


Complainant Interview Summary

Arrested subject made no complaint.

Here is a brief of what was known to Sgt. Meyer at the time of the arrest.

SEVERITY OF THE CRIME:

P.C. for 2nd degree assault by stabbing on Riley, Brian L. 7/5/1985 and this photo of the suspect.



DID THE SUSPECT POSE AN IMMEDIATE THREAT?:Suspect was actively fleeing the scene of the crime and had been pursued on foot for approximately 6hrs by Officers, K9 and CBP Air/FLIR.

DID THE SUSPECT ATTEMPT TO FLEE OR RESIST?:Riley was desperate enough to return to the area of the stabbing and attempt to get into his girlfriend's residence, then once again took off running and hiding on foot, upon the arrival of responding Police Units. Sgt. Meyer did not know if Riley was still armed with the knife he had used in the stabbing, or any other weapon(s).

The conditions were very wet due to an active rain storm, cold, soaked ground, heavily wooded and dark areas of search.

WERE THE OFFICER'S ACTIONS THAT OF A "REASONABLY OBJECTIVE OFFICER" UNDER THE SAME CIRCUMSTANCES WITHOUT THE BENEFIT OF 20/20 HINDSIGHT?:

Yes. Sgt. Meyer's decision to close distance on an actively fleeing 2nd Assault suspect, possible still armed with a deadly weapon, and non-compliant, justified his use of his service weapon in a draw and direct manner while verbally ordering compliance. Sgt. Meyer was alone at the time, in the middle of a desolate location under the above listed conditions.

At approx. 0342 we were dispatched again to the apartment where the stabbing had previously occurred. We again tried to set a perimeter and track the suspect but were unsuccessful.

After we secured the perimeter I blacked out and parked at Travis Pattern I noticed a male walking East Bound on Hawthorne. As he approached me I stepped out of my patrol vehicle. I identified myself as Spokane Police. I asked to talk with him. He refused and stated " Fuck You" I again asked him to stop so I could talk with him about The incident that had occurred earlier. It should be noted this is a dimly lit area with little to no foot traffic.

I again asked the male to stop, as he matched the description of the male involved in the stabbing. Having Prior knowledge of the stabbing incident I knew we had PC for the suspect and that he was probably still armed with the knife. The male briskly walked across the street and was non compliant. I followed him across the street and gave him loud verbal commands again to stop, This time I used a draw and direct technique with my duty issued Glock.

I remained drawn in on the subject until I gained compliance. The suspect got down on the ground and he was taken into custody. As he was being handcuffed I recognized the subject as Riley. I advised him that he was under arrest for 2nd assault. He was transported to SCJ where he was booked in without any further incident.

Sgt. Meyer was within Policy 300.3 in the application of the potential use of deadly force by pointing his firearms at a Violent Felon, and safely seizing him. Sgt. Meyer was operating under both prongs of Deadly Force Policy 300.4, in that Law Enforcement may use deadly force to :

- A) Protect himself or others from what they reasonably believe would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury. And/or,
- B) Stop a fleeing subject when the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed..... A felony involving the infliction.... Of serious bodily injury or death, and the officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the subject is not immediately apprehended. A verbal warning should preclude the application of such deadly force, and,

Sgt. Meyer's professional response and application of verbal tactics in association with his draw and direct of his service weapon, resulted in the physical compliance of the Dangerous and Violent fleeing suspect, Riley, Brian L. Sgt. Meyer's application of this force and the reporting of it, was objectively reasonable and within department training and guidelines.

It should be noted, to the best of my knowledge and resources, General Order 13-001, DIRECT POINTING OF FIREARM AT AN INDIVIDUAL, and the REPORTING OF SUCH AS A USE OF FORCE, has not been added to SPD Policy as of this time.

Direct pointing of firearm at an individual. (General Order 13-001).

While on a perimeter location, Sgt. Meyer spotted Brian L. Riley 7/5/85 trying to breach the perimeter of a K9 track. There was P.C. for 2nd degree assault by stabbing on the suspect and Sgt. Meyer had Riley's last booking photo up on his computer screen. The suspect was actively fleeing the scene of the crime and had been pursued on foot for approximately 6hrs by Officers, K9 and Customs Border Protection Air/Marine Unit in their helicopter equipped with Forward Looking Infrared.

