



Officer Howe was assisting other officers on a DV order violation and burglary for the violation. The female told K-9 Buchmann when asked if the male, Ramos was inside that if she told him she might get shot. This would indicate the possible presence of a firearm. Officer Howe also had information prior to his arrival that the male had been armed with a gun in the past. When Ramos was contacted he was non-compliant with the officers to walk out to them. When he did come partially come out he refused to put his hands on his head after kneeling down facing away from the officers. He reached down to his pocket and waist area. Officers weren't sure if he was armed. He was warned he might be Tased if he didn't comply. He told the officers to 'Fuck Off' and to go ahead. These non-compliant actions and his verbals indicate someone who may potentially be violent. 309.2 POLICY The TASER device is intended to control a violent or potentially violent individual, while minimizing the risk of serious injury. The appropriate use of such a device should result in fewer serious injuries to officers and suspects. Officer Howes' use of the Taser to control Ramos was appropriate and within policy. Lt. **Suspect Interview Summary**

I contacted Ramos along with Corporal Cordis at jail after he had completed the booking process. Corporal Cordis took photographs of where the Taser probes had penetrated his skin. While the photographs were being taken I noted a small puncture wound in the middle-right side of the subject's back and a second puncture wound on his right buttocks. The wounds were consistent with a Taser probe puncture. I did not observe any other injuries.

I spoke to Ramos and asked him what had happened with the officers. Ramos replied, "I was un-compliant, I think it was appropriate". I asked him if he could tell me what happened and he repeated the same statement. I asked Ramos if he had any injuries other than the Taser wounds, he stated his neck was sore from the officer placing his leg on it when they were handcuffing him. I looked at his neck and did not observe any visible injury.

**Officer Interview Summary**

Officer Howe stated he and other officers were attempting to take Ramos into custody. Ramos was non-compliant and reached for his waistline several times causing concern that he was attempting to access a weapon. He deployed his Taser in dart mode after several verbal warnings and commands for compliance. The Taser made contact and Ramos was immediately subdued. Officers took him into custody without further incident. See Officer Howe's attached report.

**Witness Interview Summary**

There were no civilian witnesses to the use of force. See attached additional reports from officers.

**Physical Evidence**

Photographs of injuries, expended Taser cartridge.

**Investigative Summary**

Officers were confronting Ramos while he was actively committing a residential burglary based on him being inside the residence where two court orders restrained him from being. The victim was found outside the residence afraid for her safety. Officers had information that a male armed with a gun had been previously contacted at the residence.

While confronting Ramos he was non-compliant. While facing away from officers he made movements towards his waistline and reached inside his pants pockets causing officers to fear he was trying to access a weapon. Ramos was given numerous commands to comply and was finally

warned that if he did not comply he would be Tasered. Ramos verbally acknowledged the Taser warning but remained non-compliant.

I reviewed Officer Howe's attached Taser data. I noted trigger activation at 20:56 for five seconds. The attached graph for that activation shows contact was made during the entire 5 second cycle.

Officer Howe's use of force was reasonable given the circumstances he and other officers on scene were facing. He chose a reasonable amount of force to gain compliance from a subject who was possibly armed and clearly had no intention of ending the confrontation peacefully. The Taser deployment was immediately effective and allowed officers to take Ramos into custody without further incident. Officer Howe's actions were reasonable, appropriate, and within department policy.

While enroute, radio advised the call was an open line and a female and male were heard yelling at each other. Radio advised the female was crying and the male was making threats to break things up in the entire house. Radio then heard a "crashing" noise.

Prior to arrival, I viewed the CAD entry and saw **#1a** name attached to the call. I immediately recognized **#1a** name and knew she had a NCO against her on/off again boyfriend, **#1a**. I also knew **#1a** son and her grandson, **#1a** and **#1a**, resided at 516 W. Gordon and they too had an order against Ramos, which prohibited Ramos from being within or remaining within 2 city blocks of the above-mentioned address. Radio confirmed both orders.

I walked up to the front door and saw the back of a person's head in the mirror. Ofc. Groom knocked on the door with negative results. I asked Ofc. Groom if the door was unlocked and he said yes. I told Ofc. Groom to open the door and announce Spokane Police. Ofc. Groom opened the door and

yelled, "Spokane Police," at least 5 times. In addition, we both yelled for Ramos to come to the door, which he did not.

