



#### **Report Narrative**

On 080314 at approx 0041hrs, I responded to assist other Officers at Ron's Tire, 2202 E Euclid. While enroute, Radio advised the Complainant/Witness Brent Coy called 911 to report a burglary in progress at Ron's Tire. Coy lives next door to the store, and observed a burglar inside the fenced area and making noise. Other Officers contacted Coy for his statement. We located the RP and owner for the store. He advised he lives in a trailer inside the fenced area, and he was home with his girlfriend who was in the hot tub. When we arrived on scene, we contacted Ron, the owner. He opened the locked gate to the fenced area so we could check it. He advised nobody should be inside the fenced area, and if anyone is located he wanted to press charges.

I looked at the fenced area. The fence was a 6 foot tall chain link fence which also had another two feet of barbed wire on top of that. The 8 foot tall security fence was in excellent condition and was meant to keep burglars out. Due to the nature of the business, selling used tires, the fenced area was full of valuable inventory which consisted of tires, vehicles, tire changing machines, tools, trailers, etc...

Ofc Bishop and Ofc Stone advised they located a cut hole in the fence, right where next to the witness Coy's house. Coy reported that the burglar was last seen next to a vehicle, right next to the hole in the fence.

Ofc Stone, Ofc Bishop, Ofc Harvey and I positioned ourselves at the northern part of the yard, at the entrance gate. Ron and Rhonda were outside the fenced area and advised nobody else should be inside. I gave two very loud K9 announcements as follows; "Attention in the yard! This is the Spokane Police K9 Unit! Come out now or the area will be searched by the Police K9! Come out now or the K9 will find and bite you!" I waited over 30 seconds between and after the announcements. K9 Axl did not bark during or after the announcements. I observed no movements or sounds from the suspect.

I deployed SPD K9 Axl for the following reasons;

Crime-

Whoever cut the hole and entered the fenced yard was there for a purpose. The yard contained thousands of dollars worth of inventory, tools and other items that could easily have been stolen. Whoever entered the yard was there with the intent to burglarize the business, or worse harm Ron or his girlfriend Rhonda who lived on site. Ron advised he wanted whoever was in his yard arrested for burglary (a felony).

Threat to Public or Responding Officers-

The fenced area was full of tires, vehicles, tools, tire changing machines, etc. All those items provided very good hiding locations for the burglar. Every stack of tires in that yard also served as a ambush point for the burglar to assault searching Officers. In order to thoroughly search the yard, each stack of tires would have to be looked in for someone hiding down the middle of the stack. Getting that close to a potential threat is very dangerous for searching Officers. There was also a huge risk to Ron and Rhonda if the burglar was not located. Since they lived on site inside the fenced area, the burglar would have immediate access to ambush them if not located by the Police.

Burglars are known to carry tools and weapons. Whoever was in the yard had not been searched and was most likely armed with a weapon or a tool that could be used as such. Suspects Resistance-

Whoever was in the fenced yard had hidden themselves. Instead of surrendering after the announcements, or even attempting to flee, the suspect continued to hide in an attempt to evade capture.

I deployed K9 AxI from the gate. Due to the hole in the chain link fence, I kept AxI on lead. Our

search led directly to two parked vehicles along the south fence line of the yard. This was directly next to the witness Coy's residence and the hole in the fence. K9 AxI showed very high interest in the vehicles. K9 AxI showed strong indications that a suspect was close by or had recently been close by due to the scent indications. Of the two parked vehicles, the one on the right was a car, the one on the left was a truck. K9 AxI showed very high interest in or immediately around the truck. Both vehicles were surrounded by long rows of tires, placed together so the tires looked like long tubes on the ground. I chose to stop the search, make more announcements and give the suspect another chance to surrender.

From the front of the truck, I announced two more times as follows; "Attention in the area! This is the Spokane Police K9 unit! I know you are in here, and you are close! You are under arrest for Burglary! Come out now or you will be contacted by the K9!" Once again, I waited over 30 seconds between and after the announcements. I saw no movement and heard no signs of a surrender. K9 Axl didn't bark during my announcements, but he barked afterwards.

