

### **Incident Summary**

Sqt Vigesaa stopped a stolen vehicle being driven by Ian J Anderson (dob 01/19/79), Officer Yen, Officer S Kenendy and Sqt Ervin assisted Sqt Vigesaa with the stop. Sqt Vigesaa used verbal commands to direct Anderson to be compliant. Anderson attempted to flee from Sgt Vigesaa and he was physically detained by Ofc Yen and Sgt Vigesaa. They guided Anderson to the ground to handcuff him, because he was violently resisting and his physical size. Anderson continued to physically resist and he moved his hand underneath himself near his waistband, which caused the officers concern that he might be trying to access a weapon. Sgt Ervin deployed his taser and delivered the probes to Andersons back area. The taser was activated for one cycle (5 seconds). This caused Anderson to immediately comply with the Officers directions for him to stop resisting them. Medics removed the taser probes and photos were taken of Andersons abrasions on his face caused from prone cuffing and his resisting and struggling on the ground. Sgt Ervins taser was downloaded and the printout is attached. It did not print out the graph, because of an error and this was reported to the taser instructor (Sgt Booth) and the taser may need to be replaced. The taser deployment did register though. This taser deployment was appropriate and within SPD policy given the facts and circumstances the officers knew at the time.

On 06-24-14 at about 1548hrs I was on Patrol. I observed the listed reported stolen vehicle traveling EB on Maxwell from Adams. The vehicle was being driven a WM and had two passengers with him.

I tactically followed the vehicle while waiting for assisting officers. I followed the vehicle to the back 1018 N Washington where the vehicle parked. The vehicle was parked facing the building and I pulled in behind the vehicle and blocked it from being able to back up. I was driving a Police Impala.

Assisting officers were pulling up including Ofc Yen. I was wearing the uniform of the day with a SPD Badge on the left chest and SPD Shoulder Patch.

The front female passenger later identified as Edwards was getting out of the vehicle when I pulled in behind it. I was out of my car and I identified myself as "Spokane Police" and told her to sit back down in the vehicle. Edwards still had the passenger door open and complied and sat back in the car.

The driver-Anderson then opened the drivers door and I identified myself as "Spokane Police" and told him to put his hands on the steering wheel. I had my duty weapon out at low ready when I gave the commands to the driver. I was standing about 7' away from the door and towards the rear of the car. I could see there was another rear passenger in the vehicle but couldn't see what they were doing due to the tinted windows. I gave an order of "Passengers put your hands in the air" but couldn't see if they were compliant.

The drivers door was open and I was communicating with the driver and telling him he is being detained and that it was a reported stolen vehicle he was driving. Anderson was compliant and said he was just borrowing it. I told him it would be alright and I would get his statement briefly. I knew I had Ofc Yen with me on the opposite side of the vehicle and at least one or two officers onscene or pulling up.

I told the driver to step out of the vehicle and he did. I then had him face the vehicle and side step to the back of the vehicle. The driver was compliant with my commands as he faced the vehicle,

I put my gun away in order to place handcuffs on the subject. The subject then took off running behind the vehicle and to the north right towards Ofc Yen. The suspect tried running by Ofc Yen but Ofc Yen grabbed ahold of him and held him long enough for me to run over to him and take upper body control of Anderson. Anderson was still actively resisting and trying to get away. I gave him orders to stop resisting and took him to the ground using upper body control.

I had Ofc Yen stay focused on the vehicle with 2 more suspects and unknown threats while I held the suspect on the ground. Ofc Kennedy and Sgt Ervin joined me immediately. I was holding Anderson on the ground by keeping him in a headlock pinned to the ground. Anderson was still violently trying to get up and I couldn't see where his hands were or what they were doing. I was facing WB and his body was also facing WB. I could tell Ofc Kennedy and Sgt Ervin were having difficulty getting control of his hands which made me believe the suspect could be actively trying to access a weapon he may have on his body since he hadn't been searched yet.

I was consistently giving Anderson commands to "Stop Resisting", "Relax", "You are under arrest". My head was less than a foot from his as I ordered him loudly and clearly. Anderson continued to violently resist and soon thereafter I heard the Taser and felt Andersons body tense up. I couldn't see what was happening behind me and/or when they got the handcuffs on. I was holding Anderson in place whole they tried to get handcuffs on. See Ofc Kennedy and Sgt Ervins reports for details.

