



CONFIDENTIAL

On 11-26-14 at about 1739hrs myself and my PACT gathered intel about wanted subject-Sean Driver. Driver was currently wanted on SPD misdemeanor warrants as well as a Burglary warrant out of CDA Idaho for several cts of Burglary. I am familiar with Driver and his 20 plus years of criminal history and his propensity for non compliance. Driver is a Repeat Offender with 36 prior Felony convictions.

We learned Driver was at the listed storage unit and driving a vehicle. I knew that we didn't want to let Driver become mobile in the vehicle due to his numerous prior vehicle eludings. I began making a coordinated containment and hopefully peaceful arrest when he began driving out of the gated storage unit. We quickly executed a successful blocking technique while he was leaving. We had his vehicle blocked in and he was by himself in the vehicle.

We had marked Police vehicles with emergency lights activated and officers including myself in uniform. We had Ofc Gorman with his K9 on scene with us.

Driver immediately began yelling at us and refusing to get out of his vehicle. He questioned why we were stopping him and I explained to him that he was wanted in Idaho for Burglary as well as local warrants. Driver contested everything that I was telling him and began using his cell phone. We continued to negotiate with Driver while he stayed in his vehicle. He had his window down slightly but was more concerned about making phone calls. I advised him at least three times of his warrants and that he was currently under arrest. Ofc Kennedy took over negotiations while I began coordinating officers and advising dispatch of our incident.

Within a few minutes two separate vehicles arrived associated with Driver. One claimed to be his ex-wife and one claimed to be his current girlfriend.

I had several other officers assist with the incident and prevent the arriving subjects from getting to Driver and the immediate scene. Driver was making statements that if he were to come out of the vehicle we would have to kill him. These statements and his behavior are consistent with past incidents involving him.

I planned a coordinated extraction maneuver with on duty SWAT and TAC officers with multiple force options. The rear right window of Drivers vehicle was breached and a T16 OC grenade was put inside his vehicle. The intention was to force Driver out of the vehicle and place him in custody without injury to himself or others. The OC had the desired effect and Driver quickly exited his vehicle. Ofc Cole who was on the driver's side of the vehicle had his Taser out and deployed his Taser at Driver's target area when he refused to comply and when Ofc Cole couldn't see his hands. The taser missed Drivers targeted area and missed him completely.

Driver fled on foot SB towards Francis and the subjects who were standing by at the scene. Ofc Gormans K9 quickly apprehended Driver and he was taken into custody without further incident.

Prior to putting the extraction team into motion I considered the known facts of the incident. In addition to Driver's criminal history stated above, he didn't show us any weapons although making threatening statements. The negotiations with Driver didn't have their desired effect of de-escalating his rising angry and non-compliant behavior.

Driver continued to make phone calls and already 2 vehicles had shown up. I wanted to get Driver into custody peacefully and was aware that he could be calling in additional friends to assist with a potential escape. Having officers with Taser's, handheld OC and Ofc Gorman's K9 assisted in getting Driver into custody without the incident elevating to anything greater. Ofc Cole chose to deploy his Taser in probe mode for the same reasons.

Driver was arrested on his warrants and a new PCS-Meth charge with resisting arrest referred.

Over the past week I have been actively searching for wanted subject Sean M. Driver 5/28/1976. Driver is wanted on several local misdemeanor warrants and a Felony extraditable arrest warrant out of Kootenai county Idaho on four counts of Burglary.

On 11/26/2014 at about 1736 hours I received a phone call from Sides, stating that Driver had just arrived at that location in a white Nissan Maxima.

Myself and other Officers responded to that location. Driver has a lengthy record of eluding and running from police. We planned on contacting him inside the fenced storage facility.

Before we were able to go inside the facility, Driver showed up at the exit gate in the white Nissan Maxima, WA #ASH1030.

Because of his tendency to run from police we executed a blocking stop on his vehicle before he could exit the gate. I was driving patrol suv #330 that is fully equipped with emergency lights and siren. I was wearing the Spokane Police P.A.C.T. uniform of the day.

