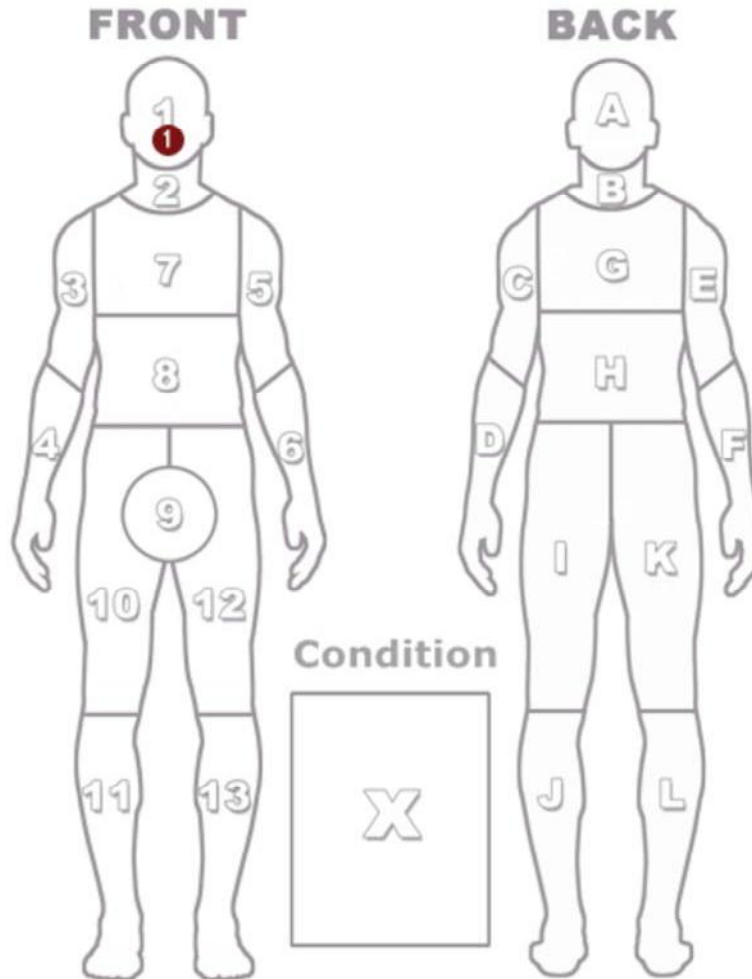

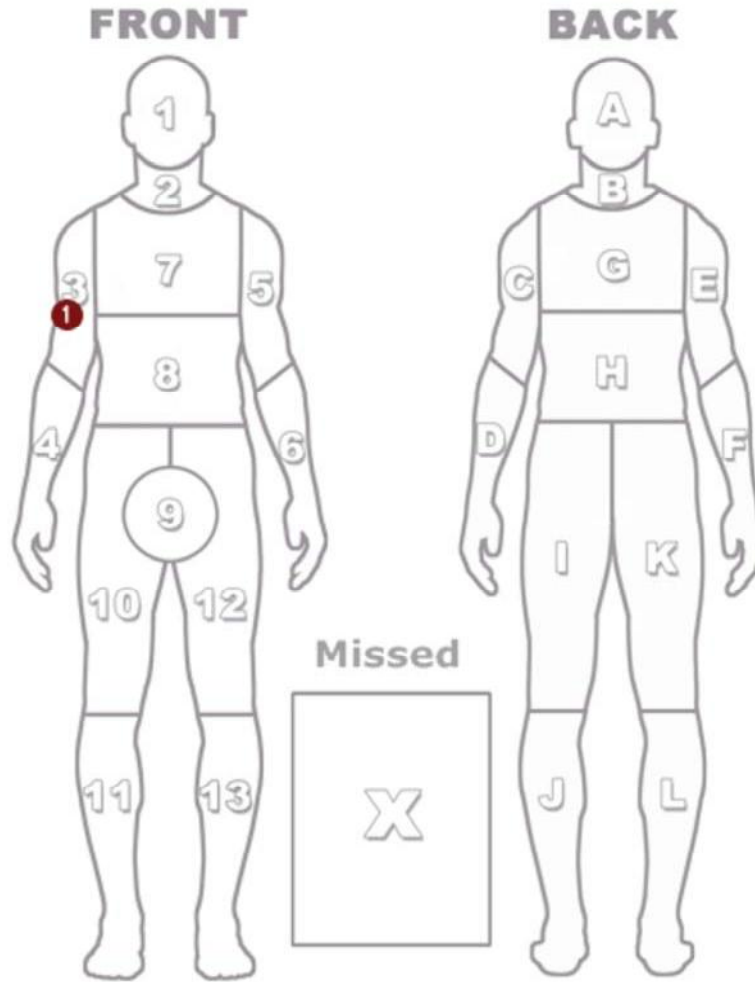

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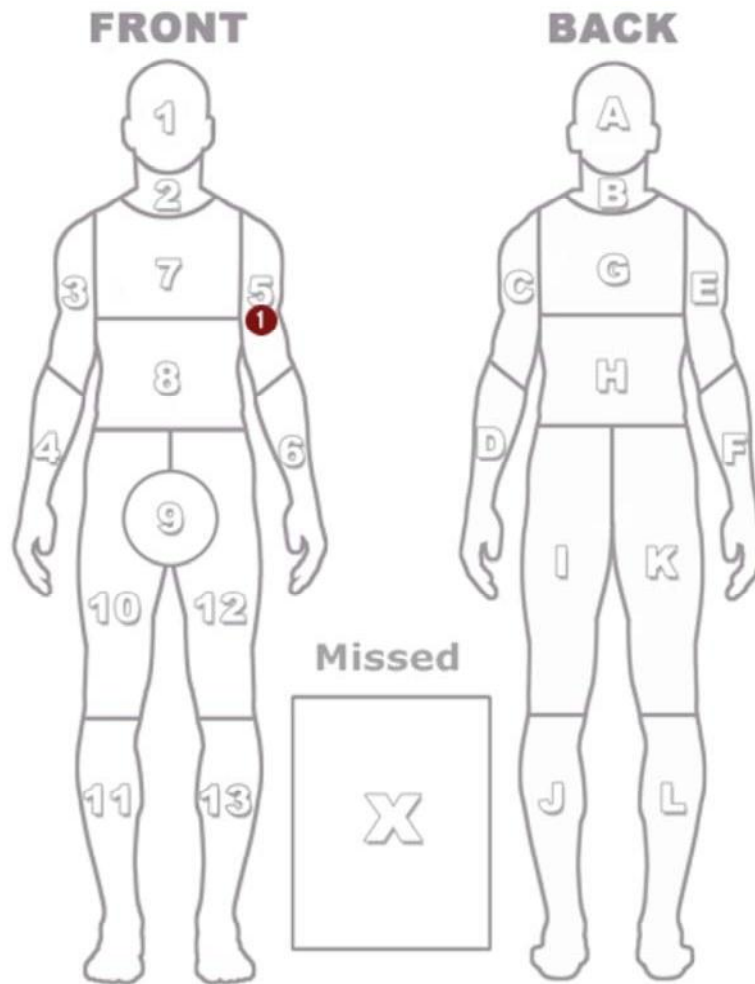

Officers responded to 9030 E Sunset highway #12 on a fight between a male and a female. Dispatch had advised that, "COMP SEEING MALE AND FEMALE YELLING AND HITTING EACH OTHER. NO WEAPONS SEEN. LIKELY HIGH/INTOX. MALE AND FEMALE WERE OUTSIDE, BUT ARE NOW BACK INSIDE #12"

Officers arrived on scene and attempted contact in #12, however the male in the room refused entry to officers (see arrest and additional reports). Officers were able to identify the male and the female in the room from contacting neighbors who were also able to provide information that the female had just been arrested for assault. Officers then discovered that there was a valid and served no contact order that existed between the male (Kenneth Jeannette) and the female (Bridgit Morrison) and that the order listed Morrison as the respondent.

I had arrived on scene and was briefed and had accessed the ram in my vehicle. We were preparing to breach the door when the male opened the door, and the officers could partially see a female in the room. Jeannette was blocking the doorway and preventing entry. I still had the ram with me, however I could see Officer Arredondo and Karurin contact the male blocking the doorway.

Officer Arredondo and Karurin took hold of Jeannette and removed him from the doorway; he was guided to the ground where he was handcuffed. Once on the ground Jeannette was twisting and squirming on the ground and refused to give the officers his hands.

