

This was a person with a weapon call at Byrne Park, 100 E. Lacrosse. A male was waving a handgun around and yelling at a female there. When Corporal Dahle contacted the male, the male refused to show Corporal Dahle his hands when ordered to do so. The male reached down by his left side, which was the side away from Corporal Dahle. Corporal Dahle knew the male was armed and was possibly grabbing for the handgun. Corporal Dahle drew his firearm to the low ready position and ordered the male to show his hands. The male again reached under his left leg where the handgun could have been concealed. Corporal Dahle pointed his firearm at the male and ordered him to his stomach. The male then complied and Corporal Dahle found a large black revolver next to the male's right hand. The gun was a Black Ops BB gun that looked realistic. It appeared to have real bullets. The male was detained.

The male was Joshua Roullier. He had been contacted previously and made the statement he was going to get a gun and commit suicide by cop. He was mentally unstable and had been drinking. Officer Dahle's use of force was appropriate and effective.

On 07/26/14 at approx. 10:10 hours I responded to Byrnes Park (100 E. Lacrosse) for a report of a male waiving a gun. Cpl. Dahl and I arrived at the same time. When we arrived Cpl. Dahl came in from the East and I came in from the West.

When I arrived I could see a male and female, later identified as Joshua Roullier, and Makelle Hamilton standing in the park. It looked like they were verbally arguing. I saw Hamilton throw her hands up in the air and walk away from Roullier. She then walked to a Burgundy Ford Explorer (APN2972) and got in. She started to pull away from the curb, but I stopped her from leaving. I pulled in front of her and activated my overhead lights. I could see Cpl. Dahl approaching Rollier, who was now sitting on the grass. I could hear Cpl. Dahl telling Rollier to show him his hands. I could see Cpl. Dahl detain Rollier, at the same time I was having Hamilton step out of her car. (See Cpl Dahl's additional).

Once I got Hamilton out of the car I did not know who might have the reported gun, so I directed Hamilton into a prone position and I handcuffed her. I patted her down for weapons and did not find any.

I asked her what was happening between her and Rollier. She stated he is just a friend. She said she picked him up to give him a ride to the Shadle Walmart. When they got to the Wal-mart she just got a drink of water and used the bathroom. She did not know what Rollier did while he was at Wal-Mart. Hamilton stated she and Rollier started arguing once back at her car. They were arguing about him drinking. They then got into Hamilton's car and were still arguing. They were passing the park we were now in. She stated because they were arguing she just stopped and got out to just get away from Rollier. She went and used the restroom and when she came back to the car Rollier was outside the car. They argued a little bit and she got back into her car and was leaving when I pulled up.

I asked Hamilton about someone, having a gun. She stated she knew nothing about a gun and had not seen one. Hamilton was not really being cooperative and was now in the back of my car and handcuffed. I read her Miranda Rights and she stated she understood them, and did not wish to waive them. I asked her no further questions. While I was talking with Hamilton I did notice there were approx. 2-4 children playing in the park.

I then went over to Ofc. Bishop's car where Cpl. Dahl was detaining Rollier. Cpl. Dahl showed me the "gun" that was sitting right next to Rollier when he detained him. I noticed it was a large very real looking black revolver type gun. Cpl. Dahl advised me it was a "Black Ops BB gun".

I asked Roullier why he was carrying such a realistic looking BB gun. He first said it was "habit". He then said he bought it for his 4 year old son. I explained the dangers to Rollier about carrying a fake gun. He responded that he hoped carrying a fake gun would someday get him killed. I now remembered approx. 1-2 weeks ago reading in one of the SPD Intel flyers that Rollier had allegedly made statements about Suicide by Cop and was trying to acquire an air soft gun or real weapon. I told Rollier that I would probably be taking the BB gun for safekeeping. He became angry and said he would just go out and get another one if I did.

I then went and spoke with witness Christopher Weddle. He told me the following:

He lives across the street from the park. He saw Hamilton and Rollier pull up to the park in the Burgundy Ford Explorer (He does not know Rollier or Hamilton). When they got out of the car they were verbally arguing. He watched as Hamilton walked towards the middle of the park. When she walked away Rollier was standing next to the Explorer. Weddle said it looked like Roullier might have been urinating by the car. Rollier then walked away from the car and Weddle could see him fiddling with something near the waistband of his jeans. He then heard Rollier yell at either Weddle

or a car passing by. He heard him yell, "Don't look at my butt". He then watched as Rollier pulled a gun out and was holding it near his waistband. Rollier was walking back and forth with the gun. He did not point it at anybody, but this alarmed Weddle enough that he went back into his house to stay safe and called 9-1-1. Weddle then saw Cpl. Dahl and I arrive and detain Hamilton and Rollier.

I went back and discussed the incident with Cpl. Dahl. I then advised Rollier that he was under arrest for Weapons apparently capable of producing bodily harm-unlawful carrying or handling (IE-Intimidation with a weapon). Ofc. Bishop transported Rollier to jail for me. I went to the jail booked Rollier. Cpl. Dahl took the Black Ops BB gun and placed it on property as evidence. I then cleared the call.

