

Dimit was intoxicated, uncooperative, threatening, and refused to follow commands. Arm bar control to cuffing was appropriate when he tried to leave. Dimit beat his head on the shield en route to Jail and refused to get out of the car once there. When Ofc. tried to pull him out by the feet, Dimit deliberately broke out his teeth by striking his face on a bar. Officer video cameras caught the incident. Use of force was reasonable by officers and within policy. Body camera was an excellent tool in this incident.

I showed Dr. Frahm the video of the incident as well as still pictures of the injury. His assessment based on the video and the still pictures was that Jones broke off the porcelain veneer on his crowned right front tooth. It appeared that his left front tooth had a small chip. Dr. Frahm noticed a lack of apparent injury to Jones' mouth and lips. He noticed no swelling or bleeding around the right front tooth. Had there been a significant impact to his tooth he would have expected to see

Please provide training on how to obtain copies of pictures from IDENT. Any pictures or videos should be reviewed by the chain of command as the UOF is reviewed. The need for this to	much more damage beyond the missing porcelain veneer. Dr. Frahm advised that the porcelain veneer can be broken from everyday use. In reviewing the video it is evident that Ofc. McMurtrey pulls Jones' foot in an effort to remove him from the car. However, McMurtrey's slow pull does not correspond with the force that Jones' mouth/ head impact the shield in the rear of the car. It almost appears that at the same time McMurtrey pulls Jones' foot, Jones purposefully strikes his face on the rear shield. The use of force was minimal and reasonable. The extent of Jones' "injuries" as noted by Dr. Frahm is minimal. However, I do think that we need to look at options to make the rear partition more safe for prisoners. The amount it protrudes obviously contributed to Jones' injury and is likely to consider to future injuries. We should have fleet design some sort of padding or other safety feature to cover or pad the large protrusion. The padding should prevent injuries such as sustained by Jones as well as injuries to knees, shins, etc. I have reviewed this incident and find the use of force, pulling the subject's foot by Ofc. McMurtrey, to be reasonable and within policy. The video was somewhat useful, but it does appear as though the subject's injuries were self inflicted by the intentional impact with his face to the security screen in the car.

#### **Complainant Interview Summary**

Complainant (Charles Dimit) was contacted inside the Spokane County Jail and declined to make a statement.

#### **Officer Interview Summary**

Officers responded to a 3<sup>rd</sup> party report of a male assaulting another male by choking, punching and kicking. Officer's contacted Dimit at the scene and arrested him for assault. Dimit was uncooperative throughout the encounter. He tried to walk away, had to be detained in handcuffs, and was yelling and swearing at Officers. During transport to Jail, Dimit was banging his head on the inside of the door, and the transport had to be stopped to try to secure him in the back seat. Dimit refused to comply and could not be secured in the seat. At the Jail, Ofc. McMurtrey requested Cpl. Ennis video tape the encounter which he did. He opened the back door of the patrol car. Dimit was laying across the back seat of the car with his feet on the driver's side and his body facing toward the front of the car. Ofc McMurtrey asked him four times to exit the vehicle. Dimit refused to get out of the patrol car. Officer McMurtrey used force to remove Dimit for the following reasons:

*Crimes Committed*: Dimit was under arrest for assault. He was now willfully resisting Ofc. McMurtrey's attempt to complete the arrest process by refusing to get out of the car.

Suspect's Threat to Officers: By refusing to exit the vehicle, Officers may have to enter the vehicle to extract the suspect. The back of the patrol vehicle is a confined space placing the Officer in close proximity with the suspect. This close proximity increases the Officers risk of being assaulted, and being exposed to body fluids. Demit had been involved in an assault and he had blood on him.

*Suspect's Resistance*: The suspect was passively resisting Ofc. McMurtrey by laying on the seat and refusing to move.

Based on these factors, Ofc. McMurtrey decided to pull on his leg to remove him from the vehicle. While sliding along the seat, Dimit's mouth struck a metal partition on the shield and his front teeth were damaged.

#### **Investigative Summary**

#### 300.3.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

An officer may use force which reasonably appears to be necessary to effect an arrest if, after notice of the intention to arrest the person, he/she either flees or forcibly resists (RCW 10.31.050).

