### Incident Summary

---

The suspect, Matthew Peterson, was barricaded in a room in his house. He had confirmed warrants and had been involved in an earlier assault with a neighbor. He was given several verbal commands which he refused to comply with. After Officers forced the door open he aggressively advanced on them in an assaultive manner and Ofc. Childress deployed his taser. Peterson was taken into custody for his warrants. Medics were staged in the area and removed the taser probes. Peterson was then taken to the hospital to be treated for his injuries from the earlier assault. He told me that he did not have any injuries other than where the taser probes made contact and the laceration on his head from the earlier assault.

**GRAHAM STATEMENT:**

**Crime:** Felony arrest warrants to include 1st Robbery (Violent Crime), Resisting Arrest, and Obstructing.  
**Threat:** Peterson was told he was under arrest. He refused to comply with commands and was observed to have been covered in his own blood. He was verbally abusive and stated numerous times he was going to fight the Officers. He also has a violent criminal history.  
**Resistance:** Peterson refused Officer's commands to surrender and intentionally barricaded himself behind a closed door. He stated he was going to fight with Officers when he was taken into custody.

This use of force was reasonable and within policy.

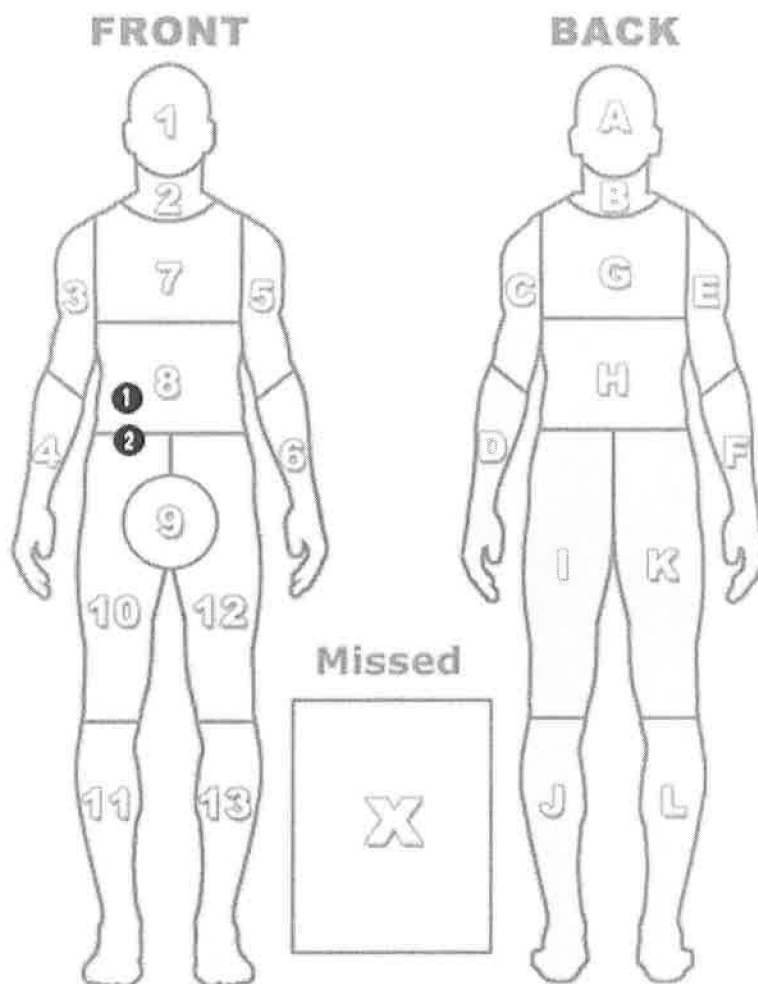

Richard describe his injured friend as Matthew Peterson, 35 YOA, I/M, 602/MED, wearing no shirt and camo shorts.

OFC Winters and I were dispatched at 0254.

At 0259, Julia Stevenson (AKA Julia Hegger) called from 3010 N. Regal to report that she was arguing with her highly intoxicated and aggressive neighbor. She said that he had pushed his way into her house and had been throwing rocks. She described him as an I/M, 20's, 5-05/HVY, wearing no shirt and shorts. He left the house and she did not see where he went.

