot to the north of the Cost Plus World Market at 6100 N Division when he saw the subject ( #14 ) on the west sidewalk of Division walking back and forth. #14 had what appeared to be a large machete in his hand. He was waiving it around and yelling at passing cars. He exited his car when the first officer arrived on scene from the north. He moved further to the north so that he could see better and so he was not putting #14 between himself and the officer. He heard the officer immediately give #14 verbal commands to drop the machete. #14 refused to cooperate and continued to waive the machete around. He believed he heard #14 tell the officer to he was going to have to shoot him. Other officers arrived and they all continued to give #14 verbal commands to put the machete down. #14 continued to refuse and waive the machete around. He heard him say again, "You're going to have to shoot me." #14 was initially on the sidewalk, but as officers continued to talk to him, he stepped off the curb toward the officers. He heard what sounded like a shot and saw #14 fall to the ground and drop the machete. Initially, he thought that #14 had been shot with a pistol or rifle, but he saw #14 moving around on the ground and he did not see any blood. Officers approached quickly and placed #14 in handcuffs. He said the officers only used a cuffing technique on #14; he did not see them apply any other tactics. He saw that #14 was sitting up, talking to officers, and appeared to be completely uninjured.

I asked him about the officers' commands to #14. He said, "They'd given him more than enough chances [to drop the machete]." He concluded with saying the officers actions, in his opinion, were appropriate. He said based on #14 actions and statements, he thought the officers were going to have to use lethal force on him. He felt the officers did a great job dealing with the situation quickly so that #14 didn't put anyone else in danger.

**Physical Evidence**

- Photographs of the injury to #14 left thigh



- Spent 40mm kinetic energy round
- Measurement of 39 feet from where Ofc. Brasch deployed the 40mm round to where #14 was standing.

### Investigative Summary

After reviewing the reports from all of the officers as well as speaking briefly with #14 at the scene, I feel that the use of force by Officer Brasch was not only appropriate and effective, but very likely saved #14 life. I based that decision on the following information:

Officers responded to the area of 6100 North Division on a report of a subject, later identified as #14, walking up and down the sidewalk, waving a machete, and yelling at passing cars. While it was still early (0500 hours), the area #14 was in was near two main arterials in a commercially zoned area in the city of Spokane. There were numerous vehicles on Division, and there were civilians beginning to show up for work to businesses in the immediate area. When officers arrived, they located #14 on the west curb line of Division in the 6100 block. He had a large black machete in his hand and was waving it around in the air. Officers immediately employed the use of verbal commands in an effort to get #14 to drop the machete. #14 refused to follow directions; he repeatedly told officers that they were going to have to shoot him to get him to drop the machete. Based on the statements #14 was making, it was clear that he was a threat not only to himself, but to responding officers and citizens in the immediate area. Officers used their vehicles to block southbound traffic on Division and to create a barrier between themselves and #14. They were approximately 40 feet away from #14 while giving him verbal commands. Officers on scene had their weapons out and were using "draw and direct" techniques. Officer Brasch deployed a single shot 40mm launcher loaded with a foam rubber projectile, or BIM (Blunt Impact Munition). Officer Brasch indicated to other officers that if #14 made an attempt to aggress upon their location, he would fire a BIM at #14.

#14 continued to become more agitated and made several statements about forcing officers to shoot him. At that point, #14 stepped off the sidewalk in the direction of the officers. He had the machete raised in a threatening manner, and was refusing to follow verbal commands to drop the machete and stop. Concerned for the safety of himself and fellow officers, officer Brasch announced, "index" to the officers on scene and fired one 40mm round that struck #14 in the upper left thigh. #14 immediately dropped the machete and fell to the ground. Officers were able to approach and take control of #14 by placing him in handcuffs using a prone cuffing technique.

Once in custody, #14 was cooperative. He made several statements to myself and other officers which included the following:

"You guys did a great job keeping me alive."

"I don't normally like cops but you guys are all right."

"What will it take the next time? A gun? Next time I will make sure it works."

"Next time I'm gonna have to have a gun so you will shoot me."

"[I have] attempted suicide several times but I can't do it on my own. I am gonna have to have one of you guys take me out."

On 07/08/14 at approximately 0501 hours I responded to the area of Division/Francis to investigate a reported person with a weapon. The caller, Bill Rouso, reported that a white male wearing a red shirt and black pants was walking s/b on Division waving a machete and screaming at people.