Dimit was under custodial arrest for Assault and had been transported to the Jail to complete the arrest process. He had been uncooperative throughout the encounter. He was asked four times to exit the vehicle and refused to get out of the car. The Officers would have to enter the confined back seat area to extract him exposing them to hazards inside the car. Dimit had not been fully searched at this time and had only been patted down for obvious weapons. Dimit was passively resistant. By pulling on Dimit's leg to extract him, Ofc McMurtrey used a low amount of force to complete the arrest. The usual and expected effect of this use of force is for the subject to slide across the seat and stand up resulting in no injuries. His use of this force was objectively reasonable based on the totality of the circumstances. The force was consistent with SPD Policy and State Law.

In examining the back seat area, the shield in the new SUV's contains a metal "bump out" in the partition to make room for the patrol rifle and shotgun in the Officer area. This "bump out" is made of metal and has metal edges. The shields in the older patrol cars are flat and smooth with no "bump out" or edges. The injury to Dimit's mouth and teeth was an unintended and unanticipated consequence of the use of force. The injury was due more to environmental factors inside the patrol car than to the use of force.

In response to the injury, roll call training was conducted to minimize the chances of this occurring again. Officers were reminded that whenever possible, they should utilize jail staff to do the extractions. Other considerations, like controlling the head and upper body were also discussed. These new SUV's are still relatively new to our department and we are still responding to challenges they present to completing our mission. Therefore, it may be helpful to provide training department wide about the risk of injury that the shield partitions present. In addition, the Department may explore the possibility of cushioning the partition to avoid similar future incidents.

On 120214 at approximately 0034 hours, I responded to assist officers Bode and Kannberg on a report of an assault in front of 1414 W 10th Ave in Spokane, WA.

An anonymous 911 caller reported seeing a male choking a male in front of the listed address. The male with no shirt was screaming for help and being punched and kicked. See CAD.

Mary Tracey also called 911 reporting seeing the same.

I arrived on scene after Officer Bode and Sgt. Kannberg. Both involved subjects were already detained in handcuffs.

I assisted Sgt. Kannberg with a male, later identified as Charles Dimit. He was screaming loudly that the police beat him up and that he was just walking down the street when the police violated his constitutional rights. He was very verbal that his attorney is Timothy Note and that he would "have your badge".

Sgt. Kannberg and I escorted to my patrol vehicle. He was continuously verbose, threatening that he would take our badges. He repeatedly called us numerous vulgar names, such as "Faggots", and "Stupid mother fuckers". He initially refused to get in the vehicle, still screaming at us. I had to push him in to the vehicle with my hands. This resulted in no injury. He was patted down for weapons with none found and the handcuffs were checked for proper fit and double locked prior to securing him in the patrol car.

While inside the vehicle, Dimit continued to yell extremely loud the same type of obscenities at me. He refused to cooperate with my investigation, or to identify himself. He slurred his name once, but it was indiscernible. When I tried to question him, he stated, "I have nothing to say to you".

Dimit appeared highly intoxicated. He smelled heavily of intoxicants. His eyes were watery and

bloodshot, he slurred his speech, and was unable to maintain normal balance as he stood.

I observed abrasions to Dimit's elbows and fists. His hands were bloody. He had no injuries to his face. He was not bleeding from the mouth.

I left Dimit in my car, supervised by Sgt. Kannberg. I then contacted witness Mary Tracey at 1418 W 5th Ave #5.

Tracey stated the following in summary:

She recognized the blonde male with the shirt on as a tenant of the other building (1414 W 10th). She did not know the shirtless male. She was inside her bedroom in her apartment when she heard a loud sound, screaming and the wind chimes on the porch of 1414. She looked out of her window and heard the shirtless male screaming for help. She saw the blonde male in the black shirt punch him in the face with a closed fist repeatedly. The shirtless male fell to the ground. She saw the suspect kick him in the ribs and face several times. The shirtless male then got up and ran away, despite the constant assault. She then saw the police arrive on scene.

I conferred with Officer Bode, and verified that based on the victim and witnesses statements, there was probable cause to arrest Dimit for city assault.

I transported Dimit to SCSO jail. While transporting him to jail, Jail staff was advised that we were bringing in an uncooperative suspect. Cpl. Ennis was requested to respond to photograph Dimit.

Dimit screamed at me and made baseless accusations the entire trip to jail. He claimed he was beat up by the police, that his mouth was bleeding and that he had a concussion. He repeatedly told me he was going to take my badge, that the police assaulted him for no reason, that he was just walking down the street.