I arrived in the area at 0302. I found Richard Anderson at Fairview and Haven. He told me that he got into a fight with Matthew and that the fight happened at Fairview and Regal under the streetlight. Richard said that he was hanging out with Matthew, and then Matthew got "crazy drunk" and started trying to fight him. Richard refused to fight, so Matthew started throwing rocks at him. Richard responding by swinging a "reinforced mop handle" at Matthew and hit him on the head. Richard said that Matthew had a large cut on his head, and that he last saw him going SB on Haven.

Richard told me that he has known Matthew for years, and that he lives next door with his parents. Richard pointed at the house (2911 E Fairview).

I went to 3010 N Regal. Julia Stevenson told me that she heard a commotion and came outside and saw that her yard was a mess, and that her next door neighbor was throwing rocks. She went inside and he pushed his way into the house so she went downstairs and locked the basement door. She heard him leave shortly thereafter. She did not know where he went.

OFC Ames and OFC Yinger arrived and advised me that Matthew Peterson had warrants, including one for 1st Degree Armed Robbery. We requested a K9, and OFC Jensen responded.

Radio confirmed the warrants.

OFC Winters followed a blood trail from the area of the fight to 2911 E Fairview.

OFC Ames located Matthew Peterson's IDENT card on the front porch of 2911 E. Fairview.

Although the address on the warrants were for a different location, DOL showed that an IDENT card that was issued to him on 07/03/2014 listed 2911 E. Fairview as his address.

OFC Yinger saw Matthew at the back door of the house.

Matthew talked to us through the closed door and refused to surrender after we advised that he was under arrest for his warrants. His father, Wayne Peterson and his mother Bernadine Peterson decided to open the door to prevent it from being damaged. They both advised that Matthew was in the basement.

Several other officers, including LT Hendren arrived.

Matthew was eventually taken into custody, and transported to the hospital via ambulance for treatment of his injury from the altercation with Anderson.

Matthew told me that I was lying when I told the medics that he had been hit with a mop handle. He was belligerent and uncooperative.

I conferred with LT Hendren and determined that there was PC to arrest Matthew Peterson for Resisting Arrest.

See reports by several other officers for details of the apprehension and booking of Peterson.

On 7/27/14 at about 0340 hours I responded to 2911 E Fairview to assist officers who were searching for a subject involved in a fight at 3010 N Regal that was also wanted. Upon arriving I was briefed that the suspect, Matthew Peterson, was inside the residence at 2911 E Fairview. There was a valid warrant for his arrest for 1st degree robbery.

Radio advised that the warrants listed a different address for Peterson, but his DOL record showed the 2911 E Fairview address as his home address. I requested for Radio to advise the issue date on the DOL record and they advised that the issue date, with that address listed, was from 7/3/14. Officer Yinger had also advised that he saw Peterson through the back door or window and positively identified him inside the residence. Based on that information we had probable cause that the 2911 E Fairview address was Peterson's current address and that he was present on the premises.

Officers were talking with Peterson through both the front and back door. He was advised that he was under arrest, multiple times, and ordered to exit the residence. Peterson refused to comply. Officer Ames and Officer Jensen gave separate announcements that he had a warrant for his arrest and if he did not exit we would force entry into the residence. Peterson continued to refuse to follow commands.

I requested a NCIC III and records check on Peterson looking for weapons info to determine if SWAT was necessary. As we were getting prepared to possibly force entry, Peterson's father, who is the owner of the residence, opened the front door. Both he and his wife were very cooperative, even though they initially tried to cover for Peterson when officers first arrived at the residence. They agreed to exit the residence so that officers could attempt to apprehend Peterson without endangering either of them. His parents advised that Peterson had gone into the basement. They said that he was intoxicated and possibly under the influence of other substances. They feared that he would fight with officers if we attempted to arrest him. They did advise that there were no firearms in the residence and that Peterson was not armed. His parents advised that they were also concerned about the injury to Peterson's head and stated he would need medical attention.

The father claimed that Peterson lives on "the res" but stays at their home when he is in Spokane. I advised that Peterson lists that address as his in DOL. In our discussion they also stated that he receives mail at the Fairview address.

After additional announcements, Officers entered the residence and discovered that Peterson was hiding behind the basement door. The door did not lock, so Peterson was on the other side of the door, holding it shut to prevent officers from opening the door.