While yelling into the residence, I heard a whistle coming from the direction of the sidewalk. I walked to the sidewalk and contacted #1a. I asked #1a if she knew why we were at her home. She said yes. I asked #1a if Ramos was inside her home. #1a said nobody should be in her home. I told #1a that I saw the back of a person's head inside her home. #1a again told me nobody should be inside her home. I asked #1a if she wanted police to clear the home and she said yes.

I walked up to the front door and advised officers, to include K9 Ofc. Buchmann, that nobody had permission to be inside #1a home and she wanted police to clear her home.

While K9 Ofc. Buchmann made announcements, #1a approached the front door and asked if she could remove her 2 dogs. Both dogs were in the foyer so we said yes. Afterwards, #1a was asked again if Ramos was inside her home. #1a said she did not want to answer that question and added that she would be killed if she answered that questions.

While yelling for Ramos to come to the door, Ramos appeared. Ramos was told that he was under arrest for Residential Burglary and DVOP Violation. Ramos was told to show his hands and get down on his knees. Ramos got down on his knees but he did not put his hands on top of his head like he was directed to. Instead, Ramos stuck his left hand into his front left pocket. I and other officers yelled for Ramos to stop and place his hand on top of his head. Ramos removed his hand from his pocket but refused to put his hand on top of his head. Ramos was give several more directives to place his hands on his head and to lie face down on his stomach. Ramos ignored all directives and again tried to place his left hand into his left pocket. To prevent anybody from getting hurt and due to the possibility that Ramos had a weapon inside his pant pocket, Ofc. Howe applied a taser application. Cpl Cordis and I contacted Ramos and placed him into handcuffs (DL). I again advised Ramos that he was under arrest for Residential Burglary-DV and DVOP Violation. I informed Ramos that he had the right to free legal counsel if needed.

Initially Ramos cursed at police but after he was escorted out of #1a house, Ramos apologized for his behavior. Ramos said he knew he was not suppose to be at the address and police were just doing their job.

Medics responded and removed the probes from Ramos' back and right buttock. Afterwards, I transported Ramos to jail, where he was booked for 2 counts of Residential Burglary-DV.

I have PC to arrest Ramos for DVOP Violation and Violation of an Anti-Civil Harassment Protection Order, however, Ramos was not charged with either of those two misdemeanors crimes at the time of his bookings.

The order stated Ramos was not to have any contact with [REDACTED] #1a whatsoever. The order also stated Ramos was not to knowingly enter, remain or come within 2 city blocks of 516 W. Gordon. The NCO stated any wilful violation by Ramos would subject him to a mandatory arrest. (See Attached)

On 09-14-2014 at 2044 hours I responded to 516 W. Gordon for a reported argument.

While en-route I remembered a bulletin that listed [REDACTED] #1a as having an order with a male. I observed that the phone listed came back to [REDACTED] #1a in the call. I had dispatch check for an order.

Ofc. Grooms and I arrived at the location at approx. the same time. As we walked up, I observed a male in the front window. When he saw me he ran toward the back of the house. I ran to the west side of the house and got over the fence. I then opened the gate for following officers. I stayed at the back of the house while other officers took Dominic Ramos into custody.

I then contacted [REDACTED] #1a. She told me: She has had an order with Dominic for the past year. At about 1730-1800 hours she went to pick up Dominic because his friend had called her at his request. She brought him back to her house. He had been drinking. At about 2036 hours he snapped and threw a bowl of chili at the wall. They argued but there was nothing physical. She walked out of the house and when she came back to the front of the house, Law Enforcement was on scene. She refused to say more about the incident. She discovered a short time later that he had taken her SD memory card. She did not see anything else missing.

I gave [REDACTED] #1a a CV card with the report number on it.

I contacted the officers who had arrested Dominic. They told me that he had an SD card in his possession. That was the only thing in his pockets. I retrieved the SD card from Domonic's property at jail and returned it to [REDACTED] #1a.

On 9-14-14 at 2040 hours I responded to 516 W Gordon in reference to an argument. SPD Radio advised there was an open line and there was a female and male yelling at each other. Before I arrived other officers were already on scene.