I gave K9 Axl the command to search and he did so immediately. K9 Axl went to the passenger side of the truck, looked inside the cab, looked inside the bed, then started to crawl underneath the bed. Just as he started to crawl underneath, he flipped around and dug his nose in between the tires which were in one of the long rows. I heard the suspect, who was later identified as Betsy Dinwiddie, yell for me to get the dog. Dinwiddie had somehow crawled inside the long row of tires and was almost impossible to see. Since I was within 15 feet of the contact location, I immediately ran over and gave K9 Axl the command to release, which he did immediately. K9 Axl was on the contact less than 5 seconds.

Dinwiddie was removed from the stack of tires. Without K9 Axl, Dinwiddie might not have been located. Dinwiddie was handcuffed, placed under arrest and transported to Deaconess for treatment of the K9 contact. Cpl Busch responded and photographed the hiding location and the hole cut in the fence. A name check of Dinwiddie showed she was the respondent on a Anti -Harassment Order, which listed Rhonda as the petitioner. She was arrested for 2nd degree Burglary and Violation of the Court Order.

At Deaconess, I verified Dinwiddie had been read her constitutional rights and was willing to answer questions. She advised she had, and gave the following answers;

She was aware there was an order restraining her from being in proximity to Rhonda, but she just wanted to see her face and see what she looked like. She knew the Police K9 had arrived, and heard all four of my announcements. She didn't say anything or surrender because she was scared and "just kind of froze". She heard the K9 very close to her but still didn't say anything.

I observed her injuries. Due to her positioning, and the difficulty K9 Axl had getting to her inside the tires, she had very few injuries. Dinwiddie was laying on her stomach inside the tires and K9 Axl contacted her back. It looked as if K9 Axl attempted several contacts but couldn't get a grip because the contact location was the middle of her back. Dinwiddie looked as if she had 3-4 distinct contact locations, from her shoulders to her belt line, all in the middle of her back. All contacts had scratches and redness with only one slight puncture and no bleeding. The injuries were cleaned and covered with antibiotic ointment, no stitching was required.

Cpl Ennis photographed the injuries at Deaconess. Sgt Hallock was advised of the contact. See other Officer reports.

On 8/3/2014 at approximately 0029 hrs, OFC Bishop and I were dispatched to 2202 E Euclid for a suspicious person call. The complainant, Brent Coy, advised that a "male" was inside the secured fence area of the tire shop.

We arrived on scene and Coy stated that the suspect was still inside the barb-wired fenced area hiding near a pickup truck. See OFC Bishop's report for Coy's statements.

The barb-wired fenced (approximately eight feet tall) area was completely secured. It was obvious that the fence was there to keep everyone out of the business area. Coy showed me a very small cut in the fence (south side) where the suspect probably crawled into the secured tire shop area. Coy said that the hole in the fence was old. I did see the small hole in the fenced area. It was big enough for someone to crawl through it. It was somewhat hidden by the bushes. I could hear some noise coming from the south side of the fence near a pickup truck, but could not see anyone. I yelled that I was the police and that the person hiding needed to come out with their hands up or else they may be bit by a police dog. I said that several times without any response.

The business owner, Ronald Masingale, lived in a mobile home in the back fenced area as well. Dispatch was attempting to contact the owner. Ronald heard the noise and came outside. I spoke to Ronald through the fence and advised him of the situation. Ronald stated that only he and his girlfriend (Rhonda Carter who was in the hot tub) were the only two people in the fenced secured area. Ronald stated that no should be back there and that he wanted to press charges on anyone who was found in the secured fence area. I spoke with Rhonda who said she was in the hot tub and did not hear anything, but did see LE flashlights going on and off and heard LE yelling at someone to come out or they will be bit by the police dog.

Ronald unlocked the fence and told us that we could search his yard. He stated again that no one was suppose to be inside the barb-wired fenced area except him and Rhonda. OFC Gorman and his K9 arrived on scene. OFC Gorman, his K9, OFC Bishop, and myself entered the fenced area from the North side. OFC Gorman made four loud K9 announcements in the fenced area. OFC Gorman stated that the suspect was also under arrest and to give up now. He made two of them

within approximately 15 feet of where the suspect was later found. OFC Gorman and his K9 were working around the pickup truck (that the complainant stated the suspect was still in the area hiding) when the suspect (later identified as Betsy Dinwiddie) was located by the K9. Dinwiddie did not make any noise or attempt to give up prior to the K9 contact.

OFC Bishop and I took Dinwiddie into custody (handcuffs DL) around 0059 hrs. I read Dinwiddie her constitutional rights around 0101 hrs. She verbally that she understood them and would waive them. A showup was contacted with Coy who stated that he was 100% positive that Dinwiddie was the suspect he saw in the yard.

