Complainant Interview Summary

On 9-7-2014 I contacted Michael J. Gibson (6-15-80) in the alley next to the Revolver. Mr. Gibson was sitting on the ground with his legs crossed. His arms were behind him in handcuffs and he had been seen by medics. I observed a laceration on his right elbow and above his right eye. Cpl. Adams took photos of his injuries.

I asked Mr. Gibson what his name was and he gave it to me. His voice was soft and cracking as he spoke. I then introduced myself to him as a Sergeant with the Spokane Police Department. I asked what happened. Mr. Gibson stated he got into a fight with a 21yr old kid that got out of hand. Mr. Gibson paused multiple times before he would say something. The next thing he knew he was "fighting cops". He told me a couple times that he was fighting a 21yr old kid in the bar and it got out of hand. He stated he was the "aggressor". I asked if he was hurt and he stated yes but did not elaborate on this. I saw he had scrapes and cuts and told him this. He indicated they were on the pavement and that is where the injuries came from. He also stated he was a wrestler.

I asked Mr. Gibson if there was any reason why he tackled the officer. Mr. Gibson stated "Yeah, I did not know it was an officer." He stated they were in an alley brawling. Mr. Gibson stated he did not blame the officer for what he did; however, he thought the officer was aggressive. He said he was saying "I give in." and "I quit." before they got him. He looked back at the crowd of people numerous times and shook his head. He said it was a brawl at a bar. I then concluded my interview with him.

Officer Interview Summary

Officer Beltiz and Officer Chimienti were working bar patrol on a Saturday night. They observed a fight break out in an alley between the Revolver and Barachos with a large crowd (estimated at 200 people) just before closing time. They attempted to de-escalate the fight by using their emergency equipment on their marked patrol car. The crowd did not disperse, but some subjects stopped fighting. Officers then made contact with 2 combatants.

Officer Belitz contacted Michael Gibson who was being restrained by a subject. He identified himself as a police officer and told them to stop. The male who was holding onto Mr. Gibson said he was "just trying to get him to stop". Mr. Gibson refused to deescalate. Officer Belitz took control of his wrist and the male holding him let go. Mr. Gibson immediately charged Officer Belitz. Officer Belitz believed Mr. Gibson was trying to tackle him, stepped to the side, and attempted an arm bar control technique to take Mr. Gibson to the ground. Mr. Gibson then

threw a closed fist strike at Officer Belitz face. Officer Belitz used force for the following reasons:

Crime: Mr. Gibson was involved in the assault/disorderly conduct incident at a bar. Mr. Gibson aggressively charged and punched at Officer Belitz, attempting to assault a uniformed police officer (3* assault – Felony).

Threat: Officer Belitz was in an alley between two bars in downtown Spokane on a Saturday night. They were surrounded by numerous people who had been watching a large fight with active participants in the crowd. Being the bar area of downtown, most subjects at the scene had been consuming alcohol. He contacted a combatant who refused to deescalate after numerous visual and verbal warnings were given. The combatant charged Officer Belitz, actively assaulting the officer.

Resistance: Visual and audible warnings were given to the combatants – spot light from a marked patrol car, air horn from a marked patrol car, lights and siren from a marked patrol car – Mr. Gibson continued to participate in an assault/disorderly incident. As Mr. Gibson was being restrained, Officer Belitz contacted him, identified himself and ordered him to stop fighting. Mr. Gibson did not deescalate. Officer Belitz took wrist control of Mr. Gibson as he was being restrained by a citizen. Mr. Gibson charged Officer Belitz in a tackling motion. Mr. Gibson punched at Officer Belitz with a closed fist. Mr. Gibson was now physically assaulting Officer Belitz, placing him in fear of bodily harm.

Officer Belitz advised Mr. Gibson he was under arrest and told him to stop resisting. He attempted to control Mr. Gibson by taking him to the ground. The situation was tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving. Mr. Gibson continued to resist and reached out toward Officer Belitz face. Officer Belitz placed Mr. Gibson in a Level I neck restraint and ordered Mr. Gibson to stop resisting. Mr. Gibson continued to struggle with Officer Belitz. Officer Chimieti arrived to assist Officer Belitz and again Mr. Gibson was ordered to stop resisting and advised he would be rendered unconscious. Mr. Gibson did not deescalate and grabbed at Officer Belitz's leg, continuing to resist. Officer Brown-Bieber arrived to assist. Officer Belitz applied a Level II neck restraint. Mr. Gibson was handcuffed and post Level II neck restraint protocol was followed.

