### Incident Summary

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After reading the attached documents and speaking with involved officers, I find that Officer Lesser's deployment of K-9 Rav as a locating and apprehension tool was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, Department Policy and met Department expectations. (Based on the suspect's active resistance.)

After Rav located and apprehended the suspect I find that Officer Lesser's deployment of the X26P CEW in probe mode was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, Department Policy and met Department expectations. (Based on the suspect's assaultive resistance.)

Due to the ineffectiveness of Officer Lesser's initial CEW deployment I find that Cpl. Bartlett's initiation of a second cycle on this deployed CEW was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, Policy and met Department expectations. (Based on the suspect's assaultive resistance.)

Due the ineffectiveness of Cpl. Bartlett's initiated second cycle on the originally deployed CEW (confirmed by bar graph on download document) I find that Ofc. Palmer's deployment of the X-2 CEW was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, Department Policy and met Department expectations. (Based on the suspect's assaultive resistance.)

Further I find that the Officers on scene and the command and control of Sgt. Hartman were exceptional. These officers utilized appropriate tactics, personnel, equipment and thorough de-escalation techniques to resolve this incident.

## Report Narrative

The suspect, Urbanski, had a confirmed felony DOC Escape warrant. The original charge was for Possession of a Controlled Substance. Officers gave multiple announcements from outside the residence via the patrol car's public address system. Urbanski refused to come out.

We then proceeded to the north east back door that had been left open. I made two very loud announcements, "Attention in the house- Richard you are under arrest. You need to come out now or the house will be searched by a police dog and when he finds you he will bite you". During the announcements I made sure that K9, Rav, was quiet and that his barking would not distort my announcements. After the announcement I had Rav bark. Once Rav was done barking I made sure he was quiet again so that if Urbanski responded in any way I would be able to hear him and he said nothing.

I decided to deploy my K9, Rav, in an attempt to locate Urbanski for the following reasons:

- Urbanski was currently wanted for a felony DOC Escape warrant with the original charge being Possession of a Controlled Substance.
- He was actively resisting / evading arrest.
- He had not been searched and it was unknown if he possessed any weapons.
- He had refused all of our verbal requests to surrender and exit the residence.
- He was listed as a violent offender by DOC.
- He also showed to be assaultive and resistive towards law enforcement.
- He also showed to have made statements of suicide by cop.
- As of two days ago Ofc Yrigollen stated that he had received information that - Urbanski was armed with a large knife
- Urbanski had been inside the residence for at least 60 minutes and had ample time to secrete himself or set up a possible ambush for searching officers
- And by utilizing K9, Rav, as a searching and locating tool it minimizes the risk to Urbanski and officers especially based on the statements made by Urbanski wanting a suicide by cop. By deploying Rav it gives myself and other officer's stand off distance to avoid any risk with close quarter apprehensions.

I deployed Rav initially on a long line to clear the immediate kitchen area. We then moved up and as officers held and covered the doorway that led to the living room I cleared the bathroom and a bedroom on the nw corner of the house with Ofc Yrigollen and Ofc Willard.

I then moved back up to the doorway that led to the living room area. I put Rav into a down position. I gave two more very loud announcements " Richard this is the Spokane Police Department K9 unit you are under arrest. You need to come out now or the house will be searched by a police dog and when he finds you he will bite you". During the announcements I made sure that K9, Rav, was quiet and that his barking would not distort my announcements. After the announcement I had Rav bark. Once Rav was done barking I made sure he was quiet again so that if Urbanski responded in any way I would be able to hear him and he said nothing.

I gave Rav the search command and he entered a bedroom on my left about 5 ft away from us. I could hear him working the room and then I heard what sounded like a struggle. We entered

the room and did not see Rav. I checked the closet and I could see that Rav had entered a small crawl space that was underneath the stairs that went to the second level. The opening to the crawl space was about 18inches x 20 inches.

I shined my light inside and I could see large pieces of foam mattress and insulation. I could see Rav's back feet. I gave Rav the recall command but he did not return. I looked again and I could see the suspect had wrapped at least one hand around Rav's collar and was attempting to choke Rav. I could hear Rav's breathing change and it sounded like he was having difficulty breathing.