I positioned my vehicle behind the Nissan with my emergency lights activated. Ofc. Kennedy had positioned her vehicle in front of the Nissan. At one point I saw the reverse lights on the Nissan come on and I believed he would possible try and ram his way out.

I could see that Driver was the only occupant of the vehicle.

I heard Sgt. Vigesaa give Driver verbal commands to step out of the vehicle and that he was under arrest for his warrants.

Driver refused to step out of the vehicle and kept reaching down into his lap. At one point I could see that he had a cell phone in his hand. Ofc. Kennedy spoke to Driver for several minutes, trying to convince Driver to step out of the vehicle. At one point I heard Driver say that if he gets out of the car we are going to have to "shoot" him.

Ofc. Howe and other Officers arrived onscene. See Ofc. Howe's report for more information. After about 10 to 15 minutes Driver opened the driver's door and began to run s/b through the parking lot. Driver was taken into custody by K-9 Ofc. Gorman and his K-9. See Ofc. Gorman's report for more information.

I was standing by the left side of Driver as Officer's were handcuffing him in the prone cuffing position. I saw Ofc. Heuett pick up two small plastic baggys from underneath the left side of Driver, near his waist area. Ofc. Heuett handed me the baggys. The baggys were about 2"x2" and both contained an off white crystal substance. I field tested the contents of one of the baggies and it field tested positive for meth.

I photographed the suspect vehicle and damage to the rear passenger side window.

I contacted employee sides at the office. She advised the incident was captured on business surveillance. I advised the Spokane Police Taru unit about the incident and asked for a copy of the incident to be made.

After being medically treated at the hospital Driver was booked on his warrants and Possession of a Controlled Substance (Meth). P.C. also exists for Resisting Arrest.

While enroute the scene, I heard Sgt. Vigesaa advise that Driver was refusing to exit his vehicle. He was requesting extra tactical equipment in order to extricate Driver from the vehicle.

Upon arrival, Sgt. Vigesaa advised me that he had exhausted several means of verbal tactics, attempted K9 bark out, and more harsh negotiations. None of which were working. At this point, it was clear that Driver was actively resisting our lawful attempts to apprehend him. As Sgt. Vigesaa briefed me, I could hear officers in the background verbally attempting to get Driver to comply.

We then made a tactical plan to remove driver from the vehicle. Once we were set, I extracted the left rear passenger door and inserted a T16-Hand held OC10, expulsion grenade. This had the exact desired effect that was intended and Driver quickly exited the vehicle and fled in an Southern direction, where he was quickly apprehended.

Once he was in custody, I then spoke to the registered owner of the vehicle, who had just arrived. I obtained signed search consent from her to search the vehicle for any contraband that may have been left behind by Driver. She further advised she and Driver are "just friends" and she did in fact let him borrow her car. She advised that she got a call from him after the police had blocked him in and when he was refusing to exit the car. I

She stood by while the search was conducted. At no time did she revoke her consent, limit the scope of the search, or affect the search anyway.

While enroute, Sgt Vigesaa advised he had information that Sean Driver was inside the premises. Driver had a confirmed outstanding felony warrant for Burglary, as well as three misdemeanor warrants for DWLS 3rd. Driver has an extensive history of violence, fighting with police, eluding and running from the Police.

As I arrived on scene, Sgt Vigesaa advised over the radio that Driver was in a vehicle and attempting to leave the premises. The vehicle, a white Nissan Altima was at the exit gate, waiting for the gate to open so he could leave. Driver was the driver of the vehicle and only occupant. As the gate opened, Sgt Vigesaa, Cpl McCollough and Ofc S Kennedy used their vehicles to block Driver's vehicle in place. As they did this, I parked my fully marked K9 patrol vehicle sideways in front of the exit of the mini storage, which was about 50 feet directly in front of Driver. My reflective K9 markings were visible to Driver. I exited my vehicle with SPD K9 Axl. I was wearing my K9 training uniform, which is fully marked with 'Police K9'. K9 Axl was also wearing his duty harness, which is marked with 'Police K9' and SPD patches. We took up a position on the east side of Sgt Vigesaa's vehicle, which was parked next to Driver's. From this position I had a view directly into the drivers seat of Driver's vehicle.