Officers stood in the living room, attempting to negotiate with Peterson for several minutes. I entered the living room and could hear Peterson on the other side of the door, yelling wildly at officers. He was cursing and threatening officers. He made numerous comments indicating he was going to fight with officers. He asked officers if we knew who he was and when we replied that we did not know him he stated something to the effect of "I am not going without a fight." It was clear, based on his angry tone, level of intoxication, and his numerous comments, that Peterson was likely going to fight with officers if we attempted to go hands on with him. The original call also involved Peterson threatening to fight another subject. In that incident he had been struck in the head with a stick by the other half and officers had followed the blood trail to his residence.

I requested for SWAT officers to respond with a pick and a shield. Once those tools were on scene we moved to open the door to the basement. Officer Jensen had his K9 with him and Officer Childress had a Taser ready to be deployed.

Officers Meyer and Brasch moved up to the basement door. Officer Brasch attempted to open the door but Peterson was on the other side, holding the door, trying to prevent him from opening the door. After struggling to open the door for several seconds, the door came open.

Once the door was open, Peterson walked into the living room. His head, face and chest were covered in blood from the prior incident. His demeanor was hostile and assaultive. He had a crazed look on his face. He appeared "puffed up" and ready to fight. He gave no indication that he was going to surrender peacefully. He refused to follow officers commands to get on the ground and surrender. It was clear that Peterson was going to fight if we went hands on with him.

After giving Peterson an opportunity to comply with our commands without success, Officer Childress deployed the Taser, in dart mode. The Taser was very effective and allowed officers to move up and prone handcuff Peterson without further force or injury to Peterson or officers.

Once in custody, Peterson was taken outside the home to be evaluated by medics. SFD personnel removed the probes from his stomach area. Peterson continued to act crazy and hostile to both officers and medical personnel as he was being treated. Due to the injury Peterson sustained from the prior incident he was transported to the hospital for stitches.

Prior to leaving I thanked Peterson's parents for their cooperation. They both thanked us for how we resolved the incident.

On 07-27-14 at approx 0345 hrs I responded to 2911 E. Fairview to assist Officers with a barricaded suspect.

I was in the living room to assist the Officer's with the plan that had already been developed. When the door was opened to the area he was hiding I saw him jump out aggressively. He was only wearing swim shorts and tennis shoes and was covered from head to toe in blood. It appeared there was a large cut on his head that was bleeding excessively.

When he jumped out of the room he faced us and flexed his entire body. His fists were balled and I could see all the muscles in his arms and upper body flexing. I had also been advised that he had made comments that he wasn't going without a fight. He then took 1 or 2 steps towards us. The living room was very small. I was at the back of the Officers and was less than 20 feet from him.

I saw a taser application applied to the front of his upper body. It immediately stopped his movement and he fell to the ground. Other Officers placed him in handcuffs.

I responded to the hospital and was able to have short intermediate conversations with him between raging outbursts. He did tell me that he didn't think he had any injuries other than the taser probes and the previous cut to his head. He told me several times that the taser didn't hurt him and he had been trying to get police to shoot him with it at least a couple other times. He even borrowed a stun gun from a friend and used it on his leg. He was disappointed that the batteries weren't fully charged in that one. He appeared to have no pain threshold and encouraged us to try and make him feel pain.

After he received sutures in his head he was released to Ofcs. Ames and Yinger.

On 07/27/14 around 0308 hours Ofc. B. Yinger and I were working as a two-officer patrol unit, and dispatched to the area of Regal / Fairview reference a Fight incident. Ofc. S. Haney and Ofc. T. Winters had been dispatched to the location regarding a fight between neighbors, and determined that one of the neighbors was outstanding.

Richard M. Anderson (032658) had been identified as one of the involved neighbors, and the outstanding neighbor was identified as Matthew M. Peterson (062871). It was reported Peterson was struck in the head with stick during the fight, and he was bleeding profusely from the wound.

Anderson claimed he was friends with Peterson, and he confirmed Peterson lives at 2911 E. Fairview. Dispatch advised that Peterson was showing to have three confirmed felony warrants for his arrest, and verified his current address was showing to be 2911 E. Fairview through DOL.

Ofc. Yinger and I then arrived on scene, and assisted Ofc. Winters in following a trail of blood away from the scene in order to try and locate Peterson. Ofc. Yinger, Ofc. Winters and I were able to follow the trail of blood from where the fight occurred, all the way up to and around the 2911 E. Fairview address.

