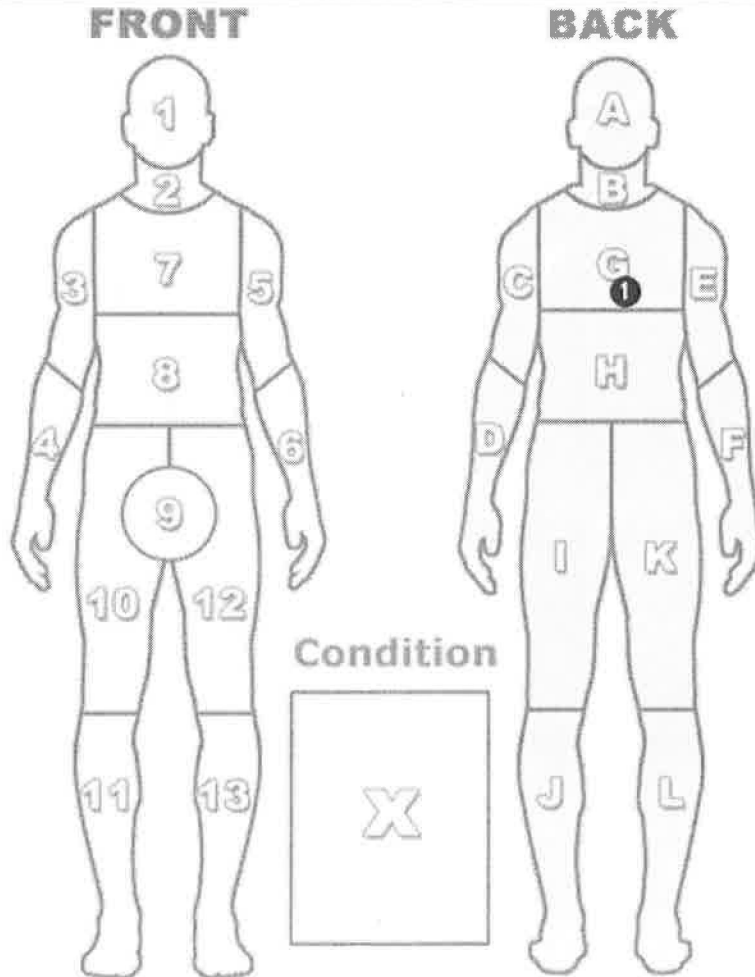

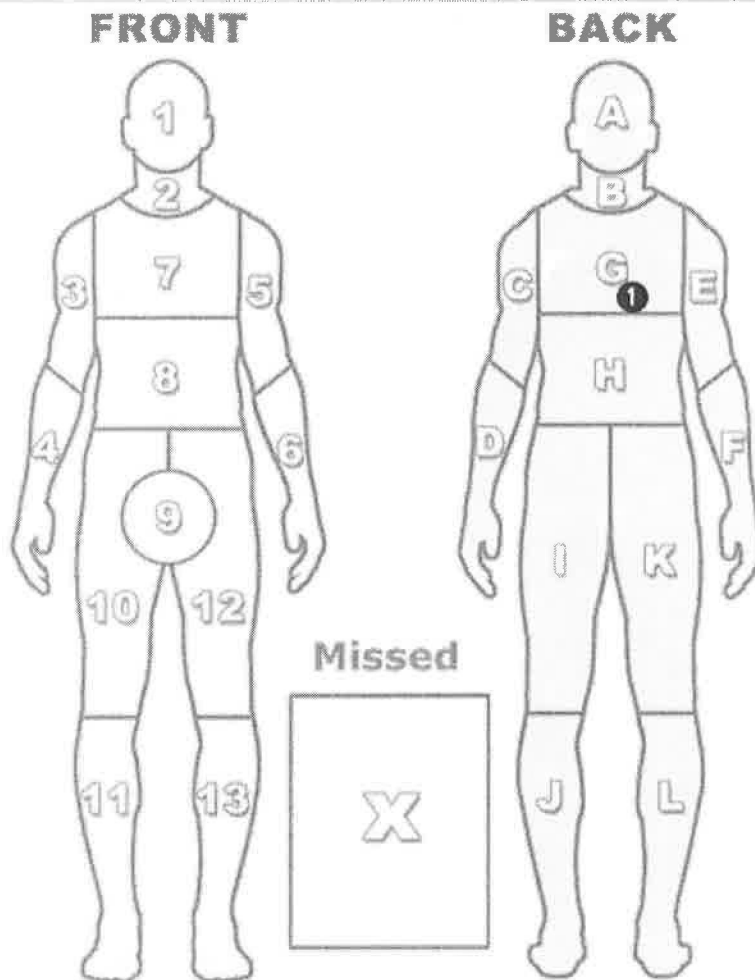

Report Narrative

On 07-13-14 at about 2102 hours, I responded to 11th and Cedar to assist Officer's Schneider and Widhalm with a resisting suspect. They had been in a physical fight with the suspect then he fled on foot and they lost sight of him.

I responded with K9 Leonidas "Leo." We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for over 5 1/2 years. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). Leo is my second working dog in 10 years of being a handler. I am also a Master Trainer with the WSPCA.

I was wearing the uniform of the day and arrived in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to the left side. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

Officer's Schneider and Widhalm told me they had probable cause to arrest the fleeing suspect for a minimum of 3rd degree assault on both of them. They did not know his identity at the time but they were responding to an argument/possible DV at 1414 W. 10th, which is where they originally contacted the suspect. I was told the suspect was only wearing pajama bottoms, no shirt or shoes. They told me the suspect had been tased but actually pulled out the probes. They last saw him running S/E at 11th and Cedar as he ran past a privacy fence on the N/E corner.

There were several other officer's in the area and a perimeter had been established. I could hear several perimeter units making verbal K9 announcements over their patrol car PA systems (according to CAD there were 9 announcements given over the PA systems prior to locating the suspect).

I decided to track for the suspect for the following reasons:

CRIME:

There was probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violet crime of 3rd degree assault (x2) against law enforcement. There was also probable cause for obstructing and resisting arrest.

RESISTANCE:

The suspect was actively resisting arrest by fleeing on foot after fighting with and assaulting the police.

