### Incident Summary

CpI McCollough initiated a t/s on Wa AMH5706 which was being driven by Laine at Cedar and Cleveland. Laine told his passenger we are getting pulled over. Laine made a quick turn onto Grace from Cedar pulled over jumped out of the driver seat and ran to the front of his vehicle. Ofc Cole had pulled up in front of the suspect vehicle and Laine attempted to run around the passenger side of his vehicle. Ofc D Howe had run up on the passenger side and cut off Laine's escape route. Ofc Howe, Ofc Cole and Laine all collided on the grass parking strip. Ofc Howe's right knee inadvertently made contact with the right side of Laine's head as he was going to the ground. Laine was knocked unconscious by the inadvertent contact and being unable to catch himself his head struck the side walk causing a small abrasion the the left side of his head. Laine quickly regained consciousness and was hand cuffed.

Cpl McCollough immediately requested medics who responded and medically cleared Laine. McCollough took photos of the scene and injuries to Laine and Ofc Howe.

Witness Trujillo was a passenger in Laine's vehicle sitting in the front seat. She said Laine told her they were getting pulled over. She said he finally stopped the car quickly jumped out and tried to runaway but ran right into the officers. She said they all went to the ground and Laine hit his head on the side walk. I asked if this would have happened and if Laine had not ran from the car and she said No.

Witness Sanders was riding with Cpl McCollough. He the driver was trying to runaway when the officers ran up and they all collided and went to the ground. Ofc Howe received a small cut on his right knee when it inadvertently made contact with Laine's head. Based on the totality of the circumstances Ofc Howe and Ofc Coles actions were justified.







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On 07/13/2014 at about 1008 hours I was driving w/b past 1408 W. Euclid. I saw a white male getting into the driver's seat of a blue Ford Explorer, WA #AMH5706.

I recognized the male from several previous contacts as Jay H. Laine 04/20/2967.

A d.o.l. and name check of Laine showed he was wanted on a local misdemeanor arrest warrant and his driving status was Dwls 3rd.

The Explorer pulled away from the house and turned s/b on Cedar. I pulled behind the vehicle and activated my emergncy lights at about Cedar/Cleveland. The vehicle continued s/b on Cedar, passing several locations where the vehicle could have pulled over. I could see Laine looking at my patrol vehicle in his rear view mirror.

The Explorer then turned e/b on Grace and pulled over to the south curb line, about mid block. I saw the driver's door immediately open. Laine held up his hands briefly and then started to run away to the s/e.

Ofc. Howe was directly behind me and both of us began to chase Laine on foot. I ran towards the driver's side of Laine's vehicle, while Ofc. Howe ran around the driver's side of Laine's vehicle.

Laine cut back w/b, directly towards Ofc. Howe. Laine then held up his hands and said, ok I give up. As Ofc. Howe and I were getting close to him to take him into custody, he spun away from me and directly into Ofc. Howe. Laine collided with Ofc. Howe. Laine appeared to have lost consciousness when he collided with Ofc. Howe.

Ofc. Howe and I handcuffed Laine in the prone cuffing position and called for Medics.

Sgt. Gately responded to the scene.

Medics evaluated Laine and suggested Laine to go the hospital to be evaluated. Laine refused to be transported by ambulance.

On July 13, 2014, at about 1008 hours, I responded to the area near Cedar/Cleveland, Spokane Washington, to assist Cpl. McCollough who was making a traffic stop. Cpl. McCollough advised me that he recognized the driver the vehicle (Laine) from numerous past police contacts. He further advised that Laine had a confirmed outstanding warrant for his arrest.

I was directly behind Cpl. McCollough when he activated his emergency lights at Cleveland/Cedar. I found it odd that the driver, later id'd as Laine, passed up numerous spots that were safe to pull over. Laine continued driving southbound for approximately a block, then eastbound for about two blocks. Laine ended up stopping on Grace between Cedar and Adams.

Laine only pulled over slightly, leaving approximately 18 to 24 inches between his tire and the curb, partially blocking the street. As soon as Lane stopped, I saw the driver's door quickly open. Through my training and experience, I know that when the driver of the vehicle opens the door, when being stopped, the driver is either about to flee, or fight. In this case, Laine quickly began to flee in a South easterly direction.

Cpl. McCollough and I both gave chase. I ran on the passenger side of Laine's vehicle as Cpl. McCollough ran on the driver side. Laine ran about 20 feet and acted like he was going to give up. He put his hands toward the sky and said, "I give up!" Both Cpl. McCollough and I slowed slightly. When Laine saw us slow, he quickly took several more rapid steps, as if he was again going to flee. After the stutter steps he said again, Ok Ok, I give up". At this point, I gained ground on him. Just as I got close, he attempted to spin away from Cpl. McCollough and ducked his head down low and spun right into me, we collided.

As I was in mid-tackle, he spun his head directly into the line of my legs, and my knee struck his head. This collision was accidental. Laine appeared to have lost consciousness from the collision. He appeared to of lost consciousness for approximately 5 to 8 seconds before regaining.

Cpl. McCollough and I were able to get Laine into the prone cuffing position and get him handcuffed (dl). Due to the fact that he appeared to have in lost consciousness, I rolled him onto his side so that he could better breathe. After the collision, Laine appeared to have a cut on the top of his head from the collision. Sgt. Gately was advised of the incident and medics were called to the scene.
