Incident Summary

Police were called by a resident of 1814 W. Gardner after he saw an unfamiliar van parked in his driveway. Inside he saw a woman who was asleep and holding what he believed was a handgun.

Officers tactically deployed using police cars for cover. The woman, who appeared to be alone, was awakened by use of siren/air horn/P.A. announcements. She did not immediately follow directions and was moving about inside the vehicle. Other officers viewing from a different direction saw that she had an object in one hand. We were concerned that she might be under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. Additionally her van was facing the triplex of which at least one unit was occupied. Several neighbors had exited their homes to see what was going on and pedestrians were present in the area.

For his safety and that of the other officers and civilians, Ofc. Wilkinson raised his patrol rifle from low ready and pointed it at the head rest behind the woman. He returned the rifle to low ready once the woman exited the van and her hands were seen to be empty. (She had been holding a cell phone which she dropped).

This use of force was justified and within policy.

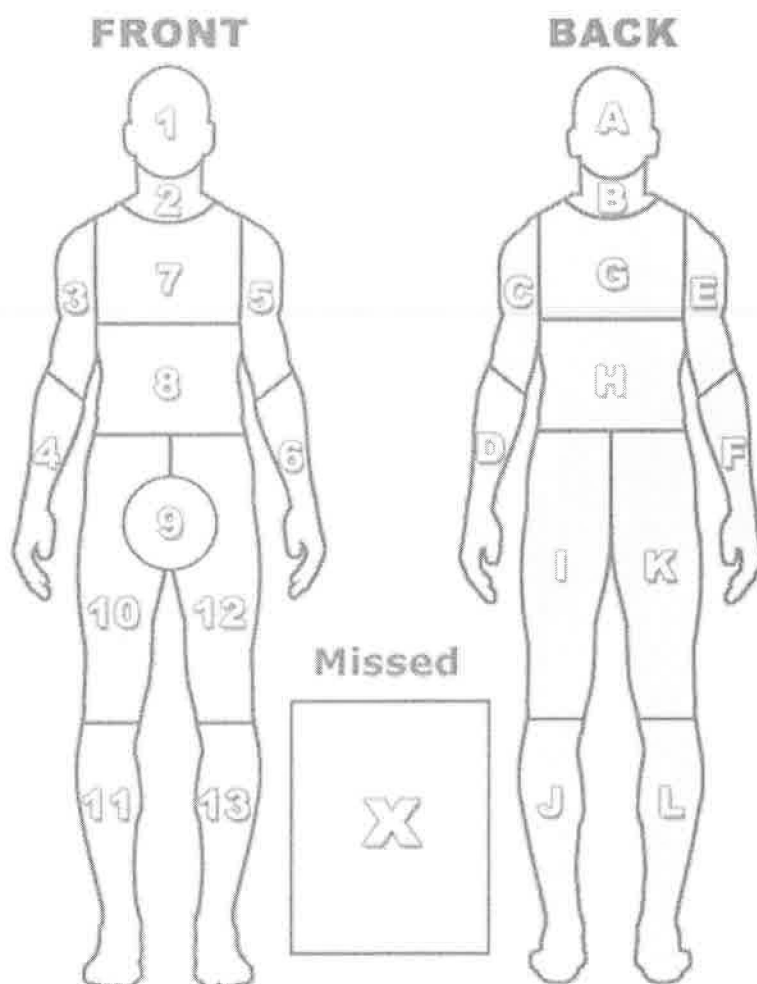

Dispatch advised she had a DOC warrant which was confirmed. She was placed into custody for her warrant. Patricia asked us to get her purse out of the van to take with her to jail. We told her we had to search the purse if we were going to bring it with us. While searching the purse, I located two small clear plastic containers. One had a small trace amount of white powdery residue inside which appeared to be methamphetamine based on my training and experience. The other had a trace amount of brown sticky residue which appeared to be heroin residue.

I later field tested the substance beleived to be methamphetamine and it tested presumptive positive for amphetamine. Officer Lynch later booked both containers in as evidece.

I spoke with Patricia Ford who told me the following:

She just purchased heroin from Allen Murch (06/17/70). He just received a new shipment of heroin. He just purchased 2 oz of heroin. He has been buying it from a male named "Jones." "Jones" is a bald white male that is 35-37 years old. He drives nice vehicles and just purchased a residence in Medical Lake. One of his vehicles is a silver Camaro.

She was at Murch's last night and he is keeping his heroin in the drawer next to his side of the bed. The drugs are in the drawer in a baggie. He is currently living at 1310 E. Boone.

You enter through the front man door that faces Boone. If you walk in the front door you go in the 2nd door on your left (would be to the west). The first door to the left after entering the front door does not open.

Murch is living with Nicole who is a 21-23 year old white female. He has been driving rental cars and parking them in the back of the location. She advised it is always, "the nicest vehicle there." She just purchased 3 oz of heroin from Murch. She advised several other people pitched in on it and mostly funded the purchase.

Dwayne Runge (11/17/69) and his girlfriend Karen funded most of the purchase. Dwayne's sister Charla also helped fund the purchase. Murch is currently selling 3/4 of an oz for \$475. An unknown female Beth also helped pay for the heroin.

Runge lives on the park near Broadway and Cannon. Patricia can be reached on her cell at 919-6469.

Ford was booked on her warrant.

On Thursday July 24, 2014 at 2005 hours I responded to the report of a person with a weapon at 1814 W. Gardner. The complainant reported that there was a female sitting in a parked van holding a firearm in her lap.

When I arrived on scene I deployed my AR -15 long rifle due to the nature of the call. I took up a defensive position behind a parked vehicle behind the suspect's van. Another officer on scene advised over the police radio that the female sitting in the driver's seat was slumped over and leaning against the steering wheel of the vehicle. This led me to believe that the occupant of the vehicle might be under the influence of either drugs or alcohol. Through my training and experience as a patrol I know that people under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol can have impaired decision making skills. Other officers began using the PA system of a Patrol Vehicle to give the suspect verbal commands. The Verbal Announcements advised the suspect to put her hands outside the vehicle. The subject made initial made no movement to comply with the verbal announcements. After several minutes of verbal announcements I observed the female in the driver's seat of the vehicle begin moving things around inside the cab of the vehicle. She also made a movement to look behind the vehicle. The movements inside the vehicle raised my level of concern because the subject was not complying with the verbal commands. Based on her movements inside the vehicle and the report made by the complainant I feared that the driver of the vehicle was planning on firing her weapon at either me or other officers that had deployed just to the west of my position. At this point I raised my rifle and pointed at the head rest of the driver's seat. I chose this target because it was the only visible part of the driver I had a clean line of sight from my position. The back doors of the van were partially obstructing my view of the driver. While my rifle was pointed in at the target the safety was always in the safe position.

The subject complied with the verbal commands of the officer's on scene and was taken into custody without further incident. I then assisted other officer's in conducting a PAT frisk of the vehicle. A cigarette lighter that was shaped like a small pistol was discovered near the driver's seat. No other firearm was discovered in the vehicle.