He began thrashing around the back seat and it sounded as if he were striking his head on the side of the door. He had slammed his head numerous times previously while I was interviewing Tracey, see Sgt. Kannberg's report. I pulled over at 5th Ave and Cedar to attempt to buckle Dimit. He refused to sit up or comply with any of my directives. As I stood in the doorway, he screamed, "Ouch! I'm being assaulted by the police, Stop!" several times. He then stuck his leg out of the car door, pinning the door open. I told him several times to put his leg back in to the car. By that time, I determined I was not going to be able to safely buckle him and decided not to force the issue. He ignored my commands to place his leg back in the car. I had to force it back in to the car with my foot to close the door, book him in to jail and complete the arrest.

I drove my vehicle in to the jail sally port to unload Dimit. He was still belligerent and uncooperative.

I requested Cpl. Ennis film the extraction, knowing that Dimit would not cooperate.

I opened the drivers side back door. Dimit was sitting on the drivers side back seat lying with his body across to the passenger side. I told him four different times to sit up and get out of the car. Dimit at no time cooperated with my directives. He layed in the back of the car repeating something to the effect of, "Don't kill me, you are going to kill me". After my fourth request for him to exit the car, I pulled on his feet to slide him to the door where I could then escort him out using arm control. When I pulled on his legs, he flinched his head forward. I heard and saw his face strike a vertical metal portion of the partition in the back of the car. As Dimit sat up, he stated to me that I broke out his teeth. He then spat out numerous fragments of tooth on the ground.

My intention was to extract Dimit out of the vehicle to book him in to jail. It was necessary for me to pull him out because after four verbal directives, he refused to exit the car on his own. The design of the patrol vehicle doors only affords one person to operate in the confined space. I gave Dimit numerous chances to exit the patrol vehicle on his own volition, however he refused. He used his limp body and lack of cooperation to prolong and delay the arrest/booking process.

I felt it was necessary to remove him from the vehicle for the following reasons:

He was under arrest for city assault, a crime in which he already assaulted a person by punching and kicking him multiple times in the face and torso. He was intoxicated and belligerent. He, at no time was cooperative with the arrest process. I tried numerous times to use less intrusive means of removing him from the car, to include four verbal commands and actually reached inside to assist his feet to make it easier for him to simply sit up and step out. He had made numerous threats to me, and displayed intent on self harm by slamming his head in to the patrol car shield. I felt that it was safest to pull on his feet, while still being able to stay out of the back of the patrol car. Should he have assaulted or attempted to assault me, I could have easily stepped back out of his reach. I considered approaching him from the passenger side, in which I could have pulled him by the shoulders out of the vehicle. This was not a practical option because it increased the likelihood of a fall on to the concrete because his body would have been inverted. I also would have had to reach well in to the car, increasing the danger to myself.

He willfully resisted me completing the arrest by lying in the back of the car, forcing me to physically remove him. The fact that he struck his mouth on the partition was inadvertent. See video.

I later looked at his mouth and it appeared that he broke his middle upper teeth, see photos.

Sgt. Kannberg was present at the time, see his additional report.

After Dimit was booked, I collected the tooth fragments from the floor. I noticed that he did not bleed from the mouth even after breaking his teeth. The tooth fragments appeared to be synthetic in

On 120214, I responded to the report of two males fighting in the street in front of 1414 W 10th. The anonamous caller stated one male was punching and kicking the other male in the face while choking him.

When I arrived on-scene, I observed both men standing in the roadway. One male was not wearing a shirt and had blood on his face and torso. I identified myself as a police officer and yelled for both men to get on the ground. The male later identified as Eric immediately followed commands and layed on the ground. The male later identified as Charles would not follow commands. He eventually went down to his knees but refused to lay down.

I detained Eric in handcuffs and pat frisked him for weapons. I placed him in the back of my patrol car. I assisted Sgt Kannberg with handcuffing Charles.

I advised Eric of his Miranda Warnings from a department issued rights advisement card. He stated he understood his rights and wished to voluntarilly waive them and answer my questions.

Earlier today he met Charles at a gas station and came to his apartment to hang out. Eric said Charles turned violent and began hitting him after an undescribed "Misunderstanding". Eric said he did not want to say too much and would not tell me if he was kicked or how many times he had been punched. He said he was not choked and at no time did he loose conciousness. Eric told me, "You saved my life." and "Thank you for helping me." I asked him if he thought Charles was going to kill him and he said no.