Dinwiddie told me the following:

Dinwiddie stated that she crawled through the open hole in the fence to spy on Ronald and his girlfriend. Ronald was her ex-boyfriend. They dated for about 1.5 years. Dinwiddie stated that she knew she was not suppose to be there. See OFC Bishop's report for further details on Dinwiddie.

I contacted Ronald and Rhonda as Dinwiddie was walked out of the fenced area past them. Ronald and Rhonda both stated that they knew Dinwiddie. Rhonda stated that she had an anti-harassment order against Dinwiddie because she was harassing her for dating Ronald.

Ronald said that Dinwiddie was his ex-girlfriend. They dated for about 1.5 years and broke up over a year ago. Since they broke up, Ronald and Rhonda had been dating. Ronald continued on by stating that this was the second time that Dinwiddie had broke into his property. Ronald said that Dinwiddie usually cut a hole in his fence to break in and would then go about slashing all of his tires. The alarm went off last time at his business and Dinwiddie answered the phone from the alarm company and pretending to be Rhonda in order to try and cancel the alarm and police from coming. Ronald did not see any damage to his tires at this time. Ronald did not know if the hole in the fence was new or old. I gave Ronald and Rhonda a crime victim card.

CPL Busch took photographs of the hole in the fence and where the suspect was located. CPL Ennis took photographs of the K9 contact marks on Dinwiddle at Deaconess ER.

Dispatch confirmed that Dinwiddie was the respondent on a served anti-harassment order protecting Rhonda. The anti-harassment protection order was #12720788. The order stated that Dinwiddie was not allowed to be within 2 blocks of any known location of Carter. The order was signed on 1/9/2013. The order expired on 1/9/2015. A triple I was conducted and no previous convictions were found on Dinwiddie for court order violations.

Dinwiddle was under arrest for Burglary 2nd DV and Anti-harassment Order Violation. Dinwiddle was transported to Deaconess ER to be medically cleared. Dinwiddle was then transported and booked into Spokane County Jail for the above charges.

On 080314 at approx 0041hrs, I responded to assist other Officers at Ron's Tire, 2202 E Euclid. While enroute, Radio advised the Complainant/Witness Brent Coy called 911 to report a burglary in progress at Ron's Tire. Coy lives next door to the store, and observed a burglar inside the fenced area and making noise. Other Officers contacted Coy for his statement.

We located the RP and owner for the store. He advised he lives in a trailer inside the fenced area, and he was home with his girlfriend who was in the hot tub. When we arrived on scene, we contacted Ron, the owner. He opened the locked gate to the fenced area so we could check it. He advised nobody should be inside the fenced area, and if anyone is located he wanted to press charges.

I looked at the fenced area. The fence was a 6 foot tall chain link fence which also had another two feet of barbed wire on top of that. The 8 foot tall security fence was in excellent condition and was meant to keep burglars out. Due to the nature of the business, selling used tires, the fenced area was full of valuable inventory which consisted of tires, vehicles, tire changing machines, tools, trailers, etc...

Ofc Bishop and Ofc Stone advised they located a cut hole in the fence, right where next to the witness Coy's house. Coy reported that the burglar was last seen next to a vehicle, right next to the hole in the fence.

Ofc Stone, Ofc Bishop, Ofc Harvey and I positioned ourselves at the northern part of the yard, at the entrance gate. Ron and Rhonda were outside the fenced area and advised nobody else should be inside. I gave two very loud K9 announcements as follows; "Attention in the yard! This is the Spokane Police K9 Unit! Come out now or the area will be searched by the Police K9! Come out now or the K9 will find and bite you!" I waited over 30 seconds between and after the announcements. K9 Axl did not bark during or after the announcements. I observed no movements or sounds from the suspect.

I deployed SPD K9 Axl for the following reasons;

In order to thoroughly search the yard, each stack of tires would have to be looked in for someone hiding down the middle of the stack. Getting that close to a potential threat is very dangerous for searching Officers.

There was also a huge risk to Ron and Rhonda if the burglar was not located. Since they lived on site inside the fenced area, the burglar would have immediate access to ambush them if not located by the Police.

Burglars are known to carry tools and weapons. Whoever was in the yard had not been searched and was most likely armed with a weapon or a tool that could be used as such.