Officer Belitz and Officer Chimienti received injures to their arms. Photos were taken.

Witness Interview Summary

Witnesses Jacob McConnell, Justin Miller, Adam Imes, and Dashea McDowell stated there had been a fight at the bar. Officers were there trying to break the fight up. Mr. Gibson attempted to assault the officer and the officer took him to the ground.

Witness Timothy Goad stated he was in an argument in the bar with Mr. Gibson and Mr. Gibson was trying to fight him. They exited the bar and he told Mr. Gibson to hit him. Mr. Gibson hit him numerous times knocking him to the ground, he did not hit back. Mr. Gibson was being held back by another person when police arrived.

Physical Evidence

Investigative Summary

Mr. Gibson was actively assaulting a citizen in an alley between two bars in the downtown area of Spokane on a Saturday night. There were numerous people who had exited the bars watching the fight (there are 5 drinking establishments in this one block area). Officers, in a marked patrol car, used visual and audible signals to deescalate the combatants. All but one combatant deescalated. Officer Belitz, wearing the uniform of the day, contacted this subject, Mr. Gibson, who was being held back by a citizen. He identified himself to Mr. Gibson and ordered him to stop fighting, further attempting to deescalate Mr. Gibson. Mr. Gibson did not deescalate. Officer Belitz took control of Mr. Gibson and the citizen let go of Mr. Gibson. Mr. Gibson immediately attacked Officer Belitz, attempting to tackle and strike Officer Belitz with a closed fist. Knowing he was in a large crowd of people, between two bars in an alley, and having someone attack him, the situation was tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving; Officer Belitz applied a Level I neck restraint. Mr. Gibson did not deescalate and refused to comply. Officer Chimienti and Officer Brown-Bieber assisted, but Mr. Mr. Gibson would not comply. Officer Belitz then applied a Level II neck restraint.

300.3.4 NECK RESTRAINT CONTROL HOLD

The proper application of a level one or a level two neck restraint hold may be effective in restraining a violent or combative individual. However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the neck restraint hold is subject to the following:

- (a) The officer shall have successfully completed department-approved training in the use and application of the neck restraint.
- (b) The neck restraint may only be used when circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application reasonably appears necessary to control a person in any of the following circumstances:
 - 1. The subject is violent or physically resisting.
 - 2. The subject, by words or actions, has demonstrated an intention to be violent and reasonably appears to have the potential to harm officers, him/herself or others.

Officer Belitz is trained in the proper use of the neck restraint control hold. Mr. Gibson was actively assaulting Officer Belitz. Officer Belitz followed his training and acted within policy when he applied a Level II neck restraint.

The visible injuries Mr. Gibson received appeared to be consistent with fighting on pavement (scrapes and lacerations). I did not see, nor did Mr. Gibson complain, of excessive injuries. Officer Belitz's actions were objectively reasonable based on the totality of the circumstances and state law.

On 09/07/14 at approximately 0134 hours Ofc Beltiz and I were working a special patrol assignment downtown. We were in a fully marked police vehicle equipped with overhead lights and siren. We were both wearing the uniform of the day that was fully marked with a department badge and patches.

Ofc Belitz and I were in the area of Barachos bar, 211 S Division, when we both observed a fight break out between Barachos and The Revolver.

We approached the fight in our fully marked patrol vehicle and sounded the air horn in attempt to disperse the crowd. It was around bar closing time and there was approximately 200 people on/around the side walk and entrance to the alley between the two bars. We then activated our emergency lights and sounded the air horn again in a second attempt to stop the fight and have the crowd disperse. The crowd did not disperse and the fight continued. We then activated our emergency siren along with our overhead lights in a third attempt to stop the fight and disperse the crowd. The crowd did not disperse and the fight did not stop. We approached the combatants. I contacted a male who appeared to be involved in the fight and was being restrained by several people. Officer Belitz contacted another male who also appeared to be in the fight.