Eric declined medics.

Several times Eric broke down and began sobbing in the back of my car. I removed Eric's handcuffs.

Eric told me he thought he might have broken his thumb and requested I give him a ride to Deaconess for medical attention. I asked him again if he wanted medics to come to the scene and he said no.

I gave him a ride to Deaconess.

Corporal Ennis responded and took photos of Eric's injuries.

Upon arrival Officer Bode was on scene and he had one subject proned out in the street and the other was on his hands and knees. I took up a position to the left of Officer Bode's vehicle facing east bound. I lit up the area with the emergency lighting from my vehicle and exited my car.

Officer Bode advised he had the subjects' proned out and I advised radio. It appeared one subject, Charles Dimit, wanted to get up as he was not getting down on his stomach. Mr. Dimit was on his hands and knees.

The other male subject appeared cooperative as he was on his stomach and not saying anything.

I told Mr. Dimit to get on his stomach and he stated no. He stated he was the victim. At this time I did not know who he was. He was wearing a shirt and the other male was not. The complaint advised the subject that was wearing the shirt was the aggressor who was choking the other male. I gain ordered him to get down and he refused. I could see he was not going to get down on the ground. I could see blood on him and the other male. I began circling to his left approaching him going around some vehicles. I continued telling Mr. Dimit to get down and he refused. He then began standing up saying he would not get down.

As Mr. Dimit stood he began walking at an angle away from my car. I approached him and told him to sit down and he refused. He stated he was the victim and was going to his house. I took left arm control of him and he began pulling away. Officer Bode assisted me by taking right arm control. Mr. Ditit started pulling away and he was pushed up against a vehicle for control. He was then handcuffed.

After Mr. Dimit was handcuffed we stepped back. I asked him to sit down and he refused. He took a couple steps. I did not want to chase him if he attempted to run so I guided him to the ground in a sitting position telling him to sit. Mr. Dimit began telling me I was violating his civil rights and requested my badge number. I provided him with my badge number. He stated he lived there and I could not do this to him. He stated his attorney was Timothy Note and continued yelling at me. Mr. Dimit appeare to be under the influence.

Officer McMurtrey arrived on scene and I gave him a quick briefing. I advised him there was minimum charges of disorderly conduct. Mr. Dimit continued yelling. Officer McMurtry advised he had a vehicle to put Mr. Dimit into.

Mr. Dimit was asked to stand and he would not. I assisted him in getting up by taking right arm control of him and standing him up. Officer McMurtrey had left arm control. We then began walking him to Officer McMurtrey's vehicle. I told Mr. Dimit he was being detained and asked what was going on. Mr. Dimit stated it was a domestic. Mr. Dimit had blood on him but I could not see his exact injuries at this time. He kept telling us Timothy Note was his attorney.

At officer McMurtry's vehicle Mr. Dimit was asked to sit down in the back and he refused. He was asked to sit down and again he refused. Officer McMurtrey then guided him into the vehicle. Mr. Demit then asked to speak to his supervisor. I told him I was. Mr. Dimit began yelling at me about who his attorney Timothy Note, how he was going to have my badge and his rights were violated. The door to the Officer McMurtrey's vehicle was shut. Mr. Dimit then refused to ID himself to officers.

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I returned to my vehicle and began checking CAD information on the complaint. Officer McMurtrey then contacted the complaint. I checked with Officer Bode and he had not received any information about what happened from the other male, Eric Johnson.

I heard Mr. Dimit hitting something in the back of Officer McMurtrey's vehicle. I shined my light on Mr. Dimit and saw he was hitting his head on the bars to the side window. I contacted Mr. Dimit and began talking with him to get him to stop hitting his head.

Mr. Dimit demanded to be released and wanted my name, rank and badge number. I provided him with my name, rank and badge number. He stated I was violating his rights and his attorney was Timothy Note. He was screaming profanities at me and accused me of laughing at him. I advised him I was not. He stated officers were not listening to him and what he had to say. I then asked him what happened. Mr. Dimit stated, "I was walking down the street and the police accosted me". He stated police were kicking him in the head. He demanded to be released, was going to have my badge and Timothy Note was his attorney. I let Mr. Dimit scram at me for a bit so he could vent trying to get him to calm down. I then contacted Officer Bode.