THREAT:

The suspect posed an immediate threat to the searching officers. He was obviously extremely violent and not afraid to fight the police. It was likely he had just been involved in a domestic dispute as well so he was also an immediate and extreme danger to the victim. The suspect had not been searched and it was unknown if he was armed or what his intent was? The suspect's identity was unknown at the time so its likely he would have escaped if not for the use of K9 Leo, which would have given him an opportunity to return to the victim's location.

I yelled a K9 announcement prior to starting a track at 11th and Cedar. I cast Leo around the

N/E corner and we began tracking E/B along the yards. We made our way around a house and into the backyard where a resident told us she saw the suspect run through. We contained tracking E/B a couple more yards then turned N/B and crossed the alley. We worked our way up to the south side of 10th and then moved E/B again.

Leo was not showing the behavior consistent with being on a good track at this point so I was trying to see if he could pick it up again. As we walked E/B, Leo quickly dove into a thick bush that was at the N/W corner of the building at 1303 W. 10th. I heard a male scream and I pulled Leo back and yelled at the suspect to show us his hands. I couldn't see him where he was initially hiding and he was slow to crawl out but eventually did so with nothing in his hands. From how he crawled out, it looked like he was hiding on his stomach with his head towards us. This male matched the description of the fleeing suspect and the other officer's took him into custody without further incident.

I noticed the suspect was only wearing pajama pants. His face and body were extremely dirty from laying in the bushes and dirt. His chest also had numerous scratches, which appeared to be from climbing over wooden fences as he was running from the police.