I contacted Officer Arredondo at the front door of the house. He advised he had PC to arrest Ramos for DVOPV and residential burglary. Arredondo said Ramos was the only person in the house. Officer Buchman was also on scene with his K9 partner. I stood behind Arredondo and Buchman while Buchman gave his K9 announcement (see his report for further). After a couple of announcements by Buchman I saw a Hispanic looking male with no shirt on walk down from the upstairs and into the living room, which was just beyond the front door. The male was about fifteen feet away from us (we were still outside the front door). I heard Arredondo address the male as Ramos and tell him he is under arrest. Ramos was told to walk out to us, but he refused. The male immediately went to his knees, facing away from us and would not respond to commands from us to walk out to us. At that point we entered the enclosed patio to the front door of the house, which put us about ten feet away from Ramos. After at least three commands for him to come out to us I watched as Ramos dropped his left hand and shoved it into his left front pants pocket (he was wearing blue jeans). I had no idea if he was armed or not since I could not see his front. I yelled at him to put his hand on his head. Ramos refused and continued to dig around in his pocket. I yelled at him at least two more times to put his hands up and on his head. He did take his hand out of his pocket, but he didn't put his hands on his head. I told him to place his hands on his head, but he refused. I yelled at him he was under arrest and again ordered him to put his hands on his head. Ramos began being verbally defiant at this point by saying "fuck off", he said this to us several times. I ordered Ramos again to place his hands on his head, but he refused. Ramos had his hands about half way up, where his hands were about level with his shoulders. I continued to tell him to put his hands on his head, but he would not. Two different times Ramos lowered his left hand slightly towards his waist line. I still didn't know if he was armed or not and his behavior was causing me to concern that he was indeed armed and was possibly going to try and access a weapon and try to assault us. Ramos was also still verbally defiant and was saying "fuck you" to my commands. At that point I took out my Taser and turned it on which activated the aiming laser. I aimed it at Ramos's back and told him that if he didn't comply I was going to deploy my Taser on him. Ramos responded with "go ahead" and refused to comply with my commands for him to get lay on his stomach. I ordered him two more times to lay on his stomach and again told him that if he didn't comply I was going to deploy my Taser on him. He again responded with "fuck you, go ahead". At that point I informed my partners that I was going to deploy my Taser. I took aim at the upper back near his shoulder blades and pulled the trigger on my Taser.

## Crime:

Ramos was under arrest for DVOPV and residential burglary DV.

## Threats to officers and others:

Ramos was being very verbally defiant and refusing to cooperate with officers. Ramos had previous arrest for assault DV, which is a crime of violence. Often times DV crimes lead to homicide and are very emotionally charged situations. I had no idea if Ramos was armed or not. I had received previous information before I arrived on scene that a male associated with the listed address has a history of being armed with a gun. Ramos had plenty of time before we contacted him to hide firearms in the house and set up an ambush for officers. Ramos was demonstrated behavior that I recognized through my training and experience to be pre-fight behavior. He was not concerned at all that a Taser was going to be used on him, which caused even more concern that he wanted to fight. If he was not arrested he posed a threat to the petitioner and situations similar to this have ended in serious assault or even homicide.

## Resistance:

Ramos was refusing to comply with commands and had been advised several time he was under arrest. He was being very verbally defiant. He had already shoved his hands in his pocket once, which is a common place to hide and/or access a weapon. He refused to place his hands on his head and twice lowered his left hand back towards his left pocket causing me great concern that he was probably armed with some type of weapon (I was thinking either a knife or gun). After being threatened with the Taser he remained defiant and verbally abusive and even told me to "go ahead". He was evading arrest by his non-compliance and disobeying my commands.

The Taser probes struck Ramos in the right upper back and right buttocks. This was affective and completely locked up Ramos who fell forward onto his stomach. Once he hit his stomach we quickly approached him and Cpl Cordis and Arredondo took control of Ramos and cuffed him in the prone position. One the Taser cycle (five seconds) was over Ramos became complaint so no other force was necessary or used. Once he was cuffed he was taken out to the street and I called for medics to respond and remove the Taser probes and treat the probe contact points.

I placed the Taser cartridge, AFIDS and probes onto property.

On 9-14-14, at approx. 2050 hrs, Ofc Howe and I responded to assist Ofc Arredondo and Ofc Jamieson at 516 W Gordon with a active burglary occurring. The complainant reported that a male was in her house. 911 heard a male and female arguing. The male was yelling at the female to get downstairs or she would get hurt.