Jeannette's face was covered with bruises and cuts that were in various state of healing and he had a bloody lip. It was impossible to tell which injuries were from being assaulted tonight and from him being assaulted the previous week.

Jeannette was handcuffed directly in front of the doorway which had a small cement sidewalk and a gravel parking lot. The bloody lip would be consistent with the abrasive surface that he was handcuffed on, and his resistance while being handcuffed.

The investigation showed that Morrison was the primary aggressor and the respondent on the no contact order. Morrison also had a swollen right hand and the knuckle of her middle finger was cut and bleeding, her injury was consistent with her striking something with her right hand.

Jeannette was released from the handcuffs and cited for obstructing. He was walked back to his room. Jeannette insisted that there had been no assault and that all of the injuries were from the officers. He also insisted that there had been no previous assaults between himself and Morrison. I asked him if he wanted medics to come and look at his bloody lip and he declined medics. I asked if he had any other injuries and he said, "just my face".

#### Summary:

Officers had determined that there had been an act of domestic violence and had a lawful duty to protect the victim of the violence from not only the present crime but future crimes as well.

The application of force, in this case the takedown technique, was reasonably objective for the suspect's active resistance<sup>1</sup> and the nature of the call. The takedown was within department training and use of force guidelines.

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<sup>1</sup> Active resistance – The use of physical force or mechanical resistance in achieving and or maintaining non compliance

On 11/16/14 at about 0150 hrs, I responded to The Bell Motel (9030 W Sunset Hwy #12) reference a possible domestic dispute.

Prior to arriving on scene, the complainant advised she had observed a female and male assaulting each other. She indicated the female had just been arrested last week for assault.

Upon arriving on scene, I located a large pile of personal belongings(blankets, pillows, coat) outside of unit #12. I knocked on the door and the male inside the residence indicated he was fine, he was

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the homeowner at the location and he declined in opening the door. The male identified himself through the door as Kenneth Jeannette.

I advised the male we were there because we had reports that the occupants in his residence had been involved in a physical altercation, and we needed to check their welfare. He refused to open the door, he stated he and "his wife" were both fine and we could go away. I advised him that Law Enforcement would not be leaving until we could see that both he and his wife were fine. He quickly changed his mind and stated he and "his male partner" were inside and he still "under no circumstances" would be opening the door.

At this time, I had radio attempt to re contact the original complainant to verify she had witnessed the actual physical portion. The original complainant did not answer her phone. I requested additional units and Sgt Boothe as this looked to be a possible situation where we would need to breach the door.

While waiting for the additional units to respond, Radio advised that there was a valid NCO in effect that protecting Kenneth from a female Brigit Morrison. Radio confirmed it was valid and served (4Z925838).

I next contacted the neighboring units to see what they had observed/heard. The tenant in #11 said she heard a bunch of yelling but she needed to take her child to another unit and quickly left. I contacted the tenant in #13, Laura New who stated she had heard arguing for over 30 minutes to almost an hour. She stated that there was a male and female who lived at the location. She stated that she heard the male yelling at the female, "look at my face, you are going to jail for a felony this time".

Once Sgt Boothe arrived at the location, he was briefed on the situation and we decided the door would need to be breached. As we were about to breach the door, Kenneth slowly cracked open the door. He kept saying "hang on, hang on", as he opened the door wider there was a long stick that was next to the door frame and he was holding his dog on a leash. We ordered him to let the dog go and step outside, he continued to hold the leash and kept saying "hold on, hold on". I noted there was a female sitting inside the unit in the corner on a chair huddled up. I advised him to give the female the leash and step out. He finally dropped the leash but still would not fully cooperate. At this time, Officer Kaurin and Sgt Boothe, and I were able to grab him from the threshold and had to physically remove him. He was guided to the ground in the gravel parking lot in front of his doorway. He refused to give us both hands, he had his left hand/arm tucked under his body and kept twisting his body. His lower body was sideways on the pavement and his upper body was in the gravel. I advised him he need to give me his other arm, which he kept yelling, "we don't need to do this". I was finally able to take control of his left arm at which time he was placed in handcuffs (DL) and advsied he was under arrest for Obstructing. He stated he had a bloody mouth at which time I advised him we could have medics come check him out. He declinded medics and did not

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complain of any injuries besides his mouth. I advised him he failed to comply with orders. He was given numerous opportunities to come out willingly and cooperate but refused. He was escorted to my patrol vehicle and placed in the back seat while I re contacted the Officers clearing the apartment.