The suspect was eventually identified as Bricen J. Steeneck. He was arrested for violation of a DV protection order, resisting arrest, obstructing, and the extremely violent crime of assault 3rd degree against both officers.

The spot/bush Steeneck chose to hide was very close (approx. 50') from a perimeter patrol car, which made a PA announcement from that location (10th and Adams). The patrol car also had its emergency lights activated so Steeneck had plenty of warning and opportunity to give himself up. However, he chose not to.

Ofc. Lyons transported the suspect to Deaconess Hospital so his minor injuries could be treated prior to being booked into jail.

I was at the hospital for a short time but had to leave for another call prior to Steeneck's treatment. However, I did see his injuries. They consisted of scratches on his chest, most likely from climbing over a fence without a shirt on. I saw two taser probe marks on his front torso area as well. On his back, I could see some very faint rake marks, which were consistent with a K9 contact. They were not bleeding but light pink in color, as if a very slight contact.

Photos were requested of all the visible injuries.

The suspect was acting intoxicated or high at the hospital and wasn't willing to cooperate and answer basic questions for me prior to me leaving.

Sgt. Overhoff was aware of the contact and responded to Deaconess as well.

The suspect was treated then booked into the SCSO jail on the listed charges.

On 7/13/14 at approximately 2056 hours I responded to 1414 W 10th on a report of a male and a female arguing. A complainant reported hearing a female yelling "stop" and "let go of me." The sound of someone being slapped was also reportedly heard.

Upon arrival I could hear arguing sounds of male and female voices coming from the lower apartment on the West side of the building. A window was open. I listened as a female and male argued about how he did not pick her up somewhere and how she was left on a corner standing alone.

Then Bricen Steeneck (DOB 7/20/91) opened the mini blinds on the open window and peered out at me. I said, "Police, go to the door so we can talk." Steeneck left the window. I could smell body odor and intoxicants when Steeneck was in the window.

Officer Widhalm was near the door to the lower units in the building.

Officer Widhalm directed Steeneck to talk to me. So he could contact the female half.

I asked Steeneck who the woman in his apartment was. He stated that she had left. I explained to Steeneck that I knew that she was in the apartment because I had heard them arguing. I explained to Steeneck that we shouldn't start off our conversation with him trying to lie to me and mislead me. I asked him to be honest with me from here on.

I explained that when people lie to the police its a crime because it misleads the Police and the investigations are hindered and take more time.

Clearly she had not left from the apartment. It appeared to have only one exit door and the only exterior windows would be facing me at the time.

Steeneck was wearing pajama pants and no shirt. He appeared sweaty. His eyes were watery and bloodshot. It appeared likely that he was under the influence of some intoxicant.

I asked Steeneck to walk to the front of the building. Steeneck said that he "knew the law."

I again asked him to sit on the stairs of the front of the building.

At this time Steeneck's tone of voice was defensive. He had already lied once. He appeared under the influence of intoxicants. And he was now looking me from my feet to my head, it appeared that he was sizing me up.

Steeneck sat on the middle step. I asked him the name of his girlfriend, he said, "Amanda." I asked him what her last name was? Steeneck said that he didn't know. I explained that I found that to be a bit unlikely and I explained that arguments are simply that, arguments, and not a crime. One side gets loud and another side gets louder and that why we had people calling 911. Steeneck nodded his head up and down. It appeared that he was agreeing with me.

So I asked him again what his girl friends last name was. He looked away and kind of shrugged it off. Steeneck then said, "She's not supposed to be here." I asked him what his name was. He appeared to be ignoring that question.

Steeneck then stood up. Steeneck said that he wanted a cigarette. I asked Steeneck to sit back down so we could talk.

Steeneck said, "I'm not under arrest, I can leave." I explained to Steeneck that he was being detained for an investigative detention and that he was not free to leave.