I followed a trail of fresh blood up to the front door of the residence, and observed fresh blood on the door / door jam of the location. I also discovered a wallet lying on the front porch of the residence with blood on it, and I opened up the wallet to see it belonged to Peterson.

Ofc. J. Jensen and I were standing at the front door of the location, and eventually knocked on the door to see if we could get an answer. A male voice later identified as Peterson's father began talking to us from behind the door, however he refused to answer / open the door.

Ofc. Jensen and I advised Peterson's father that we needed to talk to his son, and also to check on his welfare due to all of the blood we observed outside the residence. Peterson's father confirmed that Peterson was inside the residence, but he was "sleeping and not bleeding anymore."

Ofc. Jensen and I continued trying to explain why we needed to talk to Peterson and that we were not leaving, but his father still would not answer the door. Peterson himself then began screaming at us from inside the house, cursing and advising us to "go the fuck away."

I could hear Peterson's father telling him "calm down Matthew" as he kept screaming at us, and threatening that if we came inside the house he was going to fight all of us. Peterson then briefly went to the back door of the residence, where Ofc. Yinger observed him briefly come out the back door and start yelling back there as well.

I attempted to convince Peterson's father to let us in as Peterson was at the back door, but a few moments later Peterson was right back to screaming / cursing at us from behind the front door. Ofc. Jensen and I continued trying to get some compliance from Peterson and his father, while we

waited for more units to respond / arrive.

It should be noted that approximately 20 minutes had gone by, until we had enough units on scene to assist. Lt. T. Hendren was also on scene by this point, and we finally made the announcement to Peterson inside the residence that he was under arrest for several felony warrants.

Peterson began arguing about the charges from these warrants being "bullshit," and so we gave him the final warning to open the door or it would be breached. The noise from Peterson screaming inside the residence suddenly stopped, and a few seconds later Peterson's father finally opened up the front door.

Peterson's father started demanding for us to put our guns away, and also telling us that he was only going to allow one Police Officer inside his house. I then advised Peterson's father we would be bringing in as many officers as we needed, and instructed he and his wife to exit.

Peterson's father complied with my instructions, and he even informed us that Peterson had ran to the basement. It should be noted the door to the basement was just on the other side of the small living room, and it was determined Peterson was standing behind the door to the basement and he was physically holding it closed.

Ofc. Jensen and I again started a similar dialogue with Peterson as he was behind the door, advising him that he was under arrest and to come out. Peterson continued to scream / curse at us from behind the door, and refused to comply with any of our commands.

Lt. Hendren began directing in some more officers and equipment, as we kept on trying to negotiate with Peterson. It should be noted another 25 minutes had gone by, until a few SWAT officers arrived on scene with a ballistic shield. Peterson continued to threaten to fight us from behind the basement door, saying how he was gonna make us kill him and that he was not going to give up without a fight.

The basement door was then forcibly pulled open, and Peterson emerged from the basement door. I could see that Peterson was bleeding profusely from the right temple of his forehead, and when he walked out of the door he had nothing in his hands as far as weapons.

Peterson was being told numerous times to "get on the ground," however he did not comply and he started walking towards us. Peterson had an extremely menacing look on his face, and even though his hands were down by his sides I could see his hands were both clenched into fists.

Peterson was also flexing his arm / chest muscles, and appeared to be growling or making a low guttural noise. It was obvious Peterson was walking out to fight, and he was also told to stop advancing. Peterson refused to comply with any of our numerous commands, and a taser was deployed to prevent him from closing any more distance towards us.

Peterson immediately went to the ground upon being tased, he was moved in a prone cuffing position, and I placed him in handcuffs (DL). Peterson continued to scream / curse at us, as he was stood up and walked out to the street where the medics were already staged.

The medics began attempting to administer some aid to Peterson as he was standing there, and he refused to stop screaming / cursing at everyone. At one point Peterson even turned towards me as he was screaming / cursing, and spit some small specks of blood into my face.

I was immediately relieved by Ofc. Winters, and had the medics clean the blood from my face. Peterson was then loaded onto an AMR gurney, and during the entire time he did not stop swearing /

cursing at us. Peterson was still threatening to fight us when he got the chance, and after repeated requests he refused to calm down.

Due to Peterson's behavior and demeanor we were not going to un-handcuff him while he was on the gurney, and so he was unable to lay all the way down. The AMR medics did strap Peterson's legs down to the gurney, and he was placed up into the ambulance in order to be transported to SHMC.