I identified myself as a police officer and advised the male that he was being audio and visually recorded by my body camera. The male was identified as Jacob McConnell.

As McConnell was beginning to tell me about the fight, I saw Ofc Belitz engaged with a male and fall to the ground. I ran to Ofc Belitz's location and could see that he was struggling with the male in attempt to gain control of him. I could see that Ofc Belitz had the male, later identified as Michael Gibson, in a Lateral Neck Restraint (LNR). Gibson's left arm was free and his right arm was tucked underneath his body. I took control of his left wrist. I gave several verbal commands to stop resisting and stop fighting and to place his hands behind his back. Gibson refused my commands and continued to struggle. He attempted to break free of Ofc Belitz's and my control. As I was controlling Gibson's left wrist, I heard Ofc Belitz give a verbal warning to Gibson that if he continued to fight and attempt to break free from us, he would be rendered unconscious. Gibson's right arm was beneath him as he was in the prone position and he refused to remove it from underneath his body. I applied a goose neck pain compliance technique in attempt to get Gibson to remove his right arm from underneath his body. Gibson still refused. While controlling his left wrist I was able to pry Gibson's right arm from underneath his body. I was then able to apply my handcuffs and secure Gibson.

During the fight, Gibson was rendered unconscious. I requested medics and a supervisor to respond to our location because of the LNR.

Ofc Brown-Bieber arrived and took control of Gibson.

I then re contacted McConnell to obtain a statement. McConnell told me that he and his friends were inside the bar when another male bar patron began causing problems. He said that one of his friends became engaged in a physical fight with the male and the fight went outside. He said that he was being held back by some unknown people outside the bar, when we showed up.

McConnell was extremely intoxicated and at one point made a statement to the effect of, "if my friend is in a fight I am going to help!"

I then contacted another male and identified him as Justin Miller. Miller stated that his friend was the one that Ofc Belitz and I were fighting. Miller gave me a brief statement that they were inside Barachos when a male began causing problems. His friend (Gibson) started to fight with the male and the fight went outside. Miller would not provide me with any other statements regarding the incident.

Ofc Belitz and I then transported Gibson to Deaconess Medical Center where he was treated for some abrasions to his forehead and being rendered unconscious from the LNR application.

Gibson was cleared to be booked into jail. Ofc Belitz and I transported him to Spokane County Jail and booked him for Assault 3rd Degree and Resisting Arrest.

During the fight I sustained some minor cuts and abrasions to my left forearm, elbow, and fingers. My injuries were photographed by Cpl Adams.

On 090714 at approximately 0134 hrs. I was working downtown bar patrol as a member of the department TAC team. I was driving a fully marked patrol vehicle and wearing a full police uniform along with a badge and department patches. Officer Chimienti and I were working as a 2 man unit for this detail.

We were parked in the alley on the east side of Division St directly across from Borrachos bar located at 211 N. Division St. watching the crowd in front of the bars. In the alley between Borrachos and The Revolver, I observed a large fight incite.

I first turned on my spotlight and placed it on the crowd. No one stopped. I then drove across the street and turned on my overheard red and blue lights but no one seemed to care. I then activated my sirens to try and get the crowd to disperse. Most of the people stopped fighting and Officer Chimienti and I exited the patrol vehicle.

I began to tell people to stop fighting and most people cooperated. Officer Chimienti contacted a male (see his report) and I observed 2 males actively fighting in the alley against the north wall of Borrachos. I contacted the males and identified myself as the police. One male appeared to be only holding the other male and trying to keep from being assaulted.

I told both of the males to stop and the one male looked at me and said "officer, I am just trying to get him to stop." I then yelled at the other male who was later identified as Michael Gibson, to stop fighting and again identified myself

as the police. Gibson refused to stop and I took control of his left wrist and pulled him away from the other male. Gibson looked directly at me and then charged at me and appeared to be attempting to tackle me.