Immediately Driver was confrontational. Initially he opened the door and yelled "What the fuck!", then he slammed his door closed. Sgt Vigesaa and Ofc S Kennedy initiated verbal contact with Driver. During their conversation, I heard them both tell Driver that he was under arrest for his warrants. Driver denied that he had any warrants. Sgt Vigesaa told him he had a confirmed outstanding felony warrant for Burglary out of Idaho. That warrant had nationwide extradition. Driver yelled, "I'm not going back to Idaho! Your going to have to shoot me!" He also advised Driver of his three local warrants for DWLS 3rd. Driver rolled his window down about an inch and again yelled, "I'm not going back to Idaho! You're going to have to shoot me before I go back!"

While negotiating with Driver, we made a tactical plan to knock out a rear vehicle window and insert O.C. powder with the intention of forcing Driver out of the vehicle. Driver overheard the plan and yelled, "If you touch my fucking car I'm gonna come out shooting!"

During our negotiating, I observed driver was texting and talking on his phone. Within a couple minutes, two vehicle's arrived and parked right next to my K9 car. Both vehicles were occupied by

woman who claimed to be there for Driver. One was his ex wife and one was his girlfriend. Both were causing a scene and required an Officer to control them and keep them away from us as we communicated with Driver.

We communicated with Driver for over 10 minutes. During that time, he was told by Sgt Vigesaa and Ofc S Kennedy that he was under arrest several times, ordered out of the vehicle multiple times, and advised that a Police K9 was on scene several times. He was advised that if he did not surrender, we would insert O.C. gas into the vehicle. He was also advised that if he ran on foot, the Police K9 would bite him. Once enough resources arrived and our tactical plan was set, the decision was made to breach a rear window and insert O.C. While the tactical team completed that, I remained on the east side of Sgt Vigesaa's vehicle.

From my location, I could see Driver and the tactical team approaching the vehicle. As soon as they breached the back window, Driver threw open the drivers door. He stood up, put his hands up in the air, closed the drivers door and yelled "Ok, I give up!" As soon as that sentence was finished, Driver dropped his hands and sprinted to the south, towards the two females who were now waiting in their vehicles with passenger doors open. It was obvious Driver was attempting to get to their vehicles in an attempt to escape arrest, retrieve a weapon or prolong the stand off.

I deployed SPD K9 Axl for the following reasons;

Crime-

Driver was wanted for a confirmed outstanding Felony warrant for Burglary out of Idaho. That warrant had nationwide extradition. Driver also had three confirmed outstanding misdemeanor warrants for Driving with Suspended License 3rd degree.

Threat to the Public and Officers-

Driver is a well known criminal. He is currently listed on SPD's 'Repeat Offender Program', which lists the top 25 active criminals in the city. Driver has a very lengthy past of stealing cars, then driving them at deadly speeds in attempts to flee from Police. Driver also deals in stolen property and has multiple restraining orders against him. Most importantly, Driver had previously escaped from prison. When Police attempted to arrest Driver on several outstanding warrants in 2008, Driver barricaded himself in the basement of a residence and threatened to shoot Police and himself with a rifle if they entered. That standoff lasted several hours, and Driver only exited after Police inserted gas.

During this incident, Driver had mentioned having a firearm several times, and even threatened to shoot Police if we touched his car. He had not been searched, and due to his past and his statements during this incident, there was a very high likelihood he was armed. It was unknown to what extent Driver would go to in order to evade arrest. There was also a very high likelihood that one of the other vehicles there for him contained a weapon. If he was allowed to get to one of the

vehicles, he would be able to retrieve a weapon and use it against the Police.

Level of resistance-

As stated above, Driver has experience initiating stand offs with Police. Driver locked himself in his vehicle, then once police initiated a plan to have him surrender, he exited the vehicle and sprinted away towards his waiting get away vehicle. If allowed to reach the waiting vehicle, there most definitely would have been a pursuit, stand off, and possibly a deadly force situation if Driver followed through with his threats to shoot the Police.