I next contacted a female inside the unit who was identified as Brigit Morrison. She was very upset we were at the location. She stated she knew she had been arrested last week for assaulting Kenneth and she knew that there was an order. She stated she had contacted the courts to have it dropped but they told her she needed to attend her court date and speak with the Judge. I advised her that the order was still in effect and she was prohibited from being at this location and being with Kenneth. I noticed that Brigit had fresh scrapes on her right hand which was consistent with punching/hitting something. She was placed in handcuffs(DL) and advised she was under arrest for violating the order. She was placed in the back of Officer Belitz's car and later transported to SCJ and booked.

I later reviewed a copy of the order which was signed by Brigit in court on the 10th of this month and signed by the Judge(4Z925838).

At this time, I contacted Sgt Boothe who had briefly chatted with Kenneth. Sgt Boothe stated that Kenneth had bruising on his forehead, bruising and a scrape on his left temple. He also had sustained a bloody mouth from being guided to the ground. Kenneth was advised that he would be issued a citation for obstructing. He was cited and released and advised of his mandatory court date (4Z100643).

Based on the statement we received from Laura, the fresh bruising on Kenneth's face as well as the fresh scrapes on Brigit's hand it was determined there was PC to arrest Brigit for Felony DVOPV.

Corporal Kakuda took photos of both subjects injuries.

On 111614 at approx 0145 hrs officers responded to 9030 W Sunset Hwy on a possible DV.

Dispatch advised that a complainant had called in and said, "COMP SEEING MALE AND FEMALE YELLING AND HITTING EACH OTHER. NO WEAPONS SEEN. LIKELY HIGH/I NTOX. MALE AND FEMALE WERE OUTSIDE, BUT ARE NOW BACK INSIDE #12"

Officers arrived on scene and determined that the male was Kenneth Jeannette and that the female was Bridget Morrison. The witness advised that the female had been arrested last week.

Dispatch advised that there was a valid and served no contact order between the two and that the order listed the female as the respondent on the order. The order stipulated no contact what so ever, and listed the address on sunset.

Officer Arredondo had contacted the male through the door. The male had identified himself as Kenneth and refused to open the door.

I arrived on scene and I could see a large pile of clothing and property on the ground directly in front of the residence. Officer Arredondo was talking to the male who was still refusing to open the door.

We were setting up to breach the door, as the witness had seen an assault and there was a history of violence between the two persons and the condition and location of the female was unknown.

The male then said that he was going to open the door. Once he opened the door he physically blocked the door with his body, despite him saying that he was cooperating he wouldn't move from the entrance of the doorway. The male's position represented a large safety issue as his intent of why he was blocking the door was unknown and he was being deceptive.

Officers removed the male from the doorway and he was placed into a prone cuffing position and he was handcuffed (DL). The male was placed into a shield, partially because it was approx 15 degrees outside and he needed to be protected from

We entered the small apartment and the female was inside. The female was equally uncooperative and insisted that nothing had happened. However the females right hand was red and swollen and her middle finger knuckle was cut and bleeding. The injury would be consistent with her striking something hard with a closed fist.

I contacted the male, who had a bloody lip. The male also had multiple bruises and cuts on his face in various states of healing. It was difficult to determine which injuries had been inflicted from the female tonight and which ones were from the previous assault that the female had been arrested for.

The males bloody lip was most likely from the gravel roadway that the male had been handcuffed on. His injury was consistent with the abrasive surface that he was handcuffed on.

The female was placed under arrest for the order violation and assault. The male's face and the scene were photographed and the male was given a crime victim card with the incident number.

The male was insistent that nothing had happened. When he was speaking he was slurring his words and speaking with a thick tongue. He had the odor of intoxicants on his breath and person.

A dispatcher confirmed a valid protection order with Kenneth Jeannette and a Bridget Morrison.

It should be noted that officers were dressed in the generic Spokane Police patrol uniforms, complete with badges, patches, and accessories. Also, there were at least three fully marked patrol cars (vehicles # 352/388/366) parked in front of the complex (vehicle #366 was parked in front of apartment #12's door).