Sgt. Meyer did not know if Riley was still armed with the knife he had used in the stabbing, or any other weapon(s). The conditions were very wet due to an active rain storm, cold, soaked ground, heavily wooded and dark areas of search.

Sgt. Meyer's chose to close distance on the actively fleeing 2nd Assault suspect, possibly still armed with a deadly weapon. Riley was non-compliant, refusing to comply with Sgt. Meyer's verbal orders to show his hands and lay down on the ground. Sgt. Meyer drew his service weapon, pointed it at Riley and, in a draw and direct manner, ordered Riley to stop and informed him he was under arrest. Sgt. Meyer was alone at the time, in the middle of a desolate location under the above listed conditions.

Sgt. Meyer's professional response and application of verbal tactics in association with his draw and direct of his service weapon, resulted in the physical compliance of the Dangerous and Violent fleeing suspect. Sgt. Meyer's application of this force and the reporting of it, was objectively reasonable and within department training and guidelines.

DIRECT POINTING OF FIREARM AT AN INDIVIDUAL-NOW CONSIDERED A USE OF FORCE

Why the change: The Department is in the process of seeking accreditation from WASPC. We have and are continuing to bring our policies in line with best practices. The recent Use of Force Commission made recommendations that are being incorporated into our policies and practices.

- Policy 300 – Use of Force
- Policy 344 – Report Preparation

The direct pointing of a firearm by an officer at an individual shall be considered a Use of Force.

When an officer directly points a firearm at an individual the following **SHALL** occur:

1. A supervisor shall be notified and respond (if possible) – **Policy 300.5.1 & 300.7**
2. A supervisor will complete a Use of Force report and it will be forwarded through the chain of command - **Policy 300.7**
3. Justification for the action will be documented in an Incident Report – **Policy 300.5**

***Policy 300.5** – Any use of force by a member of this department shall be documented promptly, completely, and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. The officer should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances.

*having a firearm in hand with a depressed muzzle, shall not be subject to this policy.



Use of Force

300.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy provides guidelines on the reasonable use of force. While there is no way to specify the exact amount or type of reasonable force to be applied in any situation, every member of this department is expected to use these guidelines to make such decisions in a professional, impartial and reasonable manner.

300.1.1 DEFINITIONS

Definitions related to this policy include:

Deadly force - Force reasonably anticipated to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious bodily injury.

Force - The application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed or restrained.

300.2 POLICY

The use of force by law enforcement personnel is a matter of critical concern, both to the public and to the law enforcement community. Officers are involved on a daily basis in numerous and varied interactions and, when warranted, may use reasonable force in carrying out their duties.

Officers must have an understanding of, and true appreciation for, their authority and limitations. This is especially true with respect to overcoming resistance while engaged in the performance of law enforcement duties.

The Department recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. Vesting officers with the authority to use reasonable force and to protect the public welfare requires monitoring, evaluation and a careful balancing of all interests.

300.2.1 DUTY TO INTERCEDE

Any officer present and observing another officer using force that is clearly beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances shall, when in a position to do so, intercede to prevent the use of unreasonable force. An officer who observes another employee use force that exceeds the degree of force permitted by law should promptly report these observations to a supervisor.

300.3 USE OF FORCE

Use of deadly force like any force used by an officer, must be objectively reasonable based on the totality of the fact and circumstances known to the officer at the time the force is used.

The "reasonableness" of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of

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force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation an officer might encounter, officers are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.

It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which officers reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by the Department. Officers may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury, nothing in this policy requires an officer to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying reasonable force.

300.3.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

An officer may use force which reasonably appears to be necessary to effect an arrest if, after notice of the intention to arrest the person, he/she either flees or forcibly resists (RCW 10.31.050).