I arrived on scene and located the male, who was later identified as **#14**. I saw that the male was holding an approximate three foot long machete type knife. **#14** was approximately 40 feet away from me when I began giving him verbal commands to drop his weapon. **#14** then began to aggress towards me, holding the machete and pointing at me. I remained behind my driver door for cover and continued to give him verbal commands. **#14** was uncooperative and refused to drop the machete. At one point he stated, "you are going to have to shoot me to get me to drop this!" **#14** was making repeated and continued statements about wanting to die and that we would have to shoot him.

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Officer Winters arrived on scene and was also giving verbal commands and was able to engage #14 in conversation.

At that point to avoid cross fire, Officer Winters and I came together in the middle of the street. #14 was approximately 40 feet away from us and still standing on the sidewalk. As more officer arrived on scene, #14 continued to yell at us to shoot him and multiple statements that he was going to die today.

Officer Brasch arrived on scene and had 40mm blue nose less lethal. He took up a position behind my lethal cover. I heard Officer Brasch make the statement that if he steps off the sidewalk he would deploy the 40mm less lethal blue nose round.

After more statements that we were going to have to shoot him, #14 stepped off the sidewalk towards our position. Officer Brasch deployed the 40mm less lethal blue nose, striking #14 in the left leg. #14 immediately dropped the machete and fell to the ground.

Lt Hendren, Officer Winters, and I approached #14 on the ground and secured him in handcuffs(dl).

After #14 was secured in handcuffs, he continued to make statements regarding suicide by cop. He stated that he takes medication at night and hopes that he does not wake up. He asked several times why we did not shoot him. He then made the statement, "next time I'm gonna have to have a gun so you will shoot me!"

Fire and paramedics arrived on scene. AMR transported him to Holy Family Hospital for a involuntary mental hold. I followed them to the hospital and completed the mental health patient report form.

At the hospital, #14 made the additional statements that he has "attempted suicide several times but can't do it on my own, I am gonna have to have one of you guys take me out!"

On 070814 at 0501 hours I responded to the area of Division and Francis regarding a report of a male walking down the street waiving a Machete. The complainant stated a male wearing a red shirt and black pants was waiving a Machete at passers by. Ofc. Chimienti arrived on scene first and located the male on the west side of Division just south of Francis. I was two blocks to the south and arrived seconds later.

Upon arrival I saw the male, who was later identified as #14 standing on the sidewalk facing Ofc. Chimienti. I saw #14 was holding a large Machete in his right hand down by his side. I stopped my patrol vehicle just south of #14 and exited the vehicle. I heard Ofc. Chimienti ordering #14 to drop the Machete but he refused. I deployed by department issued AR-15 rifle and circled to the east to Ofc. Chimienti's location.

I heard #14 yell at Ofc. Chimienti that we were going to have to shoot him. I took over verbal commands from Ofc. Chimienti and began telling #14 to drop the machete. #14 continued to refuse to drop the machete and told me he wanted to Die. #14 stated "I know how you cops are, the news says you just kill everyone." #14 then stated I was going to have to kill him. I told #14 I did not want to kill him and that I wanted to get him help.

Several other Officers arrived on scene. Ofc. Brash deployed a 40mm blue nose kinetic energy device and a plan was devised to utilize the less lethal if #14 stepped off of the curb. I saw #14 began to disengage his conversation with me. #14 then took two steps forward off of the curb and Ofc. Brash deployed the blue nose. I saw the blue nose round struck #14 causing him to drop the Machete and fall to the ground. Several Officers and I rushed up on #14 and he was detained in handcuffs.

While waiting for medics to arrive I heard #14 stated several times that we did a good job in not killing him. #14 then stated next time he was going to use a gun so that way we would have to shoot him.

#14 was transported to Holy Family Hospital for evaluation by AMR.

On 070814, at 0501 hours, I responded to the area of Francis and Division, in the City of Spokane.

SPD Radio advised that a male was seen waving a machete in the air and screaming at passing vehicles.

As I was enroute, I heard Officer Chimienti and Officer Winters had made contact with the male. The officers advised that the male was uncooperative and asked dispatch to secure the radio channel for emergency traffic only.

A short while later the officers on scene requested that their back up units, in which I was one, "step it up". This typically means that the officers are in a dangerous situation and need backup officers to respond with a code response, utilizing lights and sirens.

Because of the erratic behavior of the individual and the fact that he was armed with a weapon, I was concerned for the safety of Officer Chimienti and Officer Winters.