I side stepped Gibson and attempted to take him to the ground utilizing an arm bar. When I did this, Gibson threw a punch at my face with his right hand. Gibson's right fist was balled up and I could see his jaw was clenched. The tendons in his neck were sticking out and his knuckles had turned white from how tight he was clenching his fist

*****At the time of the contact with Gibson, I was investigating an in progress assault. The crime of Assault is a crime of violence.

*****When I contacted Gibson, I was alone and there were approximately 200 people in the immediate area either watching or participating in the fight. Many of these people were intoxicated. Gibson had not been frisked for weapons and therefore could be concealing several different types of weapons on his person. I could see that Gibson was a fit person and was clearly in good shape. He had a muscular build and when he engaged me, I could see that he had some wrestling experience based on the way he controlled his movements. I was uncertain if Officer Chimienti was able to assist me or if he was engaged in his own confrontation. I was also unsure of how far off my back up units were from arriving. Even with Officer Chimienti there, we were vastly outnumbered and the situation was tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

*****It was clear to me, that when Gibson completely disregarded me as a police officer, he was willing to do whatever it took to escape the situation that he had placed himself in. When I told Gibson to stop and took control of his left hand he brought his right hand up in assaultive manner clenching his right fist into a ball and threw a punch at me. As Gibson did this, he was also attempting to pull his left hand away from my control. I had already told Gibson that I was the police but Gibson didn't seem to care that I was the police and he continued to pull away from me in an effort to flee. As Gibson attempted to flee, with his right hand up, fist clenched, attempting to punch me, he clearly showed that he would do whatever it took to evade arrest. I had pulled up in a fully marked police car, wearing the uniform of the day with a visible badge and department patches, and identified myself as the police, and also activated my sirens when I first arrived. There was no telling what Gibson would do to get away.

For the above-mentioned reasons, when Gibson lifted his right hand, made a fist, and swung at me, I took Gibson to the ground. I told Gibson he was under arrest and I told him to stop resisting. Gibson continued to fight me and was attempting to pull away from my control. Gibsons arms were flailing and he was attempting to reach out towards my face. I was able to get Gibson on the ground for better control and I had now applied a level one lateral neck restraint (LNR) in an effort to control Gibson until my backup arrived.

Gibson was now face down on the asphalt of the alley, and I was also on the ground attempting to control him.. I had my left arm around the front of his neck holding the level one LNR. Several times I told Gibson to stop resisting. I then saw Officer Chimienti arrive to assist me.

We both told Gibson to stop resisting and to place his hands behind his back. I warned Gibson that if he did not stop resisting and comply, I would render him

unconscious. Gibson still refused to comply and I could feel him grabbing towards my leg while I was holding him down. Gibsons assaultive behavior continued by him pulling his arms away from our control and clenching his fists and tensing his muscles. We still did not have good control of Gibson. Therefore, I tightened my hold, applying more pressure and applied a level 2 LNR and rendered him unconscious.

Officer Beiber then arrived and handcuffs were applied by Officer Chimienti (D/L). Medics were called for to evaluate Gibson. He slowly began to regain consciousness and we rolled him on his side for better recovery. It appeared that Gibson had some abrasions the right side of his face from being face down during the incident on the rough asphalt.

Corporal Adams arrived and took photos of these abrasions as well as some scrapes I had on my forearms. Officer Chimienti also suffered some scrapes on his forearms and elbow and these injuries were also photographed by Corporal Adams.

Medics arrived on scene and checked out Gibson for his injuries. It appeared that the blood was only coming from his forehead, and that he had some small scrapes from the asphalt on his face.

Medics on scene cleared Gibson for jail. Sgt. Kannberg arrived on scene and I briefed him of the incident. After the scene was secured, we attempted to interview witnesses. I contacted a bouncer who was directly involved in the incident. He was identified as Adam Imes. Imes told me the following;

He was a bouncer for Borrachos and was dealing with a fight in the alley between Borrachos and The Revolver. During the fight, he observed me arrive on scene. He said it was very obvious that I was the police because I arrived in a fully marked police vehicle and even activated my red and blue lights along with the sirens.

He also said that my uniform with a badge indicated that I was a police officer as well. He saw me approach Gibson from the front and heard me identify myself as the police. Gibson then charged at me in a "violent and aggressive" manner as if he was going to tackle me.