Officers were establishing a "contact team" when without warning the door opened. I observed a male and a female standing in the threshold of the doorway. The male refused to obey verbal commands to step outside of the room, saying he has a dog in hand. Officers then pulled the male out of the apartment, separating the male and female. I then entered the apartment, yelling, "Spokane Police Department, Spokane Police Department." I had the female who was later identified as being Bridget Morrison sit down on a chair in the single room apartment. Morrison told me that she did not call the police. She voluntarily added that Jeannette did not assault her.

The male and female were positively identified as being Kenneth Jeannette and Bridget Morrison. I was advised that Morrison was the respondent on the order, while Jeannette was the protected party. I requested a triple I on Morrison (no prior convictions).

Officer Huffman took Morrison into custody.

I took photographs of Jeannette, Morrison, and the items left out in front of apartment #12. See photo-log for more information. Jeannette advised me that the items left out in front of his apartment belongs to Morrison. At jail, Morrison was uncooperative when asked to photograph the injury to her hand, again saying she did not call the police.

Officer Arredondo advised a male who was inside the apartment was refusing to open the door. When I arrived at 0211 hours I parked my patrol vehicle in front of the apartment and utilized my spotlight to shine into the window of room 12.

I approached the window and observed a male, later identified as Kenneth Jeanette, looking outside of the window. He using one hand to pull blinds apart to look out of the window.

I briefly began speaking to Jeanette asking him to show me his hands through the window. Jeanette refused to do so and would only utilize one hand to look out of the window. Shortly after I requested him to show me both of his hands on the window he let the blinds close and he did not return to look out the window again that I saw.

Due to the nature of the call and the caller saying a male and female had been fighting and both had gone back inside I was concerned for the welfare of others inside the apartment.

Officer S. Arredondo was preparing to force entry into the residence by getting additional Officers and resources needed on scene.

During the time we were waiting for additional resources Jeannette was given multiple chances to open the door and continually refused saying everything was fine inside and he wanted us to leave.

Sgt Booth arrived with a ram and Cpl. Kakuda began setting up an entry team at the front door to enter after we utilized the ram to open the door.

I moved to the outside of the door along with Cpl. Kakuda and Officer S. Arredondo. Moments after I was in place Jeannette began opening the door.

As Jeannette began to open the door I told him to "show me your hands". As I began to gain a visual on Jeannette I observed he was holding his right hand up into the air but kept his left hand down to his side.

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I began giving Jeannette directions to step outside of the doorway. Jeannette repeatedly told us he was holding his dog and while he said this he was not attempting to come outside of the doorway.

As Jeannette was standing I could see there was stick near his left hand which he was holding down to his side and not completely showing me his palm.

I observed a female standing behind Jeannette. I was concerned that even though Jeanette had opened the door he was not going to allow us to enter the residence to ensure the safety of those inside and complete our investigation.

Jeannette was not completely showing me his left hand although he had raised his right arm up with his palm facing me. Jeannette was also not complying with my direction to have him step out of the doorway.

In order to clear the doorway so Officers could enter I reached out with my left hand and grabbed Jeannette's right wrist. I wanted to move Jeannette out of the doorway and also wanted to ensure he was not able to grab the stick which was located near his left hand which he had kept down to his left side.

After grabbing his right arm I quickly pulled Jeannette out of the doorway and moved him approximately 4 feet from the door. Due to the quick pulling action on his arm Jeannette was off balance and I utilized the balance displacement to continue to move Jeannette to the ground.

Jeannette was placed on the ground on his belly. I had continually held his right wrist and brought his right hand behind his back so I could place him in handcuffs. When Jeannette was placed on the ground he had placed his left hand underneath him.

I saw his left arm was under his body and I began to give him direction to place his left arm behind his back. I observed that Jeannette was not following my directions and was not removing his left hand from under his belly.

I continued to hold his right arm giving directions to him to place his left hand behind his back. Officer Arredondo moved to his left side and moved his left arm behind his back.

At this point I placed handcuffs onto Jeannette. I then searched Jeannette and assisted Officer Arredondo as we placed him into the back seat of his patrol vehicle.

I then completed a citation for obstruction and issued it to Jeannette at the conclusion of the investigation at the scene. I advised Jeannette of the court date and ensured he knew where the Spokane County courthouse was at.



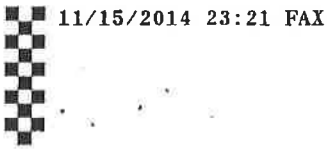