300.3.2 FACTORS USED TO DETERMINE THE REASONABLENESS OF FORCE

When determining whether to apply force and evaluating whether an officer has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, as time and circumstances permit. These factors include, but are not limited to:

- (a) Immediacy and severity of the threat to officers or others.
- (b) The conduct of the individual being confronted, as reasonably perceived by the officer at the time.
- (c) Officer/subject factors (age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion or fatigue, the number of officers available vs. subjects).
- (d) The effects of drugs or alcohol.
- (e) Subject's mental state or capacity.
- (f) Proximity of weapons or dangerous improvised devices.
- (g) The degree to which the subject has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist despite being restrained.
- (h) The availability of other options and their possible effectiveness.
- (i) Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
- (j) Training and experience of the officer.
- (k) Potential for injury to officers, suspects and others.
- (l) Whether the person appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by flight or is attacking the officer.
- (m) The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape.
- (n) The apparent need for immediate control of the subject or a prompt resolution of the situation.

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- (o) Whether the conduct of the individual being confronted no longer reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to the officer or others.
- (p) Prior contacts with the subject or awareness of any propensity for violence.
- (q) Any other exigent circumstances.

300.3.3 PAIN COMPLIANCE TECHNIQUES

Pain compliance techniques may be effective in controlling a physically or actively resisting individual. Officers may apply those pain compliance techniques for which they have successfully completed department-approved training. Officers utilizing any pain compliance technique should consider:

- (a) The degree to which the application of the technique may be controlled given the level of resistance.
- (b) Whether the person can comply with the direction or orders of the officer.
- (c) Whether the person has been given sufficient opportunity to comply.

The application of any pain compliance technique shall be discontinued once the officer determines that compliance has been achieved.

300.3.4 NECK RESTRAINT CONTROL HOLD

The proper application of a level one or a level two neck restraint hold may be effective in restraining a violent or combative individual. However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the neck restraint hold is subject to the following:

- (a) The officer shall have successfully completed department-approved training in the use and application of the neck restraint.
- (b) The neck restraint may only be used when circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application reasonably appears necessary to control a person in any of the following circumstances:
 - 1. The subject is violent or physically resisting.
 - 2. The subject, by words or actions, has demonstrated an intention to be violent and reasonably appears to have the potential to harm officers, him/herself or others.
- (c) The application of a neck restraint control hold on the following individuals should generally be avoided unless the totality of the circumstances indicates that other available options reasonably appear ineffective, or would present a greater danger to the officer, the subject or others, and the officer reasonably believes that the need to control the individual outweighs the risk of applying a neck restraint control hold:
 - 1. Females who are known to be pregnant
 - 2. Elderly individuals
 - 3. Obvious juveniles
- (d) Any individual who has had the neck restraint hold applied, and was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel and should be monitored until examined by paramedics or other appropriate medical personnel.

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- (e) The officer shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has been subjected to the neck restraint control hold and whether the subject lost consciousness as a result.
- (f) Any officer attempting or applying the neck restraint control hold shall promptly notify a supervisor of the use or attempted use of such hold.
- (g) The use or attempted use of the neck restraint control hold shall be thoroughly documented by the officer in any related reports. Such documentation shall be reviewed by a supervisor for policy compliance.

300.4 DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

Use of deadly force like any force used by an officer, must be objectively reasonable based on the totality of the facts and circumstances known to the officer at the time the force is used. Use of deadly force is justified in the following circumstances:

- (a) An officer may use deadly force to protect him/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believes would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.
- (b) An officer may use deadly force to stop a fleeing subject when the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed, or intends to commit, a felony involving the infliction or threatened infliction of serious bodily injury or death, and the officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the subject is not immediately apprehended. Under such circumstances, a verbal warning should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

Imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous. An imminent danger may exist even if the suspect is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at someone. For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes any of the following:

1. The person has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the officer or another.
2. The person is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death without a weapon and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to do so.

300.4.1 SHOOTING AT OR FROM MOVING VEHICLES

Shots fired at or from a moving vehicle are rarely effective. Officers should move out of the path of an approaching vehicle instead of discharging their firearm at the vehicle or any of its occupants. An officer should only discharge a firearm at a moving vehicle or its occupants when the officer reasonably believes there are no other reasonable means available to avert the threat of the vehicle, or if deadly force other than the vehicle is directed at the officer or others.

Officers should not shoot at any part of a vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle.