He saw me take Gibson to the ground and saw me end up on the ground as well. He saw another officer arrive (Chimienti) and we then wrestled with Gibson and finally took him into custody.

After medics cleared Gibson, and Sgt. Kannberg spoke with him, I transported Gibson to Deaconess ER because jail needed medical clearance after him being rendered unconscious. Prior to the transport, I notified Gibson that he was under arrest for 3rd degree assault L/E and resisting arrest.

While at the hospital with Gibson, he started talking to me without being questioned. Gibson said that he is a wrestler and when he fights, he takes it all the way to the end even if he had to be put unconscious. Gibson then said that he was intoxicated but should have known that I was the police when I told him.

On 09/07/14 at 0134 I was dispatched to the Revolver bar at 221 N. Division St. after officers reported a fight at that location. Upon arrival I observed a large crowd at the entrance to the alley between the Revolver bar and the Borrachos bar.

When I entered the alley I observed Ofc. Belitz and Ofc. Chimienti struggling with a subject later identified as Michael Gibson. All three were on the ground in the alley, with Ofc. Belitz holding onto Mr. Gibson's neck while Ofc. Chimienti attempted to put Mr. Gibson's hands in handcuffs. Ofc. Chimienti had placed a handcuff on Mr. Gibson's left wrist but Mr. Gibson was pulling his right hand away to avoid having his right wrist handcuffed.

I took control of Mr. Gibson's right wrist and assisted Ofc. Chimienti in securing Mr. Gibson in handcuffs. While we were handcuffing him Mr. Gibson grabbed at my hands. Once he was cuffed Ofc. Belitz released Mr. Gibson, who appeared unconscious but could be heard breathing loudly. Ofc. Belitz and I rolled Mr. Gibson onto his right side to make it easier for Mr. Gibson to breathe. After a few seconds Mr. Gibson regained consciousness and opened his eyes. I asked him if he was able to sit up and he said that he was, so I assisted him to a sitting position. Ofc. Belitz double-locked Mr. Gibson's handcuffs.

I stood by with Mr. Gibson while officers interviewed witnesses to the incident. Spokane City Fire Department Ladder One, commanded by Cpt. Renner, responded and evaluated Mr. Gibson. Mr. Gibson had an abrasion on the right side of his face and on his right elbow, but Fire Department personnel stated the injuries did not require stitches. I waited with Mr. Gibson until Ofc. Chimienti and Ofc. Belitz transported him to the hospital for medical clearance. I observed scratches and abrasions on Ofc. Chimienti's and Ofc. Belitz's elbows from the struggle.

I later spoke with Timothy Goad, who said Mr. Gibson had bumped into him at a bar. The two argued and then went outside to discuss the matter further. Once outside, Mr. Goad invited Mr. Gibson to hit him on the chin. Mr. Gibson responded by hitting Mr. Gibson on the chin. Mr. Goad stated during the incident he did not hit Mr. Gibson at all, and Mr. Goad said he did not wish to press any charges in reference to this incident.

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On 090714 at 0136hrs, I responded to 221 N. Division (Revolver Tavern) on a fight call. Prior to my arrival, Officer Belitz advised responding units to "step it up."

Upon arrival, I provided scene security. I then overheard/observed a male who was later identified as being Dashea McDowell, verbally and physically demonstrating to a couple of males how the male "swung" on the officer. He was telling the males that he could not believe that the male attempted to hit the officer.

I then contacted McDowell and another male who had witnessed the incident. I asked the male ("Tamoor Khokar") to standby for contact, while I interviewed McDowell.

McDowell told me that he had just exited Borrachos and peered around the corner into the alley. He observed a "bouncer" holding a male (Michael Gibson) in a headlock. The officers (Officers Belitz and Chimienti) arrived and the bouncer was handing over control to the officers, when Gibson pulled away. McDowell stated Gibson with a closed fist (believes it was with his right hand) attempted to hit Officer Belitz. He said Officer Belitz got Gibson up against a wall in the alley. Officer Belitz then grabbed onto Gibson's arm and "swung" him to the ground. McDowell stated Officer Chimienti assisted Officer Belitz and they got on top of him. The officers handcuffed Gibson without further incident.