I was then tasked with riding in the ambulance up to the hospital with Peterson, and took a seat in the vehicle at a position behind him after he had already been loaded. Peterson was extremely intoxicated, and did not appear to even realize I was in the ambulance with him at that point.

As the ambulance started traveling towards SHMC, the AMR medic was attempting to do all of his work in order to aid Peterson. Peterson then began screaming / cursing at the AMR medic, calling him a child molester, and accusing him of raping children and well as his own children.

Peterson was also leaning his torso towards the AMR medic while doing this, and several times I observed the AMR medic tell Peterson to stop leaning towards him while also moving him back to a centered position on the gurney. I had not said anything up to that point, however I finally advised Peterson to just lay back on the gurney.

Peterson then turned his torso towards me, and started in on his screaming / cursing and accusations. I could see Peterson was trying to push his body up towards with his feet, however his legs were still strapped in as he tried closing space towards me in the ambulance.

I gave Peterson another two or three commands to lay down and stop, however he refused to do so. I then took hold of Peterson's right arm which was closest to me, and pulled it backwards in order to force his to lay down on the gurney. Peterson continued trying to pull away from me the entire ride to the hospital, however he was not able.

As were just pulling up into the driveway up at SHMC, Peterson made another attempt to free his legs and move his body closer to me. I noticed Peterson was having some success getting free from the leg straps, and so I stood up in the ambulance and placed the palm of my hands onto his shoulders to try and keep him flat.

Peterson was still trying to free his legs, and it was working because I could not hold him down as he shoved off of the gurney with both of his legs. I then noticed that Peterson had kicked completely out of the legs restraints on the gurney, and he began kicking in the ambulance.

Peterson started moving his body up towards me in the gurney now that his legs were free, and it appeared he was trying to use his head to strike me. I immediately placed my left hand on Peterson's right cheek, and pushed it down on the gurney as the back doors of the ambulance opened.

Peterson was still thrashing his legs around, and so I placed my right knee up on his upper right thigh. Ofc. Yinger and the other AMR medic then rushed up into the back of the ambulance, and were finally able to get Peterson's legs back into the straps / secured.

Peterson was eventually wheeled into the hospital, and he continued screaming / cursing almost the entire time he was being treated. Peterson was released from the hospital after receiving treatment for the wound on his head, and he refused to stop his belligerent / threatening behavior.

We were even unable to walk Peterson out of the main hospital doors, since his behavior would have been very disruptive to any of the other people out in the waiting room. Peterson was walked out the ambulance exit of the emergency room, and placed in our patrol car.

Peterson continued cursing and calling us names all the way to jail, and also when he got to the jail so he immediately failed booking. I read Peterson his warrants at jail, and a settle slip was completed. Peterson was booked for his three warrants, and also cited / released for Resisting Arrest.

On July 27, 2014 at about 0352 hours, I was dispatched to 2911 E. Fairview to assist other Officers who were on scene, attempting to arrest an uncooperative subject wanted on three Felony Warrants. While en route, I was advised the subject was named Matthew M. Peterson.

I arrived on scene at about 0356 hours and walked into the front yard of the residence. As I walked up onto the front porch, I saw Officers Ames, Winters, Haney and Jensen standing just inside the door and in the living room yelling several commands for suspect Peterson to give up. I walked into the living room and took out my Taser as to use a less lethal option if needed.

I stood by on the right side of Officer Jensen who is a K9 Officer. I was advised that Peterson was told he was under arrest on the warrants; that he was barricading himself behind a closed door which lead to the basement staircase, and that he was covered in blood from an earlier fight. As I stood by, Officers Jensen and Ames were making every attempt to get Peterson to surrender. However, Peterson would only yell back that his rights were being violated and he wasn't going anywhere without a fight.

It was agreed that if Peterson exits from his hiding place, I would first use my Taser to subdue Peterson before the use of the K9 was applied.

Once Officers Brasch and Meyer arrived on scene, they entered the living room and approached the door that Peterson was hiding behind. Officer Brash was able to pull open the door and prop it open so Peterson could be taken into custody.

I saw Peterson enter the short hallway from the stairwell and turn into the living room facing me and the other Officers. I saw Peterson was wearing shorts and no shirt. His face and chest were covered in blood and he appeared wet from sweating. I saw Peterson looked extremely angry and crazed from his facial expression (wide eyed & blank stare). Peterson began walking towards us with his hands down at his sides, as he was told to stop by one of the other Officers. Peterson refused to stop and took two more steps in our direction.