#### Suspects Resistance-

Whoever was in the fenced yard had hidden themselves. Instead of surrendering after the announcements, or even attempting to flee, the suspect continued to hide in an attempt to evade capture.

I deployed K9 Axl from the gate. Due to the hole in the chain link fence, I kept Axl on lead. Our search led directly to two parked vehicles along the south fence line of the yard. This was directly next to the witness Coy's residence and the hole in the fence. K9 Axl showed very high interest in the vehicles. K9 Axl showed strong indications that a suspect was close by or had recently been close by due to the scent indications. Of the two parked vehicles, the one on the right was a car, the one on the left was a truck. K9 Axl showed very high interest in or immediately around the truck. Both vehicles were surrounded by long rows of tires, placed together so the tires looked like long tubes on the ground. I chose to stop the search, make more announcements and give the suspect another chance to surrender.

From the front of the truck, I announced two more times as follows; "Attention in the area! This is the Spokane Police K9 unit! I know you are in here, and you are close! You are under arrest for Burglary! Come out now or you will be contacted by the K9!" Once again, I waited over 30 seconds between and after the announcements. I saw no movement and heard no signs of a surrender. K9 AxI didn't bark during my announcements, but he barked afterwards.

I gave K9 Axl the command to search and he did so immediately. K9 Axl went to the passenger side

of the truck, looked inside the cab, looked inside the bed, then started to crawl underneath the bed. Just as he started to crawl underneath, he flipped around and dug his nose in between the tires which were in one of the long rows. I heard the suspect, who was later identified as Betsy Dinwiddie, yell for me to get the dog. Dinwiddie had somehow crawled inside the long row of tires and was almost impossible to see. Since I was within 15 feet of the contact location, I immediately ran over and gave K9 AxI the command to release, which he did immediately. K9 AxI was on the contact less than 5 seconds.

Dinwiddie was removed from the stack of tires. Without K9 Axl, Dinwiddie might not have been located. Dinwiddie was handcuffed, placed under arrest and transported to Deaconess for treatment of the K9 contact. Cpl Busch responded and photographed the hiding location and the hole cut in the fence. A name check of Dinwiddie showed she was the respondent on a Anti-Harassment Order, which listed Rhonda as the petitioner. She was arrested for 2nd degree Burglary and Violation of the Court Order.

At Deaconess, I verified Dinwiddie had been read her constitutional rights and was willing to answer questions. She advised she had, and gave the following answers;

She was aware there was an order restraining her from being in proximity to Rhonda, but she just wanted to see her face and see what she looked like. She knew the Police K9 had arrived, and heard all four of my announcements. She didn't say anything or surrender because she was scared and "just kind of froze". She heard the K9 very close to her but still didn't say anything.

I observed her injuries. Due to her positioning, and the difficulty K9 Axl had getting to her inside the tires, she had very few injuries. Dinwiddle was laying on her stomach inside the tires and K9 Axl contacted her back. It looked as if K9 Axl attempted several contacts but couldn't get a grip because the contact location was the middle of her back. Dinwiddle looked as if she had 3-4 distinct contact locations, from her shoulders to her belt line, all in the middle of her back. All contacts had scratches and redness with only one slight puncture and no bleeding. The injuries were cleaned and covered with antibiotic ointment, no stitching was required.

Cpl Ennis photographed the injuries at Deaconess. Sgt Hallock was advised of the contact.

#### NARRATIVE:

On Saturday August 3, 2014 at 0039 hours I responded to 2202 E Euclid to investigate a burglary. I arrived onscene and contacted the complainant, Brent Coy. In summary he told me the following:

He lives at 2940 N Lee. His back bedroom window is directly outside of the south fenced tire lot of Ron's Tires at 2202 E Euclid. He was inside his house with his wife, Destiny Carlton. They heard a noise outside the window. They looked outside and window and observed what they thought was a white male wearing a white shirt and blue jeans standing outside of a vehicle inside the fenced lot. The suspect looked like he/she was trying to look inside vehicles in the lot, possibly prowling the vehicle. The suspect turned around and saw them, and then immediately dropped down to the ground and tried to hide from them.

Brent then called the police. He knew there was an open area in the fence by his window and the vehicle. He went outside and stood by the fence and the hole in the fence so the suspect did not try and leave. He waited there until the police arrived. He did not see the suspect leave the area.