I continued to yell at the suspect to show me his hands and let go of the dog. Urbanski refused and instead of letting go it appeared he was twisting the collar harder. Again I yelled at him to let go of the dog and I would have him release the contact but Urbanski would not.

The situation was extremely tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving. We were in a confined space. I could not verbally recall my K9, Rav, due to Urbanski twisting Rav's collar and choking him. Urbanski would not follow any commands nor would he say anything. He would not show me his other hand. He had not been searched and it was unknown if he possessed any type of weapons. I continued to tell Urbanski to stop fighting and he refused. I could not enter the small crawl space to attempt to go hands on with Urbanski nor did I want to not being able to see his other hand and that he had not been searched. Urbanski was also kicking at the opening. Based on the reasons above I deployed a Taser in an attempt to gain control of Urbanski.

I did not have a Taser on my vest carrier so I asked Cpl Bartlett to hand me his. The space was too small for Cpl Bartlett to deploy so I would have to do it. I had a target area of Urbanski's buttocks and it was the only place that I could deploy the Taser without striking K9, Rav. I deployed the Taser and it struck the targeted area. This was the first time that Urbanski had made any noise. I was able to see his second hand and could see that it was clear. I reached out and went to grab Urbanski's foot and pull him out. After the initial five second burst was over Urbanski began kicking with his feet at me. I asked Cpl Bartlett to give his a second Taser application based on Urbanski's action. However one of the initial darts had come out and the Taser was ineffective. Ofc Palmer deployed his Taser which was effective.

At this point I was finally able to get Urbanski to let go of Rav. I downed Rav in place and reached down and was able to pull Urbanski clear and passed him off the other officers at the doorway who took him into custody.

AMR arrived on scene and removed the remaining three Taser darts. Ofc Yrigollen and Ofc Willard transported Urbanski to Deaconess Medical Center. At the hospital I inspected Urbanski's injuries. He had what appeared to be several K9 rakes on the left wrist area. He also had what appeared to be several scratches on his right shoulder area. The doctor inspected the injuries but Urbanski refused any type of medical treatment.

Cpl Bartlett arrived and photographed Urbanski's injuries. Sgt Hartman was advised on scene of the K9 contact and Sgt Kendall also responded to the hospital. See other officer's reports for further info.

Urbanski was transported to jail and booked on the outstanding DOC warrant. He was also charged for Harming a Police dog when he maliciously tried to choke Rav with his collar along with resisting arrest.

I estimated that the distance from where I gave the second set of announcements from the kitchen doorway to the closet was about 15 feet.

On 08/12/2014, at 1511 hours, Ofc. Willard and I were working in the Chronic Offender Unit. We were actively looking for wanted Chronic Offender Richard Urbanski who had an active DOC warrant for his arrest.

We were able to obtain information that Richard was staying at 613 E 9th. We contacted Shawn Davuletcher who gave us permission to search her residence which was located on the second floor apartment #2. While heading there I came into contact with Carl Bautista who stated Richard was in the apartment. I then asked them to step outside with me while I checked for a K9 unit to respond.

While outside Carl told me that Richard has been recently since yesterday carrying a large knife around the house with him. Carl and Shawn also stated Richard has been making suicidal statements if he comes into contact with the police which matched prior information.

Carl and Shawn allowed a search of both of their apartments and also signed search consent cards.

I contacted Sgt. Hartman who responded to the scene along with negotiators and a K9 unit. Several attempts to have Richard exit the house willingly were refused. K9 officer Lesser,D then took over the scene for his search and dog bite. For further information see officer Lesser,D's report.

We then transported Richard to Deaconess for treatment of minor marks. It should be noted Richard was not making suicidal statements when contacted. Richard was released and we transported him to the Spokane County Jail. Richard was booked in on the listed charge of Harming a Police Dog which is detailed in Ofc. Lesser,D's report. Ofc. Willard completed a settle on the missing person report for Richard. The search concent cards were completed and turned into records.