On 07-26-14 at approximately 1010 hours, I responded to the report of a person with a weapon at 127 E Lacrosse. It was reported that a male was at the park, and was brandishing a handgun. The male was reported to be yelling at a female, and had the gun in his hand. The male was reported to be a W/M, wearing a gray jersey with blue letters. The gun was described as a 12 inch length "black bigger handgun." The male caller described the female as a W/F, blond hair, and wearing a blue tank top.

Officer Zinkgraf arrived on scene and advised that they were on the north side of the park. I drove my patrol to the north side of the park, and approached from the east. I observed a W/M, wearing a gray jersey with blue letters. The male was sitting on a small hill. When I pulled up the male reached under his left leg, which was on the side opposite from me.

I drew my sidearm to a low ready, and told the male to show me his hands. The male replied, "I didn't do anything." The male then reached back under his left leg.

The call was a person with a gun. The suspect I was contacting was wearing the same clothing the caller had described. The male had also not immediately complied with my commands to show his hands, and had also reached to an area that could not see.

I pointed my firearm towards the male, and told him to get on his stomach. The male complied at this time, and laid on his stomach. I approached the male and observed a large black revolver right next to his right hand. I told the male not to move, and ordered him not to reach for the gun. I was able to handcuff (dl) and detain the male at this time. Sgt. Huddle was advised of the use of force.

The firearm turned out to be a replica Black Ops BB gun. It was very realistic, and I thought it was real until I attempted to make it safe. The weapon even appeared to have real bullets. The bullets turned out to fake as well.

I asked the male why he had it out, and he stated, "Because if I had it in my pants it would be concealed." The male was identified as Joshua Roullier. Roullier stated that he had just bought the weapon today. I asked why he had it in the park, and he did not answer.

On 7/26/14 at 1008, a complainant reported there was a male suspect in Byrne Park (100-200 E Lacrosse) with a handgun. The male was waving the gun around and yelling at a female. The male was described as a W/M wearing a grey jersey with blue lettering. The complainant advised the male and female had been in a Ford Explorer that was parked on the street.

While responding to the incident, officers on scene advised they had detained the people involved in the incident. I arrived on scene and Cpl Dahle had a male later identified as Josh Roullier detained in cuffs on the ground in the park. Josh was wearing a grey jersey with blue lettering. Dahle had recovered a black long barrel revolver handgun. The gun looked completely real however it was an air soft gun. The revolver appeared to have real ammunition in it. Josh was placed in the back of my patrol car while officers continued their investigation.

I observed the car doors open to the Ford Explorer parked on the street. There was a fifth of Jack Daniel's whiskey on the rear passenger floorboard. The bottle had been opened as it was 2/3 full.

While Ofc Zinkgraf was speaking to witnesses, I briefly contacted the female detained in the back of her patrol car (Makelle Hamilton). Makelle advised she had picked Josh up just before they went to Walmart. She filled up her water and went to the bathroom while she was in Walmart. She didn't know what Josh did inside of Walmart and she didn't know he had the air soft gun with him. They ended up stopping at the park because Josh was drinking whiskey in her car while she was driving and he was spilling it all over the car. Makelle wanted Josh out of her car.

I was at my patrol car when Ofc Zinkgraf interviewed Josh about the incident. She had asked Josh about the replica gun he had with him. On 7/17 we had received an intelligence bulletin advising that Josh had made statements advising he was looking to acquire an air soft gun or real gun. The bulletin advised Josh stated he wouldn't hesitate to brandish it at officers and he made statements about "suicide by cop." Among the many statements Josh made to Zinkgraf about having the replica gun and the dangers of having it and displaying it, he stated he hopes to God the gun does get him killed.

During the interview Josh had a plethora of vulgar comments/statements/names for officers. Ofc Zinkgraf advised she had probable cause to arrest Josh for intimidation with a weapon (9.41.270). I was going to transport and booked Josh into SCJ as he was in my car. Prior to leaving Josh

continued his abusive verbal behavior towards me. He then struck his forehead 3 times against the plastic divider in the patrol car. I advised Josh if he struck his head again he would be placed in leg restraints.

I didn't use the leg restraints to transport him to jail and he didn't strike his head again. Cpl Dahle followed me to jail. During the trip to jail Josh continue his verbal behavior as he called Zinkgraf a "cunt" and myself a "faggot."

At jail in the booking area Josh finally changed his demeanor when he wanted to get out of jail. He apologized to me for all the things he said to me and advised I shouldn't have been treated the way he treated me. I showed him the statute for the charge he was arrested for and described his behavior to him and how it met the elements of the charge. Josh verbally advised he understood how his behavior met the statute. He advised he just felt backed into a corner when he was talking to police at the park and that is how he handles the situation when he feels that way.

See Zinkgraf and Dahle's report for further details. Zinkgraf submitted a mental health evaluation request at jail for Josh due to his statements in the field and how there related to the intelligence bulletin.