I arrived on scene and observed a male, who was later identified as [REDACTED] #14 standing on the sidewalk. [REDACTED] #14 was armed with a large black machete style weapon.

I observed that [REDACTED] #14 was not following commands to drop the weapon. I took a 40 mm launcher from the trunk of my patrol vehicle. This piece of equipment is used to deploy a 40 mm foam rubber projectile, or a BIM (Blunt Impact Munition).

I performed a two man loading drill and verified that all of my rounds were foam rubber projectiles.

I heard [REDACTED] #14 make a statement to us asking how many of us were going to "shoot" him. [REDACTED] #14 was still armed with the machete and was gradually making his way closer to us along the sidewalk.

This is a main arterial through the City and traffic was starting to get heavy. We had blocked off traffic coming from the north, but I was concerned not only for our safety, but for innocent citizens

I observed that directly behind #14 was a strip mall with several businesses and I was worried that people would be coming to work soon and be placed in a dangerous situation because of his actions.

#14 still refused to drop the weapon, after getting continual commands to put it on the ground. I was concerned for my safety because I did not know if #14 was trying to commit suicide by forcing us into a lethal encounter or if he planned to kill or maim us with the machete.

I informed Officers with me that if #14 stepped off of the sidewalk towards us, I was going to deploy the 40mm BIM in an attempt to end the situation quickly and hopefully without serious injury to him or us.

#14 was getting more agitated and stepped off of the sidewalk with the machete in his left hand. #14 was only about 40 feet from us and trying to close distance.

I announced "index" to the officers on scene and then deployed one 40mm foam rubber round to #14 left thigh.

#14 dropped the machete away from his body and fell to the ground. We moved forward and #14 was placed into handcuffs (double locked). I reloaded the 40mm in case another round needed to be deployed.

I heard #14 state, "What will it take next time? Have a gun?" #14 also stated, "Next time I'll make sure it works!"

I had photographs taken of the spent round and measured off the distance of the shot. The distance I was away from #14 was 39 feet.

Corporal Busch took photographs of #14 left thigh, which is where the round hit his body. #14 stated, "What did you hit me with?"

I logged the machete, the spent round and the foam munition onto Spokane Police Property.

When I arrived Lt. Hendren was already supervising the officers on scene. Officers had impact weapons deployed. The male, #14 was standing on the west sidewalk area still holding the machete. I heard him make a statement asking how many cops were going to shoot him. #14 took a step towards officers off the curbing and he was shot with the 40mm launcher with a foam rubber projectile. This dropped him to the ground and he dropped the machete. He was talking and didn't appear injured much from the rubber projectile.

The street #14 was on is the major arterial in the City of Spokane. Even at 5a there was traffic and persons had stopped to watch us. #14 actions posed a danger to officers and potentially the public if he wasn't secured quickly.

On 7/8/14 at about 0506 I responded to the area just south of Francis on Division to assist officers with a person with a weapon. Officers were dispatched on a male walking south on Division, armed with a machete, waving it around. After arriving, Officer Chimienti requested for units to "step it up" as the suspect was not being cooperative.

Upon arriving, I saw the suspect, **#14** standing on the west sidewalk of the 6100 block of North Division. I saw that he was holding a machete to his side. He appeared intoxicated or under the influence of some substance. He was not cooperative and refused to follow numerous commands to drop the weapon.

I requested for a responding officer to bring a less lethal option to the scene. Officer Brasch arrived with a 40 MM launcher and a blunt impact munition. He joined myself and Officers Winters and Chimienti, in the south bound lanes of Division. Officer Winters and Chimienti had lethal cover and Officer Chimienti was attempting to talk with **#14**.

I heard **#14** ask something to the effect of "How many of you will shoot me if I come at you?" It seemed clear that **#14** was contemplating "suicide by cop." We told him that we did not want to shoot him and continued to try and speak with him. **#14** stepped off the curb and began stepping toward us. I believed that **#14** was going to approach officers. We did have enough distance between us and him to attempt other de-escalation techniques before having to use lethal force. It was clear to me that he was going to try and force officers to shoot him. Officer Brasch made a split-second assessment and announced "index." At that moment he deployed the 40 MM round, striking the suspect in the area of his hip or leg. The impact was very effective and caused **#14** to drop his weapon and fall to the ground. We immediately rushed up and took **#14** into custody without further incident. I assisted with prone handcuffing **#14**.

Medics responded and checked **#14**. Sgt. Hallock arrived and conducted the use of force investigation.