300.5 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Any use of force by a member of this department shall be documented promptly, completely and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. The officer should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances. To collect data for purposes of training, resource allocation, analysis and related purposes, the Department may require the completion of additional report forms, as specified in department policy, procedure or law.

On 12/23/14 at approximately 2125 hours I was dispatched to 1110 E. Westview Ave. on a report of a stabbing.

Upon arrival I spoke with witness Leihuanani Riojas who informed me of the following:

She was at her apartment at 9727 N Morton Ct. (bldg 9 apt 12) with another woman, suspect Brian Riley and victim, Justin Galles. She said that the four of them met at her apartment to go together to see a friend in the hospital.

I asked her what happened and she said that Brian stabbed Justin. She thought that Brian was punching Justin, but then saw that Justin had been stabbed and was bleeding. Brian fled on foot out of the back door, heading EB into the field behind her apartment.

Justin also left on foot and ran to 1110 E. Westview to the lobby and stated he had been stabbed. People at 1110 E. Westview called the police.

Leihuanani described Brian as a white male, bald, about 5'9"-5'11", with a right arm tattoo sleeve.

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She said he was wearing blue jeans, a dark blue shirt, a dark hat with a skull logo on it and dark blue Nike Jordan shoes. The knife he used to stab Justin was described as all black, about 6" long. Brian put the knife in his back pocket before he fled on foot.

Leihuanani said that they were not arguing prior to the stabbing and she was not sure what provoked the assault. Brian stabbed Justin an estimated 4 or 5 times. She said she has known Brian for a while that he has no car, no bike, and lives somewhere in the Valley.

I then rode with Justin in the AMR ambulance up to SHMC. While in the ambulance I asked Justin who stabbed him, he said he did not know his name. I asked if he could describe the suspect, he said he was a "bald white guy". He said that he "might have a goatee". I asked what happened and he told me that he was just eating a bowl of cereal when the suspect "just started stabbing me." He said that they were not arguing and he had only met the suspect a couple of times before. He said they were not friends.

I asked where this happened and he said "the apartment". I asked who else was there and he said Lei and "T". I clarified that Lei was Leihuanani and that T was Tia. I asked what happened after he was stabbed and he said "I took off." I asked if he saw the knife, he did not. I asked if the suspect said anything when he was stabbing Justin, he did not.

Doctor's at SHMC ER confirmed that there were two stab wounds to Justin's right torso toward his back, both non life-threatening. I also saw these two stab wounds on Justin's back. I collected Justins clothing and placed it on property.

The witness named the suspect and watched the entire incident, the victim described the suspect that the witness had named, and a SPRS photograph of Brian Riley matched the description given. With this I developed probable cause to arrest Brian Riley for Assault II.

On 12/24/14 at approximately 0342 hours I was dispatched to 9728 N. Morton Ct. on a report of a female from the stabbing calling in that the suspect was back at her apartment, building 9 apartment 12. She said that he was at her back door.

Upon arrival Brian Riley was not at the apartment. A perimeter was set and a K9 track ensued. The incident ended with Brian Riley being arrested to the North of the apartment complex, after having fled on foot.

On 12/23/14 at about 2125 hrs. I responded to 1110 E. Westview Ct for a report of a male stating that he had just been Stabbed.

I responded to the area and located the male in the door way he was bleeding from the side. I assisted in the medical aid until fire personal arrived on scene.

While I was on scene I was approached by 2 females. I identified one of them as Teresa Poskie. They said they knew the victim and that he had just been assaulted in apartment #912. I directed officers over to the Deer Run Apartment to locate a crime scene.

I was advised by the Officers that rode up with the victim that medical staff had determined that the injuries were non-life threatening.

Based on the dense wooded area behind the apartment and the likely escape route for the suspect we set up a perimeter in the area. We began search with the Police K9. due to officer safety due to the wooded area I requested air support from the Border patrol. I notified the DSO of my intentions, I also sent out a command page.

After an extensive search we were unable to locate the suspect who had been identified as Brian L. Riley. I was advised that Officer had shown a photo montage to the witnesses who positively Riley.