At 1542 hrs on 8-12-14, I responded to 613 E 9th to assist other officers with a barricaded subject. Richard Urbanski was wanted and was refusing to come out.

After numerous verbal announcements I entered the residence with other officers, via the open back door. We began to search the main floor. K15 found Richard hiding in a crawl space on the east side of the residence.

The K9 had made contact with Richard and he began fighting with the dog. I heard the K9 make several yelping sounds. I heard Ofc Lesser repeatedly yell at Richard to, "Let go of the dog!" Richard did not comply.

Cpl. Bartlett deployed his taser and we again ordered Richard to let go of the dog. Richard continued to fight with the K9 and refused to follow our commands.

I could only see one of Richards hands which was grabbing the K9. The other hand was out of view behind the K9. I then deployed my taser (X2 model) to Richards mid-section from a distance of about 8 ft for 5 seconds. Both probes contacted Richard's stomach area.

Richard then let go of the K9 and complied with our commands. He was then taken into custody. He was treated at the scene by SFD and then transported to Deaconess by AMR.

Cpl. Bartlett later placed both taser cartridges into Property as evidence.

Sgt. Waters was onscene and advised of the taser deployments.

On 8/12/14 at about 1540 hours I was at my residence when I received a page from radio requesting that a K9 unit respond to 613 E. 9th. The page stated units were looking for Richard Urbanski who had a Felony DOC Escape warrant (which was confirmed).

I was in plain clothes so I threw my vest carrier on and responded with K9, Rav.

While enroute radio advised that the original charge on the DOC Escape warrant was for Possession of a Controlled Substance. I also asked radio to check his criminal history and they stated that he had extensive stat 5-flyer entries for suspicious person and drugs. He showed to be resistive and assaultive towards law enforcement, which was listed on the DOC Escape warrant. Radio also stated his recent convictions were for 1st Burglary, Possession of a Controlled Substance, and was listed as a violent offender. I also noticed that when I checked WACIC it also stated that the suspect had made suicide by cop threats.

I arrived on scene and contacted Sgt Hartman. He stated that Ofc Yrigollen and Ofc Willard (Chronic Offender Unit) had located Urbanski inside of 613 E. 9th. He stated that when officers went to the door of the residence and spoke with the residents and asked them if Urbanski was inside they stated he was. They stated they had last seen him going towards the living room.

Sgt Hartman confirmed that this was Urbanski's primary residence where he had been living and they also had consent from the home owner's to enter the residence in an attempt to locate Urbanski and place him under arrest. He also stated there should not be anyone else in the residence except for the suspect.

I also spoke with Ofc Yrigollen and he stated that a couple of weeks ago Urbanski fled and was located by a SCSO K9 unit. At that time Richard made statements of not going back to jail. He also stated that he had received information that as of two days ago Richard was armed with a large knife.

Sgt Hartman advised that Sgt Waters and Ofc O'Brien ( both trained negotiators) were also on scene. They pulled their patrol vehicle up to the front of the residence (sw corner) and made multiple announcements over the PA system advised Urbanski that he was under arrest and asked him to exit the residence. Urbanski did not respond nor did he exit the house.

We worked our way to the back door on the north east corner of the residence. The door was already open. I reached up and opened the screen door and made two very loud announcements into the residence **"Attention in the house- Richard you are under arrest. You need to come out now or the house will be searched by a police dog and when he finds you he will bite you"**. During the announcements I made sure that K9, Rav, was quiet and that his barking would not distort my announcements. After the announcement I had Rav bark. Once Rav was done barking I made sure he was quiet again so that if Urbanski responded in any way I would be able to hear him and he said nothing.

I decided to deploy my K9, Rav, in an attempt to locate Urbanski for the following reasons:

- Urbanski was currently wanted for a felony DOC Escape warrant with the original charge being Possession of a

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Controlled Substance.

