

Investigative Summary

On 082314 I responded at the request of Officer Beltiz, who had arrested a male and was requesting a supervisor.

Officer Beltiz had located a male that he identified as having a warrant (see attached arrest reports)

The suspect, Jeffery Swecker, was in custody and handcuffed (DL). Swecker had a small amount of blood coming from his left nostril and in his mustache. Swecker also had a scrape on his right elbow. Both injuries were consistent with abrasions sustained during an arrest on the abrasive roadway surface that he was arrested on.

I contacted Swecker and I asked him if he would be willing to speak to me and he said that he would

Swecker said that he was contacted by the officer. Swecker was speaking very slowly and his words were a mumble. I asked him if he had been drinking or using any drugs and he admitted that he had used about 5 dollars worth of methamphetamine several hours ago.

Swecker said that he uses around a gram of methamphetamine a week.

Tonight he was contacted by the officer and that they were talking. Swecker said that he thought that they were done talking so he was walking away, the officer told him that he was under arrest but he didn't think that he had anything to arrest him for so he kept walking. I asked him why he thought that and he said, "I was being arrogant"

Swecker said that when the officer grabbed him he, "Jandered his forearm into the officers face". I asked him what Jandered meant and he just repeated the word several times. Swecker said that he made two attempts to hit the officer.

I asked him why he wanted to hit the officer and he said that he felt that he was still in the right. He then said that the officer put him in a headlock and had him on the ground. I told Swecker that he shouldn't fight the police and he said, "Yeah, I know it's wrong"

Based on the officer's reports, the physical evidence and Swecker's statements it's objectively reasonable to believe that Swecker's actions were assaultive¹ towards the officer, and that the application of the level 2 neck restraint against an assaultive resistor is an objectively reasonable application of force and within the Spokane Police Department's policy and training.

¹ A reasonable perception that the actions of the individual would result in an assault on a individual or officer, and that the scope and severity of the assault would support the reasonable conclusion that the assault would not result in great bodily harm or death

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On 082314 at approximately 2146 hrs. I was in the area of Hartson and Haven investigating a possible fire. While I was out of my patrol car attempting to locate the origination of smoke, a male walked past me who I recognized from past contacts as Jeffrey A. Swecker. I said hi Jeff and the male replied, "hi officer."

I asked Jeffrey if he knew where the smoke was coming from. Jeffrey stated that he had no idea where the smoke was coming from. After seeing him, calling him by his name, and the fact that he answered to Jeff, I was 100% certain that the male I was talking to was Jeffrey A Swecker.

After Jeffrey walked past me, I got back in my patrol car and pulled up his SPRS photo to confirm that it was indeed Jeffrey. The photo matched the male that I was talking to and made me even more certain that it was Jeffrey A. Swecker. I conducted a quick records search of Jeffrey's name and noticed that he had an active outstanding misdemeanor warrant for Violation of a DV No Contact Order.

I was certain that the warrant was an exact match of name and date of birth for Jeffrey. I then drove south on Haven St to Hartson Ave and drove west on Hartson Ave in an effort to locate Jeffrey. I located Jeffrey in the area just to the west of Nelson and Hartson. We are approximately mid block on the 2700 block of E Hartson.

I drove my patrol car up to Jeffrey without activating my emergency overhead lights and exited my vehicle and called out to Jeffrey. I put myself out with radio with a warrant subject and provided them with Jeffrey's name. I asked him to come back and talk to me.

At first, Jeffrey continued to walk away until I again asked him to come over and talk to me. Jeffrey then came to me and said "what's up." I began to ask Jeffrey if you knew any more about the possible fire that I was looking in to. I then began to make conversation about his older brother who had some troubles with the law in the past.

I was merely stalling until my back up arrived to assist me in taking Jeffrey into custody. Suddenly, Jeffrey just stopped talking and turned and started to walk away from me. I told Jeffrey he was not free to leave and that he was under arrest for his warrant. Jeffrey placed both of his hands into his front pockets and continued to walk away from me.

I reached out and grabbed ahold of Jeffrey's left wrist keeping his left hand inside of his pocket to prevent him from displaying or producing any type of weapon. When I did this, Jeffrey removed his right hand from his pocket and started to take a swing at me in an effort to punch me in the face. Jeffrey's right fist was balled up and his jaw clenched. I could see the tendons in his neck stick out when he did this. His knuckles had turned white from how tight he was clenching his fists.

*****At the time of the contact with Jeffrey, I was investigating an active arrest warrant for him for a DV assault No Contact Order Violation. The crime of DV Assault is a crime of violence.