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At approx. 0342 we were dispatched again to the apartment where the stabbing had previously occurred. We again tried to set a perimeter and track the suspect but were unsuccessful.

After we secured the perimeter I blacked out and parked at Travis Pattern I noticed a male walking East Bound on Hawthorne. As he approached me I stepped out of my patrol vehicle. I identified myself as Spokane Police. I asked to talk with him. He refused and stated " Fuck You" I again asked him to stop so I could talk with him about The incident that had occurred earlier. It should be noted this is a dimly lit area with little to no foot traffic.

I again asked the male to stop, as he matched the description of the male involved in the stabbing. Having Prior knowledge of the stabbing incident I knew we had PC for the suspect and that he was probably still armed with the knife. The male briskly walked across the street and was non compliant. I followed him across the street and gave him loud verbal commands again to stop, This time I used a draw and direct technique with my duty issued Glock.

I remained drawn in on the subject until I gained compliance. The suspect got down on the ground and he was taken into custody. As he was being handcuffed I recognized the subject as Riley. I advised him that he was under arrest for 2nd assault. He was transported to SCJ where he was booked in without any further incident.

On 12/23/14 at 2125 hours I was dispatched to the Brookstone Place retirement home at 1110 E. Westview Ct. for a report of a stabbing. When I arrived Sgt. Meyer and Ofc. Haney had located a male later identified as Justin Galles in the entryway of the retirement home.

Sgt. Meyer was holding a plastic bag to an injury on Mr. Galles's right torso. I replaced the bag with a trauma dressing and applied pressure while waiting for medics to arrive. When I applied the dressing I saw that the injury consisted of two lacerations, each about 1" long, on Mr. Galles's lower right torso. While waiting for medics I attempted to interview Mr. Galles.

Mr. Galles had difficulty speaking and seemed reluctant to provide information. He said he had been stabbed, that it had happened at some apartments nearby, and gestured to the east. When I asked who had stabbed him, he said he did not know but described the suspect as a white male about my age (30s). He eventually said he had been at a friend's apartment and the stabbing had occurred there, but said he did not want to "snitch." Spokane Fire Department arrived and took over care of Mr. Galles. I assisted the Fire Department personnel in removing Mr. Galles's t-shirt and the two jackets he was wearing, and Cpl. Busch was able to photograph Mr. Galles's injuries. I did not observe any other injuries on Mr. Galles and he said he was not injured anywhere else. He admitted using methamphetamine at about 1300 hours that day. When asked if he had anything sharp on his person he said he had a knife in his left front pants pocket.

Mr. Galles was moved to a stretcher to be transported by AMR. I removed a pocket knife from his left front pants pocket before he was placed in an ambulance. He was transported to Sacred Heart Hospital by AMR.

I assisted Ofc. Haney in collecting Mr. Galles's shirt and coats as evidence. On the right lower back of each of the articles of clothing were holes and blood consistent with where Mr. Galles was injured. Ofc. Haney placed Mr. Galles's wallet in the bag with the clothes, and I placed his pocket knife in the bag.

I then interviewed several people at Brookstone Place who had seen Mr. Galles arrive at the facility. I first spoke with Trina Reed, who worked at the facility. She provided the following statement: She had been in a staff room near the front door at about 2130 hours, about to get off of work. She heard someone banging on the front door and came out to see what was going on. Ms. Reed saw a male standing between the inner and outer doors holding his shirt up. As she got closer to him she realized he was bleeding from an injury on his right side. He was asking to come inside. Another employee (Krystal Moore) called 911. Ms. Reed radioed the other staff members and told them to lock the doors because she did not know where the suspect was. A short time later two women walked up outside the front doors, and a short time after that the police arrived.

I next interviewed a resident of the facility named James Kacalek. He provided the following statement: He had been inside the building and heard pounding coming from the front doors. He

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walked to the front doors and saw a man outside pounding on the door and yelling. The staff told the man they could not let him in, so the man sat down between the inner and outer front doors. A few minutes later two women walked up outside the front doors, and after that the police arrived.

I also spoke with another employee named Mariel Snyder, who said she had been inside the building and had come to the doors to see what was going on. She did not provide more information than had already been provided by Ms. Reed, Ms. Moore, and Mr. Kacalek.