- He was actively resisting / evading arrest.
- He had not been searched and it was unknown if he possessed any weapons.
- He had refused all of our verbal requests to surrender and exit the residence.
- He was listed as a violent offender by DOC.
- He also showed to be assaultive and resistive towards law enforcement.
- He also showed to have made statements of suicide by cop.
- As of two days ago Ofc Yrigollen stated that he had received information that Urbanski was armed with a large knife
- Urbanski had been inside the residence for at least 60 minutes and had ample time to secrete himself or set up a possible ambush for searching officers
- And by utilizing K9, Rav, as a searching and locating tool it minimizes the risk to Urbanski and officers especially based on the statements made by Urbanski wanting a suicide by cop. By deploying Rav it gives myself and other officer's stand off distance to avoid any risk with close quarter apprehensions.

I deployed Rav initially on a long line to clear the immediate kitchen area. We then moved up and as officers held and covered the doorway that led to the living room I cleared the bathroom and a bedroom on the nw corner of the house with Ofc Yrigollen and Ofc Willard.

I then moved back up to the doorway that led to the living room area. I put Rav into a down position. I gave two more very loud announcements " **Richard this is the Spokane Police Department K9 unit you are under arrest. You need to come out now or the house will be searched by a police dog and when he finds you he will bite you**". During the announcements I made sure that K9, Rav, was quiet and that his barking would not distort my announcements. After the announcement I had Rav bark. Once Rav was done barking I made sure he was quiet again so that if Urbanski responded in any way I would be able to hear him and he said nothing.

I gave Rav the search command and he entered a bedroom on my left about 5 ft away from us. I could hear him working the room and then I heard what sounded like a struggle. We entered the room and did not see Rav. I checked the closet and I could see that Rav had entered a small crawl space that was underneath the stairs that went to the second level. The opening to the crawl space was about 18inches x 20 inches.

I shined my light inside and I could see large pieces of foam mattress and insulation. I could see Rav's back feet. I gave Rav the recall command but he did not return. I looked again and I could see the suspect had wrapped at least one hand around Rav's collar and was attempting to choke Rav. I could hear Rav's breathing change and it sounded like he was having difficulty breathing.

I continued to yell at the suspect to show me his hands and let go of the dog. Urbanski refused and instead of letting go it appeared he was twisting the collar harder. Again I yelled at him to let go of the dog and I would have him release the contact but Urbanski would not.

The situation was extremely tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving. We were in a confined space. I could not verbally recall my K9, Rav, due to Urbanski twisting Rav's collar and choking him. Urbanski would not follow any commands nor would he say anything. He would not show me his other hand. He had not been searched and it was unknown if he possessed any type of weapons. I continued to tell Urbanski to stop fighting and he refused. I could not

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enter the small crawl space to attempt to go hands on with Urbanski nor did I want to not being able to see his other hand and that he had not been searched. Urbanski was also kicking at the opening. Based on the reasons above I deployed a Taser in an attempt to gain control of Urbanski.

I did not have a Taser on my vest carrier so I asked Cpl Bartlett to hand me his. The space was too small for Cpl Bartlett to deploy so I would have to do it. I had a target area of Urbanski's buttocks and it was the only place that I could deploy the Taser without striking K9, Rav. I deployed the Taser and it struck the targeted area. This was the first time that Urbanski had made any noise. I was able to see his second hand and could see that it was clear. I reached out and went to grab Urbanski's foot and pull him out. After the initial five second burst was over Urbanski began kicking with his feet at me. I asked Cpl Bartlett to give his a second Taser application based on Urbanski's action. However one of the initial darts had come out and the Taser was ineffective. Ofc Palmer deployed his Taser which was effective.

At this point I was finally able to get Urbanski to let go of Rav. I downed Rav in place and reached down and was able to pull Urbanski clear and passed him off the other officers at the doorway who took him into custody.

AMR arrived on scene and removed the remaining three Taser darts. Ofc Yrigollen and Ofc Willard transported Urbanski to Deaconess Medical Center. At the hospital I inspected Urbanski's injuries. He had what appeared to be several K9 rakes on the left wrist area. He also had what appeared to be several scratches on his right shoulder area. The doctor inspected the injuries but Urbanski refused any type of medical treatment.