Officer Bode advised he had PC on Mr. Dimit for assault. Officer McMurtrey then transported Mr. Dimit to jail. I had radio notify jail we were en-route with an uncooperative subject and was following Officer McMurtry to jail.

At 6<sup>th</sup> and Cedar Officer McMurtrey stopped and had to check on Mr. Dimit. He opened the back door to his vehicle and told Mr. Dimit to sit up. He refused. He again told him to sit up and he refused. Mr. Dimit put his foot out the door and Officer McMurtrey told him to put his foot in the vehicle and he refused. Officer McMurtrey tried to push his foot in but Mr. Dimit pushed back. He then pushed his foot back into the vehicle and shut the door. I asked Officer McMurtry what had been the problem that he stopped. He advised he had to check on Mr. Dimit as he refused to sit up. We then continued to jail.

Officer McMurtrey had pulled into the sally port of the jail. Cpl. Ennis met officers at jail for photos. Jail staff was advised of the situation and Cpl. Ennis videoed the next interaction with Mr. Dimit.

Officer McMurtrey opened the back door of his patrol car. Mr. Dimit was advised he was being audio and video recorded. Officer McMurtrey told Mr. Dimit to exit the vehicle. He refused and asked not to be killed. He was again told to get out of the vehicle. Mr. Dimit refused. Officer McMurtrey asked him a total of 4 times to get out of the vehicle and Mr. Dimit refused. At this time Mr. Dimit was lying down on the back seat

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of the patrol car. Officer McMurtrey took control of Mr. Dimit's lets and began pulling him out of the vehicle. I then heard a "pop" and Mr. Dimit stated we broke his teeth. Officer McMurtrey was not even close to Mr. Dimit's head and I wondered what happened. He then sat up and exited the vehicle saying we broke out his front teeth. He then spit some teeth out of his mouth. He was checked for weapons and turned over to jailers. I did see he had an injury to his front teeth.

In looking inside the back of Officer McMurtrey's vehicle it appeared Mr. Mimit hit his teeth on the metal shield separating the front seat from the back seat. The shield is not strait/flat all the way across as in the older vehicles and has a boxed in area that protrudes out about 2 inches. It appears Mr. Dimit hit his tooth on the corner of this. Photos were taken. I collected the damaged tooth and photos were taken of this. Photos were also taken of Mr. Dimit. Officer McMurtrey placed the damaged teeth on property.

I looked at the broken pieced of teeth. The pieces had different colors on each side and it appeared they were caps, but I was not sure.

Mr. Dimit had been taken back to a holding cell. After the jailer's were done with Mr. Dimit, Cpl. Ennis and I attempted to talk to him about what happened. Mr. Dimit made no statement and appeared passed out.

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I contacted Lt. Hendren and advised him of the situation. No further police action was taken.

On 120214, at about 0054 hrs, I responded to the Spokane County Jail to assist Officer McMurtrey with this call. He was investigating an assault and he had arrested a suspect. Officer McMurtrey was transporting the suspect to Jail. During the transport, I heard him ask dispatch to advise the Jail that the suspect was very uncooperative. I arrived at the Jail at the same time as Officer McMurtrey. We agreed that based on the suspect's lack of cooperation, we would video tape the events in the Jail Sallyport.

Officer McMurtrey opened the driver's side rear door to his patrol car and I advised the suspect (Charles Dimit) that he was being audibly and visually recorded. Dimit was laying on his right side with his feet near the passenger side door. Officer McMurtrey asked him four times to sit up and get out of the car. He refused to get out of the car on his own power.

Officer McMurtrey attempted to pull Dimit's foot toward the door and slide him along the seat. As he slid across the seat, Dimit's head seemed to move forward and strike a metal protusion in the center of the shield. Dimit said that he had knocked his teeth out. Dimit now slid out of the car easily and stood up. He stuck out his tongue showing pieces of broken teeth on it. Dimit then turned his head and spit out the teeth fragments. I continued to video tape Dimit while he was searched and escorted into a holding cell. Looking at the teeth fragments, they did not appear to be natural teeth. They were a two-tone color with the inside being a cream or beige color and the outside being white. The white looked like a painted coating on the fragments. Several of them were photographed and collected as evidence.

I took photographs of Dimit's mouth, teeth, and hands. See the video and all photographs for additional information. See all other reports for additional information.