We were investigating a possible domestic violence situation, specifically a potential domestic violence assault. Steeneck had admitted that the other female party was his girlfriend. A complainant heard sounds of a slap and a female saying "let go of me." Steeneck was not willing to give either her name or his name. Steeneck's admission that his girlfriend should not be there made me suspicious that there may be a protection order between them. At this time there was reasonable suspicion that crimes of domestic violence were occurring or had occurred.

Steeneck flexed his arms and shoulders. I saw his hands close and open, making fists. Steeneck was still refusing to sit down. I recognize these as signs that Steeneck was planning on fleeing or fighting.

I asked Steeneck to sit down but he refused. I explained that I would have to put him in handcuffs if he refused to sit, and I asked him to sit again. Steeneck refused. I asked Steeneck if there was anything I could say or do that would get him to sit down? Steeneck refused.

Steeneck was standing on the middle step of a cement stairway to the building. It was a wide stairway with 4-5 steps.

I took Steeneck's right arm into right arm control. I could feel Steeneck's muscles tense and he pulled his arm to his center. I feel Steeneck beginning to turn toward me. I stepped behind him and applied a level one neck restraint. I asked Steeneck to stop. Steeneck struggled. He attempted to pull away. I felt his elbow of his right arm drive backyard into the lower portion of my vest.

I was telling Steeneck to stop moving and to "just stop." Steeneck began to breath deep and make a noise, I recognized as a noise made by someone who has likely lost consciousness. I could not see his face. He didn't go completely limp and I was able to loosen my grip and sit him down on the stair.

My right hand was by my lapel mic. I keyed the mic and asked Officer Widhalm to come around to the front of the building. Officer Widhalm was 15-20 feet away inside of a doorway but we could not see each other.

Officer Widhalm arrived as I had was attempting to guide Steeneck's hands behind his back and I was attempting to gain control by handcuffing him. Steeneck began to actively try to pull his arms and body away.

Steeneck immediately moved quickly and aggressed toward Officer Widhalm. I again applied the neck restraint. Steeneck was sweaty and gripping him was difficult.

He was trying to elbow me. He was grabbing my legs at times with his hands. He was kicking in the direction of Officer Widhalm. We were all so close together that I can only assume he struck Officer Widhalm. He sent his elbows backward, driving them into my vest at times, striking me in the chest area.

At one point I felt Steeneck's hand move my holster on my belt. I crunched down, bending my upper body toward my holster and I could feel with my elbow that it was intact and my pistol was secured in it.

I was on my back on the stairs. Steeneck was on top of me. Steeneck's chest was up.

I heard Officer Widhalm give Steeneck a warning that he would be tased if he didn't stop fighting. Steeneck didn't stop and was tased.

There was so much movement and with Steeneck on top of me I could not fully see what was happening.

The taser wasn't having the desired effect. Steeneck was slippery wet with sweat.

At one point Steeneck's girlfriend came running around to the front of the building and screamed at

us to stop. Officer Widhalm ordered her to go back to the apartment. She did back up toward the apartment and disappear from view.

Steenek continued to fight. He was told to stop by me and Officer Widhalm multiple times. I heard Officer Widhalm say, "you are under arrest, stop fighting."

I let go of Steenek to free myself from being under him, so I could retrieve my expandable baton. Steenek propelled himself, very intentionally, and he collided with Officer Widhalm and then began to run.

Officer Widhalm and I followed on foot East on 10th. I got into my car which was at that intersection. Officer Widhalm reported that he last saw Steenek East on 11th. I drove to 11th and East.

At this time there was PC to charge Steenek with Assault 3 for assaulting Officer Widhalm and me (Officer Schneider). There was also PC to charge Steenek with resisting arrest. There was also PC for obstruction for making false statements, and running from the police.

I later parked at 11th and Adams. K9 Officer Hamilton arrived. A K9 track was initiated, Steenek was located hiding under a bush at 1303 W 10th. See Officer Hamilton's report.