Cpl Bartlett arrived and photographed Urbanski's injuries. Sgt Hartman was advised on scene of the K9 contact and Sgt Kendall also responded to the hospital. See other officer's reports for further info.

Urbanski was transported to jail and booked on the outstanding DOC warrant. He was also charged for Harming a Police dog when he maliciously tried to choke Rav with his collar along with resisting arrest.

I estimated that the distance from where I gave the second set of announcements from the kitchen doorway to the closet was about 15 feet.

ON 08/12/2014 at approximately 1600 hours I responded to 613 E 9th to assist officers with a warrant arrest.

The wanted person, Richard Urbanski, had reportedly made threats to harm officers in the past. While en route officers advised that Urbanski refused to come out of the residence. Officer Yrigollen advised he had consent to enter from the residents and showed me signed consent cards.

I was present when Officer O'Brien made several announcements over a patrol vehicle public address speaker advising Urbanski he was under arrest. Urbanski was also urged to come out of the residence. The announcement was loud enough that I observed neighbors approximately 1/2 block away come out of their homes.

After several minutes K-9 Officer Lesser, myself and other officers approached the rear door of the residence. The rear door faces east on the east side of the house.

We opened the back door and made several more announcements. We entered and cleared the kitchen area (see Officer D Lesser's report).

More announcements were made from the kitchen area prior to clearing the remainder of the residence.

I heard Officer Lesser clearly shout for someone to show him his hands. Officer Lesser was in the southeast bedroom of the residence. I entered the room and saw Officer Lesser in the entrance to a small closet. It sounded as if there was a fight occurring further inside the closet. I did not hear any voices, but I heard several loud sounds similar to someone being thrown around.

The closet was very small and there was not enough room for two officers. I looked in the closet and saw a very small opening at the east end. Officer Lesser illuminated the opening with his flashlight. I could see a males lower legs and the lower part of his body. The male was moving around, but not saying anything.

I then saw the male roll to one side. I could see that he hold of Officer Lesser's K-9. I could not see what part of the dog he had hold of, but his right hand was made nearly into a fist with a large

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amount of the k-9's coat. The male, later identified as Richard Urbanski, was pushing and pulling the dog from side to side. Urbanski did not appear to be pushing the k-9 away, but was instead pushing and pulling on it.

After several seconds Officer Lesser asked for my Taser. I believed that Urbanski was assaulting Officer Lesser's police dog. As there was not enough room for both Officer Lesser and I, I handed him my Taser. I heard Officer Lesser warn Urbanski to let go of the police k-9 or he was going to be Tased. I could not fully see Urbanski or the k-9, but I could hear the struggle inside the small space adjacent to the closet.

Officer Lesser deployed the Taser (see his report).

After the Taser application Officer Lesser handed it to me. I believed the probes were still attached and stepped away from the closet entrance to allow Urbanski to come out.

It first appeared that Urbanski was going to surrender. After a few seconds I again heard what I believed to be a struggle. Officer Lesser advised to give a second Taser application. I could not see what was occurring, but could hear the concern in his voice.

I activated my Taser. At about the same time Officer Palmer deployed his Taser (see his report).

Urbanski was slid out of the closet and handcuffed.

Medics checked Urbanski (see Officer Yrigollen's report). I secured my Taser and cartridge. I also secured Officer Palmer's Taser cartridge. As I was securing my cartridge I found that one of the probes had become dislodged. It appeared it came out as Urbanski was coming out of the small space and into the closet.

I photographed the closet area and space Urbanski was hiding. I placed the spent Taser cartridges on property.

I responded to the hospital and photographed Urbanski.

Lt. King advised me to clarify my initial report and use of force (Taser Application).

At the point where K9 contact was made, it was a confined area. I was 5th in line, into the room, behind Lesser, Bartlett, Willard, and Yrigollen. I did not see the initial Taser deployment.

I stepped into the room at the point when Ofc. Lesser called for a second Taser deployment. It was at that point that I first observed Richard Urbanski. I could see him grabbing the K9 and I could only see one of his hands.

