



Report Narrative

On 083014 at approx 1856hrs, I responded to assist other Officers with a warrant pick up at 816 N Cannon. While enroute, radio advised Officers were called to the residence for a reported domestic disturbance. While on scene, they determined there was no crime but the suspect, Jolene Danaher had an outstanding felony warrant for 1st degree Armed Robbery. The confirmed warrant listed 816 N Cannon as the address for Danaher. During this incident, she was supposedly armed with a knife.

While enroute, I quickly read the call on the computer. Radio summarized Danaher's criminal background as follows; 'Felony warrant for 1st degree Robbery (Armed), confirmed gang member (Arvans), Violent Offender, Convicted Felon, Suspended Drivers License'.

Upon arrival I contacted Sgt Lee. Sgt Lee advised on scene Officers had already cleared the main floor of the residence, removed several people from the residence and had been attempting verbal contact with Danaher for approx 20 minutes. When the other people exited the residence, they advised Danaher was inside and upstairs. They also advised there was nobody else besides Danaher inside and no pets. Once inside I contacted Ofc Stone and Ofc Pavlischak. Both advised they had been yelling up the stairs at Danaher, and ordering her to surrender. There was no response to their commands. They requested K9 assistance due to the tight, steep stairwell which led to a blind landing at the top.

I moved to the bottom of the stairs and made two loud announcements as follows; "Attention in the residence! This is the Spokane Police K9 Unit! Jolene, You are under arrest for you warrant! Come out now, or the K9 will be used! When the K9 finds you, he will bite you!" Both announcements were made at the bottom of the stairs, in a very loud voice. K9 Axl barked after, but not during the announcements. I waited over 30 seconds after each announcement and heard no movement or voices.

I deployed SPD K9 Axl for the following reasons;

Crime-

Danaher was wanted on a confirmed outstanding warrant for 1st Degree Armed Robbery, a violent Felony.

Threat to Officer/Public-

Danaher has a very long history of violence. She is a confirmed Gang member with the Aryan's, She has been armed in the past when she committed Armed Robbery, and several witnesses observed her with a large knife immediately prior to Police arrival.

Danaher was inside her private residence, where she has the tactical advantage over searching Officers. She knows the floor plan and it's hiding spots, ambush locations and has the ability to hide weapons throughout the residence. The residence was small and very cluttered with old clothing, furniture, bicycle parts, rotting garbage and food, mattresses sitting on the floors, etc... It would have been very easy for Danaher to hide throughout the residence.

Resistance-

Danaher fled into the upstairs area of the home. Everyone else in the residence exited when they heard the Police announcements. Even the occupants who were upstairs came down and

exited peacefully. Danaher had to listen to and ignore over 20 minute of announcements from other Officers and Myself. The upstairs area was not very big, so it would be impossible for her not to hear me and other officers yelling our announcements within 15 feet of where she was hiding.

After getting no response to my K9 announcements, I released SPD K9 Axl and gave the command for him to search. K9 Axl climbed the stairs and started searching immediately. Due to the winding staircase, I wanted K9 Axl to clear the stairs and top landing before Officers ascended the stairs. After a couple minutes of letting him search alone, we joined him upstairs. There were several bedrooms, closets and a bathroom. We cleared the bedrooms, the bathroom, and started to clear down a hallway next to the stairs when I heard Danaher yell at me to get my dog. At the end of the hallway was a small storage area that looked like a closet opening without a door on it. The opening was partially covered by a piece of wood, and it was completely full of dirty clothing.

Danaher had climbed into the opening, pulled to wood up in front of her and buried herself in the dirty clothes pile. K9 Axl had to pull the wood away from the opening and burrow into the clothes pile to locate her. K9 Axl contacted her on her lower right forearm, just above the wrist. When K9 Axl contacted her, I was approx 10 feet away. It was hard to see how Danaher was positioned in the opening due to all the clothes, but it looked like she was sitting with her legs crossed. She was pulling her right hand towards her, as if to pull it away from K9 Axl. Some point in this struggle, the inside of her right thigh got injured. It was unknown if the injury was from a slight mouth contact from Axl before he contacted her wrist, or from his claws during the contact. Once I could see Danaher was not armed, I gave K9 Axl the command to release and he did immediately. Estimated contact time was approx 5 seconds or less.

Once K9 Axl released, Danaher started to struggle with Ofc Stone and Ofc Pavlischak. They had to physically roll her onto her stomach in order to apply handcuffs. Danaher was refusing to cooperate and continued to kick her feet. Eventually she calmed enough to remove her from the residence. Sgt Lee was still present on the call, and he photographed the hiding spot Danaher used.