*****I have known Jeffrey for approximately 10 years. When I was a corrections officer working in the jail, I had several contacts with Jeffrey there. I was aware that Jeffrey has a history of violence and can be very dangerous when contacted. Jeffrey has a history of mental health issues, including schizophrenia, which could make contact with him even more dangerous. When I contacted Jeffrey I was alone and the area was dark with minimal lighting from street lights. Jeffrey had not been frisked for weapons and therefore could be concealing several different types of weapons on his person. I was uncertain as to how far away my back up was when I contacted Jeffrey.

*****It was clear to me, that when Jeffrey decided to walk away mid sentence and end our conversation, that he wanted to get away from me. When I told Jeffrey to stop and took control of his left hand he brought his right hand up in assaultive matter clenching his right fist into a ball and starting to throw punch at me. As Jeffrey did this, he was also attempting to pull his left hand away from my control. I had already told Jeffrey that he was under arrest for his warrant. Jeffrey didn't seem to care that I had told him he was under arrest and he continued to pull away from me in an effort to flee. As Jeffrey attempted to flee, with his right hand up, fist clenched, ready to punch me, he clearly showed that he would do whatever it took to evade

arrest. I had pulled up in a fully marked police car, wearing the uniform of the day, and identified myself as the police, and also notified Jeffrey that he was under arrest. There was no telling what Jeffrey would do to get away.

For the above-mentioned reasons, when Jeffrey lifted his right hand, made a fist, and began to swing at me, I took Jeffrey to the ground. I again told Jeffrey he was under arrest and I told him to stop resisting. Jeffrey continued to fight me and was attempting to pull away from my control. Jeffrey's arms were flailing and he was attempting to reach out towards my face. I had now applied a level one lateral neck restraint (LNR) in an effort to control Jeffrey until my backup arrived.

Jeffrey was now face down on the asphalt of E Hartson Ave, and I was on top of his back. I had my right arm around the front of his neck holding the level one LNR. Several times I told Jeffrey to stop resisting. Suddenly, I felt Jeffrey's left arm slide down by his left side and it appeared that he was reaching for my duty weapon.

I am left-handed, therefore, my weapon is on the left side of my duty belt. To avoid Jeffrey accessing my duty weapon, I had to slide my legs and hips off to the right side of Jeffrey's body. Jeffrey again attempted to reach up towards my face and it seemed as if he was trying to claw on my face or my eyes.

I then rolled myself onto my back and pulled Jeffrey on top of me. I tightened my hold on the LNR applying more pressure and applied a level two LNR rendering Jeffrey unconscious. I then rolled Jeffrey onto his stomach while maintaining the LNR. I was now completely on top of Jeffrey's back.

Shortly after this time, Ofc. Stone and Ofc. Thompson arrived on scene to assist me. I notified Ofc. Stone that I had good upper body control of Jeffrey and I needed them to take control of his arms. See their reports for further details.

Just as Ofc. Stone arrived on scene, Jeffrey regained consciousness because I had loosened the pressure on the LNR. Once Jeffrey regain consciousness, and as Ofc. Stone and Ofc. Thompson were attempting to take control of Jeffrey's arms to place him into handcuffs, he began to flail his arms around again.

I could feel Jeffrey grabbing onto my right leg with one of his hands. I then applied more pressure to my neck restraint and again rendered Jeffrey unconscious. Ofc. Stone and Ofc. Thompson were then able to get control of Jeffrey's hands and place them into handcuffs. Jeffrey quickly regained consciousness after he was in custody.

I could see that there was blood on the asphalt and it appeared to be coming from Jeffrey's nose. We rolled Jeffrey onto his side into the recovery position and notified Radio that we needed medics and a supervisor. Medics arrived on scene and checked out Jeffrey for his injuries. It appeared that the blood was only coming from his nose, and that he had some small scrapes from the asphalt on his face.

Medics on scene cleared Jeffrey for jail. I requested a Corporal to photograph Jeffrey's injuries and Cpl. Kakuda arrived and took these photos for me. Sgt. Boothe arrived on scene and I briefed him of the incident. After medics cleared Jeffrey, and Sgt. Boothe spoke with him. I transported Jeffrey to jail. Along the way I notify Jeffrey that he was under arrest for 3rd degree assault L/E and resisting arrest.

Along with the assault and resisting arrest charge, Jeffrey was also under arrest for obstructing. While I was waiting for radio to confirm the warrant on Jeffrey, and waiting for my back up to arrive, Jeffrey attempted to walk away from me when he was not free to go. This willfully hindered and delayed my investigation while I was waiting for the return.