Upon positively identifying Steenek it was learned that he was the respondent on a domestic violence protection order protecting Jessica Deibert (DOB 6/1/91). Officer Widhalm recognized the female that he had contacted as Jessica Deibert at 1414 W 10th with Steenek. At that time there was PC to charge Steenek with Violation of a Domestic Violence Protection Order. A criminal history check was performed and no previous convictions of an order violation were found.

Officer Lyons transported Steenek to Deaconess.

I went back to 1414 W 10th. Deibert was gone. The front door to the apartment was open. The apartment was cleared to ensure that there was nobody hurt inside of it. I also located a set of keys and locked the apartment door. The keys were later returned to Steenek at jail to be placed into his property.

I met Officer Lyons at Deaconess. Steenek had been read his rights and agreed to talk to Officers. Steenek admitted that Deibert was at his apartment to pick up baby clothes. She was mad about some text messages on his phone. He also was supposed to have picked her up on a street corner but he drove past her in.

Steenek was medically cleared for jail. I asked Steenek why he kept fighting with Officers even after being tased. Steenek responded, "it hurt," "so I grabbed one Officer." I said well you grabbed me and elbowed me and kicked another Officer. Steenek responded, "well you probably deserved

On 071314 at approximately 2107 hours, I responded to the area of 1414 W. 10th to assist Officers who had been in a fight with a suspect and were now in foot pursuit.

Upon arrival I assisted with the perimeter while they conducted a K9 track. Officers advised that they had taken the suspect into custody at 1303 W. 10th.

I responded to 1303 W. 10th and placed the suspect, who identified himself as Bricen J. Steeneck in the back of my patrol vehicle.

Once in the back of my patrol vehicle I read Bricen his constitutional rights, which he waived. I asked Bricen what had happened and he told me the following: Someone knocked on his door so he turned up the music. He finally opened the door and the Police had him come outside and sit down. He stated that he wanted a cigarette so he got up and the Officer attacked him. Bricen advised that he ran because he was being tased.

A name check of Bricen showed that he was the respondent on a protection order protecting Jessica N. Deibert. Using a ruse, I advised Bricen that we were talking to Jessica at his apartment and asked what their argument was about. Bricen advised that Jessica came over to get clothes for their child and that when she began to yell at him he turned up the music and got in the shower. Once Bricen realized what he had said, he changed his story and stated that he didn't know who was there.

I transported Bricen to Deaconess Hospital to be medically cleared to be booked into Jail. As we waited, Bricen made a comment about grabbing one of the Officers during the fight. Ofc. Schneider told Bricen that he had elbowed him and kicked Ofc. Widhalm and Bricen stated that he did because they deserved it. Bricen was cleared to be booked into Jail and Ofc. Schneider took custody of him.

On 071314 at approximately 2050hrs, I was dispatched to 1414 W 10th Ave Apt #7 on a report of a female in the apartment being heard saying, "let go of me," and "stop." The complainant, Mary Tracey also reported that it sounded like someone got slapped.

Officer Schneider and I arrived at approximately 2057hrs. We were both in Spokane Police jumpsuit uniform complete with department issued badge, patches, name tag, duty gear, etc. When we walked up to 1414 W 10th I heard a male and female yelling inside apartment #7. I heard the female yell, "I'm going to call the police." The male yelled back, "Go ahead and call the police." Officer Schneider yelled into the open window identifying himself and told the occupants to come out. I was standing by the front door to the apartment and saw a male, later identified as Bricen Steeneck, exit. I told him to go talk to Officer Schneider at the front of the house while I spoke to the female inside. He replied that there was no one inside and the female had left. This was not the case because I was able to see the front door and all the windows to the apartment from the time I heard the male and female inside, to the time Bricen came outside.