Anderson was eventually handcuffed and treated by medics for the Taser application. He had a couple small abrasions on his face and forehead from me trying to hold him in place while he violently resisted.

Ofc Kennedy spoke with Anderson.

Ofc Yen spoke with Edwards.

I spoke with the rear passenger-Whiteley. Whiteley advised she didn't know anything about the vehicle and was getting a ride from Anderson.

The owner-Dugdale was called and came to the scene. Dugdale said he was surprised it was stolen due to it needing a sensor to run. The vehicle was being driven with a key that appeared to be the right key for the vehicle. Dugdale said he was having a neighbor work on his vehicle. He doesn't know where the key came from that it was being driven with. Dugdale didn't know Anderson and confirmed he didn't have permission to have his vehicle.

Anderson is listed as an Armed Career Criminal and Repeat Offender locally. He had an outstanding DOC warrant with the original charge of Possession of Stolen Vehicle. He also had a NO Bail DUI warrant. A check of Andersons driving status showed him Suspended 1st with an Ignition Interlock Required (which this stolen vehicle didn't have).

The vehicle was searched with Dugdale's consent. There were two backpacks in the trunk that Anderson claimed were his. One backpack contained clothing and one contained misc tools and vehicle keys. The keys were taken and placed on property by Ofc Cole. The two backpacks were given to Ofc Yen who was transporting Anderson to jail.

Anderson was booked on his warrants and a new charge of PSV, DWLS1st-Interlock Required and Resisting.

Cpl McCollough photographed the scene, vehicle and Anderson.

On 06-24-2014 at 1548 hrs, Sgt. Vigesaa advised over police radio he was following a stolen Green Nissan Maxima bearing MT Plate 238073A. He followed it to the area of Washington/Boone and advised the suspect had driven to the back of the businesses on the south east corner of Washington/Boone.

Upon arrival, I saw a male exit the vehicle, then run north through cars. Sgt. Vigesaa and Ofc. Yen quickly grabbed the male, after he attempted to push past Ofc. Yen. The male was later identified at lan Anderson.

lan was not obeying verbal commands and struggling against us to prevent apprehension. His legs were in a stance of balance, and he refused to place his hands behind his back. Due to the fact he just ran from a stolen car, had a DOC Escape Warrant for Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle, and was now fighting with us resisting our arrest and blatantly refusing to obey verbal commands, Sgt Ervin tased Ian in the back. This was done quickly to end the struggle, and to prevent anyone from getting hurt.

This instantly stopped the fight in lan, and he began obeying verbal commands. I was able to handcuff lan.

lan sustained minor abrasions to his eyebrow and cheek, from the struggle he continued to give us. I sat lan up and photos were taken of his minor injuries.

I read Ian his Constitutional Rights, which Ian did not want to waive.

As we were clearing the scene, Ian asked me, "what are you arresting me for?" I said, "Possession of the stolen vehicle, obviously, and your warrant".

On 6/24/14 at approximately 15:49 Sgt. Vigesaa advised that he was behind a stolen green Nissan Maxima with Montana plates. He was in the area of Howard and Maxwell headed North. Sgt. Vigesaa advised that he was going to stay off of it until he got other units in the area so they could assist and stopping it. Officer s. Kennedy and Officer Yen advised they were close. Sgt. Vigesaa advised that the vehicle was turning into the parking lot behind the businesses located on the South East corner of Boone and Washington. I turned into that location to assist.

There were three officers trying to gain control of him and he was still trying to fight and get away. I grabbed my Taser and quickly discharged it into his middle back area. As soon as this happened Anderson calmed down and allowed us to take control of both of his wrists. Officer Kennedy placed the handcuffs on him, and the fight was over.

Anderson calmed down after he was handcuffed. I had medics respond to the location to remove the probes and provide medical care. Corp. McCollough took photos of his injuries.

Injuries consisted of two Tazer probe marks on his back. One was to the left of his spine and the other was to the right. Anderson had some road rash scrapes on both sides of his face.

Officer Kennedy advised Anderson of his rights, which he did not waive. I discovered that Anderson had a DOC warrant for his arrest. I advised him of that and told him I did not understand why he was fighting so hard when it was only a DOC warrant. He said that this was his eighth violation and he was going to go back to prison for at least 2 years.

I collected the Tazer cartridge and gave it to Officer Yen to place on property. I went to the station