Sgt. Meyer asked me to wait with the two women who had approached the facility shortly after Mr. Galles had arrived. The women were identified as Teresa Poskie and Leihuanani Riojas. Other officers had already interviewed them and they had said the stabbing occurred at Ms. Riojas's apartment at 9727 N. Morton Ct. #912. Ms. Riojas asked if she could go back to the apartment to get some belongings, such as shoes and a dog (in addition to the dog she was already carrying). Sgt. Meyer said I could give Ms. Poskie and Ms. Riojas a ride over to the apartment and retrieve those things for her.

I gave Ms. Riojas and Ms. Poskie a ride over to her apartment, where Ofc. Russo was securing the apartment. They waited outside while I retrieved a pair of shoes and a white Chihuahua named William from the apartment. I gave the shoes and dog to Ms. Riojas, who then requested different shoes. I took the original shoes back into the apartment and obtained shoes that Ms. Riojas approved of.

Ms. Riojas asked when she would be able to go back in the apartment. I explained that it was currently considered a crime scene and that it could be some time until she was allowed back in. I asked her if she would be willing to sign a search consent form to allow police to process the apartment for evidence of the stabbing. I also explained that it was possible that police would obtain a search warrant to process the apartment for evidence. Ms. Riojas initially said she did not know what to do but then agreed to sign a search consent form to allow police to process the apartment. She said she was the tenant at the apartment and the only other people that lived there were her minor children. Ms. Riojas signed the search consent form at 2218 hours, and Cpl. Busch was able to enter and document the crime scene.

I continued to wait outside with Ms. Riojas and Ms. Poskie. Ms. Riojas was eventually allowed back into her apartment when Cpl. Busch had finished processing the scene. Sgt. Meyer asked me to re-interview Ms. Poskie to obtain a more complete version of events from her.

I offered to let Ms. Poskie sit in the back seat of my patrol car to stay warm while I interviewed her and she agreed to do so. She provided the following information: She had been driving with a friend named Tina and Tina needed to stop by Ms. Riojas's apartment to talk to Ms. Riojas. When Ms. Poskie and Tina arrived at Ms. Riojas's apartment they found Mr. Galles standing outside the apartment. Ms. Poskie had met Mr. Galles before. Mr. Galles seemed reluctant to enter the

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apartment, but came in when Tina and Ms. Poskie entered.

Ms. Riojas and a white male known to Ms. Poskie as "Rowdy" were already inside when Ms. Poskie entered the apartment. Tina went to the bathroom while Ms. Poskie, Ms. Riojas, Mr. Galles, and Rowdy stood in the kitchen and living room. Ms. Poskie was closer to the kitchen and Mr. Galles was closer to the living room.

The group was talking when Ms. Poskie saw Mr. Galles arch his back suddenly. She then realized Rowdy was standing behind Mr. Galles and saw Rowdy pull a knife out of Mr. Galles's back. Rowdy then stabbed Mr. Galles in the back a second time. Mr. Galles fell to the ground and Rowdy walked towards Ms. Poskie and Ms. Riojas in the kitchen. Rowdy was still carrying a curved knife in his hand (Ms. Poskie gestured as if Rowdy had the knife in his right hand) as he approached them.

Rowdy said something like "I thought you said he had stalked you," which Ms. Poskie thought was directed at Ms. Riojas. Mr. Galles left out the front door of the apartment, and Ms. Riojas picked up one of her dogs and also left out the front door of the apartment. Ms. Poskie saw Rowdy leave out the sliding glass back door of the apartment. Ms. Poskie then left out the front door of the apartment.

When Ms. Poskie got outside she found Ms. Riojas out front but did not see Mr. Galles. She and Ms. Riojas walked around until they saw lights at the front of the Brookstone Place building and went that way. They found police attending to Mr. Galles there. It was not clear where Tina had gone during this incident.

While I was speaking with Ms. Poskie, Sgt. Eckersley arrived with several copies of a photo montage. I explained to Ms. Poskie that I wanted her to look at some pictures and to let me know if she recognized anyone in the pictures. I read her the statement at the bottom of the montage. When I showed her the montage at 2228 hours, she pointed at picture #4 and said that was probably Rowdy. I had her circle that picture and initial the montage.