Medics responded and cleared her for transport to Deaconess for inspection and treatment of her injuries. I responded to Deaconess to observe the injuries and interview Danaher. When I arrived, Ofc Stone advised he read Danaher her constitutional rights and she advised she was not going to answer any questions.

Her injuries were cleaned, then photographed. The injury on the inside of her right thigh appeared to be light scratching and bruising. On her right wrist, she had four punctures on the top and two on the bottom, just above her wrist. The two on the bottom appeared slightly larger. Looking at the contacts, it looked as if when Danaher pulled her wrist away from K9 Axl, it made him slightly readjust his contact. The result was four punctures on top instead of just two. X-rays also revealed Danaher had a break in her lower Ulna bone and a slight crack in her Radial bone. She would need surgery to correctly set the Ulna bone.

I advised Sgt Kendall and Sgt Lee of the injuries. Due to Danaher needing surgery, Sgt Lee advised Officers didn't need to stay with her at Deaconess. I left the phone number to Police Radio with the ER nurses, and called up to the nursing station where she was going to be moved to (room 917). The were advised to call immediately after surgery. Due to not being able to book her, the warrant settle was not completed. When she is released from Deaconess, she will be immediately booked.

The were advised to call immediately after surgery. Due to not being able to book her, the warrant settle was not completed. When she is released from Deaconess, she will be immediatly booked.

On 08/30/14 I responded to 816 N. Cannon with Ofc Stone and Ofc Erhart. Gosney used to live at the location and he was there to pick up some furniture from Danaher. Gosney sent his nephew to the door. An unknown male opened the door and the nephew asked for Danaher. Danaher came to the door and said "You can't come in here". Danaher opened a small switchblade knife as she said this. Danaher slammed the door, almost catching the nephew's fingers.

The nephew told Gosney what happened and Gosney called 911. Radio informed us that Danaher had a warrant for Armed Robbery. I arrived on scene and Gosney told me what had transpired. Gosney and his family were parked directly in front of the house. Ofc Stone arrived and I briefed him.

Ofc Erhart took a position on the SE corner of the house. Gosney and his family could see the north side of the house. The neighbors directly to the north of the house were watching with intense scrutiny.

A female came out of the house. She closed the front door behind her. There was a dog on the front porch that growled and barked at Ofc Stone and I. Ofc Stone began talking with the female. She identified herself as Cathy, Danaher's daughter. She calmed the dog down. We told Cathy that Danaher had a warrant and we were not leaving. Cathy said Danaher had locked the door behind Cathy. This occurred at 1846 hrs.

Radio also informed us that Danaher had several violent crimes in her past and she was listed as a violent offender.

Radio also informed us that Danaher's address of record on the warrant was this house, 816 N. Cannon.

I knocked on the door at least ten separate times. I announced that Danaher had a warrant and she was under arrest.

Danaher was wanted for a felony warrant of Armed Robbery. This is a dangerous and violent crime. We also knew that Danaher was armed with a knife and she has had several other violent crime arrests. We did not know how many other people were in the house and what other weapons were in the house. A decision was made to call out a K-9.

I continued knocking and announcing that Danaher was under arrest and we were going to send in a police dog. A male opened the door to come out and I stepped in the house to secure the front room. He and Cathy started to object and we informed them about the warrant.

I began announcing inside the house that a police dog would be coming in and it would bite whoever it found. People started coming down the stairs, out of bedrooms and up from the basement. I estimated somewhere between 12 and 15 people came out and left the house. I made no less than a dozen announcements to Danaher about her warrant and the police dog.

The last one out, a black male around 40 years old, pointed upstairs when I asked about Danaher. Ofc Stone and I secured the main floor. Ofc Pavlischak, Ofc Wells and Ofc Harvey came inside to assist.

I watched the door to the basement after being exposed to the over used, waterless, bathroom and its putrid stench.

Eventually Ofc Gorman arrived with a K-9,

Danaher was taken in to custody upstairs at 1918 hrs. I heard Danaher claim she was sleeping. It was approximately a half hour after Danaher had locked the door behind Cathy.

I talked with two separate neighbors that were fed up with the house and the crime and drugs that seemed to radiate out of it.

On 8/30/2014 at approximately 1831 hrs, I was dispatched to 816 N Cannon St for a DV. While enroute dispatch advised that the suspect, Jolene Danaher, was inside the residence and had a felony warrant for robbery 1st degree. Dispatch also advised that Jolene was #7a violent offender, and a convicted felon. Dispatch was looking up the address on the warrant while we were all still enroute.