## GRAHAM STATEMENT:

Crime: Felony Arrest Warrants, Resisting Arrest, Obstructing

Threat: Peterson was told he was under arrest, he refused to give up, he was observed to have been covered in his own blood, he was verbally abusive and stated numerous times he was going to fight the Officers, he has a violent criminal history

Resistance: Peterson refused Officer's commands to surrender, he intentionally barricaded himself behind a closed door, he stated he was going to fight with Officers when taken into custody.

Fearing that Peterson would make good on his threat to fight us, I aimed by Taser at his lower abdomen and pulled the trigger. The two Taser probes deployed as expected and struck Peterson on his lower stomach area just to the left of his belly button. Peterson hunched over and began falling to the living room floor. Officer Brasch, standing behind Petersen, pushed him down to the floor where he was taken into custody without further

incident or any assaults on any Officers.

Once Peterson was placed in handcuffs, he was stood up onto his feet. Peterson still remained belligerent and continued to be verbally abusive towards us. Officer Ames and I escorted Peterson outside the house and to the street where Fire Department personnel were waiting to treat him for his injuries. The Taser probes were removed by Fire and his injured forehead was treated. Peterson was then placed on a gurney by Officer Ames and I, and he was secured by AMR medics.

I cleared the location and drove to the property facility. Once at property, I placed the spent Taser cartridge (serial #C4102D45T) on as evidence. I discarded the probes into the "sharps" container to be destroyed properly as they were a bio hazard.

This was the extent of my involvement in this particular incident. Please review the additional reports by the other Officers involved.

On 072714, at 0406 hours, I responded to 2911 E. Fairview to assist Officers on a warrant arrest. The subject, Matthew Peterson, had locked himself behind a door inside the residence. Peterson was yelling that he wasn't "going down without a fight".

Upon arrival, I heard Peterson yelling from behind a door, leading to the downstairs. SPD Radio had confirmed warrants for his arrest.

Other officers were on scene, including K9 Officer Jensen with his canine partner. We formulated a plan to move up and open the door and give commands to Peterson to come out with his hands up in the air.

Officer Meyer moved towards the door with a ballistic shield and I approached with a pick. I was going to use the pick to open the door, but observed that it was unlocked.

I grabbed the door knob and started to pull the door open, but Peterson yanked the door shut. I had latex gloves on and the knob was slipping from my grip when Peterson pulled the door shut.

I had to pull the door open three times before finally getting a grip on the edge and being able to keep it open. Peterson was still trying to pull the door shut.

Peterson finally burst out of the door and turned towards the officers near the door. I had stepped back as the door opened.

Peterson was yelling and flexing his arms. Peterson had his hands clenched in fists and was swearing and screaming. Peterson was not following commands and refused to stop resisting his arrest.

Peterson was bleeding heavily from the head, from an earlier altercation, and had blood on his face and arms. I observed that a Taser had been deployed and the probes were in Peterson's lower torso.

Peterson was tensing up and screaming, but was not falling to the ground. It appears the distance between the probes was not far enough apart to incapacitate all of his muscles groups.

On 7-27-14 at about 0308 hrs, Ofc Ames and I (two officer unit) responded to the area of 2911 E Fairview to assist Ofc Winters and Ofc Haney on a fight call. Bernadine Peterson called at 0245 hrs from 2911 E Fairview and reported two males were outside fighting. She said one of them was her son and it sounded like she said there were weapons involved before she hung up. At 0253 hrs, the clerk from the Cenex at 3030 E Euclid called. He said a male came to the location saying his friend was injured nearby. The male got on the phone and was identified as Richard M Anderson (032658). He said his friend was a 35 year old I/M named Matthew Peterson. He said Peterson was throwing rocks so Anderson hit him with a stick. He last saw Peterson walking S/B around Fairview/Regal. At 0259 hrs, Julia Stevenson called from 3010 N Regal. She said her intoxicated neighbor pushed his way into her house. He was highly intoxicated and aggressive and was throwing rocks. She locked herself in her basement and he left. Ofc Haney made contact with Anderson and Stevenson back at 3010 N Regal.

Peterson was described as wearing shorts but no shirt. He was also bleeding from the head.