Crime: DOC Escape Warrant, Resisting Arrest, Harming a Police Dog

Threat: Richard was in a confined space. The area had not been searched and the potential for weapons was high. He was actively resisting arrest. he had made statement to others that he would not be taken alive. He had a lengthy history of eluding/assaulting police. He was thought to be armed with a knife.

Resistance: Richard was fighting with a police K9. He was refusing to comply with repeated demands to let go of the K9.

Ofc Lesser had supporting Graham factors and had asked for a second Taser deployment. (See his Additional Rpt) Based on this I then deployed my X2 Taser to Richard's abdomen from a distance of about 8ft for 5 seconds. Richard then let go of the dog and complied with out demands and was taken into custody.

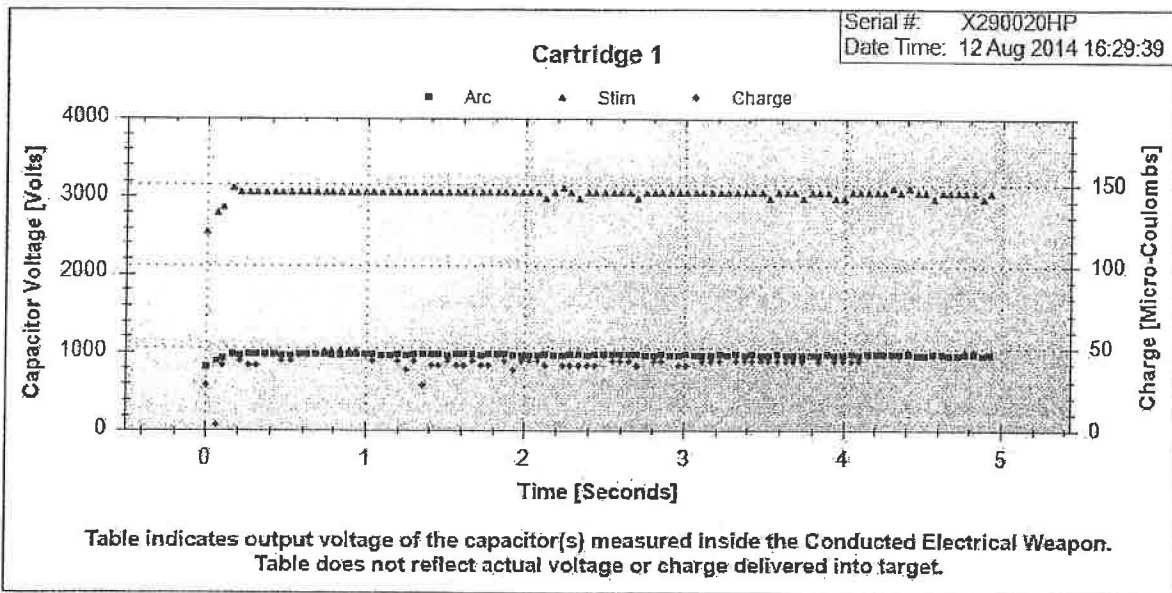

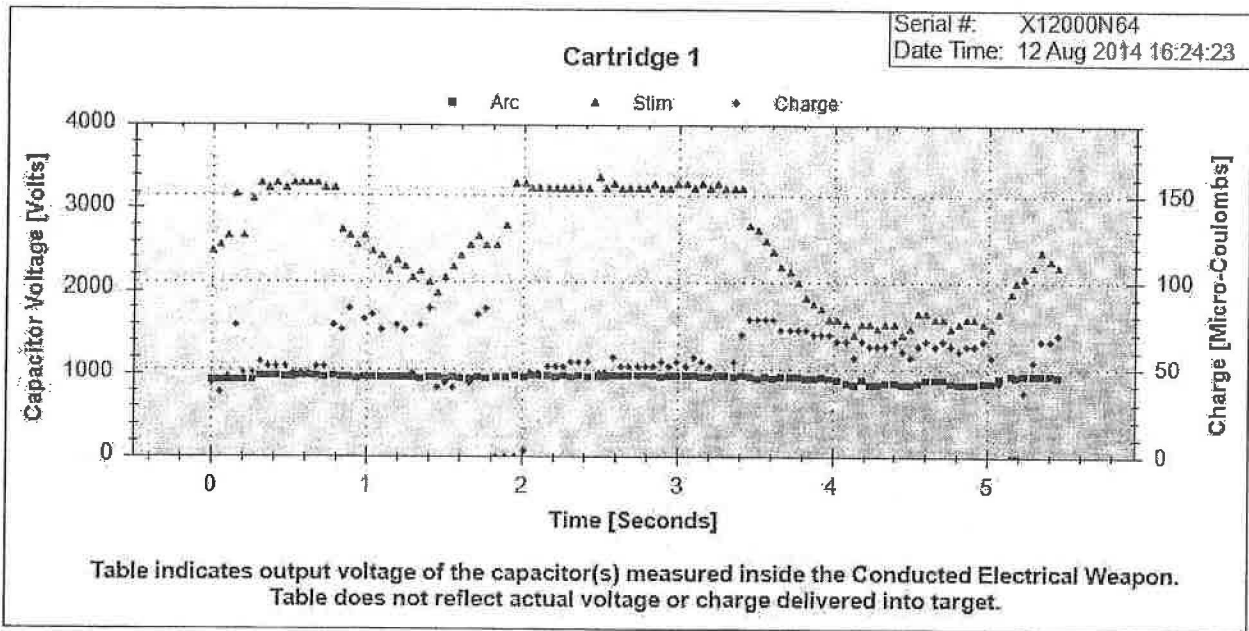

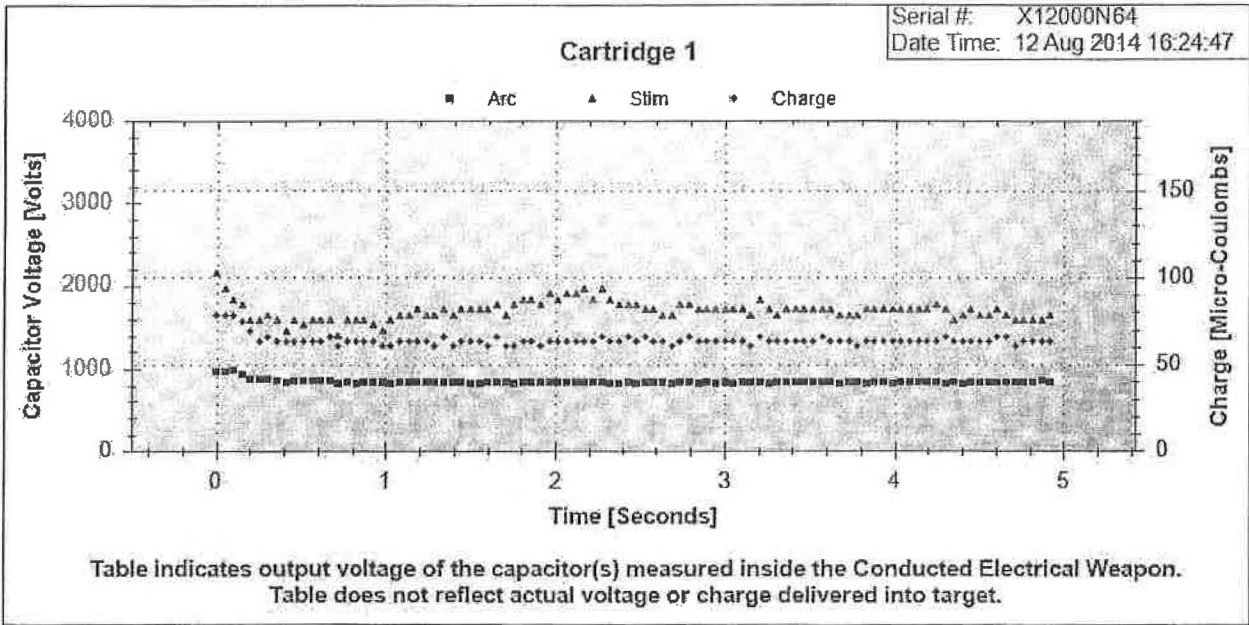