The way all the vehicles were positioned in the entrance of the storage facility, Driver was trying to sprint to a vehicle that was only approx 50 feet from his. Driver is a larger, muscular male that appears athletic. He took off very quickly, and action had to be taken immediately if we were going to deny him access to the waiting vehicle. Due to the prior announcements made, the level of danger Driver posed to Officers and the close proximity to his get away vehicle, I was unable to give Driver any further K9 announcements. Driver was already two car lengths away before I was able to release K9 AxI.

I released K9 AxI and gave him the command to contact. K9 AxI responded immediately and was able to contact Driver before he reached the get away vehicle. Driver must have seen the dog coming, because right before K9 AxI contacted him, he turned towards him and lowered his body weight as if to catch him. K9 AxI contacted the front of Driver's left shoulder, knocking him backwards. Due to the large flat shape of a shoulder, K9 AxI was not able to hold that contact as they moved backwards. K9 AxI was able to quickly contact Drivers left lower forearm, right above his wrist. Driver tried to pull his arm back quickly, but K9 AxI maintained his grip. Driver fell to the ground on his back. I was within 20 feet of Driver when K9 AxI contacted him, and by the time I ran there Driver was surrendering. I gave K9 AxI the command to release and he did immediately. K9 AxI was on the contact approx 10 seconds. Driver was detained (DL) without further incident.

Driver was placed under arrest and transported to Deaconess for treatment of the injuries. Injuries consisted of four punctures on Drivers left shoulder, and two punctures on his left wrist. Injuries were treated, then photographed by Cpl Denton. The injuries required no stitching. Driver was discharged and booked into Spokane County Jail.

Sgt Vigesaa was present during the call, and Sgt Kendall responded as well.

At about 1800 hrs, I arrived at the storage facility at 1900 E Francis with the knowledge that Driver was at his storage unit. I had previous knowledge that he was wanted locally for misdemeanor charges, and that he had a significant felony warrant out of Idaho. Radio traffic I hear while en route had indicated that Driver was reaching for something below him. I observed that Sgt. Vigesaa, Cpl. McCollough and Ofc. Kennedy had blocked Driver's vehicle at the metal gated area of the facility. He was seated in the driver's seat, and Ofc. Kennedy was trying to negotiate with him. I placed myself just to the east of where Ofc. Kennedy was standing. I could see that other officers had their guns out and had lethal options. I advised her and Cpl. McCollough that I had my taser out, and that they had "lethal".

I could hear portions of the negotiation attempts by Ofc. Kennedy. As she would talk, Driver's window was up. He would lower it in order to speak, and would close it when Ofc. Kennedy would respond, indicating that he was trying to not hear her. I heard him make a statement that were he to come out of the vehicle, or if we damage the vehicle, we would have to kill him. He mentioned that he was going to be in prison for 20 years. He was making phone calls and was moving about with agitation. With his mindset and the statements he was making, I thought that Driver was trying to set up a shooting situation with us. I made the decision at that time that if Driver were to attempt to run or start ramming our vehicles, I would use the taser in an attempt to disable or distract him and thus maybe prevent a lethal encounter, protecting all involved.

As the negotiations appeared to be ineffective and there was potential for him to attempt to flee with the vehicle, I supported the decision to insert pepper spray into the vehicle to end the encounter. I anticipated that the situation would escalate without a quick action on our part.

When the gas was inserted, Driver exited the driver's door, and he did not appear to be surrendering, but appeared that he was trying to flee on foot. I could not see if his hands were empty as he exited in the quick manner. I deployed the taser, and missed my target to the right, striking Ofc. Kennedy's undercover vehicle. I observed Driver being taken into custody. I assisted with trying to stand him up. He complained of extreme pain to his "broken" left arm. I held him by his clothing to cradle him, and told him to stand on his own, so I wouldn't stress his arms, which he did. He was placed in Ofc. C Lesser's vehicle.