I knocked repeatedly on the door to the apartment but no one answered. I also repeatedly told the female inside that I was a police officer and that I wanted to check on her welfare. The female would not come to the door. I then heard Officer Schneider call for me to come back to his location. His voice sounded stressed, which was unusual. When I came around the corner of the house I observed Bricen on top of Officer Schneider and they were both laying on their backs on the front stairs. It appeared that Officer Schneider was trying to restrain Bricen but Bricen was resisting and assaulting Officer Schneider by hitting him in the chest with his elbow. Officer Schneider was telling Bricen to stop resisting but Bricen refused.

Bricen started grabbing onto Officer Schneider's arms and I tried to approach Bricen to take control of his arm but he made a kicking motion towards me. I then drew my taser and took the cartridge off. I told Bricen he was under arrest and ordered him to stop resisting or he would be tased. My hope was that he would comply and the incident would end peacefully. Instead, Bricen immediately arched his back tried to break free. Bricen was yelling and grunting throughout.

At that time I had the following information:

1. We were at the residence on a report of a possible assault and knew Bricen and a female were

involved. This made this incident a likely Domestic Violence situation which are historically one of the most dangerous situations for law enforcement.

2. Bricen was actively resisting and assaulting officers who were lawfully detaining him as a suspect.
3. Bricen and his residence had not been searched so he could have weapons on him or easily accessible in his apartment that he could retrieve and harm officers and citizen if he was not controlled.

Based on this information I applied a "drive stun" on Bricen's upper body with the intended target of his left shoulder blade. I targeted this area because he currently was using this hand to grab onto Officer Schneider. Bricen started violently moving around before I made contact it looked like the taser contacted somewhere around his upper left shoulder. This did not have any effect on Bricen's demeanor and instead it only seemed to make him more determined to fight. He continued to violently move around and then he started kicking at me. I tried a few more times to get a good contact drive stun on Bricen but was unable to keep contact. Bricen was moving around so violently that he nearly knocked the taser out of my hand multiple times.

I then put my cartridge back on the Taser and ordered Bricen again to stop or I would tase him with the darts. Sometime about this point a female came running from the area of apartment #7. She ran towards us, yelling for us to stop. She said Bricen was only trying to protect her. The female, later identified as Jessica Deibert tried to get in between us but I told her to get back. She continued to stay right at my back yelling at us. I had to split my attention between not allowing her to attack me and the process I had already started of deploying the taser.

Bricen continued to kick at me and try to break free from Officer Schneider. It was apparent that he intended to continue assaulting us and was not going to give up. I was unable to get close enough to Bricen to get any kind of physical control without the high possibility of being kicked in the head. The only target I had on Bricen was his chest. This is not a preferable target but it was all I had and Officer Schneider was trapped behind Bricen so I had to use caution not to inadvertently hit the officer with the taser.

This was a rapidly evolving and tense situation forcing me to rely on my training and experience. I felt the safest way to attempt to end the incident with the least amount of force was to deploy the taser darts on Bricen. We were also just informed at our department roll call the previous day that a recent Department of Justice report to Spokane Police leaders outlined that they thought Spokane Police Officers "Got physical" with suspects more often than most departments. We were told the DOJ thought that might be because other departments used tasers more often than our department to end situations quickly.

I took a couple steps back to get some distance for a safe dart deployment. I deployed the darts

from about four feet away and I saw both darts hit Bricen on the chest. I let the taser complete its 5 second cycle. The taser had little effect on Bricen and he only more violently trashed around. Bricen repeatedly kicked at me and tried to pull the taser darts out of his chest. I pulled the trigger again to give another 5 second burst but that had very little effect as well and Bricen continued to be resistive and assaultive. Since the taser darts alone weren't working I tried to extend the distance of the effectiveness by pressing the taser body contacts against Bricen's leg as I have been taught in training. This also had little effect and I couldn't keep contact on Bricen because he was kicking so violently. Bricen kicked me in my legs a few times and my right hand multiple times. I tried another activation but started to lose my grip of the taser so I turned it off.