I went inside to show another copy of the montage to Ms. Riojas. I explained to Ms. Riojas that I wanted her to look at some pictures and to let me know if she recognized anyone in the pictures. I read her the statement at the bottom of the montage. When I showed her the montage at 2230 hours she immediately pointed out picture #4 and said that was the person who stabbed Mr. Galles. I had her circle picture #4 and initial the montage.

I went back outside and looked at the booking photo of the suspect that other units had provided and learned that picture #4 was Brian Riley, whom Ms. Riojas had told other officers was the suspect in the stabbing. Sgt. Meyer directed me to go to Sacred Heart emergency room to show the montage to Mr. Galles.

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I went to the hospital and met with Mr. Galles, who was accompanied by Officers Cedeno and Chimienti. I explained to Mr. Galles that I wanted him to look at some pictures and to let me know if he recognized anyone in the pictures. I read him the statement at the bottom of the montage. When I showed him the montage at 2230 hours at 2311 hours he said "I don't know." I wrote that he had said that on the bottom of his copy of the montage, since he did not appear able to write at that time.

I called both Ms. Riojas and Ms. Poskie to get contact information for Tina so Tina could be interviewed but I neither of them answered their phones.

I turned the montages in to police records to be attached to this report. My initial response to the incident and my interaction with Mr. Galles at the hospital was captured on my body camera.

On 12-23-14 at 2126 hours I responded to 1110 E. Westview Ct on a report of a stabbing. I arrived on scene, and found Ofc. Brown-Bieber, Ofc. Haney, and the victim, in the small vestibule between the front door and the lobby. The victim, Justin Galles, was bleeding from two stab wounds to the right torso area. I photographed Galles, and then contacted Sgt. Meyer outside.

Officers learned that the stabbing occurred inside 9727 N. Morton Ct., #912. The renter of that apartment, Leihuanani Riojas, was at 1110 E. Westview, being interviewed by Ofc. Cedenio. I explained to her that we needed to clear her apartment, to ensure that no additional victims/suspects were inside. She said that we could do that, and added that the door was open.

I responded to the apartment, and cleared the location (along with Ofc. Russo, Ofc. Fabian, Ofc. Vaughn, Ofc. Stone, and Ofc. Howard). Nobody was inside the apartment. I did see some blood on an end table in the family room, and some blood on the inside of the front door. Ofc. Russo secured the scene, while the other officers assisted Ofc. Hamilton on a K9 track.

Ofc. Brown-Bieber transported Riojas back to the apartment. We learned a short while later that the injuries to Galles were not life-threatening. Sgt. Meyer requested that I process the crime scene. Ofc. Brown-Bieber obtained signed search consent from Riojas. I also heard Riojas affirm that suspect Brian Riley did not live in her apartment.

After photographing the apartment, I had Ofc. Brown-Bieber escort Riojas into the apartment. I asked her what, if anything, belonged to the suspect, Brian Riley. Riojas indicated that a dark blue/gray baseball cap, on the kitchen counter, was Riley's. She also stated that a Samsung flip phone and "leather" case, also on the kitchen counter, belonged to Riley. I collected those items as evidence. I also took blood samples (using cotton swabs and sterile water) from the end table and front door.

While still in the apartment, the tracking team advised that they had located a black cotton bag containing some chains. Riojas confirmed that the item belonged to Riley.

After processing the apartment, I assisted in perimeter duties. I later met Ofc. Stone and the tracking team back outside the apartment. Ofc. Stone turned over the bag of chains/padlocks, and a blk/blu/gray long sleeved shirt, that they located on the track.

On 12/23/2014, at 2128, I responded to a stabbing call at 1110 E Westview Ct (with OFC Brown-Bieber and SGT Meyer.

When I arrived, I assisted SGT Meyer with rendering aid until relieved by OFC Brown-Bieber.

The victim identified himself as Justin Galles, 09/01/1986. He provided very little information. Galles said that he is not a "snitch". He did say that he was stabbed by a male at the apartments on Morton.