Upon arrival, Ofc Arredondo asked Ofc Howe and I to come join him at the front door. As we were at the front door; Ofc Arredondo advised there was PC for DVOPV and residential burglary for Dominick Ramos. K9 Ofc Buchmann was at the front door with his partner calling commands for Dominick to come out of the residence with his hands up. Ofc Buchmann advised Dominick he was under arrest and he needed to come out of the residence with his hands up. Ofc Buchmann yelled this several times into the residence without results. We moved past the front porch covering and to the front entrance door where K9 Ofc Buchmann continued to yell into the residence for Dominick to exit.

After several more commands Dominick came from an unknown area on the east side of the interior house. Dominick got on his knees like he was commanded too. Dominick was told over 10 times to put his hands on his head. His reply several times was to "Fuck Off." Dominick was wearing jeans and no shirt. When he came from the unknown area, I wasn't able to scan his pockets fast enough for weapons. With Dominick facing away from us and on his knees, we weren't able to clear his pockets for bulges or outlines of weapons. With Dominick refusing to obey Ofc's commands to put his hands on his head and continually telling us to "fuck off"; also with an unknown un-clearable area to Dominick's right as well as straight ahead of him, I was concerned that if we entered his residence and had a physical confrontation, we would be at a disadvantage and sacrifice our safety.

Dominick with a swift motion took his left hand and put it in his left front pants pocket. He dug deep with his hand and I immediately became concerned that he had a weapon. I yelled for Ofc Howe to taser Dominick for his safety and ours. After a couple more commands to lay on the ground, we determined he wasn't going to listen and that in order to keep Dominick safe as well as keep ourselves safe (due to environmental concern's) Ofc Howe tased Dominick. As Dominick was being tasered, two Ofc's were able to detain him without further incident. I was immediately able to cover the hallway to Dominick's right (which wasn't an option without being in the residence) and Ofc Lynch was able to cover the kitchen area to make the scene safe for Ofc's to work.

After Dominick was secured outside of the residence, we cleared the residence per the complainant's request for other

On 09-14-14 at about 2041 hours, I responded to 516 W. Gordon for a 911 open line. Radio advised that they had an open line with a male yelling at a female and ordering her to go downstairs. Radio was able to link a [REDACTED] #1a to the residence and found she had a DV no contact order protecting her from Dominic Ramos.

Officers J. Arredondo and Jamieson arrived and advised they saw a male inside, but no one would answer the door.

I responded with K9 Talon. We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). Talon and I are in our first year as a team.

We responded in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car and parked a few houses from the address. I was wearing the uniform of the day, which clearly identified me as a Police Officer. Talon was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch on the left side of his chest. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

Due to the possible order violation and lack of compliance, I deployed with Talon. I watched the back of the residence as they continued trying to make contact with the occupants of the home. After a few minutes, [REDACTED] #1a came out of the residence.

[REDACTED] #1a was not very cooperative and said no one else should be in the home. She secured her dogs in a bedroom and came outside. She was asked again who was inside, and she said no one was there.

I asked [REDACTED] #1a directly if it was Ramos in the house and advised her that the dog would go in and find him. She whispered to me, "If I tell you, I might get shot." She then told me that I should send my dog in. Based on her statements to me, I felt confident that it was Ramos in the house, and she was in fear for her safety if she confirmed it directly.

Once additional Officers arrived, I moved up to the doorway. I made an announcement,

saying, "attention in the house! Spokane Police K9 Unit. Dominic Ramos, you are under arrest! You need to come out now or the house will be searched by a police dog and when he finds you, he will bite you!" Talon then barked several times loudly. We waited at least 30 seconds and received no response from inside the residence. I then made a second announcement, identical to the first. Talon again barked loudly and we waited for a response. After a few seconds, a male wearing jeans, shoes and no shirt, came down from the stairs to the 2nd floor. He showed his hands and got down on his knees on the floor in the living room.

I attempted to call him back to us, but he refused to comply with commands. He started lowering his hands and I gave continued commands for him to put his hands on his head. He never put his hands on his head as commanded, but raised his hands slightly.

We were in a very narrow doorway, so I moved out of the way so that the other Officers could address him. When I moved, I no longer had sight of Ramos. Ramos was taken into custody after a Taser application and I secured Talon back in my patrol car.

**#1a** requested we clear the residence for any other people inside. I assisted other Officers in checking the residence and found no one inside.