Since the taser wasn't working and Bricen was still kicking me, I performed a leg strike to his leg as he was in the process of kicking me. This also did not stop Bricen from fighting but deflected his kick. Bricen was able to get up and push me backwards as he ran out into the street. He was not wearing a shirt and was very sweaty so I couldn't hold onto him. I chased Bricen on foot as he ran east on 10th Ave and then south on Cedar St. He then ran east on 11th. I found a female at 11th/Cedar who told me Bricen ran through her back yard and back out onto 11th.

We set up a perimeter and a K-9 responded. The dog tracked Bricen to 10th/Adams where he was located hiding under a bush. We ordered him out and onto the ground. He did so and we attempted to take him into custody but then he tried to pull his left arm under his body as I took hold of it. I pulled it out from under him and held his arm until Officer Schneider was able to handcuff him. I looked for injuries on and for the taser darts on Bricen but no longer had the darts in his chest. He had scratches on his chest and red marks where the taser darts contacted. The scratches likely occurred when I was attempting the drive stuns and he trashed around. Bricen was then transported by another officer to the Hospital for evaluation.

I returned to 1414 W 10th and retrieved the taser cartridge that I dropped in the street as I chased Bricen. I also recovered the remaining wires, cartridge doors, and a couple ID tags from the taser. I booked these items on police property as evidence. Sgt. McNab downloaded my taser information.

I was informed that Bricen was restrained from being around Jessica by court order. Jessica had left the scene by the time I got back after taking Bricen into custody. I looked at a booking photo of Jessica and confirmed that she was the female who tried to intervene when we were dealing with Bricen.

I had attempted to make contact at apartment #7 but could not get an answer at the door. I was then contacted by a female identified as Mary Tracey. Tracey advised the female from the location left just.

Tracey advised she was the complainant and had called 911. She lives at 1418 W. 10th. Her apartment faces the East so she is able to see and hear much of what goes on at 1414 W. 10th. She heard arguing coming from either apartment #7 or #6 (they are two apartments next to each other on the side of the main apartment complex). She heard a female stating "let go of me" and yelling to "get off of me." She heard what sounded like slap noises and arguing and screaming coming from within the apartment. She stated they were also arguing about people not being somewhere when they said they would be. Tracey called police.

Tracey heard police arrive and could hear officers at the door, asking for the woman to come outside and speak with them. She heard the male subject from the apartment state he was the only one home and they had a conversation about the arguing being heard. Tracey heard one of the officers walk to the front of the apartment complex with the male subject from the house while the second officers continued to try and ask the female from the apartment to come speak to them so

they could check on her welfare.

Tracey then heard the female subject screaming and a tazer sound. Tracey looked out her window, which is directly to the West of the front porch of 1414 W. 10th. She stated she saw one of the officers either sitting on the front steps or had fallen on the front steps of the location. The male subject was also sitting on the front steps of the location just lower than the officer. The male subject and the officer on the steps began "scuffling" and a the second police officer was standing in front of the steps, with a tazer. Tracey heard the Tazer activate again then saw the male subject flailing his arms and stated it appeared as if he "almost looked like he flew off the stairs" and tried to kick the officer with the Tazer. The officer standing with the Tazer then kicked at the subject who had tried to kick him stating "a kick to try to get him down to the ground. Try to subdue him". At this point the male subject from the apartment ran off and the officers ran after him. The female from the apartment was on the phone yelling that police were trying to kill him, then left the area. She believed the female subject was picked up in a vehicle.

Tracey described the female as W/F 5'5, "curvy" and pale blonde hair, wearing dark purple top. She stated the female is at the apartment about once a week and they constantly argue.

Tracey described the male as W/M 5'7, stalky, brown hair, early 30's late 20's, wearing dark colored shorts and a jersey top.

On 07-13-14 at about 2102 hours, I responded to 11th and Cedar to assist Officer's Schneider and Widhalm with a resisting suspect. They had been in a physical fight with the suspect then he fled on foot and they lost sight of him.