Dispatch found Matthew M Peterson (062871) in the system. He had three confirmed felony warrants for his arrest, including one for 1st Degree Robbery. We viewed a SPRS photo of Peterson. We showed the SPRS photo to Anderson to confirm this was the correct person and he positively identified Peterson as the same subject. Peterson lived with his mother next door at 2911 E Fairview. His WA DOL address was listed as 2911 E Fairview.

We went to the house and I observed a fresh trail of blood drops going up the front walkway from the street. The blood trail went onto the front porch and to the front door. Peterson's wallet with his Driver's license inside was laying outside the front door. Dispatch repeatedly tried calling Bernadine Peterson to have her come to the door but there was no answer.

We surrounded the house and more officers responded to assist. Ofc Ames and other officers knocked at the front door while I watched the back door and back yard. Ofc Ames made contact with the family and determined Peterson was inside the house. Peterson was heard yelling from inside the house and he refused to come outside.

I heard banging around at the back of the house and the back door suddenly opened. I saw a shirtless male wearing shorts standing at the back door. He stood in the doorway and made no movements. I shined my light on him and recognized the male as Peterson from his SPRS photo. He was bleeding heavily from a wound on his head. He had blood running down his face and covering his chest, arms, hands, and shorts. I announced myself as a police officer and I yelled at Peterson that he was under arrest on his warrants. He shouted back "Fuck you! Come get me! Let's fight boy!" I told him to step outside with his hands up. He refused to do so and continued yelling. He

slammed the back door and continued yelling inside the house.

I continued to watch the back of the house while the officers made more verbal attempts at the front of the house. Lt Hendren and Sgt Reynolds arrived on scene to assist. Ofc Jensen and his K9 also responded. Officers had Peterson's parents and dogs come out of the front of the house. Peterson was hiding in a basement room.

Officers made verbal contact with Peterson. He was inside a basement room holding the door closed. I was standing outside the house and I could hear Peterson yelling he was not going to give up. He refused to come out. Officers told Peterson repeatedly he was under arrest on his warrants. Ofc Brasch and Ofc R. Meyer arrived to assist. Eventually officers opened the door and Peterson was taken into custody. I heard Lt Hendren request medics for a Taser deployment.

I observed Peterson as he was being led out of the front door in handcuffs. He had two Taser probes attached to his lower torso region. He was bleeding heavily from a large gash on his forehead, apparently from Anderson having to strike him with a stick. Medics responded to begin treating Peterson for his injuries.

I observed Peterson was extremely intoxicated and he was uncooperative. He was yelling at officers and at the medical personnel as they tried to assist him. He was spitting blood and refused to remain still. Peterson spit some specks of blood on Ofc Ames' face when he was screaming in Ofc Ames' direction. He was bragging that the Taser had no effect on him. He said he was not going to the hospital. He argued about the medical costs and about the warrants. He said he was falsely arrested. He was also yelling towards Anderson's house so he could hear him.

The Medics bandaged Peterson's head and placed a spit mask over his head. Peterson was eventually placed on the ambulance gurney while he was still in handcuffs. He was left in handcuffs because of his violent behavior and speech. Ofc Ames rode in the back of the ambulance during the transport to SHMC. I met the ambulance there.

When the medics opened the back of the ambulance, I observed Peterson was thrashing around on the gurney. He had kicked his legs out of the restraints and was kicking the equipment in the back of the ambulance. Ofc Ames was controlling Peterson by holding his head and upper body down on the gurney. The medics and I controlled Peterson's legs and strapped his ankles to the gurney.

Peterson was uncooperative and verbally aggressive at the hospital. He had to be placed in 4 point restraints on the hospital bed. The doctor stitched Peterson's laceration on his forehead, which was about 4 inches long and 1/2 wide. Peterson was medically cleared for jail booking.

Ofc Ames and I transported Peterson to jail. He was booked on his three felony warrants and for Resisting Arrest (sector ticket 4Z0439667). See the other involved officers' reports.

On 072714 at about 0316 hours I responded to 2911 E Fairview reference a warrant call. Officers on scene were requesting a K9 because they believed Matthew Peterson 6/28/71 was inside the residence and he had multiple felony warrants.

While enroute to the location, I was able to look at a SPRS photo of Peterson and observed his physicals to be 5'10", 230 pounds. I also conducted a name check on Peterson and observed his 2 local felony warrants were for 1st degree robbery and taking a motor vehicle without permission.