I collected some bloody clothing and a pocket knife that belonged to Galles, and I took them to property.

I interviewed Krystal Moore, who is an employee at Brookdale Place. She told me that she heard someone banging on the front door and yelling for help. She went to the door and let Galles in. He was bleeding and was holding his side. He did not make any statements about how he got stabbed.

I moved to a perimeter position. While I was there, a W/M drove up and told me that he was a friend of Leihuanani's, and that she called him and told him what happened. The male told me that Brian hangs out at two apartment complexes on Nevada. By his description, one is 8484 N Nevada. He could not pinpoint the specific apartment there. He also said that he heard that Brian hangs out with a W/F named "Nicki", and that she lives in #3, in a complex on the west side of Nevada, near Francis, and that the units all have red doors. I later determined that the Knightsbridge Apartments match that description. Knightsbridge has units with at least two different addresses (910 E. Holyoke

There was what appeared to be fresh blood on the table in the living room and blood drops on the carpet.

Cpl Busch entered the location to process the scene. Photos were taken, and swabs of blood from the table and front door were taken. A cell phone and hat were taken as evidence. The items belonged to the suspect who was named (Riley, Brian).

After the scene was processed the scene was cleared.

A k9 track was attempted but the suspect was not located.

On 12-24-14 at approx 0342 hours radio advised they received a call from the 9728 N Morton #912 location. A female advised that the suspect in the stabbing was back at the location knocking on the back slider door. We responded to the area and set up a perimeter for a K9 track. Sgt Meyer was on the perimeter and located the suspect. The suspect was taken into custody and arrested for 2nd Assault.

On 12-24-14 at about 0347hrs, I responded to 9728 N Morton #912 to assist Officers trying to locate Brian Riley who was wanted for 2nd aslt. Riley was involved in a physical altercation earlier in the evening in which he stabbed another male subject prior to fleeing the area.

During this altercation, pc was establish for 2nd aslt on Riley as well as a local stat 2 warrant.

After arriving in the area, a perimeter was set up and a k-9 track was initiated. After searching the area for a awhile, Officer Hamilton decided to end the track. As Officers were clearing the area, Sgt Meyer located and attempted to detain Brian Riley near the intersection of Nevada/ Hawthorne. As I arrived in the area, Riley had just been secured in handcuffs(dl). I assisted in searching Riley. I noticed that his coat was drenched as well as his jeans and boots he was wearing. I unzipped his coat to search his inner jacket pockets when I noticed he had numerous bloody stains on his white tee shirt. He voluntarily replied that the "blood was his" from cutting his hand. After completing the search, he continued to make unsolicited statements that he was jumped and assaulted and he was arrested for no reason.

I asked him why he never called the police if he was assaulted and he said that he could handle it himself. He also said that all we needed to do was look another 50ft and we would have located him sleeping in the field because he is homeless and has been in the fields for 4-5 hours.

I transported Riley to SCJ and booked him for 2nd aslt w/weapon and on a misd warrant. Corporal Kukuda took possession of Riley's clothing/boots and photos of a small cut his to hand. The clothing items were placed on property as evidence.

On 12-24-14 I responded to 9728 N Morton in an attempt to locate assault suspect, Brian Riley. Probable cause was established earlier in the night to arrest Riley who stabbed another male with a knife. The complainant reported Riley was just at the residence knocking on the back door.

I arrived on scene and took a perimeter position. A K9 track was performed with negative results. When the perimeter was released I began to check the area of Nevada / Hawthorne.

Sgt Meyer reported he was out with a male at Travis Pattern. Sgt Meyer quickly updated his status, stating the male was uncooperative. I responded to Sgt Meyer's location where I observed a male, later identified as Riley, running away from Sgt Meyer. I pulled my car in front of Riley who raised his hands and dropped to a squatting position. Sgt Meyer took control of Riley's left arm as I controlled Riley's right arm. Riley was then placed in handcuffs and detained.

While searching Riley incident to arrest he stated that the blood upon his shirt was his blood. Riley stated he had cut his own hand. I did observe blood on the chest of Riley's white shirt.

Riley was transported to Spokane County Jail where he was booked for assault.