McDowell added that Gibson "put up a good fight," further adding that

The undersigned, a law enforcement officer, competent to testify, states as follows: That he/she believes a crime was committed by the above named defendant/defendants in the City and County of Spokane, State of Washington, because:

I. Adam Imes, Witness, can testify to the following facts:

- a. He is employed as security for Borrachos bar located at 211 N. Division St in Spokane, WA and was working as such on 090714 at approximately 0130 hours, when a fight occurred in the alley between Borrachos and The Revolver bar.
- b. He and other security from both establishments attempted to stop the fighting.
- c. During the fight, he observed Spokane Police Officer T. Belitz, contact the defendant and identify himself as the police.
- d. The defendant was actively engaged in a physical fight with another male.
- e. The defendant turned towards the officer and "violently and aggressively" charged towards him and looked like he was trying to tackle the officer.

- f. The officer attempted to take the defendant to the ground by the arm and the defendant threw a punch at the officer attempting to assault him.
- g. The officer had approached the defendant from the front and was wearing a full police uniform with a badge and department patches and there should have been no confusion that he was the Spokane Police.
- h. The officer was able to take the defendant to the ground and another officer then assisted and they placed handcuffs on the defendant.

II. Dashea McDowell, Witness, can testify to the following facts:

- a. He was in downtown Spokane at Borrachos bar when he saw a fight break out in the allev between Borrachos and The Revolver.
- b. He saw Spokane Police Officer T. Belitz attempt to contact the defendant from the front and the officer was wearing a full police uniform with a badge and department patches.
- c. As the officer attempted to stop the fight, the defendant attempted to punch the officer in the face with a closed fist.
- d. The officer pinned the defendant against the wall and then took the defendant to the ground.
- e. Another officer assisted and they were able to place the defendant into handcuffs.

III. Ofc, T. Belitz #1084, Spokane Police, can testify to the following facts:

- a. He is a fully commissioned police officer and was working in that capacity on 090714 at approximately 0134 hours, when he observed a fight in the alley between Borrachos bar and The Revolver bar in downtown Spokane, WΔ
- b. He was driving a fully marked police vehicle and was wearing a full police uniform with a badge and department patches.
- c. He observed the defendant being held against the wall by another male and identified himself as the police and told him to stop fighting.
- d. He took control of the defendants left wrist and the defendant charged at him and appeared to be trying to tackle him.
- e. The defendant then threw a punch at him and he took the defendant to the ground.
- f. He told the defendant to stop resisting and the defendant continued to fight and attempt to get away.
- g. He then applied a LNR neck restraint and rendered the defendant unconscious to stop the assault.
- h. He was assisted by Ofc. S. Chimienti and the defendant was taken into custody.
- i. PC also exists for resisting arrest for the defendant.

IV. Ofc. S. Chimienti #1068, Spokane Police, can testify to the following facts:

- a. He is a fully commissioned police officer and was working in that capacity on 090714 at approximately 0134 hours, when he observed a fight in the alley between Borrachos Bar and The Revolver bar in downtown Spokane, WA.
- b. He was a passenger in a fully marked police vehicle and wearing a full police uniform with a badge and department patches.
- c. He observed the defendant turn into Ofc Belitz as Ofc Belitz attempted to separate the defendant from another male.
- d. He observed Ofc Belitz and the defendant fall to the ground and heard Ofc Belitz identify himself as the police and to stop fighting and stop resisting.
- e. He assisted Ofc Belitz in gaining control of the defendant.
- f. The defendant ignored multiple verbal commands from him and Ofc Belitz to stop fighting and stop resisting.
- g. He observed Ofc Belitz place the defendant in a Lateral Neck Restraint (LNR) and heard Ofc Belitz tell the defendant to stop resisting or he would be rendered unconscious.
- h. The defendant failed to cease his resistance and Ofc. Belitz rendered him unconscious.
- i. Along with other officers who had arrived, placed handcuffs on the defendant (D/L) and called for medics to evaluate the defendant.