CPL Ferguson arrived first on scene and spoke with the complainant. CPL Ferguson stated that the original call was a civil issue over property and there was no crime for Jolene "supposedly" having a butcher knife or switchblade when the complainant contacted her. CPL Ferguson advised that we were now just dealing with the felony warrant. Dispatch confirmed that the robbery 1st warrant listed 816 N Cannon St as the address on the warrant.

I was spoked with Jolene's daughter, Katherine Danaher, who stated that she would not go inside and get Jolene for us because she would remain loyal to her mom. Katherine stated that there was approximately 10 plus people inside the residence and refused to cooperate with LE. We had the house locked down and had probable cause that Jolene was still inside. Her daughter stated that her mom was inside, but would refuse to go get her. The neighbors stated that they saw Jolene just prior to LE arrival in the house and they never saw her leave. The complainant, never left the location and also stated that Jolene was inside and never left.

CPL Ferguson and I knocked several times on the door with Katherine sitting next to us. I announced from outside the door approximately five times that Jolene was under arrest for a warrant and that she needed to come out with her hands up or a Police K9 would be used. Several minutes after that a male opened the door and exited. He stated he heard the announcements and came outside. CPL Ferguson and I stepped into the house since the warrant was for that address.

I announced approximately five more times (from the main floor just inside the residence) about Jolene being under arrest and that a K9 was enroute and she needed to come out with her hands up. Approximately 10 people came out of the basement and from upstairs because they heard the announcement made by me. They stated they knew that police dogs bite hard and they did not want to be apart of that. Those folks went outside and waited. All of them stated that had seen Jolene, but not sure where she was. I made several more announcements, but no one responded or came out. I spoke to Katherine again who stated she would not help us get her mother, but that there was

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a sick male laying in the basement still. I made several more announcements towards upstairs and then again towards downstairs. The male downstairs came up and said that Jolene was hiding upstairs.

At this point more officers arrived and we cleared the main floor for our safety. We held the main floor and covered upstairs and downstairs until the K9 arrived. I made approximately six more announcements telling Jolene to come out because she was under arrest and that a K9 would bite her if she did not come out. OFC Harvey made approximately seven announcements stating that she was under arrest and that she needed to come out because a K9 was enroute. We received no response on all of the announcements.

I asked the people who already came out and they stated that they heard clearly from upstairs and downstairs that Jolene was under arrest and that a K9 was enroute.

OFC Gorman and his K9 arrived on scene. OFC Gorman made a K9 announcement and there was no response. OFC Gorman sent his K9 upstairs to start clearing. OFC Gorman, Harvey, Pavlischak, and myself began to clear up the stairs. The dog found Jolene hiding in a small hallway closet underneath a large pile of clothing. The dog bite her and she immediately started screaming and punching towards the dog. OFC Gorman grabbed his dog and I grabbed onto Jolene's hands since she was punching and hitting the police dog. Jolene was screaming and not cooperating. I advised her again that she was under arrest and needed to roll over onto her stomach. Jolene finally complied and I detained her in handcuffs (DL).

I could see that her right hand was bleeding from where the K9 bit her. Medics were advised. I read Jolene her constitutional rights and informed her that she had a robbery 1st warrant for her arrest. Jolene was wearing a black dress. A blanket was grabbed for her and Jolene and I exited the residence. Jolene was still screaming and stated that she was sleeping in there with her headphones in and didn't hear any announcement. I asked her why she was sleeping underneath a large pile of clothes. Jolene replied, "I was hiding from my kids dad." Jolene did not have any headphones in when the K9 located her. Medics bandaged the dog bite and I transported Jolene to Deaconess ER to be checked out.

Jolene continued to scream and state that her warrant was for LFOs only. Jolene said, "I don't blame the dog. I love dogs. I want to meet this dog that bite me. Its my own fault."

Jolene was evaluated at the hospital. As soon as we got to the hospital, the handcuffs were taken off her right hand. She was handcuffed (DL) to the hospital bed from her left hand. The doctor determined that Jolene had a broken right wrist and advised that she would need to stay over night and have surgery in the morning.

OFC Gorman and I contacted Sgt Lee about the situation. Sgt Lee advised that we were not going

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to sit on Jolene all night long and that we would pick her up once she was being released from the hospital the next day. Jolene's handcuffs were removed and Jolene was left in the custody of the hospital staff.