I responded with K9 Leonidas "Leo." We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for over 5 1/2 years. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). Leo is my second working dog in 10 years of being a handler. I am also a Master Trainer with the WSPCA.

I was wearing the uniform of the day and arrived in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to the left side. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

Officer's Schneider and Widhalm told me they had probable cause to arrest the fleeing suspect for a minimum of 3rd degree assault on both of them. They did not know his identity at the time but they were responding to an argument/possible DV at 1414 W. 10th, which is where they originally contacted the suspect. I was told the suspect was only wearing pajama bottoms, no shirt or shoes. They told me the suspect had been tased but actually pulled out the probes. They last saw him running S/E at 11th and Cedar as he ran past a privacy fence on the N/E corner.

There were several other officer's in the area and a perimeter had been established. I could hear several perimeter units making verbal K9 announcements over their patrol car PA systems (according to CAD there were 9 announcements given over the PA systems prior to locating the suspect).

I decided to track for the suspect for the following reasons:

CRIME:

There was probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violet crime of 3rd degree assault (x2) against law enforcement. There was also probable cause for obstructing and resisting arrest.

RESISTANCE:

The suspect was actively resisting arrest by fleeing on foot after fighting with and assaulting the

THREAT:

The suspect posed an immediate threat to the searching officers. He was obviously extremely violent and not afraid to fight the police. It was likely he had just been involved in a domestic dispute as well so he was also an immediate and extreme danger to the victim. The suspect had not been searched and it was unknown if he was armed or what his intent was? The suspect's identity was unknown at the time so its likely he would have escaped if not for the use of K9 Leo, which would have given him an opportunity to return to the victim's location.

I yelled a K9 announcement prior to starting a track at 11th and Cedar. I cast Leo around the N/E corner and we began tracking E/B along the yards. We made our way around a house and into the backyard where a resident told us she saw the suspect run through. We contained tracking E/B a couple more yards then turned N/B and crossed the alley. We worked our way up to the south side of 10th and then moved E/B again.

Leo was not showing the behavior consistent with being on a good track at this point so I was trying to see if he could pick it up again. As we walked E/B, Leo quickly dove into a thick bush that was at the N/W corner of the building at 1303 W. 10th. I heard a male scream and I pulled Leo back and yelled at the suspect to show us his hands. I couldn't see him where he was initially hiding and he was slow to crawl out but eventually did so with nothing in his hands. From how he crawled out, it looked like he was hiding on his stomach with his head towards us. This male matched the description of the fleeing suspect and the other officer's took him into custody without further incident.

I noticed the suspect was only wearing pajama pants. His face and body were extremely dirty from laying in the bushes and dirt. His chest also had numerous scratches, which appeared to be from climbing over wooden fences as he was running from the police.

The suspect was eventually identified as Bricen J. Steeneck. He was arrested for violation of a DV protection order, resisting arrest, obstructing, and the extremely violent crime of assault 3rd degree against both officers.

The spot/bush Steeneck chose to hide was very close (approx. 50') from a perimeter patrol car, which made a PA announcement from that location (10th and Adams). The patrol car also had its emergency lights activated so Steeneck had plenty of warning and opportunity to give himself up. However, he chose not to.

Ofc. Lyons transported the suspect to Deaconess Hospital so his minor injuries could be treated prior to being booked into jail.

I was at the hospital for a short time but had to leave for another call prior to Steeneck's treatment. However, I did see his injuries. They consisted of scratches on his chest, most likely from climbing over a fence without a shirt on. I saw two taser probe marks on his front torso area as well. On his back, I could see some very faint rake marks, which were consistent with a K9 contact. They were not bleeding but light pink in color, as if a very slight contact.

Photos were requested of all the visible injuries.

The suspect was acting intoxicated or high at the hospital and wasn't willing to cooperate and answer basic questions for me prior to me leaving.

Sgt. Overhoff was aware of the contact and responded to Deaconess as well.

The suspect was treated then booked into the SCSO jail on the listed charges.