I arrived on scene at about 0320 hours and spoke with Ofc. Ames who was near the front porch. Ofc. Ames said Peterson had been involved in a fight and that he was bleeding. Ofc. Ames pointed to the ground with his flashlight and showed me a trail of blood leading up onto the front porch. Ofc. Ames then advised me that Peterson's wallet was near the front door, on the porch. Radio advised that Peterson's warrants were confirmed.

Ofc. Ames and I knocked on the front door and a male began speaking through the door advising us that Peterson was sleeping inside and that he was alright. We explained to the male that we needed Peterson to come outside. The male then told us that Peterson was drunk and was not coming out. At this time radio advised us that Peterson showed a DOL address at 2911 E Fairview.

We continued to knock and I then heard a different male's voice began yelling through the door. This male was telling us to "fuck off" and that he was not coming out. I explained to the male, who I thought was Peterson, that he needed to come outside because he had confirmed felony warrants for his arrest. I advised the male that he was under arrest. The male yelled more towards us that he was not coming out.

A short time later, Ofc. Yinger, who was positioned on the back of the house, advised a male came out on the back porch and he recognized this male as Matthew Peterson. Ofc. Yinger advised that Peterson yelled at him and went back inside the house.

A plan was devised outside to breach the front door after a pair of K9 announcements because we had reasonable cause to believe Peterson was in his house and he had multiple

confirmed felony warrants. I knocked on the door and gave 2 loud K9 announcements as follows: "Spokane Police K9 Unit, come out now or make yourself known, I am going to release a K9 inside, when he finds you he will bite you".

These announcements caused a male to the open the door. This male said that Peterson had gone into the basement. This male was asked to leave the house with his wife and their pets and they did so. At the open front door, I then gave another pair of K9 announcements as stated above and there was no response.

I decided to deploy K9 Cruz inside the house to search for Peterson for the following reasons:

-Peterson had 2 confirmed felony warrants, one of which was first degree robbery which is a violent offense.

-Peterson had not been searched and it was unknown whether he possessed any weapons to use against searching officers. Peterson was within his own house and knew the location of weapons and ambush points inside. Peterson was also a large male which presented a danger to searching officers in that if he decided to fight he would be very hard to control without officers getting injured. Peterson was also intoxicated and refusing to give up peacefully to police commands which concerned me in that he might be willing to do anything to avoid arrest, including assaulting searching officers.

-Peterson was clearly attempting to evade arrest by not coming out of the house when told to do so.

I gave K9 Cruz the command to search and he began searching the main floor. K9 Cruz gave an indication on the basement door in that he seemed the door with his nose and took a pointed position as if wanting to go through the door. I grabbed K9 Cruz and attempted to open the basement door and felt immediate resistance. I could tell that Peterson was holding the door shut from within the basement stairwell area.

I then backed up and began talking to Peterson. I advised Peterson that he was under arrest, that we did not want anyone to get hurt and that he should just come out with his hands in the air and he would not be harmed. Peterson then began yelling through the closed door he was holding, stating that he was not coming out and that he would not go down without a fight. I continued to negotiate with Peterson, along with other officers, for about 20 minutes in an attempt to get him to come out on his own with his hands up so that no one got hurt. Peterson continued to scream back at us telling us to "fuck off" on numerous occasions.

A plan was devised after failed negotiations that Ofc. Brasch would pull the basement door open, defeating Peterson's grasp. Once the door was opened, we would attempt further negotiations to arrive at a peaceful solution. If Peterson aggressed towards officers then a taser

would be used to help take him into custody. If the taser failed, then I would deploy K9 Cruz.

Ofc. Brasch was able to pull the basement door from Peterson's grasp and I immediately started giving commands for Peterson to come out with his hands up. I observed Peterson walk towards officers in the living room, yelling obscenities. I heard Peterson yell something to the effect of bring it on. I observed that Peterson's face was covered in blood from the earlier assault. I yelled at Peterson to stop, but he continued to aggress on officers, while still yelling. It appeared that Peterson was going to attempt to fight with officers due to his aggressive demeanor in yelling and advancing on officer's positions. Ofc. Childress deployed his taser and Peterson was taken into custody without any other uses of force.

K9 Cruz did not contact Peterson at any time during this incident. See other officers' reports.