Brent also said he knew an older, chubby male lived in a trailer inside the fenced area. This male was later identified as the owner of Ron's Tires, Ronald Masingale. Radio contacted Ronald by phone and advised him the police were at this location for a possible burglar. Ronald advised he lived inside the location and was there with his girlfriend in the hot tub. Radio asked Ronald to come talk to police in person.

I contacted Ronald. He was inside the fenced area and advised he was the male who lived in the trailer inside his business area. I asked Brent if he was sure Ronald was not the suspect he had observed earlier that he called the police about who had been around the truck outside his window. Brent looked at Ronald and confirmed it was not Ronald and was another suspect he saw inside the business.

#### [End of Brent's Statement]

I then spoke with Destiny Carlton. In summary she told me the following:

She was inside the residence with Brent. They heard noises coming from outside the window and

inside the business area of Ron's Tires. She observed a suspect who she thought to be a white male, wearing a white shirt and blue pants inside the fenced area of the business. Brent then called the police and they stayed outside until police arrived. The suspect did not leave the fenced area.

[End of Destiny's Statement]

I then spoke with Ronald. In summary he told me the following:

He was inside his trailer for the past hour or so. His girlfriend, Rhonda Carter, was in the hot tub outside their trailer and she had just got out and was heading inside.

Ronald and Rhonda both said they did not hear or see anything unusual inside the fenced lot. I advised Ronald that Brent had observed someone in his business yard and had called police. I asked Ronald if someone was in his yard what he would like have done. Ronald confirmed he wanted to pursue criminal charges against anyone who was inside his business fenced area, and that no one else was authorized or had his permission to be inside there.

Ron's Tire has a building on the north side of location on Euclid. It then has a fenced gate and area all the way around the business area. Inside the fenced area are tires, vehicles, and other items for the business. The fence is approximately 8 feet tall with two rows of barbed wire around the top of it.

K9 Ofc Gorman arrived onscene with his dog. Ronald allowed us in through the gate up by the building on the north side. Ronald and Rhonda both exited the fenced yard and waited for us to clear the area.

Ofc Gorman, Ofc Stone, and I entered the fenced yard. Ofc Gorman gave at least 4 announcements inside the fenced yard as we were searching. Ofc Gorman and his dog located the suspect hiding in the tires back by the truck that Brent had described. See Ofc Gorman's report for further information.

Ofc Stone and I placed the suspect, later identified as Betsy Dinwiddie, in handcuffs. Ofc Stone read Betsy her constitutional rights. I then escorted Betsy to our patrol vehicle and Ofc Stone spoke with Ronald. See Ofc Stone's report for further information.

Brent confirmed Betsy was the person he observed through his window inside the yard. He said he thought Betsy was a male because of her short hair.

I then spoke with Betsy. In summary she told me the following:

Betsy dated Ronald for about a year. They were engaged at one time.

She had been at her sister's house in Spokane Valley and was on her way home. She heard yesterday that Ronald was dating someone new. She thought it was "Galina" from his church. She decided to park down the street about 3 blocks away. She walked to this location because she knew he was living here. Betsy said she came here to "stalk him", referring to Ronald, because he broke her heart.

She walked around the fenced area until she found the hole in the fence by Brent's window. She crawled in through there and tried to see Ronald. She walked around to the middle, south center part of the fenced area and set her purse down. She observed a female in the hot tub. She could not see that far away in the dark to be able to tell who it was.

She then went back to the truck outside Brent's window to try and get a better look at who the female was. She then heard Brent talking and calling someone on the phone. This scared her so she ducked down onto the ground. She could not get out of the hole in the fence because Brent came outside and was standing by it. Betsy said she then went and crawled inside a bunch of tires in an attempt to hide.

Betsy said she heard the police announcements when we entered, but she was so scared she did not know what to do. She said she could barely move and did not yell or say anything because she was so scared.

Radio advised there was an anti-harassment order with Betsy as the respondent and Rhonda (Ronald's girlfriend) as the petitioner. Ofc Stone advised there was probable cause to charge Betsy with violation of the anti-harassment order and 2nd Degree Burglary -DV. See his report for further information.

I advised Betsy she was under arrest for the above crimes. We transported Betsy to Deaconess for her injuries from the K9. Corporal Ennis responded and took photographs of her injuries. Betsy was cleared for Jail from the hospital.

We transported Betsy to Jail and booked her in on one new count of 2nd Burglary-DV and Violation of the Anti-Harassment Order.