While enroute to jail, I was notified that there was an active DV no contact order preventing Jeffrey from being in the area that he was in. Jeffrey was prohibited from being within two city blocks of 2625 E Hartson Ave. This was only one block from where I contacted Jeffrey. Jeffrey was also walking west which was towards the location he was prohibited from.

However, I did not arrest and book Jeffrey on the no contact order violation because the victim was his father who is deceased. His father has been deceased since early in this year. The order was from 2009 and for some reason had not been canceled when his father passed away.

When we arrived at jail to book Jeffrey, the jail nurse declined him for acceptance because he had been rendered unconscious. She stated that although medics had cleared him on scene, he needed to be cleared by a doctor at the hospital per their policy.

I transported Jeffrey to Deaconess ER and had him evaluated by doctor there. Jeffrey was given a full exam by several nurses and two separate doctors. They all indicated that Jeffrey had no medical issues and was cleared to be booked into jail.

While at the hospital with Jeffrey I overheard him talking to the doctor. Jeffrey said to the doctor "I moved my fist towards the officers face two separate times. I should expect this. I should've gotten much worse for what I did."

After Jeffrey was cleared by the hospital, I transported him back to jail. I booked Jeffrey into jail for 3rd Degree Assault L/E, obstructing, and resisting arrest. Sgt. Boothe was on scene and aware of the arrest and booking and I completed a PC affidavit per department policy.

On 8/23/2014 at approximately 2146 hrs, OFC Thompson and I were dispatched to Haven/Hartson to back Ofc Belitz on a warrant. Ofc Belitz was out with the suspect, Jeffrey Swecker. As we approached 3rd/Haven, I heard Ofc Belitz get on the radio and say "step it up." It sounded as if Ofc Belitz was in a physical confrontation with someone.

I activated my emergency equipment (lights and sirens) and drove SB on Haven St. As we approached Haven/Hartson, I looked WB down Hartson and observed the taillights of Ofc Belitz's patrol car. We turned WB on Hartson and approximately 40 feet west of Hartson/Nelson, I saw Ofc Belitz attempting to gain control of the suspect as they were on the ground. Swecker was kicking his feet and fighting with Ofc Belitz.

I exited my patrol car and ran over to help. I yelled several times that Swecker was under arrest and to stop resisting as I attempted to gain control of Swecker's left arm. Swecker refused to cooperate and continued to kick and flail. Ofc Thompson was trying to get Swecker's right arm in control. Swecker's arms were underneath his body and he refused to cooperate and stop fighting. Ofc Belitz was attempting to gain control of Swecker's upper body throughout this time. Swecker was bigger person in stature. Swecker was approximately 6' and about 180 lbs using all of his strength to keep his hands/arms underneath his body and kick around.

I told Swecker that he was going to get tazed if he continued to resist and fight. Swecker calmed down somewhat after that and I was able to gain control of Swecker's left arm. Ofc Thompson had gained control of his right arm at this time as well. I placed Swecker in handcuffs (DL). Swecker had a bloody nose and some scraps. Some of Swecker's blood was on my hands from the struggle of him resisting.

I advised dispatch of Swecker in custody and asked for medics and a supervisor. I sat Swecker up. Medics and Sgt. Boothe arrived on scene.

On 08/23/2014 at 2149 hours I was dispatched to back Ofc. Belitz at Nelson and Hartson. Ofc. Belitz stopped a male who was known to have a warrant. I was working in a two man unit with Ofc. Stone.

Ofc. Stone and myself were enroute to Ofc. Belitz when he called for units to step it up. While approaching Ofc. Belitz's location you could see he was in a struggle with the suspect on the ground. Ofc. Belitz appeared to be trying to gain control of the suspect. You could see the suspect was still actively fighting and resisting Ofc. Belitz by kicking and flailing around.

Once I made contact with them I immediately tried to gain right arm control. The suspect had his arms clinched under his body, I was physically unable to remove them to place the suspect in hand cuffs.

I heard Ofc. Stone readily say several times "you are under arrest, stop resisting". The suspect continued to be uncompliant and resist with his arms and hands under his body. Ofc. Stone also told the suspect that if he continued to resist he would be Tazed.

I placed my knee on his lower right back in order to gain control of his hips and to keep him from moving. The suspect was kicking around. As I was doing this, I was successful in gaining right arm control. Ofc. Stone gained left arm control and he placed handcuffs (DL) on the suspect.

The suspect had a bloody nose and scrapes on his arms, hands and face. Corporal Kakuda came and took photos of the suspect. Medics came and checked the suspect, for treatment.
